ECLIPSES IN 1885.

In the year 1885 there will be two eclipses of the Sun and two of the Moon.

I. An annular eclipse of the Sun, March 16, which will be visible as a partial eclipse throughout North America, the annular phase being only visible in California and the Northwestern territories, then passing into British America and ending near the Eastern coast of Greenland. For Boston, the partial phase begins at 0h., 20m. P. M., and ends at 2h., 56m. P. M.

II. A partial eclipse of the Moon, March 30, invisible in the United States.

III. A total eclipse of the Sun, Sept. 8, invisible in the United States, but visible in the South Pacific Ocean.

IV. A partial eclipse of the moon, Sept. 24. The phases for Boston are as follows:

Beginning of eclipse, 1h., 15m. A. M. Middle of eclipse, 2h., 48m. A. M. End of eclipse, 4h., 22m. A. M.

EXPLANATION.

In previous *Registers* the computations have naturally been expressed in local time, this being practically the same for any phenomenon for places in the same latitude.

The introduction of the new time system, however, demands a change, so that a table of corrections becomes necessary, as given below.

The calendar quantities are for the meridian and latitude of Boston, expressed in the present time system. For the other places, given in the table below, add to or subtract from the calendar times, as expressed in said table.

For places not in table, find the correction from the place nearest in longitude to the one in question, and apply this. A still closer result would be obtained by finding two places in the table, one a little east and the other a little west, and estimating the correction between.

Each person had better mark on the margin of his *Register* the addition or subtraction for his own locality, and apply this correction whenever he looks for the time of any event.

The Eastern time belt ends, and the Central begins, near the western borders of New York and Pennsylvania.

For places still using the old local time, no use is to be made of this table, but 16 minutes are invariably to be added to the *Register* time.

These, added to our own members, make some 169,249 members of similar faith with our own.

The Disciples are a numerous people, not very far removed from us on many points of doctrine and practice, with an increasing tendency in both bodies to fraternize.

REPORTS

OF THE

FOREIGN MISSION SOCIETY.

CORRESPONDING SECRETARY'S REPORT.

Our Foreign Mission year has been characterized by struggle both at home and in the field—in the field to meet the great demand with the supplies afforded—at home to awaken interest, secure means and workers for the field; but struggle under the hand of the master means progress. In many respects the progress has been most cheering. In the field we find some evidences of real growth and prosperity. Church contributions from the native members have increased. The idea of church independence is gaining ground. The natives more cheerfully consecrate their tithes to the Lord and are becoming more willing to take the responsibilities of church management and work. There has been a small increase in church membership. Interest in the Gospel and in schools is constantly growing and the workers say that sometimes it seems as though a mighty revival is at hand. In many parts of the field they say, "If we had more means and more men we could secure better results in the fields, which seem already ripe for the harvest."

Some of our workers have been obliged to leave the field for rest and recuperation, but we rejoice in being able to send Bro. and Sister George, who sail immediately to take some of these places. New Brunswick is seeking some one to fill the place of Miss Hooper. Wisconsin Meeting is preparing to support another man and possibly his wife. The interest is by no means waning, but we need care and prayer to keep it in the right channels and not check it.

Dr's. Cheney and Bachelor who visited the convention held by the Church of God in Wooster, Ohio, report that these brethren are organizing for Foreign Mission work. They were invited to cooperate with us and we have reasons to hope that they will do so. The success of our Treasurer has far surpassed our highest expectations at the beginning of the year. The debt of the Society at the opening of the year was as follows: deficit for current work, \$1108.16; to the permanent fund \$5,680.00; Bible school \$500.00; total \$7,288.16. The deficit and debt have been paid in full, \$6,788.16, and all the current expenses. The debt of \$500 to the Bible school still remains. We

have reason for greatest gratitude to God for this success. May we have equal success in the coming year. The time has come when in justice to those within our field in India we more fully occupy it. We ought to send at least four new men and their wives to India next year and raise the means necessary to support them. Forgetting these things which are behind and reaching forth unto those things which are before, let us press toward the evangelization of India.

ABSTRACT FROM THE INDIA REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDING MARCH, 1884.

CHANGES IN THE FIELD.

In July, Dr. Bachelier, accompanied by his wife and daughter, left the field for their well-deserved and much-needed rest at home. At the close of the cold season Mrs. J. L. Phillips with four children and Miss Hooper left the field for America; all of them greatly needing a change of climate.

Mrs. H. C. Phillips and Miss N. M. Phillips have been temporarily transferred from Dantoon to Santipore, where a large Christian community demanded their aid. The general health of the missionaries has been fair. Jellasore Patna has suffered more than any other station from malarial fever, but there has been an improvement toward the end of the year.

Rev. Z. F. Griffin and wife arrived early in January. Bro. Griffin takes charge of the mission press while learning the language. Mrs. Griffin, formerly known as Libbey Cilley, and for three years a missionary in Midnapore, engages in zenana work.

THE CHURCHES.

The chief feature of the year in the native churches has been the development of native agency in their care and extension.

In lieu of the policy of former years, which made the missionary responsible for instruction, discipline and enlargement of the native church, the aim has been to have the churches share in this responsibility. The mission committee at a recent meeting decided to leave no stone unturned in promoting the independence and native strength of these Oriya, Bengali, and Santal churches. The report gives promise of a brighter future as a result.

Balasore Church. Mr. Coldren sends the following from Solomon Nayak: "The past year has been a year of blessing to the Balasore church. With a few exceptions the members have worked with zeal. Special meetings continuing eleven days and managed entirely by the native brethren were well attended throughout and blest with an outpouring of the Holy Spirit. This was followed by an inquiry meeting where eleven offered themselves as inquirers and five were baptized and received to the church."

Regular preaching service has been well attended but prayer-meetings somewhat neglected. The church has suffered the loss of two sisters and one brother by death; one sister willed her property, about eighty rupees, to the church. When Mr. Coldren is away on Sabbath evenings, Miss Phillips conducts Bible readings. A temperance society meets every alternate Friday evening. The Sunday-school is doing well under Saul Najak, attendance and interest increases. Any donations towards a Sunday-school paper will be gladly received. There are some in the church whose bad lives tend to lead astray the young and weak, disunion keeps some from communion; prayers are asked for these. The Metrapore branch entertained the Quarterly Meeting for the first time in March. Two baptized during the meeting. The chapel repairs are drawing hard

on the members; each one is giving one month's wages toward the work. Thanks are returned for help."

Jellasore Church. Mr. Coldren says: "The church finds a valuable help and counselor in Mrs. Smith, who has principal charge here. More growth is noted than in former year. They have repaired their chapel; send out a colporteur during the cold season; help support their poor and aged. Some cases of discipline. Meetings fairly attended. Sunday-school encouraging."

Santipore Church. He says: "It is much encouraged by the location of Mrs. and Miss Phillips here. As a result of special meetings last fall, ten were baptized and united with the church, five other candidates are waiting. One of those received and one now waiting are Hindus. The Sunday-school has greatly increased; last year there were eighty-six scholars; this year there are one hundred and fifty-two; mostly due to the efforts of Miss Nellie Phillips."

Midnapore Church. Dr. Phillips says: "Since Dr. Bachelier's departure Jacob Mishra has been the pastor. Important changes have given cheering results. The early morning is devoted to a prayer-meeting of half an hour, followed by Sunday-school. The church, Sunday-school and industrial school Sunday-school are held together at the chapel and at the same hour Sunday-school in connection with the ragged schools in bazars and villages. The Bible school students have rendered valuable aid in this direction. The preaching service held in the afternoon has been well attended. Preparatory lectures before Communion have been revived, a record of attendance upon covenant meetings and preparatory lectures have been kept with good effect. Miss Miller has rendered important aid in conducting the class meeting. Miss Coombs has aided much in the Sunday-school. The native pastor Jacob Mishra says: "Fast day in September was a great blessing to the church, also the special revival service held in December. The members are doing better toward pastoral support."

Bhimpore Church. Mr. Burkholder says: "The past year has been one of steady, uninterrupted work. India church work, when faithfully performed, meets with as good results as at home; fruit already begins to appear. In the churches of Bengal and Orissa things have taken a stereotyped condition which nothing but an outpouring of the Holy Spirit can change. We need a genuine revival. The tithe system is gaining ground. We are fully convinced that by this system only can be ushered in the day of independence of the church in India. The church subscription, aside from foreign aid last year was more than twice enough to pay for repairs and lights. The Sunday-school has been carried on regularly, native Christians taking the burden. The branch church at Gadhalata has had preaching and Sunday-school quite regularly during the year. Whole number of Sunday-school scholars, two hundred fifty; average, one hundred and twenty-four, not including the jungle schools."

Palasbani Church. Dr. Phillips says: "The year has been one of slow and steady progress. The lay preacher has been obstructed in his work by his fidelity to his pipe, which often stupefies him. There have been three baptisms, one candidate a teacher; he is greatly persecuted by his Hindu wife. Sunday-school regularly sustained. Help of American friends for this church and that of Babaigadia has enabled us to carry on the work. We are grateful for this."

Babaigadia Church. He says: "A native pastor has charge here. The regular services have been maintained, the Sunday-school kept up better than formerly. Very grateful for Mr. Ward's help. The native pastor reports that the condition of the church in some respects seems to be improving; regular preaching and Sunday-school has a good effect."

Dantoon Church. Dr. Phillips says: "Mrs. and Miss Phillips left here in February for Santipore. Samuel Sing, a Bible school student and member of this church, has died. The greater part of the church is at Dainmari where the pastor finds ample work, though he regularly visits Babaigadia and Dantoon. He reports: 'Last year I was here for two months only. I preached in the villages, markets and fairs; the people listened attentively. A mission school has been established with a Hindu pundit for want of a Christian teacher. The work at the Dainmari church is pleasant. Two baptized; Sunday-school regularly attended;

some of these people pay a part of my salary. The presence of Dr. and Mrs. Phillips last January encouraged the members."

Dr. Phillips further says: "The plan of placing one native brother over these two churches is concurred in by all the members. Special thanks to friends in New Brunswick and Rhode Island for timely aid. Prayers are asked."

SCHOOLS.

The schools have been carried on vigorously and with cheering results; previously the schools were provided chiefly for the children of native Christians, now they are extended to children of the heathen, especially to those of the poorer classes. The Santal village and ragged schools are supplying rudimentary knowledge to an ever increasing number of the children of the poor. Government grants in aid and gifts of benevolent friends are gratefully acknowledged. The poor must look to the missionary schools.

Balasore Boys' School. Mr. Coldren says: "Saul Nayak as head teacher is doing good and energetic work. The second and third teachers are Hindus; more Hindu than Christian pupils. Out of three sent up to the government examinations two passed. Caste is manifest among the pupils, but high caste Hindus don't object to sitting with Christians even if their parents were low caste before becoming Christians. The school is exerting a good influence."

Metrapore. Mr. Coldren says: "It had been closed two years for want of money. During the year we had a teacher. A branch of the Balasore church being here, there are a number of Christian girls and boys who need the school. Three boys and two girls passed the government examination, for which their efficient teacher received eight rupees as a reward. Two girls giving evidence of conversion were baptized the first Sabbath in March."

Jellasore Girls' Orphanage is reported under head of woman's work.

Santipore School. Mr. Coldren says: "Here the attendance is better; the children are more heartily interested. Difficult to get Santal children to the school, the parents have no interest. Christian parents do better. Hiram Curtis, the teacher, is much liked by the children. On account of the revival of the work in Santipore the prospect of the school looks brighter."

Dantoon. The primary school has been kept up with fair progress.

Babaigadia. Miss Miller has charge. The Bible school students occasionally visit this school.

Palasbani. The lay preacher in charge has done fairly; some of his pupils acquitted themselves admirably at the examinations. This is a morning school.

Bhimpore. Of the Santal training school Mr. Burkholder says: "Endeavored to raise the standard of the school to the same level with the government schools in the course of study. Pundit and scholars have worked with new zeal to pass the regular government examination. Last year we had sixty-six boys and twenty girls; this year seventy boys and thirty-four girls. Different branches of work have been of benefit to both boys and girls. Thanks to our friends for subscriptions and prayers; we ask an increase of both."

Jungle Schools. Mr. Burkholder reports: "They have augmented both in number of schools and scholars. March 31st we had sixty-three schools and one thousand four hundred and eighty-seven scholars. Education for girls gains in favor, which means much for the future home and consequently future government of India. We have more calls for schools than our resources permit us to heed. God speed the day when we shall have more of laborers and means."

ABSTRACT OF FIFTH ANNUAL REPORT OF MIDNAPORE BIBLE SCHOOL.

Another pleasant year of study. The chief book has been the blessed word of God. The work has been sweet and inspiring. The classes have been less broken than in former years by illness. We have studied the gospel in the Pentateuch, the Psalms and the prophecies, the glorious gospel of Christ in the Old Testament.

The Men. There are nineteen in the school, all but one married, three of them new men and promising.

School Work. The senior middle class has studied with Dr. Phillips the historical books of the Old Testament, church history and homiletics; and with the Pundits, English and Sanscrit. The school met a severe loss in the death of the head pundit, who died suddenly of cholera; he was efficient and popular. The other pundits have worked admirably.

Afternoon Schools for wives of the men have been well sustained. Mrs. Phillips aided by Miss Coombs during the last three months of the session had charge. Besides the wives of Bible school students, zenana teachers and those employed in ragged schools have attended. Interest in study has increased. A competent tailor has been employed to teach the women how to cut and make garments.

General Exercises. The Tuesday evening lectures have been continued. Plain talks on practical themes such as Temperance, Native Helpers, The Blue Ribbon, The Family Altar, Veracity and Fruit of Christian Effort. The men have manifested much interest. Three lectures on easy points in Astronomy given, bringing into use the beautiful telescope presented by R. L. Allen, Esq., of Providence, R. I. It is of great service and hearty thanks are returned to Mr. Allen for his timely gift, which will be of increasing interest. Dr. Bachelor officiated as principal during the week of the "Believer's Convention" in Calcutta, and lectured on Anatomy, Physiology and Health. This was thoroughly appreciated. Bengali, English and Santal services regularly conducted on the Sabbath. Three of the men have occasionally conducted Bengali services at the chapel. The Santal students took charge of Santal services by turn. A new feature has been a Wednesday evening discourse, a special preaching service for advanced students conducted in Bengali or Oriya.

Work. Evangelistic labors in the town and neighboring villages continued. Several men have regularly accompanied the preachers to the bazar and rendered aid, others expounded the Scriptures to Bengalese and Santals near the town, others labored from house to house. On alternate Sundays they have gone out two and two and conducted Sabbath and Sabbath school service. In town worked in Sabbath school. During vacation they have gone on evangelistic tours through the Balasore and Midnapore districts. Again we thank generous friends for their help. The regular remittance has been a comfort and blessing. The donations for Memorial Hall are opportune. Our work would be done better with a hall and recitation rooms.

WOMAN'S WORK.

The larger part of this work is educational. It is hoped ere long to have trained native women as well as men for the increasing school-work. The gospel in Bengal proves a great incentive to female education.

Balasore Girls' School. Miss Ida Phillips writes: "The year has been full of changes. Personally I have enjoyed a good degree of health. We have eight schools for Hindu girls and one for the daughters of native Christians. The present number of pupils two hundred and twenty seven, much larger than last year. The work has been good. Thirteen children passed the primary scholarship examinations. The majority of those who passed are married, the others will be soon. Yet hardly any of them are over twelve years of age and several of them have been married for two years or more. Let our efforts be untiring until this practice of child marriage is overcome. These girls will carry with them a decided knowledge of the one God, and of the Saviour who died for us all. Susana has been the most successful among our Christian school teachers. Badui also proved herself very faithful. Several calls for new schools, but our funds are too low; at the year's close we are sixty rupees in debt. In the school for native Christian children, the attendance and results are better than in any previous year. Two girls have completed their course of study. The course includes reading, writing, spelling, arithmetic, geography, history of Orissa, primers of science, and sanitary primer, besides sewing, cutting, knitting and darning.

"I have devoted considerable time to what I call my family, five boys and one girl picked up here and there; a house has been built for them in the mission compound. The boys sew fairly well and make very good domestic help; they make fair progress in school. We return thanks for contributions."

Balasore Zenanas. Miss Hattie Phillips reports no striking events or radical changes. Number of zenana pupils have averaged about sixty-five; teachers seven. Objections to enlarging the work is a lack of funds, a lack of suitable teachers and lack of physical strength on my part. Expenses have been and must continue to be heavier than usual, as several of our conveyances and implements have got past use and need replacing. Among zenana women there has been an increase of thoughtfulness and interest; in two houses I have been invited to pray.

Special effort is made to have pupils pay for their instruction. Some are too poor, at best the fees are small, but the principle involved does good. For the past four months the sewing class has averaged twenty-one. Hope to bring to next Yearly Meeting samples of work to compete for a prize.

Two comfortable and convenient schoolrooms have been fitted up in the back part of the chapel with special funds contributed by personal friends. The rooms need a half dozen wall maps, a globe, a clock, a bell, two tables and chairs. Mrs. Coldren says: "The English Sunday-school has been reduced to one class by removals of the parents. The woman's prayer-meeting is a very important element in our Christian community. Since January we have held them from house to house and thereby increased attendance. Pray especially for these meetings."

Jellasore Girls' Orphanage. Mrs. Smith says: "Miss Folsom was called to another field soon after our last report. She had done good work. In July Miss Hooper came to work among the women and children. In August a bad type of fever broke out with violence and caused us to suspend all regular work to attend to the sick. Miss Hooper took the fever in severe form, at one time she seemed in a hopeless condition, but God graciously spared her. Our thanks are due the magistrate of Balasore, and other English residents, as well as to the mission family for their kindness in this time of need. The 1st of November we came back home to find everything changed. In October Miss Hooper left for Darjuling, in November she returned improved. We hoped the coming season would fully restore her, but were disappointed; in February she was obliged to return to her home. Very little interruption since December. The Orphanage now has seventeen inmates. In July we had the painful task of expelling one of the oldest girls. Two little ones died of fever. Interest increases in lessons and needle-work. Two have been baptized. Ninety children connected with the day school. Work and study are combined and progress has been made, notwithstanding long continued sickness. The village school has suffered from lack of teachers and superintendence; there was no one to take Miss Hooper's place. Three Bible women and one zenana teacher are busy at work. The Bible women are supported with funds from England. Thanks are due old friends and new ones in America for help. The Sunday-school has increased to one hundred and twenty-six, many more have been connected with the school during the year."

Santipore and Dantoon. Mrs. H. C. Phillips says: "Truly mercy and goodness have followed us through the swiftly passing year. About twenty children gathered into our veranda and a Brahmin was employed to teach them. To the patients who came for physical treatment I have tried to bring some idea of the Great Physician. In December spent two weeks in vicinity of Mahanpore accompanied by three native workers. Madhu Nayak has been employed to do pastoral visiting and preach in the markets." Miss N. M. Phillips reports: "The study of the language occupies much of my time and will for a year to come. Frequent changes have demanded corresponding changes in vocabulary. Dispensary work has been kept up, the number of patients has decreased, but is sufficient to pay expenses. Zenana work has suffered from our occasional absence. Whole number of pupils has been fifteen, some of them unusually bright and interesting. Here in Santipore the chief work will be among native Christians, with reference to self-support, management of their own church, Sunday-school, etc. We shall attempt to visit Dantoon often."

Midnapore. The Zenanas. Mrs. Griffin says: "Praise to Him who has given

us the glad privilege of returning again to the land and work that we love. We reached Midnapore Jan. 3, 1884, and Feb. 1st took charge of the zenana work. Number of pupils at close of the year one hundred and sixty-four, taught in seventy-five different houses. Fourteen women were employed in teaching, nine of them adopted by auxiliaries and individuals in America. The support of three others has been promised by the Central Association. Religious instruction is given in all the houses where we teach but we need women to read, sing, and pray in those homes. With fervent thanks, receipts are acknowledged for sufficient funds to add four to the number of zenana teachers and engage two Bible women. We enter upon the new year hopefully."

Industrial School. Miss Coombs says: "Beginning with one poor little girl, the daughter of a leper, taught by Mrs. Phillips in her own room, it has grown to nearly one hundred, more than twenty of them girls, a regular course of study, three departments of work and a house of its own. Sewing, making rope and carpentry are taught. A complete set of carpenter's tools would help us. So far we have found sale for our products. We have lately procured a head pundit able to teach English and extend the course to middle English. The Christian village primary school was united with this last August and we have now twenty-five children of native Christians. The native pastor of Midnapore church teaches the Bible one and a half hours each day to older ones and catechism to the younger ones. It has united with the church a Sunday-school, which is held in the morning and numbers one hundred and thirty-two. We miss Mrs. Phillips greatly. We pray that interest may increase in the industrial school."

Ragged Schools. Miss Miller says: "The records of the past year fill our hearts with love and gratitude for the many evidences that our labor has not been in vain. The number of schools and pupils have increased. We have three in Dainmari, three in Babaigadia, three in Palirbani, and the remainder in Midnapore. Some of Dr. Phillip's Bible students visit the schools in Dainmari and Babaigadia and they bring good reports. In one of my schools I recently found eight little girls under ten years married. The Sunday-school is doing those children much good. We gratefully acknowledge subscriptions for the ragged schools, and hope that they will be continued."

Bhimporz. Mrs. Burkholder says: "Our village school and household instruction have been kept up. We have started a sewing society. The girl's department of the training school has increased. Whole number of girls in attendance forty-nine, forty-two boys also have attended. A special effort is made to prepare the girls for government examinations."

MEDICAL WORK.

The Midnapore Dispensary. Dr. Phillips writes: "From the pressure of other duties, I have often been obliged to send some patients to the government charitable dispensary. The general health of the station has been remarkably good. Only a little has been done in camp this year, but that I trust has been a comfort to some. The dispensary should be a thoroughly missionary agency."

ENGLISH WORK.

Midnapore. Dr. Phillips writes: "More encouragement here this year than ever before. Attendance has increased. We greatly need a hall to hold the congregation. Probably not less than two or three hundred Hindus and Mohomedans in this city understand English. During the last three months Mr. Griffin has aided much in the work. When at the station I have devoted two hours of the Sabbath to visiting the babus; it has seemed profitable."

Balasore. Mr. Coldren says: "I have kept up English service at my house during the year when not away in other work. The attendance has been smaller than it should have been."

THE MISSION PRESS.

Dr. Phillips writes: "The care of this fell to me after Dr. Bachelor's departure for America. For six months I kept the accounts and superintended the printing as best I could with my other duties. Mr. Griffin took charge immediately upon his arrival. The press should be made more directly a missionary agency, with a man to devote his strength to it.

Mr. Griffin reports: "The people must be able to read and have something to read. We aim especially to reach the children. Tract work should be an important part of the work. We need more funds."

PREACHING TO THE HEATHEN.

Balasore District Work. Mr. Coldren reports: "My field is so large, I sent Kamal Nayak with a number of Bible school students to the north part of the district, while I with others went to the south. The work becomes more and more interesting. Native preachers say they never saw such marked evidence of the speedy coming of Christ's Kingdom as during this cold season. The southern part of the district is especially promising. It is time that we do more for this part of the field."

Midnapore Bazar Work. Dr. Phillips writes: "The native preachers have attended to this since Dr. Bachelor's departure. The pastor of the Midnapore church, assisted by the Bible school students, has preached faithfully almost every evening. The Santal students have carried the word of life to several settlements of Santals in the town."

Midnapore District Work. Mr. Burkholder says: "Though not able to spend the entire cold season in district work, we visited our branch church and a new interest, where there is considerable interest. We have found this work profitable both to the missionaries and to the people. In the Balasore district we have a population of 942,421, in the Midnapore 2,514,672 for the first district we have one man, the second three. *Could words add more?*"

Dr. Phillips writes: "Personally I have done only about a month's district work. The Bible school students have done a good deal, at Dainmari the people have received our message with especial interest.

"Chandra Lilavati, the Nepalese Brahmin widow, converted in 1871, is one of the most earnest, faithful and successful Bible women. India's evangelization depends upon genuine, earnest, native agency more than all foreign men and methods combined."

REPORTS

OF THE HOME MISSION SOCIETY.

SECRETARY'S REPORT.

Self-preservation demands that the work of this society be enlarged and pressed with vigor. If we deem ourselves worthy of a full and joyous existence, the privilege to attain it is freely offered us. The fields for operation are numerous and inviting and promise an abundant fruitage. Grasping firmly as we do the grand truths of the Bible, seeking through them the blessings of a deep interior and spiritual life and cutting loose from the imposed limitations of men, we are able to present the claims of the Gospel to the world in a forcible and attractive manner and the blessing of Heaven has followed whenever and wherever we have done it faithfully and in the Master's name. With the Macedonian cry ringing in our ears, with heaven's benedictions waiting to be bestowed on Zion's faithful workmen and with the brain power and the heart power and the financial ability we possess, we shall, if true to our calling, move gloriously on. *We have been moving on.* The proofs are as clear as sunlight that our momentum is increasing. We are undertaking more work to-day than in former years and the work is assuming more potent and permanent characteristics than heretofore. The centers of influence are being taken possession of and are becoming to us the centers of missionary operations. Strong churches are being planted in our cities and large towns and from them the work is to be pushed into the regions beyond. Thousands of our young people have gone in the past from their country homes and churches to be lost to us as a people for the reason that when they went to the city they could not find the people of their choice and have sought homes in other folds. This mistake is being corrected in old fields and in new fields the work is commenced on the basis of securing the central influence first and planting feeders in the suburbs and contiguous rural districts afterwards. On this plan Lowell, Mass., has already three flourishing churches and in Providence, R. I., eight meeting-houses and seven churches are so located that their people can drink the city water and be lighted by the city gas and ride from one to another on the city horse cars. Minneapolis, Minn., has followed in

this work. Her second church is already completed and we expect soon to hear of the commencement of the third.

The brethren in Iowa and Nebraska are planning their work on this basis and we have reason to expect similar fruits as they shall develop in the future. California is offering us choice fields in her largest cities if we will but send some strong, earnest men to occupy pulpits already built and will build others when acceptable occupants are at hand. Florida is being settled by men from the North, there are communities already there the majority of whose people are Free Baptists. A Quarterly Meeting can be formed within a year if this society is able to give proper encouragement. The glorious work among the colored people still goes on. Rev. J. S. Manning has rendered efficient service in the Cairo Mission. Storer College is still sending forth the streams of sanctified culture which are affecting the civilization of hundreds of communities, fitting thousands to bear the honors and responsibilities of citizenship in this Republic, and opening the eyes of many to behold the truths of the Gospel in a much clearer light than ever before, so they are able to apply themselves understandingly to the practical duties of life. Another point of interest has appeared in the state of West Virginia during the past year and a half. Rev. John E. Cox, a brother raised among the General Baptists of the West, has been laboring with us in the Kanawha valley with remarkable success. Some fourteen churches have been formed with several hundred members. A church edifice has been built at Charleston, the future capital of the State, and the building of several others is contemplated. Bro. Cox is a live man and with the Estep brothers is doing a live work in the valley and among the surrounding mountains. Vermont has been rallying around her two institutions of learning giving them new life, and the labor therefor has strengthened and bound her churches together.

Maine is still moving on. The church at Portland has purchased a good church edifice at the west end of the city and the propriety of starting a mission at the east end will be seen soon. Saco has built a commodious house in a good locality. The Central Association by its reports has shown signs of vigorous activity. The Boston church has reached that point in its history where the raising of \$3,200 by this society to complete the \$10,000 we proposed to try to raise at Great Falls two years ago will make the amount raised for that interest \$30,000 and thus secure the settlement of several matters connected with it which have been held sometime in suspense. We see no reason why this should not be fully accomplished during the next three months. Thus all along the lines of our Zion opportunities are numerous and the brethren are waking up, siezing and utilizing them. We have occasion to thank God and take courage. To bring all the tithes and offerings into the storehouse and prove the Lord therewith, remembering his acknowledgment, "Inasmuch as ye have done it unto the least of these my brethren ye have done it unto me."

CHURCH EXTENSION.

The board at its meeting at Minneapolis in 1883 directed its Subcommittee to make arrangements for the establishment of a church extension department. Accordingly in the month of April this year the Treasurer was directed to open a department for that purpose with two divisions; one to be known as the loan department for the reception of funds to loan churches for building purposes for a term of years, without interest, on security, and the other to be known as the gift department for the reception of funds to be given to struggling interests while building church edifices according to the discretion of the Board. In case the donors do not specify to which department their donations are made the Board shall designate. The churches throughout the denomination were asked through a communication in the *Star and Free Baptist* and by circulars sent the several pastors to take up a collection for this purpose on or near the first Sabbath in May. These collections so far as heard from amounted to \$210. The first church in Minneapolis leading in the work, their collection being upwards of \$13.00

REPORTS

OF THE

EDUCATION SOCIETY.

CORRESPONDING SECRETARY'S REPORT.

Your Secretary has received reports from a few of our schools. It is to be regretted that no statistics have been received from the West. The Society has afforded aid during the year to thirteen students in the Theological department at Bates; two in the college; one in Nichols Latin School; one at New Hampton, and four at Storer College. The amount appropriated to these was \$1,119.00. The distribution was on the basis of \$90.00 to each theological student in school all the time, one half as much to college students, one fourth to seniors in preparatory courses and one-eighth to those in middle classes. This amount, per student, is larger than for some years, although the amount of funds was much less. This was owing to the fact that a larger number than usual made no application for aid.

It is safe to assume that there are in our various schools over one hundred who have the ministry in view. Now what is the duty of this Society and its friends to these young men and the scores of others whom the Spirit is prompting to enter upon this work?

It would be desirable to give our students, who are preparing for the ministry, as much financial aid as such students in other denominations receive, but in view of the urgent need of increased facilities in the schools, and other demands upon the beneficence of our people, I speak safely when I say these young men will be in hearty accord with a fixed plan to aid the theological students \$100 per year, for the present, and moreover that several of them will be able and willing to do without the aid. It is of vital importance that the Society say and all understand that students will be aided a definite sum if they need it. One of the things we must do is to fix this amount on the basis of \$100 per year for theological students. Fixing this amount and then sacredly meeting it will not only be very much better for those in school than an uncertain sum but it will, if possible, be more helpful to those who are questioning how they can meet their obligations if they enter upon a course of study. So far as the question of beneficiary aid is concerned this is a standard unto which we can attain. Then we may

hope to appeal more successfully to our people for additional funds to increase the facilities in the schools.

A movement of no little significance has been set on foot by the theological students at Lewiston. They are thoroughly in earnest and with their divine qualification what shall withstand more than twenty young men? They intend that an increased number of recruits shall be secured to fill and enlarge the ranks of the Free Baptist ministry. They are already in correspondence with the most of the pastors in New England. They ask and urge these pastors to hold special services in reference to the need of men, praying for them and helping them into the schools. They purpose to get into communication with all the young men and boys in New England who are even willing to consider the subject of entering the ministry. It is hoped that all pastors will see the propriety of co-operating heartily in this movement.

It is very important that effective measures be taken at once to raise funds to pay the Lyndon note of \$5,000. Only \$200 have thus far been raised to meet the principal. There must be a revival of agitation and consequent interest in reference to the work and needs of this Society. God will bless us if we undertake large things with large faith.

It is a mistake for this Society to stand one side for other important interests. All other interests will be best subserved by pushing vigorously the work of this Society. We can hardly more directly aid our missionary societies in their work than by doing what we can to provide qualified men for the ministry.

SUNDAY-SCHOOL UNION.

ABSTRACT FROM THE SECRETARY'S REPORT, REV. H. F. WOOD.

This report is necessarily incomplete as so few, comparatively, of our schools respond to the request to render a report. But probably those which have reported may be taken as a fair sample of those which have not. So we may judge from the reports we have received what the result might have been could we have obtained reports from the entire field. Two hundred and twenty-eight schools have reported giving an aggregate membership of 25,915. Average membership of the schools, 113. The number of conversions reported, nine hundred and seventy-five. The two schools report 75 conversions each, and two report 50 each. Others that have had any conversion report as a rule from 1 to 20. Most of the schools report themselves as fairly furnished with libraries and Sunday-school papers, while some are lacking in these and urgently call to us for help. The observance of one day at least in the year as "Children's Day" is gradually becoming more general with our people, which is doing much to awaken a deeper interest among the young in the preaching services as well as in the Sunday-school. Our Quarterlies, Lesson Leaves and Sunday-school Papers have made quite an encouraging gain in circulation during the year. Our own Sunday-school publications compare favorably with others in matter, mechanical execution and in price. And so we think they should find a place in all our schools. If they are not now altogether what we think they ought to be let us remember that a wider circulation and a more generous patronage will help furnish the funds needed to make them better.

But more has been gathered concerning the condition of our schools than these reports would indicate. In response to a circular letter sent to clerks of Quarterly and Yearly Meetings and Associations asking for a statement of the general condition and needs of the Sunday-school work in their respective bodies, quite a good many reports have been received, and from nearly all parts of the field. From these we gather many encouraging things, among which may be named the following:—

1. Our people are coming to recognize more fully the importance of this work, and so it is occupying a larger place in the church and in the hearts of the people.
2. The numbers of both old and young engaging in the work are larger than ever before and steadily increasing.
3. Our people are coming to feel more and more that the primary object of Sunday-school work is to lead the unsaved to Christ; and the fruit is seen in the increasing number of conversions reported from year to year.

The reports indicate plainly the pressing needs of the work, some of which are these:—

1. That more of the parents and church members engage in it.
2. More consecrated teachers—teachers who engage in the work because they love Christ and souls, and will be satisfied only when the lost are being saved.
3. More thorough preparation and punctuality on the part of teachers and officers.
4. Well-sustained teachers' meetings. More direct and special effort to hold and interest young men and women, especially the former.

Quite an amount of money is reported in the treasury, and the Executive Committee are laying plans for more progressive work in the future.
