

CONSTITUTION of the Randall Association of Free Will Baptists

Preamble

As members of the Free Will Baptist denomination, being regularly baptized upon profession of faith in Jesus Christ, and realizing the necessity for a bond of union and fellowship, we do hereby ordain this Constitution for our mutual edification and inspiration, hoping to accomplish cooperatively what we could not individually.

ARTICLE I. NAME

This organization shall be known as the Randall Association of Free Will Baptists.

ARTICLE II. MEMBERSHIP

SECTION 1. This Association shall be composed of Free Will Baptist churches which maintain Gospel order and agree with denominational doctrines and practices expressed in <u>A Treatise of Faith and Practices</u> of Free Will Baptists as adopted by the National Association of Free Will Baptists.

SECTION 2. Churches desiring membership in this Association shall present a petitionary letter. They shall then be examined by the Executive Board to determine whether they are in compliance with Section 1 of the Article. Upon recommendation of the Executive Board, they shall be received by a majority vote of the Association.

SECTION 3. Member churches are requested to participate in all the meetings of the Association and to report by letter to the Association at its annual business meeting. Failure to so report for a period of two years shall forfeit that church's membership in this Association.

ARTICLE III. <u>REPRESENTATION</u>

SECTION 1. Voting representation at any session shall be by standing delegates of the Association, and lay delegates who are elected representatives of the various churches comprising this Association.

SECTION 2. Standing delegates shall be the members of the various boards of the Association ordained ministers and deacons who are members in good standing with this Association.

SECTION 3. Each church shall be entitled to represent at any session of this Association with five lay delegates. Churches having memberships of 500 or more are entitled to one additional delegate for every 200 members or fraction thereof above 500.

ARTICLE IV. MEETINGS

This association shall hold regular meetings quarterly in the various member churches. These meetings shall be held on the third Friday nights of February, May, August, and November, respectively, with the May meeting being designated as the Annual Meeting.

ARTICLE V. GENERAL OFFICERS

The general officers of this Association shall consist of a moderator, an assistant moderator, a clerk, and a treasurer, each of whom shall be elected for a term of two years beginning at the close of the session at which they were elected.

ARTICLE VI. BOARDS

SECTION 1. <u>The Executive Board</u> shall consist of the general officers of the Association together with one member elected at large for a term of two years.

The Executive Board shall have the power to act in behalf of this Association when not in session only as provided for in this Constitution and By-Laws, or, as specifically directed by the Association.

This Board shall have the responsibility for the program of each session of this Association and the planning of special joint services and/or Bible Conferences for the edification of our people.

SECTION 2. <u>The Board of Ministerial Standing</u> shall consist of five members elected for terms of five years, the term of one expiring each year. The Board of Ministerial Standing shall examine any licensed or ordained minister who, as a member of one of the several churches of the Randall Association, is presented by said church as a candidate for acceptance as a minister in good standing with this Association. In the case of licensed minister, this examination shall include a written examination (see Appendix I). In the case of newly ordained minister, this examination shall include a written examination (see Appendix II), and an oral examination in which the candidate must satisfy the concerning: any errors or weaknesses revealed in the written examination, personal salvation, assurance of a call from God to preach, doctrinal purity, agreement with the beliefs of the Free Will Baptist denomination, purity of testimony and holiness of life, knowledge of the Scriptures, and willingness to accept guidance and supervision of the Board in remedying any deficiencies.

SECTION 3. <u>*The Youth Activities Board*</u> shall consist of five members selected for terms of five years, the term of one expiring each year.

The Youth Activities Board shall promote and coordinate all Associational youth activities within the Randall Association. It is understood that participation by the various churches in the enterprises endorsed by the board shall be voluntary, but such participation is wholeheartedly encouraged.

The Youth Activities Board shall, in the pursuance of the duties described above plan, promote, and conduct all the activities of the Church Training Service program at the Associational level; plan and conduct special youth rally services and other related activities which they deem prudent, and conduct a yearly camp.

ARTICLE VII. MINISTERIAL STANDING

SECTION 1. This Association, while viewing the licensing and ordination of ministers as the prerogative of the local church, does reserve to itself the authority to grant or withhold its official sanction and approval of ministers who belong to several churches comprising this Association. Only such candidates as meet the standards of the Association shall be granted that approval and sanction or consideration to be ministers in good standing with this Association.

SECTION 2. In order to attain ministerial standing in this Association, a minister must be approved and recommended by the Board of Ministerial Standing and accepted by the majority vote of this Association.

SECTION 3. Ministers are expected to attend all meetings of the Association. Ministers must attend or be accounted for at the annual meeting. Failure to do so for a period of two years will forfeit their standing within the Association.

SECTION 4. At any time that a minister in good standing with this Association is found to no longer meet the standards of this Association in either doctrine or practice, the Association shall, in writing, notify the church of which he is a member of this action.

ARTICLE VIII. DISCIPLINE

SECTION 1. This Randall Association shall have the right to settle any question of discipline, doctrine, or practice that may properly come before it from any of the churches of the Association, or act upon any appeal made by a member of said church. Said appeal shall be submitted in writing to the clerk of the Association, being properly signed. Such appeals shall be submitted to the Executive Board and, at their discretion, they shall hear the appeal and make recommendation to the Association as to the course of action they deem best. If the Executive Board does not hear any appeal, or makes no recommendation, such an appeal may be brought before the Association itself.

SECTION 2. Any action which the Association may take cannot reverse the action of any member church, although it may act in a hortatory and advisory capacity toward that end. Actual disciplinary action upon a member church or minister can deal only with their rights as a member of the Association. In this vein, the Association may refuse to seat delegates from a member church for a session of the Association or may ultimately withdraw fellowship from the church.

ARTICLE IX. PROPERTY

This Association lays no claim whatever to the property, real or personal, of any of the several churches which comprise the Association. Under no circumstances does any such property automatically revert to the Association. Such property may come into possession of the Association only by the specific action of the member church.

ARTICLE X. SUBSIDIARY ORGANIZATIONS

The Women Nationally Active For Christ of the Randall Association shall be recognized as a subordinate to the Association; but shall organize at its own discretion and have power to create and adopt a Constitution and By-Laws and maintain complete management of the work and shall conform to the general program and promotional plan of the Association. It shall report accomplishments and financial operations annually to the Association.

ARTICLE XI. DISSOLUTION

In the event of the dissolution of this Association, any assets of the organization then remaining shall be conveyed to such denominational agencies then existing which are dedicated to similar objectives to those of this organization. Said agency shall be selected by the Association at the time of dissolution.

ARTICLE XII. AMENDMENTS

This Constitution may be amended at any regular session of the Association by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the delegates present.

BY-LAWS

REPRESENTATION

SECTION 1. It is requested that each church send an offering with its letter at each session.

OFFICERS

SECTION 2. The duties of the Moderator shall include presiding at the meetings of the Randall Association and the Executive Board; calling special meetings of the Executive Board when they may be necessary to the carrying out of the duties given to that Board under the provisions of the Constitution and By-Laws; appointing such committees as are created without provision for their selection; and in general, to fulfill whatever responsibilities may be commensurate with his office or delegated to him by the body.

SECTION 3. The duties of the Assistant Moderator shall include presiding at the request of, or in the absence of, the Moderator and assisting him in such ways as may be necessary.

SECTION 4. The duties of the Clerk shall include recording the proceedings of all sessions of the Association and the Executive Board and preserving an accurate record of said proceedings; preparing and causing to be published minutes of the sessions of the Association; handling such official correspondence for the Association as he may be directed; and holding in trust all documents not otherwise preserved, and surrendering same at the direction of the Association.

SECTION 5. The duties of the Treasurer shall include the holding in trust of all monies belonging to the Association and the paying out of the same as he is directed by the Association.

SECTION 6. No person shall fill more than one elected office at the same time.

SECTION 7. No officer or board member shall succeed himself more than once in the same office or on the same board.

COMMISSIONS AND COMMITTEES

SECTION 8. The following committees, consisting of three (3) members each, shall be used in the annual session of this Association:

- A. The Resolutions Committee, who shall receive and present worthwhile resolutions to the Association;
- B. The Finance Committee, who shall receive a report from the Treasurer of the Association as to the total of all monies on hand and all outstanding obligations and make recommendations to the Association as to the allocation of all said monies;
- C. The Nominating Committee, who shall nominate a candidate for every vacant office.

SECTION 9. When the Association deems it wise, committees may be constituted for a definite period of time in a specified area. The number of members of any such committee shall be determined by the assembly. Committee members shall be appointed by the Moderator unless otherwise provided by the action creating the committee; and they shall hold office for the length of time provided, or until their work is completed, or until they are released, or the successors chosen.

HONORARIA

SECTION 10. The clerk shall receive an honorarium of \$200.00 annually.

PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

SECTION 11. The meetings of the Randall Association shall be governed by the rules of parliamentary law as set forth in <u>Robert's Rules of Order</u>, except in those cases where these rules are superseded by some rule of this organization.

STANDING RULES

SECTION 12. Each of the standing boards may temporarily fill vacancies which occur in their own boards until the next session of the Randall Association.

SECTION 13. The opportunity to make nominations from the floor shall accompany each report of a nomination committee.

AMENDMENTS

SECTION 14. These By-Laws may be amended at any regular session of the association by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the delegates present.
