## PREFACE.

SCARCE any book is more generally found in the families of our happy Union than the Almanac. It gains access to every dwelling, where it is considered a useful and agreeable companion. Its yearly return is greeted with a smile, its contents perused with eagerness, and its pages very frequently consulted. It is the wise man's assistant, and the child's toy.

It is important that we choose good companions, since we are influenced by them in a greater or less degree, according to the familiarity with which they are treated, and the value placed upon them. Our books are our companions, and they should possess such a character as to exert a salutary influence on our hearts and lives. Thousands have been ruined by books of bad moral tendency, while other thousands and tens of thousands have been richly benefitted by good books. It is our duty then to use care in selecting these intimates of our leisure moments.

Probably more than two million copies of various kinds of Almanacs are annually published in the United States: how large a proportion of these are of a moral and religious character, we are unable to say. But it is known that many belong to that class of publications whose presence should be sedulously avoided, and which ought especially to be refused admission to our firesides and family circles. The reading matter of the Register is principally of a moral and religious kind; and as this little work has hitherto been patronized to a considerable extent, we hope it will now meet with a generous reception and an immediate sale.

Besides the amount of astronomical and other matter usually contained in our calendars, the Register gives a statement of Yearly and Quarterly Meetings, Churches, Preachers, &c. in the Free-will Baptist Connection, which is very valuable for reference. This department is as accurate as it could be made from the returns received; any errors therein must be attributed to want of information from the proper sources. The Register is now before the public, and

the patronage of the friends of morality and religion is solicited in its behalf. It is desirable that the denomination for whose benefit it is more particularly designed, should be well supplied.

## THE COMPILER.

DOVER, N. H., August, 1835.

The discontented man cannot be happy. He lives in a kind of restless uncertainty, doubtful what course to pursue, ever on the alert for pleasure, but seeking it in vain. Contentment is not, however, a voluntary state of mind; no discontented man can become contented when he pleases. Its foundation rests on a state of reconciliation with God. Religion is the greatest source of contentment, and without it no one can long be happy.

Time is the most sacred and valuable property which is possessed. If worldly wealth is taken from us, more may be acquired by industry; but lost time can never be regained. It is given us in such small particles, that we often regard it as of little value; but we should reflect that our happiness for eternity is depending on its proper improvement.

## PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

There are about 10,000 school districts in New England, in which schools are kept the greater part of the year; and their beneficial effects are seen in the general knowledge and intelligence which pervade the community. In order that a school may be productive of the greatest usefulness some things are necessary:—1. A comfortable and convenient school-house in the centre of the district. 2. An intelligent and well educated instructor, who loves to teach. 3. A constant attendance of the scholars, and sufficient interest on the part of the parents to see them well supplied with the right kinds of books. These requisites being obtained, there is not much reason to fear but the school will be profitable.

## RATE OF POSTAGE.

For every letter of a single sheet, conveyed not over 30 miles, six cents; over 30 miles, and not exceeding 80, ten cents; over 80 and not exceeding 150, twelve and a half cents; over 150 and not exceeding 400, eighteen and three-fourth cents; over 400, twenty-five cents. Double letters, (that is, those consisting of two pieces of paper) double rates; triple letters, triple rates; quadruple letters, quadruple rates. Every letter weighing one ounce pays quadruple rates, and so on, in proportion as the weight increases.

Newspapers, not over 100 miles, or within the State, one cent; over 100 miles, one cent and a half. Periodical magazines and pamphlets, not over 100 miles, one and a half cents per sheet; over 100 miles, two and a half cents. Magazines and pamphlets, not periodical, for any distance not over 100 miles, four cents per sheet, that is, four cents for every 4 pages folio, 8 quarto, 16 octavo, or 24 12mo., 36 18mo., 64 32 mo.; over 100 miles, six cents.

## ECLIPSES IN THE YEAR 1830.

There will be four Eclipses this year, two of the Sun and two of the Moon, in the following order:—

I. The first will be of the Moon, May 1st, in the morning, visible.

Begins 2h. 23m. } Apparent { Quantity eclipsed, 44  
Middle, 3h. 25m. } or digits on the Moon's  
End, 4h. 28m. } solar time. { south limb.

II. The second will be of the Sun, May 15th, in the morning, visible.

Begins - - - 7h. 32m.  
Greatest obscurity 8h. 42m. } Apparent time.  
Ends - - - 10h. 10m.

Quantity eclipsed, 8½ digits on the Sun's south limb.

III. The third will be of the Moon, at the time of the full in October, invisible.

IV. The fourth and last will be of the Sun, Nov. 8th, at about 9 P. M. invisible.

## MORNING AND EVENING STARS.

The planet Venus (♀) will be *Evening star* till July 25th, thence *Morning star*.

Jupiter (♃) also will be *Evening star* till July 19th, thence *Morning star*.

Mars (♂) will be *Morning star* the whole of this year.

## Different Sects of Baptists.

There are several communities of Baptists whose sentiments are similar to those of the Free-will Baptists. The Liberty Association in Kentucky have agreed to hold Q. Ms., and have opened a correspondence with us. They report 10 churches and 324 members. Increase the past year, 39. A correspondence has been opened with the Black River Yearly Meeting in N. Y. and U. C. By the minutes of their last session, it appears that they consider themselves one with the Free-will Baptists. A complete union will probably be effected at our next General Conference. They number more than 50 churches, and 4000 members. There is also another Y. M. of similar standing in N. Y. From a correspondence opened some months since by the "United Baptists" in Georgia, it appears that their sentiments are the same as ours. They have 16 churches, and 1000 members. Information has been given of a considerable number of churches of our order, which have not yet been organized into Q. Ms. There is great want of gospel laborers among them. The New Connection of General Baptists in England in 1832 numbered 114 churches, and 11990 members. They have a flourishing Academy, a Home and a Foreign Mission Society. They have seven missionary stations in India. There is also a Society of General Baptists in Wales.

#### OBITUARY.—PREACHERS.

We have received information of six of our preachers, who have been called the past year from the walls of Zion.

Eld. Hale Swett, of Bowdoin, Me., was born at Gorham, Jan. 1, 1800. He experienced religion at the age of 16, and was ordained in 1831, at the Jan. term of Bowdoin Q. M. He labored earnestly, and, we trust, to the good of many souls. For a number of years before his death, his constitution was feeble, and in Jan. 1834, he left his field of labor. Through the whole of his sickness he enjoyed a good degree of heavenly consolation, and on a near approach to death, manifested great willingness to depart. He died Aug. 8, 1834, in hope of a blessed immortality.

Eld. John Page, of Garland, Me., died Aug. 17, 1834,

in the 48th year of his age. He was born in Wentworth, N. H., but removed in early life to Gilmanton, where he received evidence of a change of heart in 1805. He commenced preaching in 1808, and was ordained at Alton in 1811. His health gradually declined for about two years, until consumption closed his mortal career. In his last moments he felt that the eternal God was his refuge.

Eld. Sylvanus Robinson, of Byron, N. Y., departed this life Aug. 19, 1834, aged 38 years. He left his native state, Vermont, in Oct. previous to his death, and soon after became pastor of the church in Byron. His labors were much blessed, so that the church and community there have suffered a deep loss. He was ever solicitous for the advancement of Christ's kingdom on earth, and now reaps his reward.

Eld. William Saunders, of Strafford, N. H., died Nov. 30, 1834, in the 72d year of his age. He experienced religion under the labors of Eld. Randal, and was a member of the F. Baptist church 42 years. He was ordained June, 1822, and soon after became pastor of the first church in Strafford. He was an exemplary, devoted and useful man.

Nathaniel Knight, of Hinesburgh, Vt. He was a licensed preacher of the Huntington Q. M. Respecting him we have received no particular information.

Eld. Frederick Fonville, of North Carolina, deceased April 21, 1835. His last sickness, which was long and lingering, he bore with Christian fortitude and resignation. He departed in the peace of the believer. May the Lord of the harvest raise up faithful laborers to receive the mantles of those who are failing through arduous labor in his service.

#### VALUE OF THE SOUL.

It is a solemn truth that each year carries 30,000,000 immortal beings into eternity, by far the greater part of whom never heard the Gospel's joyful sound. It is a solemn truth that on every side, unreconciled, unpardoned sinners are daily passing from the bounds of time and a probationary state, to that world where their destiny will be forever fixed. These truths should excite us to activity in the service of God. A brief view of the value of *one soul* may more deeply impress us on this subject.

The value of the soul is seen, first, in the provision made for its salvation. He, who was the joy of the heavenly host before the world was created, by whom all things consist, and who is worshipped by cherubim and seraphim, descended to earth, veiled himself in humanity, endured years of suffering, and finally yielded up his life in agony on the cross, to purchase the soul's redemption. The Holy Spirit reproves, invites, counsels, consoles, all for the benefit of the soul. The Gospel is preached, mercies and judgments accompany, and even angels assist in the work of converting the soul.

Again, its value is seen from reflecting on the amount of misery one lost soul will endure in the countless ages of eternity. Take the amount of suffering endured by all people that have yet lived; compute all the devastations of war, pestilence and famine, the anguish of sufferers, the pangs of the dying, the grief of surviving friends; combine the whole, and there will yet be a time in eternity when one lost soul will have suffered more than all. Yes, there will be a time when it will have suffered more than all the lost spirits in hell have yet endured. And will that lost soul's anguish then be ended? Alas, no! Eternity will be but begun!

Finally, the value of one soul is perceived by considering the amount of happiness it is capable of enjoying. There-

are supposed to be about 900,000,000 human beings on the earth at the present time; 30 years are reckoned to a generation, so that on an average 900,000,000 persons die every 30 years. How immense the number who have lived since the creation! yet there will be a time in eternity when one soul will have existed longer than all those who have ever inhabited the earth have yet lived. Now suppose that each individual of this vast multitude had been happy every moment of his life; there will be a time in eternity when one soul that is saved will have had more enjoyment than all these put together—even more than all the angels and beatified spirits have yet experienced. And yet when all this amount has been enjoyed, the happy spirit will have but just entered the fair fields of pleasure. Thereafter, while millions on millions of years revolve, the soul will still be rising from glory to glory. Well might the poet exclaim, while looking at the starry heavens,

Survey that midnight glory! worlds on worlds!  
Amazing pomp! redouble that amaze;  
Ten thousand add; add twice ten thousand more,  
Then weigh the whole; *one soul* outweighs them all.

If such is the value of the soul, what a responsibility rests upon preachers, since they are set to watch for souls as those who must give account. How zealous should Christians be, both for the conversion of their companions, and for the success of those benevolent enterprises whose object is to enlighten and save the heathen. And how great the importance that every one duly estimate the value of the soul, and make religion the great business of life.

#### IDLE CONVERSATION.

The power of speech, with all other powers and faculties, was given us for some good purpose, but scarce any one of them is so inconsiderately perverted. Almost any thing is made an excuse for engaging in vain and frivolous conversation. Does time hang heavy on our hands? this is resorted to for the purpose of giving speed to the moments. If no useful topic engages attention, a *useless* one fills the vacuum. Thus, without stopping to inquire whether something beneficial as well as entertaining may be found to employ time, men frequently suffer their precious hours to pass without benefit to themselves or others. A moment's reflection would teach

us that nothing is more needless than idle conversation. Consider what we are, with what noble capacities endowed, with what powers of thought, judgment, memory, and the like. Think of man as a social being; how numerous the cords which bind him to society; how much time must be necessarily devoted to its relations. Behold him as an active being; how much to engage his attention—all animated nature spread out before him, opening a thousand springs of enjoyment. How many calls also for his service, how much to be done in the civil, moral and religious world. With these considerations in view, will any presume to say that there is nothing to employ their time, and that they must have recourse to trifling conversation of necessity? How inconsistent with the character of man.

Nor is idle conversation a waste of time merely. If idle, it cannot be harmless; for it is a principle in morals that what is not good is evil, there being no medium. And what is the character of the idle, and as some seem to suppose, innocent conversation which so much abounds? What but a species of slander or detraction? Here, for instance, is a company, or *party*, who spend several hours together. For want of something else to entertain, they introduce the characters and circumstances of their absent neighbors, and rehearse and listen in turn to all the unfavorable rumors, surmises and conjectures which may have chanced to enter their heads or ears; and after this stock is exhausted, they separate, supposing themselves to have spent the time very pleasantly and innocently. But could they be sensible of the wounds inflicted, and the pangs felt in consequence, their gayety would be dampened. Reputation is sacred, and he who wantonly deprives an individual of a good one, injures him more than if he had taken his property, his friends, or his life. The greatest part of conversation, though not thus baleful in its effects, partakes of the spirit of slander, and should therefore be utterly avoided and discountenanced by every intelligent and sober mind. In all our conversation, it would be well to bear in mind two important passages of Scripture: Every idle word that men shall speak, they shall give account thereof in the day of judgment. By thy words thou shalt be justified, and by thy words thou shalt be condemned.
