

### ECLIPSES FOR THE YEAR 1891.

There will be four eclipses this year, two of the sun and two of the moon, and also a Transit of Mercury over the sun's disc.

I. A Total Eclipse of the moon, May 23, invisible in New England, but visible throughout the western part of the Pacific Ocean, Australia, Asia, Africa, and Europe.

II. An Annular Eclipse of the Sun, June 6, invisible in New England, but visible in British America and the northwestern portion of the United States, and also throughout the most of Europe and in Siberia.

III. A Total Eclipse of the Moon, November 15, visible in New England and generally visible in Asia, Africa, Europe, the Atlantic Ocean, North and South America and the eastern part of the Pacific Ocean. Begins 5h., 35.0m. P. M.; middle, 7h., 18.8m. P. M.; ends 9h., 30m. P. M.

IV. A Partial Eclipse of the Sun, December 1, invisible in New England, but visible in the southern part of South America, and about the South Pole in the South Atlantic and South Pacific Oceans.

V. A Transit of Mercury over the sun's disc, May 9, partly visible in New England, and visible throughout the western portion of North and South America. Exterior contact at ingress begins at 6h., 54.6m. P. M. Exterior contact at egress ends at 11h., 50.4m. P. M.

## EXPLANATION.

In previous *Registers* the computations have naturally been expressed in local time, this being practically the same for any phenomenon for places in the same latitude.

The introduction of the new time system, however, demands a change, so that a table of correction becomes necessary, as given below.

The calendar quantities are for the meridian and latitude of Boston, expressed in the present time system. For the other places, given in the table below, add to or subtract from the calendar times, as expressed in said table.

For places not in table, find the correction from the place nearest in longitude to the one in question, and apply this. A still closer result would be obtained by finding two places in the table, one a little east and the other a little west, and estimating the correction between.

Each person had better mark on the margin of his *Register* the addition or subtraction for his own locality, and apply this correction whenever he looks for the time of any event.

The Eastern time belt ends, and the Central begins, near the western borders of New York and Pennsylvania.

For places still using the old local time, no use is to be made of this table, but 16 minutes are invariably to be added to the *Register* time.

## Report of the Foreign Mission Society.

### CORRESPONDING SECRETARY'S REPORT.

The work has been prosecuted during the year with a zeal and enthusiasm which God has blessed. At home the general interest grows steadily as is manifest in mission meetings and in contributions. The earnestness with which the young people devote themselves to this work is a marked indication of progress.

Dr. J. L. Phillips, before his departure for India, worked several months among our people and the General Baptists. This work did great good, and doubtless had much to do with the organization of a mission society by the General Baptists and the support of Mr. and Mrs. Ager in India, which this church has undertaken.

The year has brought marked changes to the field. Our working force has been strengthened by the addition of Rev. and Mrs. M. C. Miner of Ohio, and Rev. and Mrs. George Ager of Cuttack, Orissa. Rev. M. J. Coldren with his family arrived in this country in the spring to take their well-earned and much-needed rest. Mr. Coldren however, is earnestly engaged in raising \$30,000 to secure a Boys' High School to be located at Balasore. Rev. T. W. Burkholder and family have recently arrived for the respite overdue them. These changes have occasioned the change of the location of some left in the field, but it is hoped that the work may not be crippled or impeded.

The presence of the Holy Spirit has been especially manifest; harmony has prevailed; the missionaries have been courageous and industrious; there have been an unusually large number of conversions; conviction has gone into the camp of the enemy, making it very evident that the Gospel leaven is working. The native Christians are deeply interested in the self-support of the church, and ground has been gained in this direction. Perhaps this last mentioned fact is among the most promising features, for it is evident that the evangelization of India must largely be done by the converted natives. This has become so apparent of late that the Board has deemed it wise to encourage the services of a larger number of the best native Christian workers available, with the hope to make adequate provision for their reasonable support.

Still, we are asking for more well qualified men, upon whom God has placed his hand. A church desires to undertake the support of one, a Yearly Meeting desires to support another, and the need in the field is calling for them.

Let us ask then, "Lord, what wilt thou have me do in this matter?" Let us pray unceasingly that our churches may see themselves to be not an end, but a means. Let us stick to the plan of systematic giving, and push it. Let us talk missions, and expect in this year before us greater results than ever before. Are we not ready to bring all the tithes into the storehouse? Are we not ready to ask for the heathen? The condition is, "Ask of me"; the promise is, "And I will give you the heathen for thine inheritance, and the uttermost parts of the earth for thy possession."

### ABSTRACT FROM THE INDIA REPORT.

#### I. CHURCHES.

**BALASORE CHURCH.**—Z. F. Griffin says that Joseph Fullonton succeeds as pastor; all the means of grace are regularly sustained; special meetings strengthened Christians and brought sinners to Christ; have baptized our two little girls, Nellie and Frankie. Joseph Fullonton, the pastor, writes: The Sunday morning services are largely attended; week-day prayer-meetings not so well; special meetings in November brought good results. A regular meeting for seekers throughout the year has done good. Have spent time profitably in country work, also in house-to-house prayer-meetings. The support of the church has been nearly provided for by the brethren. Repairs have been made.

**METRAPORE CHURCH.**—Means of grace are regularly sustained, as during last year. We bless God for this little community.

**CHANDBALI CHURCH.**—M. J. Coldren says: This church has been doing good work. It sustains a sunrise prayer-meeting. Mr. and Mrs. Ager have added much to our strength. Spirituality among the native preachers is growing. The Sunday-school is prospering. The village school-teachers come in to study their lessons. These Hindu teachers have in many instances seen Christian truth in a new light. On the 31st of December I made over the charge of the church to Bro. Brown.

**BHUDRUCK CHURCH.**—F. W. Brown says: In the last of March I gathered and organized a church of fourteen members. Bro. Rae has had charge of the work during my absence. Have baptized three during the year; one has fallen away. James B. Rae says: A new chapel was needed, and we have built one independent of mission aid, costing over Rs. 600. The money came chiefly from Bhudruck and Cuttack. The Bhudruck native Christians gave a month's pay.

**SANTIPORE CHURCH.**—E. B. Stiles says: Ten have been added

by baptism; four have been restored. The Sunday-school has seventy-two pupils. Hiram Curtis is its faithful pastor.

**JELLASORE CHURCH.**—E. B. Stiles visited the church in March and found it lukewarm. Only a few here seem to have the spirit of Christ.

**MIDNAPORE CHURCH.**—Jacob Mishra says: The Holy Spirit has rebuked sin, and sinners have found peace. I am encouraged. The Young People's Society, the prayer-meetings, the Sunday-school, are going on well. Six Hindus have been baptized. We have established a Home Mission Fund within our Quarterly Meeting.

**BABAIGADIA.**—Sachidananda Rai says: Near the end of the year a revival took place, which was a great blessing both to the church and the unconverted.

**PALASBANI.**—The church had become disheartened, but God has been merciful. Six have been baptized, and a new building has been made.

**DAINMARI.**—This church is in a bad state. The members are few and scattered. The harvest has failed for two years: fever has destroyed many people. God alone can save this people.

**BHIMPORE CHURCH.**—Pelaram Kisku says: The condition of the church is an occasion for rejoicing. Rev. T. W. Burkholder, missionary, and Pelaram Kisku, the native pastor, have charge of the work. Six native Christian women carry on zenana work. Mrs. Burkholder has a society for the young people. The Sabbath school is in good condition. Some have been added to the church. There are five meetings during the week, connected with the church, besides house-to-house prayer-meetings every week.

**GADALATA CHURCH.**—T. W. Burkholder says: This little interest is bereaved in the loss of a deacon, and the Sunday-school two bright little ones, by death. The members have been giving more than formerly.

#### II. SCHOOLS.

**CHANDBALI.**—M. J. Coldren says: This school has been doing good work. Aid has been received that enables us to put in another teacher and make necessary improvements. F. W. Brown says: I have succeeded in getting a Christian for second master in this school. He has been acting one month and is a valuable addition to our teaching and preaching force.

The Schools of the Wisconsin Yearly Meeting are 13 in number. E. B. Stiles says: These schools are generally doing good work. Some have been closed because of the parents' objections to the catechism and other Christian teaching. It is an encouraging sign when our teaching raises opposition. M. J. Coldren says: We had a Christmas tree for these schools. Of the 200 that belong, 160 were present. Each received a gift, and all appeared happy.

**BHUDRUCK.**—James B. Rae says: The children of our native Christians are instructed here. The Mission Girls' School now numbers 45. The teachers are two Christian women. Last year six girls passed creditable examinations and entered a higher grade school. Two of the three schools opened outside of Bhudruck are now closed for lack of funds. For the same reason it is feared that the Mohammedan School at Santipore, numbering 33, will have to be closed. All these schools used to attend the Sunday-school. We had an average attendance of 175; sometimes 250.

**BALASORE.**—Z. F. Griffin says of the Boys' Orphanage: We have now 19 boys. Some are very promising. A Hindu has taken great pains to lead some boys of our Christian community into sin, and one of our boys among others.

**Industrial School.**—This institution has far surpassed our expectations. Many in Kansas, Wisconsin, Michigan, and elsewhere, have contributed generously for its support, and the Lord has blessed it.

**Mission School.**—This school is in a prosperous condition, and the inspector says it is one of the best in the province. The demand here is for an English education.

**METRAPORE VILLAGE SCHOOL.**—Teacher, number of pupils, and work same as last year.

**SANTAL.**—T. W. Burkholder says: The Training School has 117 names on the roll. Of this number 54 are from Christian families. The government examination forms a great stimulus to both teachers and pupils. The attitude of the scholars toward Christianity is very gratifying. In the Industrial department some have acquired considerable proficiency in weaving, carpentering, wheel-making, and sewing. School on the whole not as strong as last year.

**Jungle Schools.**—There are 14 of these schools at distances varying from two to thirty miles from Bhimpore, with 1,401 pupils. Of this number, 73 are of Christian parents. The Lord's Prayer, the Ten Commandments, and the Christian Catechism are taught to all with a special course of New Testament study to teachers.

### III. WOMEN'S WORK.

**BALASORE.**—Miss Nellie M. Phillips says: In the Zenana Work there are 11 teachers; entire number of pupils, 170. Their progress is all that we can expect, while their interest in the little catechism, "God's Book," and their readiness to receive and memorize it, is a very encouraging feature of the work.

**Hindu Girls' Sunday-schools.**—In these two schools there are about 65 pupils. The little girls attend the day schools. Many of them can read easily, and the work is very promising.

**SANTIPORE.**—These schools include the graded school in the

village and six primary schools in outlying villages. Five of these are supported by the Ohio Association. We are obliged to employ a good number of Hindu teachers, but are hoping to have a high school in Balasore, where our best young men can be educated under a Christian teacher to supply this demand. The schools have made fair progress, and many of the pupils have an intelligent understanding of the elementary truths of Christianity. The majority of the villagers show an appreciation of their privileges and are willing to sacrifice to keep their children in school. As I am thirty-five miles from Balasore, Dr. and Mrs. H. M. Bacheler, at my request, have consented to take charge of these schools, beginning April 1, 1890.

**Sinclair Girls' Orphanage.**—Mrs. D. F. Smith says: The present number in the orphanage is 37. Three have been admitted to the church by baptism during the year. One girl has been married, thus making another Christian home in India, while another has been very successful in Christian teaching.

**Christian Day School.**—In this school sickness has interfered with the attendance more than usual, but the examinations show fairly good results. Nearly 80 have attended during the year.

Our Bible Women now number 7. They are supported by ladies in England. Their work is to scatter Christian teaching as far and wide as possible.

**BALASORE LIBRARY AND READING-ROOM.**—Libbie C. Griffin says: The books from the library are doing a quiet work for good. The most regular visitors are the young men from the schools. More tracts and Christian papers have been given out than ever before.

**Russell Memorial School.**—In this school there are 40 Christian, Hindu, and Mohammedan boys and girls. Hari, a cripple boy from the Orphanage, is teaching. He shows superior ability and promises to make a very successful teacher.

The five Bible Women reported last year are still employed. Of their work Miss Mabel Griffin says: We go about to the zenana houses, where we read the Scriptures, sing, and often pray. Our work is chiefly among the middle classes. These listen far more eagerly than the women of the higher castes. We go very often into Brahma Somaj houses, where the women are very attentive to Scripture reading, and are nearly all believers in Christ as a Saviour. Sabbath mornings we have a Sunday-school for Hindu boys. From 15 to 30 attend, none of whom can read. I also have a class of Christian girls who form a pleasant contrast to the heathen children.

**BIBLE WOMEN AND HINDU GIRLS' SCHOOL.**—Mary J. Boyer says: Two Bible Women have been at work during the year. They read the Bible, sing, and pray with the Hindu women, many of whom pray too. A large number confess that they believe in the Christian religion and have left off idol-worship, but shrink from the sacrifice involved in breaking the caste. In February I was given charge of the seven Hindu girls' schools established by Miss Ida Phillips. The entire enrolment is nearly 300. There

are 12 teachers, of whom 7 are Christians and 5 Hindus. The inspector recently told me that this school was the best of its kind in the Province of Orissa. Sunday-schools are held in connection with two of the schools.

**JELLASORE HINDU GIRLS' SCHOOLS.**—Eliza D. Bachelier says: These are four in number, and are within a radius of three or four miles. The average attendance is about 50 girls and as many little boys. Progress has been as good as could be expected, considering the difficulties in securing an attendance. Of the girls who went to the Government examinations, 5 passed the Lower Primary grade. Sewing is taught in each school, and two Bible women visit them frequently to give religious instruction.

**BHIMPORE.**—Miss Julia Burkholder says of the work: Six of our Christian women who live here, and five others in places more or less remote, have been teaching the Bible in villages within their reach. We have to report the death of one of our best Bible readers. She was one of the few who would do anything for Christ's sake. A few of our older boys and girls have organized a society after the plan of the A. C. F., from which we hope much. We have a well attended children's service Sabbath mornings.

**MIDNAPORE.**—The Christian Village School was begun two years ago and has been a success. Mrs. S. P. Bachelier reports a total attendance of 58, with an average of 31. These children are a striking contrast to the heathen—clean, well dressed, and happy looking. Unfortunately, the school has no assured means of support. Four girls have been baptized during the year.

**Zenanas.**—Miss Coombs says: Number of pupils taught during the year, 243; present number, 170. These are separated into nine divisions, each having a teacher, who has an assistant. We seldom have any opposition to religious teaching and find some cases of actual acceptance. Our library has been replenished. The work of the Bible Women is very encouraging.

**Ragged School.**—Miss Coombs says: There are 17 of these at present, with 491 names enrolled. Of the 17 teachers, 10 are Christians and 7 Hindus. One young man educated in our Industrial School has been baptized and is engaged in teaching. Sabbath schools are connected with thirteen of these schools. Last Christmas 300 collected on our veranda and sang hymns and answered Sunday-school questions in a very pleasing manner.

#### IV. EVANGELISTIC AND MISCELLANEOUS WORK.

**BALASORE.**—A. B. Boyer says: I have been especially interested during the past year in a low caste people called Rhandaras. Many of our Christians come from this caste. I am very much encouraged from the fact that the head man in the village is very much inclined to Christianity and helps me very much in my

work. When one starts, many others are likely to follow. Our bazar work is full of interest, and is certainly giving the masses a general idea of Christianity.

**Sunday-school.**—The Sunday-school has been under my charge during the year. I am glad to be able to report an increase, both in interest and attendance. Whole number, 250; average, 180. Contributions are taken every Sunday, which at the last teachers' meeting it was voted to use toward the support of Sachidananda Rai, a native preacher, who has renounced his salary from the mission to be an independent evangelist. Besides our Christian Sunday-school, attended by Christians only, we have several schools for Hindus. These are carried on under my general supervision by native Christian young men, and are doing excellent work. The teachers work without pay, and many actually spend their own money on their schools.

**English High School.**—Mr. Boyer reports: It will be seen from the unanimous resolution sent by the missionaries to the Home Board asking for an endowment of \$30,000 for an English High School at Balasore, that we are firm believers in a higher education. The following facts may be of interest to Christians in America:

1. English is the only language intelligible in all parts of India.
2. The vernacular has almost no literature.
3. Our best native preachers and teachers are those educated in English.
4. There is now no proper feeder for our Bible School. A pass in the highest grade in the vernacular is not sufficient to take a student into the lowest class of the Bible School.
5. No man in India is considered educated who does not know English.
6. No man can be educated who only knows the vernacular.
7. Without English no man can mingle in the best society, either native or English.
8. Our best Christians will learn English whether we want them to or not. The only question is, Shall we educate them ourselves, or leave them to be educated under Hindu influence by a nominal Christian government?
9. Nearly all the missionaries and many native Christians have given a month's salary towards the school, to show that they deem it of paramount importance. We also are much encouraged to hear that the first contribution in America was \$1,000. It was by a lady in Providence, R. I.

His Excellency, the Viceroy of India, also has become interested in our proposed school, and has given a small contribution towards it.

Z. F. Griffin reports: During the past year I have spent eighty-six days doing evangelistic work in the country districts around Balasore. Though but two have been baptized, there are many results that cannot enter into statistics. The people are gradually losing faith in idolatry. It means a great deal to become a Christian here,—persecution by the Hindus on one hand and by the

European officials on the other. As I write I am at Baliapal to establish a school and Sunday-school. The people here have already bought thousands of tracts and portions of God's Word. Evenings, when not prevented by other duties, I visit the bazar. As a rule, the people are very attentive. I believe half the people in Orissa are addicted to the use of opium, which destroys the moral faculties and so stands in the way of the spread of God's Word.

**BHUDRUCK.**—James B. Rae reports: Since July, 1889, evangelistic work has been carried on by myself and two native preachers, Caleb Hodgden and Debraj Sinj. As we preach, the people listen gladly, and often follow us home to hear and learn more of the "old, old story." In the cold season we work in the morning with the pilgrims on the way to and from Jagannath. On one occasion Caleb Hodgden was permitted to preach twice a day for three days in front of the idol at Cowpore. In fifty years' experience in India I have never known or heard of such a daring thing being done. Is not idolatry waning? At another fair, held at Anyou, we preached close by the sacred bulls carved in stone. After vainly attempting to drive away the people, the priests were among our best listeners.

**CHANDBALI.**—There are 3,009 villages in the Bhudruck subdivision, a large number of which have been visited by Mr. Coldren and the native preachers. Mr. Coldren says: There are many convinced of the value of Christianity, but the law of their society makes it very hard for them to confess. I believe that India is just now in a transition period, and much depends on the efforts of the present generation.

Titus Burder says: I thank God for another year among the Telugus. Daily I visit their villages, where the people gladly listen as I tell the story of salvation. The people are becoming more and more enlightened, and in many hearts where the Gospel is striving there will soon be victory.

F. W. Brown says: Though able to do very little in the vernacular, I have spent much time in the country with the native preachers. We have found many inquirers in our work, and I believe that many of them have saving faith.

**MIDNAPORE.**—M. C. Miner, who has been in the field but three months, has occupied his time with the language and English preaching to the boys in the Bible School.

E. B. Stiles says: The Bible School under Dr. Bachelier is a great evangelizing agent. I am confident that it has done a great deal in educating the masses and removing prejudice; and more than this, I am sure it has been the means of leading some to Christ.

Jacob Mishra is doing a good work by going out into the villages near the city with some of his church members to preach. Every day of delay in occupying such important centers as Chandrakona, Tumluk, and Contai, is a loss to the mission. In our itinerant work we meet with almost no opposition and have much to encourage us.

**JELLASORE.**—H. M. Bachelier says: The visit to Contai with Bro's Stiles and Miner was a very cheering one to me. The people were much interested in the preaching. We selected a site for a mission building when it shall be erected. We spent ten days in Dantoon and vicinity. Two native Bible women who were with us did good work among the women in the near villages.

#### V. ENGLISH WORK.

**CHANDBALI.**—During the first nine months of the year M. J. Coldren and F. W. Brown alternated in taking charge of the English services. Since January 1, Rev. Mr. Ager has conducted them. Bro. Brown says: We have witnessed no conversions, but have noticed a marked awakening in the lives of both English and native people.

**BHUDRUCK.**—F. W. Brown held a number of services here, some of which were very impressive.

**MIDNAPORE.**—E. B. Stiles says: Our great need for this work is a suitable building in the center of the town. The English work has been distributing tracts, the publication of an English monthly, and visiting from house to house. In December a temperance society was formed. I think it must be next to impossible for you at home to realize the importance of English work and English education in India. I think that the day is coming when English will be the leading language in India. We must prepare for that day.

#### VI. MEDICAL WORK.

**JELLASORE.**—H. M. Bachelier says: Last year a record of cases was promised, but we have little time for preparing statistics. This is a paying dispensary, but the expenditures exceed the receipts on account of the many sick ones who are poor. One hundred and fifty-one cases of fever, 115 of ophthalmia, 124 of itch, 50 of cough, 49 of ringworm, and 20 of various diseases have been treated. The most of these were Christians living near the village, and nearly all were cured.

**BALASORE.**—Nellie M. Phillips says:—Since having charge of the zepanas, they have occupied the greater part of my spare time. The dispensary is open during forenoons, and some attend daily.

**MIDNAPORE.**—O. R. Bachelier says: Prominence has not generally been given to medical reports, because of the suspicion that has rested upon it that it would absorb too much interest from the more direct evangelistic work, but now it has justly become rec-

ognized as an essential feature in the work. On account of other important engagements, we are not able to report over 2,000 cases. Besides these, our large Christian community adds greatly to our list of patients. The dispensary continues to be entirely self-supporting. At Bhimpore Mr. Burkholder has treated nearly as many cases as we at Midnapore. The grip came to us in April. Mortality was slight, and invariably from complications.

#### VII. THE MISSION PRESS.

O. R. Bachelier says: The Press has been from the first entirely self-supporting. Besides the usual edition of 1,000 copies of the Annual Report, the following items may be mentioned:

The Oriya department has been removed to Balasore. It is in charge of Mr. Boyer. There is now great competition by the natives in job work.

#### VIII. MIDNAPORE BIBLE SCHOOL.

O. R. Bachelier, acting principal, has two classes in the Bible, one in English and one in Sanscrit. Miss Butts has two classes in English, and her services are invaluable. Samuel Dass has two classes in Sanscrit and the mathematics and Bengali literature. He is a good and faithful preacher, and is almost invariably found at the bazar in the evening. Charles Sing has charge of the preparatory class. The course of study has been thirty-six weeks; number of pupils, 12.

Bazar preaching has fallen largely to the lot of the Bible School. One of the native preachers has died during the year. Among the scholars, one is a very efficient preacher, and others are promising in this direction.

The following is the course of instruction:

1. Careful study of the entire Bible is embraced in the four years' course.
2. One day in each week composition and preparation of skeleton sermons take the place of the Bible lesson.
3. The study of English and Sanscrit forms a portion of each day's work during the entire course.

4. Bengali literature and mathematics receive due attention.
5. The last month of the term is devoted to lectures on Church History, Physiology, Hygiene, and various other subjects of practical importance.

We commence the new year with 16 students—9 in the full course, 1 past graduate, and 6 in the preparatory department.

In conclusion:

1. The school is designed to prepare young men to engage in Christian work, as evangelists, pastors, teachers, and any other calling connected with the mission.
2. The native system of education does not give us such men as we can utilize as we wish. We want men who can *think*, not mere memorizers, and if we are to have them, we must *make* them. Hence the importance of our own schools with our Western ideas of education.
3. We are led to attach great importance to the preparatory class. One year and sometimes two have been allowed to prepare to enter the full course. It is found that where students take their preparatory course in other schools, they are a long time about it, acquire bad habits of study, and in too many instances fall into temptation and so are lost to us entirely. Hence we wish to make our own school more efficient and give to it a wider range.

## Report of Home Mission Society.

### CORRESPONDING SECRETARY'S REPORT.

The Executive Committee have become fully satisfied that the change of circumstances in Home Mission matters, brought about by the organization of local societies in nearly every State, will necessitate a change in the methods of raising funds to carry forward the work undertaken by this Society, and which in many instances is general in its nature and so located that local societies are not able to reach it. Let the local work go on, the more of it the better; but in a growing country like ours there must be a general work recognized and sustained by our people, or we must be left out when and where new cities and towns are planted in new States and Territories, and assistance is to be rendered to our colored brethren in the South.

The attempt has been made to carry on the local and denominational Home Mission work together, but we believe that the plan has been detrimental to both. Other and larger denominations have their State work and their denominational Home Mission work wrought out on different lines, so that the churches feel that there are two separate things to be accomplished, and set themselves to work accordingly. We ought to be raising \$50,000 a year from our churches for general mission work such as this Society is prosecuting, but the contributions from the churches for the past year scarcely amount to \$3,600. But for timely bequests, we could not have appropriated and paid, as we have, \$5,000 this year.

### CHURCH EXTENSION.

In the church extension department the largest amount has been received for any one year since the department was opened. We ought, however, to receive thousands where we receive hundreds. We have been expecting some wealthy, generous soul would bequeath, or, what is better, give while yet alive, \$100,000 to this department. This would make it possible to help one hundred churches or more at once to build edifices for worship, and then in five or ten years, when these churches became able to return their loans, to do the same thing again—make another hundred communities happy by giving them a Christian home and a pure Gospel, and so on, *ad infinitum*.

## REPORTS FROM SECRETARIES.

We have never received more regular and business-like reports from the various missionary fields than those sent us the present year, which shows good organizations and that proper care is being taken to note the work undertaken and accomplished. If the appropriations made could have been increased tenfold, the results might have been augmented twenty-fold.

## ITEMS FROM THE FIELDS.

Brooklyn, N. Y., which has been endeavoring to pay its debt on its church property, has been strengthened and encouraged by the timely aid rendered this year. This church will soon be in condition to help in all our missionary work.

Oakland, Cal., assisted for two years, now becomes self-sustaining, and has, we trust, bright prospects before it. We ought at once to direct the starting of another mission on the Pacific Coast, and as soon as one becomes self-sustaining, one or two more should be opened. The fields are already white for the harvest.

There has been a revival of interest in the mission work in the vicinity of Harper's Ferry. Rev. J. M. Arter has had charge of the mission. One hundred and seventy-five additions to the membership have been received during the year.

The church at Hagerstown, Md., has been revived and put on a firmer financial basis. It has secured a church, which has been partially paid for, and plans are made for completing the payment. The plans include the expectation of some further assistance from this Society, which it should hasten to render. The church in Baltimore will need the fostering care of the Society. The church at Pleasant Valley, Md., has recently purchased a lot of five acres on which to build a church, and the corner-stone of the edifice has been laid, the expense of building and lot will be \$700.

The veteran missionary for many years in the Mississippi Valley, Rev. J. S. Manning, was sent to his old field again, and in May Rev. D. A. Shaw was sent to his assistance. Their work opened well, but has been greatly hindered by the race prejudice which obtains in the South. If our own brethren there were free from this prejudice it would simplify the case somewhat, but some of them do not like to be directed by a Northern white man any more than the whites of the South enjoy the domination of the colored man.

Our missionaries are of the opinion that a school established in the vicinity of Cairo for our colored brethren who desire to fit themselves for teaching and the ministry, would be the most available agency to help our colored churches along the Mississippi Valley.

The interest in Lincoln, Neb., under the direction of Rev. O. E. Baker, has been advancing in the midst of difficulties. The location of the church has seemed unfortunate, but recently the enlargement of the city is in the direction that brings us nearer the center of population. Bro. Baker needs encouragement, and the interest must be sustained at all hazards.

Rev. B. F. Zell has had charge of the missionary work in No. Kansas. The endeavor has been to hold and cultivate a few important centers, from which hereafter it is hoped will radiate beams of Gospel light.

In Minnesota, Iowa, and Nebraska, good and true brethren are toiling with commendable zeal, patience, and self-sacrifice. They have been assisted to the extent of our ability. They are worthy of larger donations, and if our treasurer could tell where the funds could be found, the Board would vote them.

A new mission on the east side, in Cleveland, Ohio, has been opened under favorable circumstances, to which substantial aid has been rendered. Waterbury Center, Vt., has also been assisted. Appropriations have been made to the Maine State Missionary Society and to the Massachusetts Association.

## CONCLUSION.

This Society needs more prayers offered for the success of its work by all the members of the Free Baptist denomination, more consecration of themselves and their means to their Master's service. It needs more money and more men, and with these forthcoming it can do a grander work than the past has been able to show. Shall that grander work be done? The response must come from our membership throughout the country. With faith in God, with confidence in the everlasting truth which we preach, with true Christian courage, let us do our part in taking the world for Christ.

# Report of the Education Society.

## CORRESPONDING SECRETARY'S REPORT.

Alertness and thrift have characterized our educational work. A correspondence school of preparation for the ministry has been mentioned at Lewiston, Maine, and an English High School in India for our Mission Field is being pressed by Rev. M. J. Col-dren. At General Conference last October generous offerings were contributed for Storer College. Dr. Bachelor recently made us aware that a building for the Bible School at Midnapore needed to be forthcoming as the Government had for years granted land at nominal rent, on condition that the building be placed upon it. At the commencement of Hillsdale College the endowment for the president's chair was completed. But Hillsdale needs an increase of endowment, in order to keep pace with increasing demands.

Reports from ten schools and colleges permit your secretary to take a recent survey of the field. Hillsdale enters upon its thirty-sixth year with 250 students, 51 being students for the ministry. Aid to 30 persons has been granted the past year, amounting to \$774. At Bates College Dr. Fullonton has one class still in the Theological Department. "Prof. Anthony brings to the school, with his scholarship and Christian earnestness, the energy of youth." The endowment of the Fullonton Chair which he occupies awaits completion. Twenty students for the ministry remain; five graduated at commencement. The Latin School opens with 55 pupils, with the largest entering class it has ever had. The Institute at Lyndon Center, Vt., has 150 pupils. Recently \$5,000 have been appropriated to build a needed dormitory. Pike Seminary has 72 students.

Kenka College at Penn Yan, N. Y., is beginning its first academic year with 50 students. Two are students for the ministry. Their substantial building (200x60 feet) of five stories, including basement, has, besides lecture-rooms, sixty-four dormitories, arranged for two students each. From room rents, profits on Assembly, and interest on lot contracts, an annual income is insured of \$3,000. Seventy thousand dollars have been received for lots. Lots valued at forty thousand dollars are for sale. On the building and grounds \$80,000 have been spent. The property aggregates: Building, \$60,000; campus, \$10,000; grove, \$10,000; lots, \$41,000; lot contracts, \$20,000; dock, Assembly buildings, etc., \$3,000; total, \$143,000.

The West Virginia College at Flemington has had 40 students

during the year. Three are for the ministry. One has received twenty-five dollars in aid. Increased endowment would enable the school to do a wider work. Rio Grande College, Ohio, has 37 students, with one for the ministry. Rochester Seminary, Wisconsin, has secured as its principal, Rev. J. P. Hewes. The year opens with 16 students, with others in prospect. Increased facilities might again call from that territory one hundred pupils.

At Parker College, Minnesota, over 120 students have been in attendance during the year. Twelve or more are preparing for the ministry. Sixty-five students begin the new year together. Before May 1, 1891, the \$7,130 lacking must be raised for the Theological Chair in order to secure the endowment promised conditionally by Mr. L. D. Parker, and then the school will have an endowment of \$65,000, and real estate sufficient to make a total property of over \$100,000. Twenty-five lots are for sale.

## Sunday-School Union.

EXTRACT FROM REPORT OF THE REV. H. F. WOOD, COR. SEC'Y  
OF FREE BAPTIST SUNDAY-SCHOOL UNION, 1890.

We have good reason to believe that more and better work has been done in our Sunday-schools during the last year than ever before. And what is true of the schools of our own denomination is equally true of all others. The reports from all parts of the world received at the First World's S. S. in London plainly indicate this.

The Sunday-school work of the world was never in so good condition and making such rapid progress as to-day. We note with pleasure an encouraging gain over last year in the circulation of our S. S. publications. During the last quarter the circulation of the *Senior Quarterly* was 33,000, and that of the *Junior Quarterly* 16,000, and that of the *Primary Quarterly* 12,000. The *Myrtle* now has a circulation of 9,299, and the *Myrtle Buds* 4,788. Our own publications are equal to the best, and are surely best for Free Baptists. There is no good reason why they should not find a place in all our schools.

The Advocates of Christian Fidelity have now a membership of between 6,000 and 10,000, and the *Dayspring*, their organ, has a subscription list of between 7,000 and 8,000. While the number of conversions has by no means been so large as it should have been, we are glad to report that there have been more than in any other year. This results from more direct purpose and earnest effort to bring the unsaved to Christ. But after the chil-

dren are converted, in too many cases they are kept out of the church, even when they come knocking at its doors for admission. How few churches have any members under twelve or fifteen years of age. Very many have not a child member. Some have only one, two, or three to a hundred adults. Surely there must be some mistake somewhere. Let us seek for it, and when it is found apply the remedy.

The Sunday-school is finding a larger and warmer place in our large gatherings. Reports from churches, Quarterly Meetings, Yearly Meetings, and Associations almost invariably state the condition of the Sunday-school. While more and more of the members of our churches are taking their places in the Sunday-school, far too many of them are still outside. Some of our schools maintain normal classes, using the Chautauqua series with very great profit, and in a few of them the weekly teachers' meeting is maintained.

More of our people are seeing the importance of town, county, and State conventions, and the good results of this conviction are already manifest. It is a sad fact that there are few in our schools between the ages of sixteen and twenty. And the great majority of those between these ages who are in our schools are ladies. We fail to interest and hold the young men.

One says, "The young men nearly all step out." Another says, "As a general thing we fail to hold the young men." What is the cause and what is the remedy?

We find a most hopeful indication in the increasing interest in children's days, children's meetings, and juvenile bands of various names. We are glad that more direct effort is being made to save the children than ever before. While we rejoice in what has been done in and by our Sunday-schools, let us, in the Master's name, go forward to yet larger and better things.




