# GENERAL BUSINESS BOARD REPORT

We, your committee on General Business, beg leave to report as follows: ARTICLE 1. That Article 2 of the Constitution of the Sunday School

and League Convention be changed to read as follows:

"The Convention shall be composed of regularly organized Sunday Schools and Leagues, and shall meet annually with the Association; the League to meet on Thursday morning and the Sunday School to meet on Friday morning. Sunday School Superintendents and League Presidents are to be ex-officio members.

ARTICLE 2. That Article 7 be changed to read as follows: "This Constitution may be altered or amended by a 2-3 vote of all members present at any regular business meeting and this vote shall be final. ARTICLE 3. We recommend that Article 4 of the By-Laws of the League

and Sunday School Convention be changed to read as follows:

"Members from two different Leagues and Sunday Schools shall constitute a quorum to transact business of the convention."

ARTICLE 4. That the following be added to Article 12 of the Church rules. "All called conferences must be announced at a regular preaching service one week in advance and the purpose of the called conference stated." ARTICLE 5. We recommend that the Clerk prepare manuscript and have 300 Minutes printed on competitive basis.

We recommend that the Clerk be allowed \$15.00 for her services. That Bro. Troy Carroll be paid \$16.38 which the Association owes him. That Sister Gilbert be paid \$3.00 for programs.

That Bro. Shutes be reimbursed \$2.00 for paper used in printing programs.

That \$15.00 be paid for State Association dues. That \$5.00 be paid National Association Dues.

ARTICLE 6. We recommend that each church t the its offering to the unified program.

ARTICLE 7. We ask that each pastor make an effort to raise money on the College expansion program as we are about \$1,500.00 behind on our quota for 1946.

ARTICLE 8. We recommend that the following be added to the church letter of dismissal: "After six months, if the letter is not presented to another church, that it be returned to the church which issued it. Should the person holding the letter fail so to do, he may, by vote of the church, be dismissed."

ARTICLE 9. We recommend that the Association go to Cordova Church in 1947.

# CONSTITUTION.

Article 1. This Assistion shall be known as the Progressive Association of Free Will Baptists of Alabama and bordering states.

Article 2. This Association shall be composed of ministers, deacons

and delegates of different churches forming the same.

Article 3. All ministers and churches wishing to become members of this body must willingly submit to the Articles of Faith, Constitution, and all rules of the same.

Article 4. Each church in this Association shall be entitled to three delegates for the first hundred members, and one delegate for each additional

tifty members, or fraction thereof.

Article 5. This Association shall have a credential committee, composed of three members, two ordained ministers and one layman, who shall be appointed by the Moderator at the convening of each regular session, whose duty shall be to examine all church letters and applications for membership or both churches and ministers and make a report of the same to the body.

Article 6. The officers of the Association shall be a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk and Treasurer, who shall be chosen by nomination and acclamation. The highest vote gets the office, the next highest become

the assistant.

Art.cle 7. This Association shall meet on Thursday, Friday and Saturday before the Second Sunday in October each year; giving the League Convention Thursday A. M. with the 11 o'clock message, and the Woman's Auxiliary Thurday P. M. with the evening message giving the Sunday School Convention Friday A. M. with the 11 o'clock message, and the Association proper, Friday P. M. and Saturday.

Article 8. The Association shall vote by acclamation where the next Association shall be held until one church gets a majority of votes cast.

Article 9. The Constitution or By-Laws may be altered or amended at any regular session of the Association, provided it lies on the table from morning until even ng, or evening until morning, and read twice in open session.

Article 10. No ministers, deacons or delegates shall be seated in this body unless they agree to stay throughout the session unless they are providentially hindred.

Article 11. That each church send 20c for each active member for As-

sociational expenses.

# RULES OF DECORUM

This Association shall be opened and closed with singing and prayer.

2. The officers elected at the previous session shall begin their administration at the opening at each regular session.

3. Only one person shall speak at a time. They shall arise and address

the Moderator and when recognized they shall proceed.

4. No person shall be interrupted while speaking by anyone except by the Moderator and not by the Moderator unless he breaks the rules of order.

5. The person speaking must adhere to the subject in question and shall not use words of personal reflection.

6. No person shall speak more than twice on the same subject without leave of the Association and not more than 5 minutes at a time.

7. No member shall laugh or whisper in time of public speaking.

8. No member shall address another except by the appellation of Brother or Sister.

No member shall absent himself without leave of the Moderator.
 The names of all the ministers, deacons and delegates shall be enrolled by the clerk, and called as often as deemed necessary by the Moderator.

11. Every member of this body shall vote for or against every move that comes before it. Those failing to do this shall be reprimanded by the Moderator.

12. Any person who shall knowingly break any of the rules shall be reproved by the Moderator accord ng to directions of the Association.

# CHURCH RULES

1. We agree as a member of the Progress ve Association of the Free Will Baptist to co-operate in every move for the betterment of our denomination and the extension of God's Kingdom throughout the world.

2. We agree to meet in conference quarterly or oftener if necessary

to tranact the business of the church.

3. The Moderator shall be chosen by the sufferage of the church in the absence of the pastor. The Moderator shall observe good order and explain all questions before he takes the voice of the church on them, and shall have the liberty of speech as anyother, but no vote unless there be a tie, when he shall give the deciding vote.

4. It shall be the duty of all members to fill the r seats in conference

and bear their part of the expenses.

5. No member shall leave ther seat during conference without per mission from the Moderator.

6. No member shall arraign another before the church for any griev-

ance without first taking gospel steps. See Matt. 18:15-16-17.

7. All business brought before the church by motion and second and in gospel-like order shall be attended to by the church unless withdrawn by the mover.

8. Any person wishing to speak shall arise and address the Moderator and if two ar.se at the same time the Moderator shall decide who shall speak first and no member while speaking shall cast any reflection on any person but shall adhere strictly to the subject under consideration.

9. No member shall speak twice on any subject without permission

from the church and not more thn 5 minutes at the time.

10. It shall be the duty of all church members to be present at all church meetings, to vote on all questions that come before the church when

called on by the Moderator or any member of the church who desires to ob-

tain the mind of the whole church.

11. If any member shall remain silent during the transaction of any business of the church and afterward complain of what was done the same shall be deemed disorderly and the member so offending shall be dealt with accordingly.

12. We agree to do all business by majority of the members present at any regular or called conference providing a quorum is present, said quorum being seven members or more. All called conferences mut be announced at a reular preachers service one week in advance and the purpose of the conference stated.

13. These rules shall be read at the opening of each conference, and

strictly enforced by the Moderator.

14. Any member who shall wilfully absent himself from church and who fails to discharge his duties as a member for six months, unless providentially hindered, shall not be permitted to vote in Church Conference until he or she has made restitution.

15. Any member desiring to move his membership from one church to another in this Association must have a letter. Failing to do so, he is taken under the watch care of the church until he presents the letter.

16. Concerning the ordination of deacons: (a) He must be elected by the church of which he is a member. (b) He must be appointed for the work of the church by the Credenti s Committee. (c) Any local church in good standing in the Association, if it so desires, may ordain deacons with the help of any two ordained min.sters and five ordained deacons who are approved by the Moderator of the Association.

# RULES FOR PREACHERS

- 1. All ministers wishing to become members of the Progressive Association must be recommended from the church from which they are members, and will be called upon to present their credentials for examination and answer satisfactorily such questions as may be asked them. Their church must recommend them for License or Ordination where they have not received such.
- 2. All preachers shall attend all business meetings unless providentially hindered.
- 3. Any minister who behaves himself unbecomingly to his high and exalted calling shall be reported by the credent al committee to the Association, who shall deal with him.

4. All ministers will be required to strictly adhere to the teachings of

the Free Will Baptists according to the Articles of Faith.

5. No minister shall speak slanderously or cast personal reflections upon another m.nister that will hurt his influence or ministerial standing.

6. All ministers shall be required to support and stand by all boards and committees appointed by the Association and do their utmost to make them a success.

7. All ministers must make an annual report of the work done by them and submit the report to the Association at its regular session.

8. An aspirant to the ministry must be recomended to the Credent'als Comittee by his church for licenese, and if they find him worthy, they recom-

mend him to the Association.

9. If, at the end of one year, he has proven himself worthy, and the church of which he is a memeber recommends him to the Association, he then goes before the Credentials Comm.ttee. If he is found worthy and sound in faith, he is to be ordained by the Presbytery.

### ARTICLES OF FAITH

1. We believe that there is but one true and eternal God, the Father, of whom are all things from evelasting to everlasting, glorious and immutable

in all His attributes. 1 Cor. 8:6; Isaiah 40:28.

2. 4. We believe that in the beginning God made man upright and placed him in a state of Glory without the least mixture of misery, from which he voluntar.ly by transgression feel, and by that means brought on himself a miserable and mortal state subject to death. Gen. 2:17; 3:19.

5. We believe that God is not willing that any should perrish; but that all should come to repentance and the knowledge of the truth, that they might be saved, for which end Unist nath commanded the Gospel to be preached among all nations and to every creatue. Mark 16:15; John 3:15-17

1 Timothy 2:4.

6. We believe that no man shall suffer in hell for want of a Christ who died for him, but as the Scripture has said, for denying the Lord that bought them because they believe not in the name of the only begotten Son of God, unbelief therefore being the cause why the just and righteous God of Heaven will condemn the children of men; it follows against all contradictions that all men at one time or another are found in such capacity as that through the grace of God they may be saved. Acts 17:30; Mark 6:6; Hebrews 3:10; Jonn 5:10.

7. We believe the whole scripture is infallibly true, and that they are the

only ru'es of faith and practice. 2Tim. 3:16-17.

8. We believe in the doctrine of General Provision made of God ir Christ, for the benefit of all mankind who repent and believe the gospel. Luke 14:16-20; Luke 13: 2-5; Luke 24:27; Matt. 25:19-20; Acts 3:19; Mark 1:3-5.

9. We believe that sinners are drawn to God, the Father, by the Holy Ghost, through Christ His Son, and that the Holy Ghost offers His div.ne aid to all the human family, so as they all might be happy, would they give place to His divine teaching, whereas such who would not receive the divine impressions of His Holy Ep.rit shall at a future day, owe their condemnation just, and charge themselves with their own damnation for wilfully rejecting the offers of sovereign grace. Matt. 11:27; St. John 6:44-65; rsaims 1:1; Titus 2:11. 12; Jeremiah 22:19.

10. We believe that men, not considered simply as men, but ungodly men, were of old ordained to condemnation, considering such who turned the grace of God into lasciviousness, denying the only Lord God Jesus Christ

who brought them, and therefore, shall bring upon themselves swift destruction, but we observe that they as such, the Apostle sayeth, because they receiveth not the love of faith that they might be saved, therefore, the indignaton and wrath of God is upon every son of man that doeth evil, living and dying therein, for there is a respect of persons with God. Jude 1:4; Peter 2:1-2; Thes. 2:11-12; Romans 2:9-11.

11. We believe that all children dying in infancy having not actually transgressed against the law of God, in their own persons are only subject to the first death, which was brought on them by the fall of the first Adam and not that any of them dying in that state shall suffer pun shment in hell by the guilt of Adam's sin, for of such is the Kingdom of God. 1 Cor. 15:22;

Matthew 18:2-5; Mark 9:36-37; Matthew 14:14.

12. We believe that good works are the fruits of a saving faith and that in the use of the means of grace, and not out of the use of those means, eternal life is promised to men. Rev. 22:14-15; Isaiah 1:19; Matt. 7:8; Jeramiah 6:16; Luke 13:34-35.

13. We believe that no man has any warrant in the Holy Scriptures for justfication before God through his own works, power or ability which he has in and of himself, only as he, by grace, is made able to come to God through Jesus Christ, believeing the righteousness of Jesus Christ to be imputed to all believers for their eternal acceptance with God. Rom. 4:24; Acts 8:20-21.

- 14. We believe that all things are foreseen in the wisdom of God, so that God knoweth whatever can or cannot come to pass upon all supposed conditions, yet not having decreed any person to everlasting life, out of respect of mere choice, farther than He hath appointed the Godly into life and the ungodly who die in sin unto death. Heb. 4:13; Prov. 8:22: Matt. 25: 21-24.
- We believe as touching gospel ordinances, in believers' baptism, laying on the hands, receiving of the sacrament in bread and wine, washing the saints feet, anointing the sick with oil in the name of the Lord, fasting, prayer, singing praises to God and the public ministry of the Word, with every institution of the Lord we shall find in the New Testament. Mark 16:15; 16; Acts 8:17; Acts 19:6; Luke 22:10-20; John 13:50-117; James 5:14.

16. We believe the Gospel made of water baptism is by immersion, and that believers are the only subjects for baptism. Mathew 3:16; Mark 1:9-

10; Acts 2:38; Rom. 6:4; Colossians 2:12.

constitute a quorum to transact the business of the convention.

5. The president or vice-president shall preside at all meetings, and in their absence the body may choose one to preside.

6. Any one wishing to speak shall arise and address the presiding officer as "Brother President" or "Sister President," and be recognized before speaking further.

7. No subject shall be discussed without a motion and a second, and the

question stated by the Pesident.

8. No report shall be adopted except by a motion and a second and a vote taken.

Following is the report of the Committee on Constitution and By-Laws: CONSTITUTION

# PREAMBLE:

In order to strengthen and unify our Christian work and the building of Christian character among the members of the Progressive Association of Free Will Baptists, and to promote and maintain a correspondence with each other in an association-wide organization, we propose to band ourselves together in an organic union and to keep the rules of such an organization according to the following plan.

Article I. This organization shall be known as the Sunday School and League Convention of the Progressive Association of Free W.ll Baptists.

Article II. This convention shall be composed of regularly organized Sunday Schools and Leagues and shall meet annually with the Association, the League on Thursday morning and the Sunday School on Friday morning. The presidents of Leagues and superintendents of Sunday Schools shall be ex-officio members.

Article III. Any Sunday School or League desiring to become a member of this Convention shall send two (2) or more delegated representatives with a petitionary letter, stating the desire of their particular organization to become a member of this Body. They shall be received by a ma-

jority vote of all members present.

Article IV. The officers of this Convention shall be a President, who shall preside at all meetings, a Vice-President, who shall preside over meetings in the absence of the President; a Secretary, whose duty it shall be to keep a true and accurate record of every meeting and every business transaction, and a Treasurer, whose duty it shall be to have, hold, convey, and convoy any and all funds entrusted to him or her by the Convention. Other officers my be elected as deemed necessary by the Body.

Article V. An Executive Committee, composed of three (3) members, to be elected so that their terms of office expire alternately thus; one to be elected for 1 year, one to be elected for 2 years, and one to be elected for 3 years, shall be chosen by the Body and shall attend to all business matters between regular annual sessions and also arrange the program for the Annual Session. One of these membes shall be chosen from the Sunday School, one from the League and one shall be elected at large.

Article VI. All officers, including Executive Committee members

must be Christians and FREE WILL BAPTISTS.

Article VII. This constitution may be altered or amended by a twothirds (2-3) vote of all members present at any regular business meeting and this vote shall be final.
