

Rev. Hubert S. Mangum, Pastor

Rev. Billy Bevan, moderator, opened the meeting. The congregation sang "Stand up for Jesus" and Rev. Troy Daniel led in prayer.

The moderator recognized the host pastor, Rev. Mangum, who welcomed everyone to their church. The congregation sang the hymn "Resuce the Perishing" and the offering was received.

Mr. and Mrs. Young from the host church sang two songs, "Is He Satisfied with Me?" and "Win the Lost at any Cost".

Rev. Bevan introduced the speaker for the evening, Rev. Tom Lilly. Rev. Lilly expressed his appreciation to the pastors and churches for their support and help. He gave a brief report of the state work.

Rev. Lilly spoke on Church Growth and his text was Acts 2:41-47:

Any child of God should be interested in additions to the church. That is referring not just to new members but to new souls saved.

This passage illustrates two kinds of evangelism, mass evangelism (v. 41 - 3,000 people were saved) and personal evangelism (v. 47). Personal evangelism is a more practical expression of evangelism - "... the Lord added to the church daily such as should be saved".

God still uses both of these forms but "...I think mass evangelism is on its way out". It has taken on the characteristics of elitism and ecumenicalism. Some of the greatest men of mass evangelism are shelving some of their efforts.

One of the reasons for this is the Devil's efforts at MISINFORMATION on TV and through government. As a result, you must win a person to you and then convince him that you have something important to say.

Another problem is evangelism is expressed too often today as "Church Growth" like it is a fad. We thank the Lord for "Church Growth Analysts" but the truth is that Church Growth is a RESULT and a CONSEQUENCE of the far greater emphasis of bringing men, women, boys and girls to a saving knowledge of Jesus Christ.

To talk about Church Growth per se is superficial. It is like a mother with a malnourished baby having a "Feed-the-Baby Week". Church Growth is a result of what we should already be doing. If we are doing it, we will have Church Growth. We all should want Church Growth because it means someone gets saved.

There are three problems we need to face:

- I. INTROVERSION (Looking at Ourselves)
 It goes against what the Holy Spirit is trying to do. This attitude will defeat you. A good illustration is the attitude churches have in relation to their attendance. If the attendance is up, our spirit is up. If the attendance is down, our spirit is down.
- II. INCLINATION TO INSTITUTIONALISM
 We can make an institution out of ourself,
 our church, or even our our denimination.
 A young church reaches out and puts more effort
 into witnessing because it has not as yet
 become an institution.

III. ISOLATION

We isolate ourselves from the community. The early church saw themselves in the midst of a lost and dying world and they claimed it. There is a difference between being separated and being a separatist.

The monks made a mistake when they went into monasteries. They took the flesh with them and kept the WORD from the world.

Why is the church in the world? Not to worship and edify. We can do those things in heaven but we won't have lost people to reach there.

There were three things the early church had that are needful today:

A. They Were Fully Conscious of Jesus as Lord The disciples took their case to the Lord and we need to do the same. The problem with Church Growth is partly forgetting that He is the Lord of Harvest. We want to grow now. However, we won't grow tomorrow because we didn't plant the seed yesterday.

B. They Were Fully Convinced that People are Lost We need to be fully conscious of a lost generation. Of all the problems of society, the worst tragedy is that men are lost without God. Apostasy in the church can be traced to the loss of the idea that men are lost.

The sinner won't see how lost he is if I don't see (through the illumination of the Word by the Holy Spirit) how lost he is. The reason unsaved people don't see any harm in sin is because we don't see any harm in it.

C. They Were Fully Committed to Give Jesus All "I came to Him knowing I had NO grounds. If He wouldn't help me I was without hope." The early Christians lived in God's world. We try to get God to come and live in our world. Their whole life turned around His kingdom.

After one verse of the invitation song, "Jesus Is Tenderly Calling", the moderator called the business session to order.

Rev. A.C. Morgan gave the report of the Board of Ministerial Standing:

We recommend that Gary Wayne Tew be accepted as a liscensed mnister. MSC.

Rev. Doug Henderson gave a report on the Youth Camp.

Rev. Bevan informed those present that all monies should be sent to Rev. Mike Trimble as he is the treasurer. The next meeting will be November 1st at Tippett's Chapel Free Will Baptist Church in Clayton.

Rev. Bevan recognized Rev. Jeff Turnbough, missionary to Spain. Rev. Turnbough gave a brief report on the work in Spain.

MSC to adjourn. The meeting was dismissed in prayer by Rev. Tim Rabon.

The service was opened with the congregational song "He Lives". Rev. L. D. Creech led in prayer.

The host pastor, Rev. Wade Parker welcomed the Randall Association to Tippett's Chapel Church. The congregation sang "Have Faith in God".

After the offering, the choir of the host church sang "Did You Ever Want to Know?" and "Mansion over the Hilltop".

Rev. John Moran delivered the evening message from the text of Mark 1:35 - 2:14 on the theme of "Fresh Oil":

Jesus rose early and went to a solitary place to pray. In 1:35, we find Jesus praying. In 2:10, we find Him ministering. These two chapters reveal the relationship between prayer and power. Power to minister and power to recruit.

Finney said, "Christians are as guilty for not being filled with the Spirit as sinners are for not repenting." Moody said, "I would rather die than live a nominal Christian life." We need to follow the patterns set by these men in seeking God's power.

The moderator, Rev. Billy Bevan called the business session to order. The clerk read a letter from Rev. Ron Byrd resigning his office of assistant moderator. The recommendation from the Executive Committee is that Rev. Bobby Bazen be appointed to fill the unexpired term of Rev. Byrd as assistant moderator.

Rev. Bevan recognized Dr. Malcolm Fry for a report from the Board of Ministerial Standing:

Recommended that Rev. Jim Turnbough be accepted into the association. It was also recommended that the association hold elections to fill vacancies on various boards.

MSC to accept Rev. Turnbough who then received the right hand of fellowship from the moderator.

Concerning the second item, Rev. Bevan suggested that it would be wise to wait until the association received official notification of the pastors having left the association.

Rev. Sam Truett was recognized who gave a report on the work of the Youth Board. He announced a Youth Rally next Saturday night at Unity Church in Smithfield. He also mentioned that it has been customary for each church to send \$10.00 a month to the Youth Board.

The moderator recognized Rev. Tom Lilly who spoke of his appreciation to the pastors and the churches. He reported on the project for the purchase of the property in Greenville.

Rev. Steve Pryor reported on the work at the Mission in Henderson. The October average for Sunday School was 74 and 80 in worship service. Six adults have recently joined the church.

Rev. Eugene Waters opened the service by leading the congregation in the song "Since Jesus Came into My Heart". Rev. Randy Cox led in prayer.

The host pastor, Rev. Eugene Waters, welcomed the Randall Association to the Stage Road Church.

James Broome who attends Peace Mission Church in Henderson gave a brief report on the work at the Mission and sang "I'd Rather be an Old-Time Christian". Everyone was blessed with the good report and especially with the singing.

After the offering was received, the ladies trio from the host church sang "The Way that He Loves".

Rev. Wade Parker, pastor of Tippett's Chapel Free Will Baptist Church, preached the message for the evening. His text was Malachi 1:6,7,8,13 & 10.

Rev. Parker pointed out that God was saying in verse 10 - 1 have to tell you everything to do. The problem with the people was insincerity which was sin. They were insincere (1) in their honor to God [vs. 6,7]; (2) in their sacrifices to God [vs. 8, 13]; (3) in their tithes and offerings; and (4) in their service to God.

After the message, the moderator, Rev. Billy Bevan, called the business session to order. He then passed out copies of a letter from Rev. Connie Cariker of the Evangelism and Church Growth Division. Bro. George Mooneyham opened the service by leading the congregation in the hymn "Jesus Saves".

Moderator, Rev. Bobby Bazen, welcomed everyone to the meeting and called on Bro. Gary Allen to lead in prayer.

Rev. Virgil Nolen, host pastor, welcomed everyone to the church. The offering was then received.

Kent Bryant, missionary to Fiji Islands with Child Evangelism Fellowship, gave a brief report on his work and then sang "People Need the Lord".

The devotion was given by Rev. Jim Turnbough. From the text of Nehemiah 6:1-4, he spoke of the attacks of Satan:

Satan attacked through SUBTLITY by trying to get on the inside track of God's work. Nehemiah saw through the attack and withstood through (1) discernment and (2) a sense of priority.

Next Satan tried to SLANDER Nehemiah. Nehemiah denied the charges (when slander is open, deny it openly) and then he prayed.

Finally Satan tempted Nehemiah to SIN. Nehemiah did not because of (1) his character, (2) his confidence in the Lord and (3) his courage. The result was that the walls were built in 52 days (Nehemiah 6:15).

Rev. Bobby Bazen then called the business meeting to order and seated the delegates.

Rev. Sam Truett gave the following report for the Youth Board:

The Youth Board sponsored nine monthly Youth Rallies and the camp making an activity every month except June and July. There was good participation and attendance at every rally.

The variety of programs included skating in September, a film in October, a "Night of Song in November, a Christmas program in December, a bowling lock-in in January, a preaching service in February, basketball tournament in March, Missionary Banquet in April and a "Day at Dixie" in May.

The board has the following needs: (1) money - \$100.00 from each church (2) participation and (3) each pastor's mailing address.

This year's Camp will be August 11-16. We need workers, money and campers. The evangelist will be Rev. Billy Keith.

Larry Gunnoe gave the report of the Executive Committee:

The Executive Committee met February 10, 1986 at the Stage Road Free Will Baptist Church.

The main point of discussion was the upcoming annual meeting. It was decided to hold the meeting at the Calvary Church in Durham and to ask Rev. Bronco West to give one of his chalk talks for the devotion. Rev. Jim Turnbough was chosen as an alternate.

The Committee chose those who would serve on committees at the annual meeting. These were as follows:

FINANCE - Mike Trimble, Chairman; Rev. Troy Daniel; Mike Walters

RESOLUTIONS - Rev. Malcolm Fry, Chairman; Rev. I. Bennie Turner; Rev. Carey Watkins

DIGEST - Rev. Eugene Waters, Chairman; Tim Murfin; Butler Hall

NOMINATING - Rev. Gary Watson, Chairman; Rev. Jim Turnbough; Rev. Wade Parker

MSC to accept the report as information.

Rev. Malcolm Fry was recognized and gave a report for the Board of Ministerial Standing:

- 1. We recommend that the Randall Association grant the request of Rev. Ralph Osborne to depart our ranks and unite with the Southern Baptist Convention.
 - 2. We recommend that Rev. Bob Hesselmeyer, holding valid credentials as a minister in good standing in Northeast Mississippi Association be received into our fellowship as an ordained Free Will Baptist minister.
 - 3. We recommend that Rev. Manuel Aldridge, holding valid credentials as a minister in good standing in the Scioto Ministerial Conference of Ohio Free Will Baptists be received into our fellowship as an ordained Free Will Baptist minister, contingent upon receiving a letter of transfer of credentials from the Scioto Yearly Meeting.

MSC to accept the report and act upon it item by item. Each item was accepted.

The right hand of fellowship was extended to Rev. Hesselmeyer and Rev. Aldridge.

Rev. Fry also gave the report of the Resolutions Committee:

- 1. Be it resolved that we give a rising vote of thanks to the officers of the Randall Association for services rendered.
- 2. Be it resolved that we give a rising vote of thanks to the host pastor and congregation for their hospitality and facilities.
- 3. Be it resolved that we support our president through prayer relative to his dealings with terrorism.

Each item was approved and acted upon accordingly.

The moderator recognized Rev. Steve Pryor of the Henderson dission. Rev. Pryor reported that the mission had averaged 92 in Sunday School in March and 79 in April. The greatest need is financial. They need \$638.00 per week.

Rev. Pryor explained that the mission had their prayer neeting on Thursday night and invited pastors to come and bring their people and be prepared to preach. On Wednesday night he would bring folks from the mission and return the favor.

Rev. Tom Lilly, State Promotional Director, was recognized by the moderator. Rev. Lilly reported that the rest home was being doubled in size and they are looking to buy new land. The total paid on the land in Greenville this far is \$133,000 leaving a balance owed of \$70,000. Rev. Lilly expressed appreciation to the Randall Association for staying current in paying fees, etc.

Rev. Wade Parker gave the report for the Nominating Committee:
