Morning and Evening Star.

♀ will be Evening Star from the beginning of the year till May the 7th, 8h. in the evening, at which time she will be in her inferior conjunction with the Sun; then Morning Star for the remainder of the year.

ECLIPSES IN 1865.

There will be four Eclipses this year, two of the Sun and two of the Moon, in the following order:

I. The first will be of the Moon, April the 10th day, 11h. and 44m. in the evening, visible, and by calculation as follows:

The Eclipse begins at 11h. and 11m. Apparent time—Middle of the Eclipse, 11h. 53m. End, 35m. past twelve on the morning of the 11th day. The whole duration of this Eclipse will be only one hour and twenty-four minutes. The digits or about two-twelfths of the Moon's diameter will be obscured on the upper edge of the Moon.

II. The second will be of the Sun, April 25th day, 9h. 26m., apparent time in the morning, invisible in the United States.

III. The third will be of the Moon, October the 4th day, 5h. 58m. in the evening. Apparent time visible except the beginning, as follows: The Eclipse begins 5h. 4m. (23m. before the moon rises.) The moon rises 5h. 27m., with about two digits eclipsed. Middle of the eclipse, 6h. 6m. End, 7h. 10m. Whole duration, 2h. 6m. Four digits and a third of the moon's south limb will pass through the earth's shadow.

IV. The fourth and last during the year will be of the Sun, October the 19th day, 11h. 52m. in the forenoon, visible, and by calculation as follows:

Beginning of the Eclipse 9h. 21m. Middle or greatest obscurations 11h. 0m. End 12h. 30m. Duration 3h. and 10m. Digits eclipsed, 8 degrees on the Sun's south limb. Moon's latitude 29° 10' N. Asc.

OBITUARY OF PREACHERS.

Rev. CLEAVELAND B. GLIDDEN died in Gardiner, Me., May 15, 1864, after an illness of three days, aged 42. He was born in Woolwich, Me., converted in 1837 at the age of 16, and ordained in Gardiner July 5, 1855. He has since labored with 1 Gardner, West Gardner, Jefferson, Whitefield and Monmouth churches. He was pastor of the latter five years.

Rev. S. D. GARDNER died in Prospect, N. Y., May 18, 1864, in the 65th year of his age. He was a successful minister over twenty years. He commenced preaching in 1841, with the church in Sherburne, N. Y., was next pastor of the church in Columbus 7 years, where a house of worship was erected, and many added to the church. He then took the pastorate of the Plainfield church four years, and saw refreshing seasons. His last labors, which were with the church in Prospect, were greatly blessed. He left a wife and children.

Rev. ABNER C. EGGLESTON died after a short illness, in Lawrence, Mich., June 16, 1864, aged 56 years. He was born in Ulysses, N. Y. In 1836, he was licensed to preach by the church in Alabama, N. Y. About a year later, he removed to Illinois, and was ordained at a session of the Walnut Q. M. He travelled as a pioneer F. W. B. minister in S. W. Illinois, where he gathered several churches. In 1849 he removed to Van Buren Q. M., Mich., where he organized two or three churches. He left a wife and eight children.

Rev. ZACHARIAH JORDAN died at Limerick, Me., May 27, 1864. He was born in Raymond, Me. July 2, 1787. He was converted in 1809, commenced preaching in Sept., 1815, and was ordained June 10, 1818. He labored very successfully as an itinerant minister for ten years, mostly in Maine. He afterwards preached to several churches in the western and southern part of the State. In 1852 he settled in Limerick, Me., where he spent the last twelve years of his life, much of the time in a very feeble state of health. He was a minister 46 years, and, until the failure of his health, was abundant in labors, and many through him were won to Christ.

Rev. DAVID P. HARRIMAN died of consumption in Strafford, N. H., June 23, 1864. He was born in Candia, N. H. He became a Christian in early life. In 1839 he entered Bowdoin College, where he graduated in due time. In 1844 he accepted a call from the Pascoag church, in Burrillville, R. I. He was ordained in May, 1846. He was subsequently pastor of churches in Saccarappa, Me., Danielsonville, Ct., S. Berwick, Me., and Strafford Centre, N. H. He took a deep interest in the cause of education, and to the labors of a pastor added those of a teacher—a portion of the time he was at Pascoag, S. Berwick and Strafford. He was Recording Secretary of the Foreign Mission Society six years, and a member of the Executive Committee seven. He left a wife and six children.

Rev. JARED H. MINER died at his residence in Otsego, Steuben Co., Ia., of typhoid fever, May 24, 1863, in the 68th year of his age. He was born in N. Canaan, N. Y. He was converted at the age of eighteen and four years later began to labor in the vineyard. In 1824 he was licensed by the Methodists. The next year he joined the F. W. Baptists and in 1829 was ordained. He labored successfully for several years in Sheldon, N. Y., and the adjacent towns. His next field was northern Indiana and southern Michigan, where many were converted and churches gathered under his ministry.

Rev. ABIEZER BRIDGES died of hemorrhage of the lungs, at Monticello, Wis., May 26, 1863, in the eightieth year of his age. He labored much in Maine, and for many years was one of our most successful ministers. He left a wife, with whom he had lived fifty-nine years, also six children, one of whom is in the ministry.

Rev. AVERY CLARK fell in battle Sept. 3, 1863, at White Stone hill, west of Sioux City, aged nearly 45. He was born in Springfield, Mass. He settled in Iowa in 1846. In 1849 he was converted, in 1854 was licensed, and in May, 1856, was ordained at a session of the Delaware and Clayton Q. M. Jan. 1, 1863, he gave himself to his country in fulfilment of a pledge he had made to do so in case the President would free the slaves. While with his regiment he was often found doing the work of a minister. He has left a wife and six children.

Rev. JACOB WM. NICHOLS died in Effingham of dropsy, Nov. 16, 1863, aged about 40 years. He was converted at the age of sixteen. In 1857 he was licensed by the Wolfboro' Q. M., and in 1858 ordained. His labors were mostly with the Effingham churches. He left a wife and five children.

Rev. JESSE BURNHAM died in Janesville, Wis., Dec. 5, 1863, in the 86th year of his age. He was born in Lee, N. H. He was converted in early life, and in 1806 moved into the forests of Maine, where he commenced the work of the ministry. In 1841, he removed to Wis., and labored successfully on the prairies of Ill. and Wis. In 1841, with the assistance of Rev. R. Cheney, he organized the 1st. F. W. Baptist Quarterly Meeting in Wisconsin. He left an aged widow.

Rev. JONATHAN TRACY died in Wales, Me., Jan. 22, 1864, in the 82d year of his age. He was born in the town of Durham, Me.—was converted at the age of sixteen—commenced preaching soon afterwards—was ordained Feb. 24, 1828. He travelled and preached extensively in Maine and N. H., revivals everywhere following his labors. He embodied several churches, and assisted in the ordination of a great many ministers.

Rev. JOSEPH STINSON died of consumption in Pittsfield, Me., Feb. 27, 1864, in his 67th year. He was born in Bowdoin, Me.—convert-

ed in 1838, and ordained March 1842, by a committee from the Bowdoin Q. M. Two years later, he united with the Pittsfield church, Exeter Q. M., which connection was only severed by his death. He left a wife and five children.

Rev. ALLEN FILES died in Benton, Me., March 20, 1864, aged 73 years. He was converted in Gorham, Me., and soon after commenced preaching as an itinerant. He was ordained in Lincolnville, and was afterwards pastor of the church in Topsham 5 years. He spent about 50 years in the ministry.

Rev. E. C. WILLEY died of consumption of the blood, in Lawrence, Mass., April 6, 1864, in his fifty-ninth year. He was born in Bartlett, N. H.—was converted at the age of eighteen—licensed in 1834—ordained in 1837 by a committee from Sandwich Q. M. He was settled over the following churches in succession:—First, second and third Eaton, Albany, N. H., and Bridgton, Me., besides laboring as an itinerant. He died in triumph, saying, "All is bright—not a cloud to be seen—Jesus is mine and I am his."

Rev. JOSEPH BRYANT died at the residence of his son in Sanford, Pa., April 29, 1864, aged 66 years, after an illness of two weeks. He was born in Vermont—converted at the age of twelve—ordained in Jackson, Pa., June 19, 1831, and sustained the pastoral relation to the church in that place sixteen years. He labored principally within the limits of the Gibson Q. M.
