

# RANDALL ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS August 1, 1986

## PROSPECT FREE WILL BAPTIST CHURCH Dunn. NC

Rev. John Reed, Pastor

The meeting was called to order by Rev. Bobby Bazen, moderator. Larry Gunnoe led the congregation in singing "Glory to His Name". Rev. Wade Parker led in prayer.

After the host pastor welcomed everyone to the meeting, the congregation mang "Rescue the Perishing". A ladies trio from the host church mang "In the Upper Room". Before receiving the offering, Rev. Bazen encouraged the churches to be mure they have paid their yearly fees.

Rev. Bazen introduced the speaker, Rev. L. D. Creech. Just before Rev. Creech preached, Johnny Allen sang "Ten Thousand Years".

Rev. Creech used Acts 1:6 - 11 and I Thessalonians 4:16 - 18 for his texts. His theme was there are three prophecies of the Bible: (1)Christ is coming; (2) Christ has come; and (3) Christ is coming again. He said, "We're looking for Jesus to come back and that's the only hope of the world."

What will be the MANNER of His coming? "The Lord Himself shall descend." What will be the TIME of His coming? It will be a time of moral and spiritual decay.

What will be the PURPOSE of His coming? He will have five purposes: (1) to raise the dead, (2) to separate the wheat from the chaff, (3) to take vengeance on the wicked, (4) to bless the right-eous and (5) to fuifill His promises.

After the message, Rev. Bazen led in prayer and then declared the meeting open for business. The first item was officially seating delegates.

The clerk gave the report of the Executive Committee:

The Executive Committee met at Hilltop Church July 9, 1986. Present were: Rev. Bobby Bazen, Rev. Jerry Allen, Rev. Eugene Waters, Rev. L. D. Creech and Larry Gunnoe. The meeting was opened with prayer by Rev. Waters.

Rev. Bazen mentioned that the next meeting on August ist had already been set at Prospect Church but the program had not been decided upon. It was decided we have a regular preaching service with Rev. L. D. Creech as the speaker.

Treasurer, Rev. Jerry Allen, brought to our attention that some of the churches had not paid all of their fees during the past year. The clerk was instructed to remind them of this in the letter announcing the meeting.

The committee then discussed what the association could do to be a help to the individual churches. Rev. Bazen mentioned such things as a Sunday School workshop, a Bible Conference or getting involved in one of the National programs such as Target 90 or a Missions Conference.

It was decided to have an all day Bible Conference in connection with the November meeting. The conference would begin with a service on Friday night and have a morning service on Saturday. The Saturday morning service would begin at 10:00 AM and include two sermons. Rev. Creech suggested that the committee wait until the August meeting to decide on who to invite as speakers for the conference. In the meantime, we should be praying about the matter.

The February meeting would feature the talent of certain churches in our association. The hour and a half to two hour program would include various skits and singers. Some of the skits would be humorous but the main one would be a serious skit that could be concluded with an invitation. The Stage Road Church would provide two or three special songs. Immanuel Church and Unity Church were mentioned as possibly doing shorter skits. Hilltop Church was asked to give the longer more serious skit.

A couple of suggestions were made about improving the quarterly meetings. These were to officially seat delegates at each meeting and to call the roll of churches and ministers at each meeting.

The committee discussed the need to reprint and update the Constitution and by-laws. The meeting was dismissed in prayer by Rev. Bobby Bazen.

The clerk apologized for not having the minutes ready. The moderator encouraged pastors to attend the Bible Conference November 7 and 8. He asked them to try to get their members involved also. The February meeting will be designed for fellowship. MSC to accept the report of the Executive Committee.

Rev. Sam Truett made announcements about camp. The evangellsts will be Robert West and Billy Keith.

Rev. Bazen recognized missionary Robert West. He thanked the association for their prayers and support during his language study. He explained that he was not in the Ivory Coast because his father had recently passed away and because his support had dropped almost 50%. He asked that we pray that needs would be met so that he could return to Africa by the middle of October.

Rev. Wade Parker of the Board of Ministerial Standing gave the report for that board. They recommended that a letter of recommendation be granted for Rev. Charles Keith to the South Carolina Conference.

MSC to adjourn. Rev. Sam Truett led in prayer.

The meeting was called to order by the moderator who called upon Rev. Wade Parker of the Board of Ministerial Standing to give a report. The Board recommended that Rev. Mickey Broadway, an ordained Free Will Baptist Minister in good standing, be received into the fellowship of the Randall Association contingent upon receiving a letter of request from Calvary Free Will Baptist Church in Durham, NC. The moderator recognized that Rev. Mark Gideon was present. Tim Murfin sang "I Can Do All Things through Christ".

This meeting was one of a series of meetings this weekend which was part of a mini Bible Conference. There were two sermons this morning; one by Rev. Sam Truett and one by Rev. Gordon Sebastian.

Following are a few notes from Rev. Truett's sermon:

Paul said "study to show yourself approved...". The purpose of study is not scholarship but workmanship. Rev. Truett commented that Nehemlah is a good book for revival.

There are three things that we have in common with Nehemiah: (1) the faithfulness of God; (2) the failure of God's people; (3) the future offers great opportunities for the children of God.

Nehemlah's passion is found in verse 4 which says he wept. The first principle is: GOD'S WORK BEGINS WITH A BROKEN HEART. God lets the things I already know burden me.

Nehemiah's prayer is the next point. It revealed he had faith in God (v. 5). It revealed his familiarity with the Scriptures (v.8). The second principle is: GOD ALWAYS USES HIS WORD TO PREPARE HIS WORK. Nehemiah's prayer also reveals that he faced his own sin (v. 6).

Nehemiah's priorities became changed. He gave up a plush position and made some sacrifices. The third principle is: THERE CAN BE NO SERVICE FOR GOD WITHOUT SACRIFICE. The real test of sacrifice is not what you're willing to do for God but what you are willing to do without. Nehemiah became committed even though he did not have a command or a clearly stated call. The fourth principle is: GOD'S WORKMAN MUST WORK BECAUSE OF COMMITMENT NOT JUST BECAUSE OF COMMITMENT.

The meeting was called to order by Moderator Bobby Bazen. Rev. Mike Trimble, host pastor, welcomed everyone and led the congregation in singing "Victory in Jesus".

Rev. Bronco West was called on to lead in prayer. Rev. Trimble led the congregation in singing "My Saviour's Love".

A trio of ladies from the Stage Road Church sang three specials: "My House is Full", "We Shall Behold the King" and "Where No One Stands Alone".

After Rev. Bazen received the offering, Rev. Trimble introduced the play, "The Black Sheep". It was a moving play which the touched the congregation.

Rev. Bazen called the business session to order and asked for a report from the Executive Committee. The report was given by Larry Gunnoe:

The Executive met Just prior to the meeting tonight here at the church. Rev. Eugene Waters opened the meeting in prayer. The dates and location for the Evangelism Conference were given. The Conference will be March 27, and 28 at the Garner Free Will Baptist Church. It was pointed out that it will take about \$1200 to finance the meeting and we need to support it as an association.

It will be announced in the meeting tonight that we may have to take from the General Fund to support the meeting. The committee will depend on the churches to give \$100 - \$150 each and whatever is needed above that will be taken from the General Fund.

The Annual Meeting will be May 1 at Tippett's Chapel Church. Four committees have been assigned to work for that meeting. They are:

Resolutions - John Reed, Chairman; Adam Scott, Virgil Noien Digest - Gene Waters, Chairman; Butler Hall; Steve Pryor Nominating - Malcolm Fry, Chairman; Wade Parker; Tim Rabon

In addition to the appointing of committees, Rev. Bob Hesselmeyer was selected to bring a devotion at the meeting.

Rev. Bazen explained more about the Evangelism Conference. Mike Trimble said that the Home Missions Department will be sending out flyers to the local churches about it. MSC to accept the report.

Three missionaries gave reports: Rev. Steve Pryor of Henderson; Rev Randy Stone of Fayetteville who held his first full schedule of services this week; and Rev. Ron Calloway of Spain who reported that the works are strong but more workers are needed.

The Board of Ministerial Standing gave its report. We recommend that:

- 3. Steven Webb, a member of First Free Will Baptist Church of Raleigh and an ordained Free Will Baptist minister in good standing, be received into the fellowship of the Randall Association with all privileges relating thereto.

Moderator, Rev. Bobby Bazen opened the service and called upon Rev. Billy Keith to lead in the opening song. The congregation sang "The Lily of the Valley" and Rev. Virgil Noien led in prayer.

Rev. Bazen recognized the host pastor, Rev. Wade Parker who welcomed the Randall Association to Tippett's Chapel. Rev. Parker said the church was "extremely pleased to have you here" and invited all to enjoy refreshments provided by the church after the meeting.

Rev. Tony Broome from the Peace Mission sang "I Wouldn't Take Nothing for My Journey Now" and "Here They Come" which greatly blessed the congregation.

Rev. Bob Hesselmeyer gave the devotion on the topic of "Storms" from Acts 27.

Paul was arrested in Jerusalem and transported to Rome. On the way there a storm arose which was probably a typhoon or a whirlwind.

Rev. Hesselmeyer pointed out that we are living in terrible times and we are constantly experiencing storms. We don't always know how to respond.

An important question we could ask about this passage is why did Paul not just perform a miracle like he had done many times before and calm the storm? The answer is because sometimes Jesus wants us to go through the storm.

God wants us to learn to DEAL with the problems we face instead of trying to avoid them.

The storm caused a lot of extra work for Paul and the crew. When we face storms, we need to roll up our sleeves and get to work. Often the pastor may feel he is like the Chief Executive Officer of a company but there are times when he has to do the dirty work.

Verse 29 of this chapter says they threw out anchors and "wished for the day". As Christians, we have four anchors:

- Faith which is personal confidence in God.
   Fullness of the Spirit
- - A. He helps us be delivered from the world, the flesh and the devil.
  - B. He helps develop in us the fruit of the Spi-
- 3. Communication with God through Bible study and prayer.
- 4. Godly friends who are people with the same heartbeat.

Rev. Hesselmeyer concluded by saying that we are living in a special time. "I trust that we throw out our anchors..." and let people see the light of our testimonies.

Rev. Bazen called the business session to order and asked for a motion to seat the delegates. MSC. He then called on the clerk to read the appointments of committees that were made for this meeting.

Under old business, Rev. Mike Trimble gave a financial report from the Home Missions Conference:

Garner..... \$ 625.00 (This includes meals, hotel expenses, offerings during the conference plus the Sunday morning offering.)

#### Trymon Messer:

Fellowship..... \$ 150.00 Prospect..... \$ 260.50 + \$35.00 monthly support

#### Miscellaneous:

50 tapes 9 \$7.00...\$ 350.00 Total.....\$1360.50

Rev. Bazen commented that it would not be necessary to take any money from the treasury to pay expenses of the conference.

The moderator reminded the pastors to send in the \$60.00 fee for their church if they have not yet done so. Treasurer, Rev. Jerry Allen was called on to read the list of those churches that have not paid as a reminder to them.

The congregation was asked if anyone had specific information about the Vandora Springs Church. Rev. Turnbough stated that he had heard that the church had voted to unite with the state group of Free Will Baptist Churches.

Rev. Sam Truett gave the report of the Youth Board:

He reported on the rallys the board had sponsored this past year. Among these were a bowling lock-in in January, a film at the Garner church, and two preaching rallys.

The rally this month will be Camp Dixle Day next Saturday from 1:00 PM to 5:00 PM. This will be an opportunity for the young people to see all that is available at the camp. There will be many activities and a short devotion.

Applications for this year's Youth Camp are available. Rev. Frank Breeden will be preaching to the teens. There is a need for cooks, life-guards, song leaders, teachers and others to help in the camp.

Mr. Carl McCabe reported for the Master's Men that three churches were participating in the program. Rev. Truett had previously announced that the Master's Men will have a retreat next Friday night and Saturday at Camp Dixle. Rev. Randy Stone will preach and the cost will be \$12.00 per person.

Mrs. Truett gave the Woman's Auxiliary Report as follows:

At the spring meeting, there were 14 Auxiliaries reporting and the present enrollment totals 209. The State Project for 1986-87 was to raise \$3400 for Ron Calloway; \$1000 for the Oklahoma Land Fund and \$2000 for the General Fund of the college of your choice.

The Randall Association goal for the State Project was \$800 for Ron Calloway but the Randall Auxillaries raised \$1153.83. The ladies also raised \$208.50 for the Oklahoma Land Fund; \$492.68 for Free Will Baptist Bible College and \$25.00 for Southeastern Free Will Baptist College.

The State Projects for 1987-88, pending adoption at the state meeting, will be \$3400 for Robert West; \$1000 for National Home Missions and \$2000 for the General Fund of the college of your choice.

The Board of Ministerial Standing gave their report:

- 1) We recommend that Rev. Billy C. Keith, holding valid credentials as a minister in good standing in the South Carolina Conference, be received into our fellowship as an ordained Free Will Baptist minister.
- 2) We recommend that Rev. Randy Stone, holding valld credentials as a minister in good standing in the Blue Ridge Association, be received into our fellowship as an ordained minister in the capacity as a resident home missionary. Also, we include the Fayetteville work under mission status.

Rev. Randy Stone asked about the responsibility of the misslon to pay dues. Rev. Bazen suggested that it was voluntary on the part of the mission. Rev. Jim Turnbough moved that the association bear the expense of the dues for the two missions. The motion was seconded and carried.

Rev. Eugene Waters gave the report of the Digest Committee:

Fourteen of twenty-six churches in the Association reported. One mission church reported. The total membership of the churches reporting was 2,146. One hundred sixty-three new members were received since the last session. Forty members were dismissed since the last meeting.

The total Sunday School enrollment was 1690 with average attendance of 1,348. CTS has an enrollment of 236 with an average attendance of 201. One hundred eighty-one women are enrolled in WNAC with an average attendance of 133. Fifty-three men hold membership in Master's Men.

The Executive Committee had no report.

The moderator called for miscellaneous business. Rev. Sam Truett asked what expenses the Association would have to pay out of the balance it had on hand. Rev. Allen said that there would be about \$600 or \$700 left after paying for the minutes and various other expenses.

Rev. Truett suggested that since Ron Calloway needs \$10,000, we could send a percentage to him for his account. Rev. Bazen suggested that the Association could look at the finances again at the August meeting.

There being no old business the moderator called for the report from the Nominating Committee. The report was given by Dr. Malcolm Fry and the congregation MSC to accept it and act on it item by item.

Rev. Hubert Mangum was nominated to serve on the Board of Ministerial Standing (1992). Rev. Billy Kelth was nominated to the Youth Board (1992). Larry Gunnoe was nominated to fill the unexpired term of Rev. Tim Murfin on the Youth Board. Mr. Gunnoe declined and was replaced in the nomination slate by Rev. Randy Stone (1991). Rev. Troy Daniel was nominated to the Executive Committee as Member-at-Large (1989). Rev. Bob Hesselmeyer was nominated to the position of Clerk (1989). Rev. Jerry Allen, Rev. Eugene Waters and Rev. Bobby Bazen were nominated to succeed themselves as Treasurer (1989), Assistant Moderator (1989) and Moderator (1989) respectively.

 $\operatorname{\mathsf{MSC}}$  to accept the nominations and proceed to elect by acclamation.

Rev. Bazen gave a statement of his purpose in serving as chairman. He commented that it had been his "prayer (that) we could... have fellowship among us and promote the cause of Christ." He pointed out the we have succeeded in getting more people involved in the association, especially laymen. He asked that the members of the association would lift up the officers in prayer.

Rev. John Reed gave the report of the Resolutions Committee which was a resolution to give the host church a rising vote of appreciation for hosting the meeting.

Various announcements were made by pastors concerning revivals and other special meetings at their churches. Rev. Steve Pryor mentioned that the Henderson Mission had averaged 65 in Sunday School and 70 in preaching services recently. Rev. Ron Calloway said that he would be returning to Spain August 10. The State Association Meeting will be held June 8 in Gastonia, NC.

Dr. Malcolm Fry moved that the association express its appreciation to the outgoing officers, especially Rev. Sam Truett and Larry Gunnoe. Motion was seconded and carried.

The moderator called for a motion to adjourn. MSC.

Rev. Ron Calloway dismissed in prayer.
