CHURCH COVENANT

Having given ourselves to God, by faith in Christ, and adopted the Word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this soleman covenant.

We promise by Ilis grace to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid all appearance of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unbloy conformity to the world, from all sanction to the use and sale of intoxicating beverages, and to "Provide things honest in th sight of all men."

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to the study of the Scriptures, secret prayer, family devotions and social worship; and by self-denial, faith and good works endeavor to "grow in grace and the knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ."

We will not forsake the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences; public worship, and the osbervance of theordainances of the Gospel, or fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor, and all its benevolent work.

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness, and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the Spirit" in the bonds of peace to be careful to one another's happiness and reputation, and seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and as far as we are able promote the success of the church and of the gospel.

We will, everywhere, hold Christian principle sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society, constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come, and His will be done so earth as it is in heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprises, the support of missions, the success of Sunday schools, and the evangelistic effort for the salvation of the world.

RILLES OF DECORUM

- (1) The Association shall be opened and closed with prayer.
- (2) There whall be no conversation by members one with another so as to interrupt business while in session.
- (3) Every member wishing to speak shall first rise and address the Moderator.
- (4) No member shall interrupt a member while speaking.
- (5) We shall admit no other title in session but that of Brother and Sister.
- (6) Every member speaking shall attend to the subject under consideration.
- (?) No member shall speak more than twice on any one subject.
- (8) Every motion made and seconded shall be attended to unless withdrawn by the Person who made it.
- (9) No member shall absent himself from the body without leave of the Moderator.
- (10) On all motions made where the vote of the body is taken, a Majority shall pre-
- (11) Any member transgressing the above rules shall be admonished by the Moder ator.
- (13) Not less than 2/3 majority shall constitute a quorum.

PILGRIM ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTIST CONSTITUTION

- This Association shall be composed of delegates elected by churches of this body to represent the churches annually.
- (2) The Association when assembled, shall first elect a moderator and clerk.
- (3) Rules of decorum must be read immediately after the Association is assembled.
- (4) The Association will encourage a sound ministry such as presents CHRIST all sufficient SAVIOR that the plan of salvation presented by CHRIST, is strictly and definitely grace and as presented by the Gospel, will save all human beings who accept it.
- (5) Any minister in good standing with their Church or Association may be invited to a seat in our Council, take part in our deliberations and their name be enrolled in our minutes.
- (6) It is the duty of the Association to appoint or elect, Committees to take care of special business. Each Committee report must be in writing and turned in to the clerk for reading before the Assembly.
- (7) All questions presented to the Association by any Church or Minister shall be attended to.
- (8) Any Church wishing to unite with this Association may do so, by letter presented by delegates of said Church. The Church must accept our articles of faith and Church covenant.
- (9) The Association may withdraw from any Church who walks disorderly or violates any rule made and passed on by this body.
- (10) It is to be unserstood that this body assumes no higher authority than an advisory council.
- (11) Any Minister found casting his influence against any Church, or in anly way marring the character unjustly of another Minister will be dealt with by the Ministers conference.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

- 1 The Bible. The Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments were given by inspiration of God, and are our infallible rule of faith and practice.
- God. There is one living and true God, revealed in nature as the Creator, Preserver, and Righteous Governor of the universe; and in the Scriptures as Father, Son, and Holy Ghost; yet as one God, infinitely wise and good, whom all intelligent creatures are supremely to love, adore, and obey.
- Christ. Christ is God manifest in the flesh; in His Divine nature truly God, in His human nature truly man. The mediator between God and man, once crucified. He is now risen and glorified, and is our everpresent Saviour and Lord.
- 4. The HolySpirit. The Scriptures assign to the Holy Spirit all the attributes of God.
 - 5. The Government of God. God exercises a wise and benevolent providence over all beings ald all things by maintaining the constituting and laws of nature. He also performs special acts of otherwise provided for, as the highest welfare of men requires.
 - 6. The Sinfulness of Man. Man was created innocent, but by disobedience fell into a state of sin and condemnation. His posterity therfore, inherit a fallen nature of such tendencies that all who come to years of accountability, sin and secome guity before God.

- The Work of Christ. The Son of God by His incarnation, life, suffering, death, and resurrection effected for all a redemption from sin that is full and free, and is the ground of salvation by faith.
- 8. The terms of Salvation. The conditions of salvation are: 1. Repentence or sincere sorrow for sin and hearty renunciation of it. 2. Faith or the unreserved committal of one's life to Christ as Savior and Lord with purpose to love and obey Him in all things. In the exercise of saving faith, the soul is renewed by the Holy Spirit, freed from the dominion of sin, and becomes a child of God.
 3. Continuance in faith and obedience until death
- Election. God determined from the beginning to save all who would comply
 with the conditions of salvation. Hence by faith in Christ men become His
 elect.
- 10. Freedom of the Will. The human will is free and self-controlled, having power to yield to the influence of the truth and the Spirit, or to resist them and perish.
- 11. Salvation Free. God desires the salvation of all, the Gospel invites all, the Holy Spirit strives with all, and whosoever will may come and take to the water of life freely.
- Perserverance. All believers in Christ who through grace perservere in holiness to the end of life, have promise of eternal salvation.
- 13. Gospel Ordinances. Baptism, or the immersion of believers in water, and the Lord's Supper, are ordinancess to be perpetuated under the Gospel. Feet Washing an ordinance teaching humility of universal obligation, and to be ministered to all true believers.
- 14. Tithing. God commanded tithes and offerings in the Old Testament; Jesus Christ endorsed it in the Gospel (Matt. 22:23), and the spostle Paul said, "Upon the first day of the week let every one of you lay by him in store, as God prospered him." (I Cor. 26:2 a).
- 15.The Christian Sabbath. The divine law requires that one day in seven be set a part from secular employments and amusements, for rest, worship, holy works, and activities, and for personal communion with God.
- 16. Resurrection, Judgment and Final Retribution. The Scriptures teach the resurrection of life and they that have done evil into the resurrection of damnation; then the wicked will "go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life."

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- The Ordination Council shall have Minister's Conference authority in the interim.
- (2) The Minister's Conference shall have authority to elect the Ordination Council.
- (3) All Ministers, licensed and ordained, shall have a seat, voice and vote to all Minister's Conferences, and, along with all delegates, at Associational Conferences.
- (4) Any Minister failing to send a report to the Association in two (2) Annually Association shall be dropped.
- (5) The Executive Board shall have Associational authority in the interim.

RULES GOVERNING ORDINATION COUNCIL

- (1) We the Committee decided that if a man is called to preach in his church, the church license him through the Association for one year before being ordaine unless called to pastor as full time to a church, and that any Minister coming from any denomination, that he carry Minister license one year unless he has already been ordained.
- (2) No licensed minister may be ordained under one year from date of license unless he is called to be a full time pastof.
- (3) All ministers being admitted to this association must promise to give up the credentials they hold from this association if and when he is adjudged by minister conference to be disquelified to preach the gospel in compliance to our faith.
- (4) Council shall or ordain any person qualifying by rules of THE PLIGRIM AS SOCIATION OF FREE WILL, BAPTIST.
- (5) Council shall not issue credentials to brothern who have two living companio without a Bible right.
- (6) This council must not use partiality in the issuance of credentials.
- (7) These rules must be read to each minister asking for entiance into this association.
- (8) This ordination council shall have ministers conference authority in the interim.

THE FIRST QUARTERLY MEETING

The first Minister's Meeting was held at James Street F. W. B. Church. Pastor . W. C. Eggers.

Moderator Sides welcomed everyone to the first Conference. He spoke about Ministers that were supposed to be there, but said it was a hard place to find. He welcomed all visitors and also welcomed his New Church and Members.

He then called everyone into Conference and asked the clerk to read the Minutes of the Association and rules. After the rules were read he said he was happy to welcome Brother Graybeal. He then asked him if he had anything to say.

Rev. Graybesi said he wanted to thank everyone for all the prayers that had been handed down for him and all the prayers that the radio programs had been handed down for him. He spoke on how the Association got started. He started it many years ago. They were in the Yadkin Valley Association and he was talking about Brother Eggers being there also. But he spoke about how a man was to be ordained. They gave him license and then when he came back to be ordained, they took his license away. So I seen what was going on and I seen right then I was in the wrong Association. After a while a man came to me and handed me a charter of this Association, and here you organize you an Association and the man in Mooresville, N. C. sent it to me. Its on record in Raleigh, N. C. and Concord, N. C. and there isn't a thing anyone can do to change it. Its in a locker in safe keeping and anybody that would like to see it can see Brother Sides and he will get it.

Now I want to preach here this morning if God will permit it. Now there's one man here in this Association that said we're hypocrites. Now if we are all that, I wouldn't want to be among you. He spoke about how many he had helped get Credentials and how many had critized him. He thanked the Lord for the 18 years he had been it.

Brother Eggers welcomed everyone to his Church. Then singers from Rev. Mainer's Church sang "Glory Land Way" and a few more songs. Then singers from Steele F. W. B. sung two songs. Then Moderator Sides took back over. He asked for an acceptance on the rules. He got the Minutes passed and then asked for the letter to be read to bring his Church into the Association. He wanted everyone to vote 100 Percent to accept it. It was moved, voted and seconded on, and passed on.

Rev. Eggers talked about how fortunate they were to have Brother Sides, and how much he thought of him. He then called for new business.

Rev. Eggers said he had a man he would like to license who was Brother Lewis Fisher. He wanted a vote on it, which he got.

Rev. Mainer brought up about some new papers being printed, it was passed on. Rev. Sides talked about putting an Assistant Treasurer in and said the clerk should have it, so she could get stamps and supplies to mail out the cards. It was moved, seconded, voted on and passed.

Ray. Correll asked to be heard. He thanked all the preachers that helped him at his Church. (Iron Station F. W. B. Church) while he was sick.

Rev. Eggers also thanked everyone for the prayers and everything that was done for him also while he was in the hospital and for all the support from everyone.

Rev. Sides asked for any more business to be brought up. Rev. Lewis stood up and gave a testimony about how God had been so good to him.

Rev. Sides asked for the Conference to be adjourned and called for everyone to remain that Rev. Graybeal was going to preach. The Conference was dismissed and Rev. V. Tucker dismissed everyone. After Rev. Eggers called on the singers to sing a few songs, which were, "Let us Have a Little Talk With Jesus" and "Victory in Jesus." It was then requested for Sister Mary and Brother J. E. Mainer to sing "Old Crossroads."

Then singers from Steele F. W. B. Church sang and then Rev. Sides made a move to go out of Conference. It was moved, seconded, and passed. Then he asked for Rev. Lewis Fisher to dismiss.

SECOND MINISTER'S CONFERENCE

MARCH 6, 1976

The Minister's Conference was held at Iron Station Free Will Baptist Church. The Rev. William Correll. pastor of the Church welcomed everyone. Then he read from the Bible I John 3:3. After this, he called on our Moderator Rev. Henry Sides to lead in prayer.

Opening songs were sung by Rev. J. E. Mainer, Jr.: "I Know a Man Who Can", "Purple Robe" and "If You Don't Love Your Neighbor." Also, Rev. Vaudry Tucker and his wife sang "Today". "I am not the Man I Used To Be" and "I Got More To Go To Heaven for Than I Had Yesterday." Then Rev. William Keller and his wife sang "I Will Meet You In The Rapture" and "Glory Way".

The meeting was finally called into Conference by Rev. Henry Sides, the Moderator who then called on Mrs. Martha Sides (His Wife) and who also was taking the minutes down for Mary Jarvis, our clerk, who could not attend the meeting to read the Rules and Regulations. After Rev. Sides read a letter from Twin Pines Free Will Baptist Church requesting Rev. Edward Laney be ordained. The Council questioned Rev. Laney and recommended him. Rev. Vaudry Tucker moved that he be accepted and Rev. Harold Oates seconded it.

The Moderator then read a letter from "North Maiden Freewill Baptist Church who requested that Rev. Keller be ordained for a full time pastor. The Council excepted him.

Next Rev. Daniel Hunsucker wanted to exchange papers from the Piedmont Association to the Pilgrim Association. It was moved and passed on.

Next order of business was that Rev. Raiford Mills, pastor of Oak Grove Missionary Baptist Church" be ordained. It was moved, seconded and passed on. Rev. Henry Sides then made a move to go out of Conference. After passing on, everyone was dismissed.

It was then turned over to our Moderator, Rev. Henry Sides, who then called the meeting into Conference. ANNUAL MEETING OF THE PILGRIM FREE WILL BAPTIST ASSOCIATION

Moderator Sides opened the Conference welcoming everyone to "Oak Grove Free Will Baptist Church". Rev. Sides is the new pastor of Oak Grove. He called everyone into Conference. Then he asked for the rules and decorum to be read by the clerk, Mary Jarvis. Then he called on Rev. Laney for Prayer. After the first business was to elect a new Moderator. Brother Graybeal stood and told what a good Moderator Brother Sides was and recomended putting him back in. A move was made, seconded, and passed on. Rev. Sides was to remain Moderator.

He then called on Rev. Mainer for a song. He led the singing in "Everybody Will Be Happy Over There." Next order of business was a Vice-Moderator. Rev. Eggers nominated Rev. Graybeal. The Moderator asked for any more nominations there was none so it was passed on for Rev. Graybeal to remain Vice-Moderator. The next business was for a Treasurer. Rev. Correll nominated Rev. Mainer, and Rev. Eggers suggested that we keep him. Motion was made and passed on. Rev. Mainer will remain as Treasurer. Brother Laney was recommended as Treasurer by Rev. Hunsucker.
