The meeting was opened by the choir of the host church singing "I've Been Changed". After prayer, the congregation was welcomed by the host pastor. The moderator made a few remarks and then received the offering. The congregation sang "Standing on the Promises" which was followed by a selection by a trio from Hilltop Church.

Rev. Jack Cox preached the evening message. From the text Matthew 25:14, the sermon was titled "Some Things Due Our Faithfulness".

Bro. Cox pointed out that some of the things we ought to be faithful to are:

- I. The Word of God
- I. Ine word of II. Our Calling
- III. The Great Commission
- IV. The Local Church
- V. Christ

Following the message, Rev. Bazen called the bussiness session to order. The Board of Ministerial Standing gave their report and made the following recommendations:

- Dr. Malcolm Fry from Unity Church be accepted into fellowship of the Randall Association.
- Rev. A. C. Morgan from Kendall Acres Church be accepted into the fellowship of the Randall Association.

- 3. Rev. John Reed from Prospect Church be accepted into the fellowship of the Randall Association.
- Rev. Jerry Huff from Hilltop Church be accepted into the fellowship of the Randall Association.
- 5. Rev. Mike Gladson from Cary Church be accepted into fellowship of this association pending a letter of good standing from the Tidewater Association.
- 6. That cards be presented annually to ministers who remain in good standing throughout the associational year. These cards to be presented at the Annual meeting.
- 7. That, in view of a letter addressed to our moderator from Rev. Bobby Glenn Smith in which he stated "the church is non-denominational atmosphere" and "the church is unaffiliated with a denomination", we recommend that Rev. Bobby Glenn Smith be dropped from our roll of ministers and ordained College Lakes Free Will Baptist Church be dropped from our list of Free Will Baptist Churches.
- All of the above recommendations were approved by the body.

Rev. Tom Lilly then gave a report on the state work. He stated that they were in the new state office located in Smithfield on lighway 70. He also stated they were in need of furnishings for the office, especially a copier.

The state is planning to double the size of the Rest Home and is selling bonds to inance this. The Misssion Board is

planning to have a Walk-a-thon in the fall for North Carolina Missions. The Book Store rent has been raised and they are looking for land to relocate. Seven churches have sent \$200.00 for this purpose.

Rev. Lilly reported that the office had been given an offset press. He expressed a great concern for the Youth Work in the state and felt that we need a Youth Evangelist. The <u>Witness</u> needs support and is only being printed bi-monthly because the support is so low.

Pastors were asked to put the state work in their church budget. Following this, Bro. Lilly gave a review of a report he presented at the state association meeting which showed the percentage of money North Carolina Churches are sending to efforts outside the state.

Rev. L. D. Creech requested that the February meeting be held at the Colonial Heights Church in Clinton which was approved.

Rev. Gary Watson will be speaking at the November 4 meeting.

Rev. A. C. Morgan was elected to replace Rev. A. B. Brown on the Board of Ministerial Standing.

Rev. Malcolm Fry was asked to speak at the February meeting in Clinton.

A motion was made and approved to welcome the new ministers to the Association.

The meeting was then dismissed in prayer by Rev. Malcolm Fry.

#### Randall Association of Free Will Baptists February 3, 1984

Colonial Heights Free Will Baptist Church Clinton, North Carolina Rev. L. D. Creech, Pastor

The service was opened by singing of the hymn "Jesus Saves". After prayer, the moderator recognized the host pastor who welcomed the association to the church.

The congregation then sang the hymn "Love Lifted Me". This was followed by the receiving of the offering.

Special music was provided by the choir of the host church. They sang "Somebody Loves Me" and "The Sun's Coming Up".

At this time Rev. Malcolm Fry was recognized to bring the evening message. Just before he preached, Rev. Fry called on two young men from his church to sing.

Rev. Fry spoke from Jeremiah 12:1-5 and titled his sermon "Only a Surface Reformation". He showed how Jeremiah had a problem of understanding. In chapter 12 verse 1, Jeremiah acknowledged that God was righteous but it was hard to understand the way that He judged. We all have these questions because we know God is righteous but have trouble fitting our concept of righteousness with His ways. God does not answer because there would only be more questions.

God expects us to have unwavering faith. This is the next step above reason and logic.

The conclusion of the message showed how the problems we are having now are preparing us for future troubles which will be even more severe. In Jeremiah's situation, if he had not experienced trouble when things were going well in Israel, he never would have been able to face the difficult times.

Rev. Fry ended with a note of hope. Although God trains us for bigger problems by giving us smaller problems, we have the promise from Isaiah "They shall run and not be weary".

The moderator opened the business session and recognized Rev. Luther Sanders of the Board of Ministerial Standing. Report as follows:

The Board of Ministerial Standing met at the Vandora Springs Church at the request of Pastor Ron Byrd on November 29, 1983 for the purpose of examining Norris Newman. Bro. Newman was a candidate for license to preach the Gospel in the Free Will Baptist denomination.

Bro. Newman is married and the father of two children. He stated that his plans were to attend the Southeastern Free Will Baptist College.

After reviewing his written test and asking him several questions, the Board recommends that Bro. Norris Newman be recognized as a licensed minister under the auspices of the Vandora Springs Free Will Baptist Church.

This item was approved by the body. There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

<u>Moman's Auxiliary</u> report as follows:

The Woman's Auxiliary of the Randall Association appreciates the opportunity to submit the following report.

We have twelve auxiliaries and 184 members.

This past year, we gave a total of \$4,618.08 to missions and education. We gave more than \$2,363 to missions. We helped our state convention to give more than \$5,392 to the NC Home Missions Board to purchase a mobile unit. At our convention this week, our state convention gave more than \$1500 to our promotional office.

The purpose of the Woman's Auxiliary is to teach and support missions. We believe the Auxiliary work in the Randall Association is faithful to that purpose.

We regret that less than half of the churches of our association have an active Woman's Auxiliary. This is a united effort and we sincerely desire the encouragement and help of our pastors. If you have any questions about our work or any complaints, we will be glad to work with you in any way.

### Executive Committee report as follows:

The Executive Committee met March 12, 1984 at the Hilltop Free Will Baptist Church. The meeting was opened in prayer by Rev. Troy Daniel.

The committee discussed recommending a constitutional change. On page 1, article 3, line 2, change the word "delegates" to "ordained ministers".

Also discussed, was the idea of returning to meeting every six months instead of once a quarter. There are advantages and disadvantages on both sides. The committee decided not to make a recommendation at this time except— No business should be discussed at the fellowship meetings except the accepting of new ministers into the association.

February 1, 1985 - Faith Church Rockingham, Rev. Tom Lilly speaker, Theme: State Work

The committee discussed the options of what to do with the \$300.00 surplus in the treasury. It was decided to recommend that the money be divided between the new mission in Henderson and the Youth Board.

The Board of Ministerial Standing was asked to update the list of Ordained Ministers who are members of this association but are not pastoring.

The Executive Committee also wishes to remind churches that the Board of Ministerial Standing is available to counsel or assist in liscensing or ordaining of ministers or deacons.

A motion was made, seconded and carried to received to accept the report of the Executive Committee.

The moderator then asked for volunteers to represent the Randall Association at the North Carolina State Assocaition meeting June 4,5,6. Those who volunteered were appointed as delegates.

Rev. Steve Pryor was called upon to give a report on the mission work in Henderson. Rev. Pryor stated he was thankful for the support the Randall Association had given. They held their first service on Easter Sunday with 23 present. They have scheduled a baptism and have already outgrown the living room they are meeting in. He invited everyone to come and help in the work and see the first phase.

This report was received as information.

Rev. Tom Lilly gave a report on the state work. They have an option on land in Greenville that can be used for state offices. Rev. Lilly said that if the churches could buy the land, he could raise money to build.
