ECLIPSES FOR THE YEAR 1887.

There will be four eclipses this year, two of the sun and two of the moon.
 I. A partial eclipse of the moon, Feb. 8. For Boston the times of the phases are as follows: Eclipse begins 4h., 14m. A. M.; middle of eclipse, 5h., 22m. A. M.; eclipse ends 6h., 30m. A. M., standard time.

II. An annular eclipse of the sun, Feb. 22, invisible in the United States, but visible in the South Pacific Ocean, and a part of South America.

III. A partial eclipse of the moon, Aug. 3, invisible in the United States, but visible in Europe.

IV. A total eclipse of the sun, Aug. 19, invisible in the United States, but visible in Europe and Asia.

EXPLANATION.

In previous *Registers* the computations have naturally been expressed in local time, this being practically the same for any phenomenon for places in the same latitude. The introduction of the new time system, however, demands a change, so that a table of correction becomes necessary, as given below.

The calendar quantities are for the meridian and latitude of Boston, expressed in the present time system. For the other places, given in the table below, add to or subtract from the calendar times, as expressed in said table.

For places not in table, find the correction from the place nearest in longitude to the one in question, and apply this. A still closer result would be obtained by finding two places in the table, one a little east and the other a little west, and estimating the correction between.

Each person had better mark on the margin of his *Register* the addition or subtraction for his own locality, and apply this correction whenever he looks for the time of any event.

The Eastern time belt ends, and the Central begins, near the western borders of New York and Pennsylvania.

For places still using the old local time, no use is to be made of this table, but 16 minutes are invariably to be added to the *Register* time.

In the field we are inspired by the general impression which the Gospel is making upon the people of India. It is welcomed more heartily each year, new doors are opened for it. *The churches are making increased efforts to support themselves*, and some are succeeding well. *The natives are learning to give to the Lord.* When they do this sufficiently they too will send out missionaries.

While many in other missions have been persecuted and martyred, our mission has been permitted to work on in security, for which let us thank God.

The work of establishing a mission at Chandbali has gone on under the supervision of Mr. Coldren as fast as our means would allow.

Since Dr. Phillips's return the Bible School has been in the care of Dr. Bachelor and Mr. Burkholder.

During the year the missionaries have suffered from malaria and over-work, but at the close of the year all were at their posts in good health.

Several changes have occurred in the field.

Miss Millar was married in July, '85, to Mr. Jewson, of the English Baptist mission, and went to live with him at Comillah.

Dr. Phillips took a vacation for three months from the last of July, '85, and supplied the Union church at Simla; thence he came to his family in America, arriving about Christmas, where he will remain until his wife's health will permit the family to return.

Mr. Coldren gave up Balasore into the hands of Mr. Griffin, and moved to Bhadrack while building the bungalow at Chandbali. Mr. George has had charge of the mission press.

The Girls' Orphanage has been temporarily moved from Jellasure to Balasore, on account of the unhealthy physical and moral condition of the former place.

Purna Chandra Basu, one of our foremost native preachers, died in March, '86. In his death our mission sustains a great loss; he was educated, sweet spirited and a gifted preacher.

Some of the results of home effort are apparent; two appropriations have been made for the new station at Chandbali, and arrangements for the purchase of Mrs. Smith's property have been perfected.

Dr. Bachelier was returned to the field early last spring. Mrs. Bachelier, his wife, expects to sail October 14, together with their son, Dr. H. M. Bachelier, and his excellent wife, also Mr. and Mrs. A. B. Boyer, who are supported by the good people of New Brunswick, and Miss Butts, late preceptress of New Hampton Institution, supported by the Woman's Society, and Miss Hooper, supported by the Woman's Society of New Brunswick, will return to the field.

If these arrive safely we shall have a much larger working force in the field than at any one time before; for this let us return thanks to God and take courage; but we need more men yet in the Bible School and in places where no stations have been established; a few are nearly ready for the work. Twenty-two at Bates College recently pledged themselves to become missionaries. When we increase the number of our missionaries and better the facilities for carrying on our work, we increase our expenses, hence it will be necessary to increase our contributions. Nothing is limiting our work in India as much as lack of money; the special calls which our Treasurer has made have been nobly responded to, but the work can not be properly carried forward until systematic giving is established more fully in the churches.

Our mission field is the heritage of the whole denomination, it claims the interest, the prayers, and the pecuniary help of every church and individual. Let us move forward, interest and instruct the young, organize methods of systematic giving, and God will give the desired results.

"Bring ye all the tithes unto the storehouse, that there may be meat in mine house, and prove me now herewith, saith the Lord of hosts, if I will not open you the windows of heaven and pour you out a blessing, that there shall not be room enough to receive it."

ABSTRACT FROM THE INDIA REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDING MARCH, 1886.

THE CHURCHES.

Mr. George, gaining some knowledge of the work, has relieved Mr. Burkholder some by taking charge of the Babaigadia and Dantoon churches. Mr. Griffin has taken charge of the stations of Balasore, while Mr. Coldren has taken up a new work at Bhadrack and Chandbali. Contai and Gurbheta need church organizations.

THE BALASORE CHURCH.—Mr. Coldren says: I made over Balasore, Jellasore, and Santipore to Mr. Griffin on the 1st of last October. Previous to that some had been added by letter, a number by baptism; each church had shared also in the work of discipline and in dismissals; death had claimed its share.

Mr. Griffin reports: The church has again chosen Kamal Nayak for pastor, and agreed to support him. The church has succeeded during the year in paying its running expenses without help from America, supported its pastor, and cared for worthy poor partially supported by the church. During the week of prayer and after, some special meetings were means of great good in converting sinners and reclaiming backsliders.

The Sabbath school is prospering under the efficient labors of Miss Hattie Phillips as Superintendent. Among the baptisms is that of a Kuline Brahmin.

The Metrapore Branch of this church is prospering under the faithful labors of Abraham Das, who is pastor and village school-master. We held special meetings at this church for a few days, and were gratified at what we saw and heard.

THE JELLASORE CHURCH.—Mr. Griffin says: The pastor of last year, Nabakumar, has been obliged to resign on account of illness. He is now improving. His place is filled, for the present, by Ram Jena, a last year's graduate of the Bible school. The removal of Mrs. Smith and the Orphanage has weakened this church.

THE SANTIPORE CHURCH.—Mr. Griffin reports: I have been here but once since accepting this work. Miss Nellie Phillips and her mother are there, and have the responsibility of the work. Mrs. Phillips writes: A systematic method of giving has been adopted, and is meeting with good success.

The spiritual life of the church is low; discipline has been necessary. A good pastor is needed here. Friends of the mission join us in prayers for the outpouring of the Holy Spirit. The people have given to those made to suffer recently from flood and famine.

CHANDBALI AND BHADRACK.—Mr. Coldren reports: We have no church here yet; but at Bhadrack there are eighteen Christians and seventeen nominal Christian children. At Aqua Pada there are four or five families from the Cuttack Mission. By our occupying the sub-divisions of Bhadrack, we can work that section of country more thoroughly than formerly.

THE MIDNAPORE CHURCH.—Mr. George reports: This church is maintaining its independence and getting hold of the true meaning of the Gospel very well. Jacob Mishra, the pastor, says: God has especially favored the church during the past year. The members have manifested constant fidelity. The introduction of a service into every family has wrought wonderful effects on the hearts of the local Christians. Each week we hold two prayer-meetings, and use one Tuesday evening each month for a sermon preparatory to communion, and one Thursday evening for monthly conference. Miss Coombs ably superintends the Sunday-school.

THE BABAIGADIA CHURCH.—Mr. George says: Jhampad has charge of this church, and is active in his work. The church has been strengthened by additions this past year.

THE DANTOON CHURCH.—Mr. George says: This church has had less help during the past year than the year before. Purna Chandra Basu was able to spend only about one week in a month with them. Last February he visited them for the last time. He died in March. The church must have some one to minister there.

THE BHIMPORE CHURCH.—Mr. Burkholder says: Some have been added, some have been dismissed, and some moved away. The people are coming up to the work in an encouraging way; they seem more willing to help bear the burdens.

The International lessons have been used in the Sabbath school, also the pictures published by the Philadelphia Lithograph Company. They are a great help. We use the *Star Quarterly*, and like it.

THE PALASBANI CHURCH.—Mr. Burkholder says: This church is weak, but the pastor is faithful and courageous.

THE GADALATA CHURCH.—Mr. Burkholder reports: This church keeps on well, and sustains its week and Sabbath day services. It is in a thickly-populated territory of Santals, and promises to be strong some day.

SCHOOLS.

The Jellasore Girl's Orphanage and Santipore schools are reported under Woman's Work. Few educated men in India uphold idolatry. Hindooism, like Catholicism, lives by the ignorance of the masses. Our schools are doing good work. The catechism is taught in all the schools.

THE BALASORE BOYS' SCHOOL.—Mr. Griffin reports: The school suffered on account of a change of teachers, but has come up again and has an increase of pupils. The teacher's staff has been increased by one. The study of English has been introduced. Half an hour each day is devoted to religious instruction. An industrial department is needed here.

METRAPORE SCHOOL.—Mr. Griffin says: The school is about the same as last year. The teacher does good, faithful work.

BALASORE BOYS' ORPHANAGE.—Mr. Griffin reports: This work is very interesting. The boys develop well. Three came to Christ this year. We hope for much from them, and are doing our best to fit them for usefulness. An industrial department has been opened for them, through the help of friends.

BALASORE GIRLS' SCHOOL.—Miss Ida Phillips says: Good health and good interest have prevailed among the pupils. Three schools have been united to form one at a central point, and a third more attend this one than went to the other three. Two young men and a Christian woman teach them. Another school is closed for the present. Mrs. Smith has taken charge of the Christian Girls' School. A day-school, consisting of twenty-five neglected low-caste children, has been opened, and two new Sabbath schools where there is an excellent interest.

The Children's Mission Society now has 27 members.

One of the schools has stood first among all of its kind in the district. Improvement among the native Christian teachers is marked, and a deep interest is manifest on the part of many of the pupils.

THE CHANDBALI MISSION SCHOOL.—Mr. Coldren reports: The school was commenced last June. Our first house was demolished by the cyclone, but funds were raised among the people to build the present one, 60 by 16 feet. We need money for desks and maps.

BHIMPORE TRAINING-SCHOOL.—Mr. Burkholder says: Our new plan of work to prepare boys and girls for government examinations is a success. On March 31, there were in attendance one hundred and fifteen, of whom thirty-nine were girls. The industrial department has been kept up with good interest. Thanks for contributions.

SANTAL JUNGLE SCHOOLS.—Mr. Burkholder reports: There is an increase in the number of schools. The Santals are industrious, and inclined to make their children work as soon as large enough; but they begin to see the need of an education. We have had, during the past year, 63 schools, in all 1,631 scholars. In the 62 jungle schools there were 1,516 pupils; 15 Christians, 206 Hindoos and 1,285 Santals; of these, 193 are girls and 1,423 boys.

In the training-school at Bhimpore, and the girl's school, we had 115; 39 Christians, 6 Hindoos and 70 Santals, of whom 34 are girls.

MIDNAPORE INDUSTRIAL SCHOOL.—Mrs. George reports: The work has gone steadily forward without interruption. The number of pupils has increased. The pupils are principally from the lower class, but there are 25 native Christian children who are progressing well. There has been a change in head pundit. The industries are continued.

MIDNAPORE RAGGED-SCHOOL.—Miss Coombs reports: Miss Millar's departure left the school in my care, and with other duties I have not been able to give it the care needed. The number of pupils is less than last year, but the same number of schools; namely, nineteen.

During September and October Miss Ida Phillips assisted me in visiting and examining the schools. One of the Bible school graduates does good work as school inspector. Sunday-school teachers' meetings are held Saturday afternoons. The catechism is taught each day in all the schools. Ragged-school work requires patience, but we can trust God to bring about the desired results.

THE MIDNAPORE BIBLE SCHOOL.—(Abstract from the Seventh Annual Report.) Dr. Phillips says: Hitherto hath the Lord helped us, and blessed be his name forever. There has been very little illness, and the work moved on pleasantly. Twenty-two men were in the school, fifteen in the regular classes, all but three married. The students' wives and quite a number of young women, married and single, attended the afternoon classes. Six new men in the school this year.

The stipend system has been continued. We need a thoroughly organized and ably managed industrial department, to aid in developing independence in the men. Married students bring their wives, as formerly.

The School.—This has been accommodated as heretofore, in the rooms and on the bungalow verandas. The course of study marked out seven years ago has been pursued. The Bible has been the chief book. The closing examinations were very satisfactory. The two pundits and three pupil teachers have done their work remarkably well.

The woman's department, under Jacob Mishra, assisted by Miss Coombs, has made commendable progress.

General Exercises.—The Tuesday evening lectures have been continued. The men and women have read the *Khristya Bandhab*. The Bengali Magazine has done the students good. The literary and missionary societies have proved a benefit. English service on Sabbath evenings has been continued. Rev. G. H. Rouse, A. M., LL. B., gave several lectures upon the books of the Bible.

Students' Work.—The young men have done something besides study. Themes of the class-room have been carried into the bazar, the market-place, and the homes of the people.

Several of the students have assisted in the Bengali service in the chapel on the Sabbath. The Santal brethren have taken their turn in the service Sunday forenoon, conducting service on my veranda. Gospel singing has been effective, from those who could not speak effectively.

Bible reading is effective. On alternate Sundays the men have visited the outposts, ten or twelve miles away. The women have worked in the zenanas, the ragged-schools, and from house to house.

Discipline.—There has been very little, but it has been necessary in two cases. We try to make the school self-governing.

The Second Graduating Class.—Four young men completed the course this year. The graduating exercises occurred Tuesday morning, July 28, the topics of addresses as follows: "What the Church has gained by Persecution," "Lessons from the Missionary Life of Paul," "Means of Increasing Liberality in the Church," "The Present Fruit of Martin Luther's Work." The occasion was one of great interest.

WOMAN'S WORK.

Work for the women of India grows more interesting each year, and the religious education of the women and children is a necessary forerunner of their becoming Christians.

BALASORE ZENANAS.—Miss Hattie Phillips writes: There has been a slow but sure increase in the number of pupils taught; 80, at the close of last year, have increased to 120. The spirit of inquiry after religious truth is small; they accept the idea of the Fatherhood of God, but fail to receive the idea of the brotherhood

of man. The spirit of oppression is not rife; only one pupil during the year has dropped her study because religious instruction was a part of the work.

One of the most interesting branches of work is Sabbath work among Hindoo children, and it is accomplishing much good. Six or eight have asked for baptism. Daily prayers with the natives employed on the place bring cheering results. The generosity of friends and the government has supplied our needed funds.

Mrs. Griffin writes: Two Bible women employed by Mrs. Coldren are continued; they give instruction in nine different places, making religion prominent. The common people hear them gladly.

Friends in Balasore and America have contributed for a library for native women in Balasore. We have now about five hundred bound volumes; and now the number must be increased, for the young men in the town schools request their benefits. Thanks to all who have helped so far in this work.

CHANDBALI AND BHADRACK.—Mrs. Coldren writes: A school has been opened in Bhadrack; eleven children come from Christian families and there are six Hindoos. Bible women will soon arrive from Balasore to work here and at Chandbali.

JELLASORE GIRLS' ORPHANAGE.—Mrs. Smith says: The fever so prevalent in 1883-84 reappeared and made a change necessary. The children were temporarily transferred to Balasore. Work has been interrupted by illness and changing. Two of the children have died; twenty-eight are now under our care.

Real spiritual growth is seen in the lives of many of these children. The mission day-school belonging to the Orphanage has suffered from malaria. We have sent but seven to the government examinations this year. An English class has been formed. The schools have had a good effect upon the community, and commendable progress has been made.

Two Sunday-schools have been carried on during the year, one in the mission compound, to which the Christian people and children of the day-school came, and another in the Patna bazar schoolroom, for Hindoo women and girls. Prizes are offered to stimulate diligence. The Bible women have charge of a Sunday-school in the Patna bazar schoolroom.

Six Bible women, supported by funds from England, do good work; one at Baripada, one at Bhadrack, two at Balasore, and two at Jellasore.

The Christian community has lost some of its best members by death. Thanks to those who have helped us with money and prayers.

SANTIPORE.—Miss N. M. Phillips says: Work should be resumed more fully at Dantoon. The village school has increased in numbers and advanced steadily in work. It accommodates our Christian children and a good number of Hindoos and Santals. Three outside schools aggregate 75. There is a normal class of Christian women. The Sabbath school is but little changed. We are encouraged by progress.

The industrial has not succeeded this year, for lack of material to work with.

MIDNAPORE ZENANAS.—Miss Coombs reports: The Zenana work has held on its way with a slight increase in the monthly number of pupils on the roll. Many learn the whole of the catechism. Some object to it. The average number on the roll has been 149, with 236 different pupils. There are fourteen teachers engaged in this work. The library is helpful. The Bible women do steady work with good results. Palasbani has a Bible woman for the first time. She has ten pupils.

The Girls' English School is going on, and reaching several families. The gift from the Young People's Society of Portland was timely.

BHIMPORE.—*Work for Women and Children.* Mrs. Burkholder writes: Our work in this department goes on as usual. Six women have been employed most of the time; five visit the villages, one looks after the industrial department of the girls' school. Tuesday morning we have Bible study, in the afternoon a sewing society for women; few women in the village know how to sew.

A Bible lesson daily for the primary department of our day-school has interested the little ones. An hour Sabbath afternoon has been devoted to the children. Twelve of these little ones have come into the church.

Our girls' school has gone on as usual. A movement is on foot among the high-caste Hindoos to stop the curse of child-marriage.

MEDICAL WORK.

MIDNAPORE DISPENSARY.—Dr. Bachelor reports: This work justly claims a portion of our time. Our Mission Dispensary in Midnapore, after virtually being closed for three years, has about the same number of applicants as formerly. Mr. Burkholder has done considerable medical work at Bhimpore.

SANTIPORE.—Miss Phillips writes: The dispensary is kept open; the calls average little more than three daily. This is an important part of our work, and demands special time and attention.

ENGLISH WORK.

MIDNAPORE.—Mr. George reports: There are many opportunities to do mission work among the babus, the college and town school boys. Religious services have been continued. Sermons, Bible readings and lectures have been given. Sunday-school work is interesting. A hall and a book-room are needed in the center of the town.

BALASORE.—Mr. Griffin says: Service has been interrupted by rains, cold-season work, duty, and disease. Of late the work is more encouraging.

Mrs. Griffin adds: An English school was much needed here, and one was opened in January. Miss Dessa of Saidpur teaches it, and is efficient. She also assists in caring for the orphan boys. The school began with seven and now numbers twelve. An English Sunday-school is held in connection with this.

THE MISSION PRESS.

Mr. George reports: We have printed 1,000 Annual Reports, also the Sunday-school Lessons in Bengali for several months, and 1,000 copies (second edition) of a Bengali Christian song-book. Now we are publishing several Gospels in Santal. By help of the \$200 sent for tract cause, we hope to send forth many useful Gospel messages. The press profit for the past year is about 500 rupees. The men have been faithful.

PREACHING TO THE HEATHEN.

BALASORE DISTRICT WORK.—Mr. Griffin reports: The interest is increasing in this work, good attention is given to the preaching, and our books are purchased. The leaven of Gospel truth is working. We are erecting a house for a native preacher at Baripada. The preacher is very efficient, as is his wife also. We have also a Christian woman at the head of the girls' school here, and a Christian postmaster. My territory contains six thousand square miles, and is densely populated.

Mr. Coldren reports: Illness prevented me from doing much district work, but what I did revealed a spirit of inquiry equal to last year. Jacobus is faithful, and has sold over 3,000 Gospels and portions of Scripture. The Lord opens the way faster than we have men and means to follow up.

Miss N. M. Phillips adds: Camp work has been a real pleasure this year. We spent some time in Dantoon, assisted by native preachers. We were received gladly and eagerly listened to.

MIDNAPORE DISTRICT WORK.—Mr. Burkholder reports: We visited our jungle schools, looked up the schools, preached in the villages and markets by the way. We disposed of a number of books. In many places the work began by someone's reading or learning a Gospel. Mrs. Burkholder was gladly received by the women. "Pray ye, therefore, the Lord of the harvest," etc.

Mr. George adds: After our Yearly Meeting, I, with my family and Miss Coombs, went to Contai for a few days. Mrs. George and Miss Coombs visited the women in the zenanas. I sold a large number of Gospel tracts. We found some very interesting cases. Some fifty to seventy-five English-speaking babus came to a preaching service. Contai needs a missionary constantly. The Bible School students have done much for this district.

MIDNAPORE BAZAR WORK.—Dr. Bachelor reports: A fair amount of work has been done. Jacob Mishra has preached in the bazar twice a week to good congregations, and gathered some near his home three times a week. He was kindly listened to. Purna did some work here for a short time, visiting two country churches and at the bazar. Sachi has worked also in the country and bazar. The Bible School students work among the people more or less each day.

Jacob remarks: There is work in Midnapore for twenty preachers, and we have not one to devote himself entirely to it. We expect to give greater prominence to this work in the future.

Reports of the Home Mission Society.

CORRESPONDING SECRETARY'S REPORT.

The Society commenced the year with \$1,700 of its appropriations unpaid. After about six weeks had elapsed the Treasurer of the Society tendered his resignation and some six weeks more had elapsed before the place was filled and the new Treasurer in position to render effective service. The Treasurer being the only officer of the Society who gives his whole time to the work, this vacancy in the office was a hindrance to success. The amount of appropriations made by the board for the year has been \$4,145.00, some of which was appropriated on certain conditions. If these conditions are all met it will require nearly \$6,000 to meet our obligations. The obligations of the Society are somewhat less than at the commencement of last year. The church extension fund does not include all moneys raised for church building in localities apart from those where buildings are being erected. If it did the report would make a better showing. Only such sums as have been received by our Treasurer for the church extension fund is included. The amount raised for this fund this year has been \$402.26. In the two years previous there had been \$481.48 raised; making \$883.74 raised since the fund was commenced in April, 1884. This fund has made it possible to loan this year to Lincoln, Neb., Sioux Falls, Dak., and Oakland, Cal., \$200 each to aid them in building. From the first one hundred dollars only has been appropriated from this fund to churches east of the Mississippi. We are glad to note the increase of interest in this fund and hope that our brethren and sisters will remember it, donate to it, and make bequests to it. These loans may be used many times in helping over the hard places and still be returned to the treasury for similar use again. The plan is to help a church in its early struggles by loaning a sum to it without interest, and when it becomes self-sustaining let it be paid back to the Society to be loaned again in a similar way. Is there an opportunity where our money can do a more promising work for the Master? The work of establishing a MORRELL PROFESSORSHIP to be filled by the President of Storer college has been commenced by the Society this year. Two reasons for attempting this work we feel assured

will be appreciated by every Free Baptist and interest them in helping to complete the subscription: 1st. To erect a lasting monument to the memory of that good man, Rev. Alexander H. Morrell, so many years of whose life were devoted in self-forgetfulness to the interests of Storer College. 2d. To provide a way whereby this Society may be relieved from paying yearly the salary of the President and so leave \$800 now furnished for that purpose to be used in aiding the churches that are struggling into life. Rev. N. C. Brackett has been charged with the work of collecting the funds and we commend this undertaking to the careful consideration of all our friends who have means.

We regret to announce that Rev. John E. Cox has been obliged to be away from the field in West Virginia for some months on account of poor health.

The Pond Street church, Providence, R. I., has with the assistance of this Society, and other friends, been relieved from embarrassments which threatened its ruin. It now has a fine church edifice on which there is no encumbrance, and the path to success seems open before it. The Cairo Mission has been blessed with the labors of that old veteran in the work, Rev. J. S. Manning. Our interests in Minnesota, Dakota, Iowa, Nebraska, Kansas, and California are in a condition where help, if we could render it in large measure, would be very effectual in building up the denomination. While we deplore our want of means to render the needed assistance, we recognize the courage and zeal of brethren who are laboring in these places, in the face of formidable obstacles, to plant the banner of the cross, build churches and sustain them. Is it not possible to help them more than we have?

Reports of the Education Society.

CORRESPONDING SECRETARY'S REPORT.

The office of Corresponding Secretary is a connective between our various institutions of learning. Sitting at a center he is able to feel the influences which come to him along the various radii as the spider sits and feels the forces at work at the ends of the different spokes of her web. For the purpose of feeling out the condition of our educational work, I have sent over twenty communications to all our Theological Seminaries, Colleges, and Preparatory Schools (thirteen institutions) as far as the REGISTER and *Star* advertisements gave me the list. Let Midnapore Bible School, Lyndon Institute, West Lebanon Academy and Atwood Institute be inserted in the list in our next REGISTER. I hope this office of Corresponding Secretary will become more and more a bond of union between the departments of our educational interests—the avenue by which all shall make their wants and wishes known to the Educational Board.

Some have already favored me with their facts and suggestions. Prominent educators at both Hillsdale and Bates have asked that the Board fix a standard of scholarship and general fitness for admission to our Theological schools. Give the professors general rules that will back them when dealing with special cases. President Mosher writes: “I should say that we ought to raise the standard of admission to the Theological course proper.” Prof. Hayes in a letter at some length proceeds to show that our Theological School has sent out very few men (only two or three) in his experience of 17 years *who had better not gone out*. And these would not have gone out, had examination by the faculty in preliminary studies been required.

I find the outlook for students for the ministry very good indeed. President Cheney writes concerning College, Latin School and Theological Seminary, “We have at least 50 young men with the ministry in view.” What an army of zealous young recruits waiting. We need them all, for one after another of the tried and true veterans are dropping away. What large places have recently been made by the deaths of Rev. A. H. Morrell, Rev. C. D. Dudley, and now of Rev. S. D. Bates. Prof. J. J. Butler of Hillsdale writes: In all departments “the whole number now on the list is 44.” From the fitting schools elsewhere I find several more who have decided to preach. So I can report that the number reaches a hundred. *One hundred young men whom the Lord has called*, preparing to preach the Gospel! God bless them! Think of it, friend. Think in your prayers of that chosen 100. This is just the thing we ought to pray about. Jesus said, Pray ye therefore the Lord of the harvest, that he send forth laborers into his harvest. One hundred young laborers coming! How

the great West needs them with its whitening fields waiting—waiting for men to go forth as Paul the Apostle went forth trusting God and the people. One hundred young men! How India stretches forth her hands to them for help. God bless the 100 young men and help us to help them. Dr. J. L. Phillips sends me in his last Bible School Report fifteen native students in the regular course and seven in the special course. Of these 22 he writes: "During the seven years that I have had the school, *full one half of the men* were studying for the ministry, the other half were all fitting for Christian work of some sort. We admit no others."

And now we come to the important subject of funds and Prof. Howe writes me, "We shall number six more than in June. *Every one* wants help. Eighteen or nineteen received aid last summer. I think, possibly, more aid would increase the number of students, but it would certainly give us a chance to do for those coming to the school better work. It would give them time to read and investigate and so lay the foundation of scholarly habits..... We would like a larger library fund." Prof. Butler gives facts and figures: "Amount of funds disbursed to thirty beneficiaries here last year \$818.95. The lack of sufficient funds for endowment and for aid is a most serious obstacle. It is most earnestly to be desired that our churches in the West shall contribute more generally and systematically to this important object."

I must just mention the obligations of the Society to the Institute at Lyndon Center, Vermont. The Society's pledge of \$5,000 remains unpaid; the annual interest of \$300, coming slowly, has just been paid. Treasurer Given tersely writes: "Over drew the treasury to do it."

The society has done its noble work and it has gone on record. Brighter—better days are just ahead. News of larger endowment of one of our great institutions has just been received. May this coming year be one of large advancement and of great usefulness both East and West and beyond the sea.

SUNDAY-SCHOOL UNION.

ABSTRACT OF THE ANNUAL REPORT OF THE CORRESPONDING SECRETARY,
REV. H. F. WOOD.

Reports of this important branch of our work have been received from all parts of the field, and in them there is much to inspire and give courage for future work.

We are coming more and more to place a proper estimate upon childhood. Mirabeau was asked at one time how we may best teach the lessons of liberty, and answered, *with much warmth*, "Begin with the infant in the cradle, and let the first name it lisps be Washington."

So we are learning that we can best impress the lessons of religion by beginning in the tender years of childhood, and by teaching the children, among their first spoken words, to lisp the name of Jesus.

Our Sunday-school workers are evidently laboring more directly for the conversion of those under their care, and as a result more conversions are reported than in any previous year, and more young Christians are being developed in our churches, and trained for future service in the Master's vineyard, than ever before. This is a most hopeful indication.

The relation of the Sunday-school to the church is more intimate than ever before. We are now feeling, as we should, that the Sunday-school work is *but a branch of the church work*.

So intimate now is the Sunday-school with the church, that in many cases the officers of the school are chosen by the church, and are regarded as *church officers*. The necessary funds, also, to support the school, are, in many cases, provided by the church.

Thus the mother is lovingly owning and claiming her child,—and the child is recognizing and lovingly submitting to the claims of its mother.

More money is being expended in Sunday-school work year by year.

We are learning that it pays to expend money *liberally* in the purchase of maps, charts, pictures and various Sunday-school "helps," through which divine truth may enter the mind and help to mold the life. More is being done for the young in the line of *special services*,—services designed especially to interest and benefit the young, and lead them into a Christian life. "Children's Day," "Rose Sunday" and other special days are being observed in our churches more generally than at any other time.

Our schools are being taught that they are *not merely to be helped*, but that they are to be *helpers* in Christian work, and so there is being constantly developed in them a strong *missionary spirit*. The introduction of Normal Sunday-school work at Ocean Park and other places is already yielding fruit, and promises much for our work in the future. While we are glad for these and many other encouraging indications, there is still room for great improvement.

Very many more of the members of our churches and congregations should be in the Sunday-school than now are—thus giving precept, example and personal endeavor to help the work. May our success in the past be an inspiration to us to do more and better work in the future.

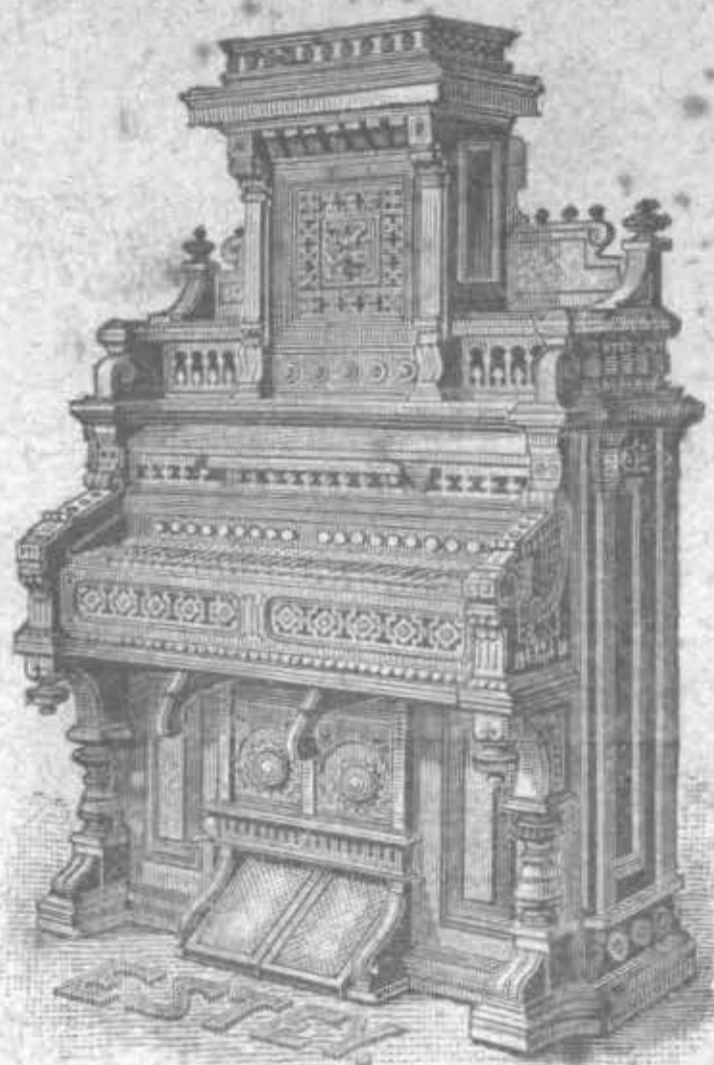
