## ECLIPSES FOR THE YEAR 1894.

There will be four eclipses this year, two of the sun and two of the moon.

I. A Partial Eclipse of the Moon March 21, invisible in New England. The beginning is visible in the western portion of North America, the Pacific ocean, and nearly all of Asia; and the end visible in Alaska, the Pacific ocean, and all of Asia.

II. An Annular Eclipse of the Sun April 5, 6, invisible in New England but visible in Asia and a part of Europe and Africa.

III. A Partial Eclipse of the Moon Sept. 14, 15, visible in New England and visible generally in the western portions of Europe and Africa, the Atlantic ocean, North and South America, and the eastern part of the Pacific ocean.

Begins at Boston, Mass., 10h. 35.6m. P. M.; middle 11h. 31.6m. P. M.; ends 12h. 27.7m. A. M.

IV. A Total Eclipse of the Sun Sept. 28, 29, invisible in New England but visible in the eastern part of Africa, the southern part of Asia and Australia, and in the Indian ocean.

## TRANSIT OF MERCURY (1894).

There will be a Transit of Mercury over the Sun's disk Nov. 10, visible in New England and visible generally in the western portions of Europe, as well as in Africa, North and South America, and the Pacific ocean.

For Boston, Mass., ingress begins at 10h. 55.7m. A. M.; egress ends at 4h. 12.1m. P. M.

## EXPLANATION.

Formerly the computations were naturally expressed in local time, this being practically the same for any phenomenon for places in the same latitude.

The introduction of the new time system, however, demands a change, so that a table of correction becomes necessary, as given below.

The calendar quantities are for the meridian and latitude of Boston, expressed in the present time system. For the other places, given in the table below, add to or subtract from the calendar times, as expressed in said table.

For places not in table, find the correction from the place nearest in longitude to the one in question, and apply this. A still closer result would be obtained by finding two places in the table, one a little east and the other a little west, and estimating the correction between.

Each person had better mark on the margin of his REGISTER the addition or subtraction for his own locality, and apply this correction whenever he looks for the time of any event.

The Eastern time belt ends, and the Central begins, near the western borders of New York and Pennsylvania.

For places still using the old local time, no use is to be made of this table, but 16 minutes are invariably to be added to the REGISTER time.

[here insert the amount], to be, by my said Executor, paid over to the Treasurer of said Society, in . . . . . days [or months] after my decease, to be used for the purposes for which said Society was incorporated [or for the Permanent Fund]."

In giving real estate the word "devise" should be used after "bequeath."

## Report of the Foreign Mission Society.

---

### CORRESPONDING SECRETARY'S REPORT.

#### THE FIELD.

An abstract taken from the India report of the work in the field will be published as usual, but we give here a general outline of affairs as they have come to the attention of the Secretary.

The interest on the part of the missionaries and native Christians has been unabated, but an unusual number of changes have interfered with the work. At the beginning of the year Rev. and Mrs. Brown returned to America on account of protracted illness, and later they withdrew from our work, much to our regret.

In the spring our veteran missionaries, Dr. and Mrs. Bacheler, returned, on account of the delicate health of Dr. Bacheler. It was their purpose to remain in America the rest of their days, but the change has restored former vitality and former zeal, and already they entertain the hope of returning to India in due time.

Dr. Nellie M. Phillips, after twelve years of service, also returned for her well earned furlough in change and recuperation.

Rev. and Mrs. Griffin and their family came a little later, from sheer necessity, for Mrs. Griffin had fought for her life for two years. She is much improved and is already at work with her husband in the interests of India.

The health of Mrs. E. B. Stiles has been giving way for two years. For a while they tried Darjeeling, but it was manifest that she could not recover there. They have reluctantly come to America, hoping for a speedy restoration and return to their beloved work.

This large exodus depletes our force and gives us the hard question to solve, how to occupy the field with those remaining. Mr. Stiles was elected principal of the Bible School when Dr. Bacheler relinquished it, but since he has not been able to attend to it, it is left with Mr. Miner, Miss Butts, and the native teachers.

The work has been pushed at Contai, and we understand that the station is ready for the missionaries assigned to it—Rev. and Mrs. Hallam.

Fifty-nine have been added to the churches by baptism. The regular and the jungle work have been kept up as fully as circumstances would admit.

Rev. and Mrs. Coldren, Rev. and Mrs. Burkholder, Mrs. Smith, and Miss Hattie Phillips returned to their former stations last fall, and carried fresh zeal into the work.

#### AT HOME.

In the meantime we have done our best to help adjust affairs to these changes. A larger amount of money than usual has been necessary for transportation, extra appropriations also have been made for the new work at Contai, and one of the most difficult of our tasks has been to supply our treasury.

Five new missionaries are ready to sail this fall, and possibly another will be ready to go with them. They are Rev. and Mrs. Geo. H. Hamlen, Rev. and Mrs. Herbert E. Wyman, also Miss Edna Wile of Nova Scotia. The other possible candidate is Miss Gaunce of New Brunswick. Mr. Hamlen is a graduate of Bates College and Theological School, and is assigned to the Balasore Boys' High School. Mr. Wyman is a graduate of the Theological School.

## THINGS ESPECIALLY HOPEFUL.

The Free Baptists of Nova Scotia have helped in supporting a missionary for some years, but this year they send out their first missionary; this will certainly increase their interest and devotion, and their blessing.

A basis of coöperation in Foreign Mission work has been agreed upon between us and the "Church of God." It was submitted by us and accepted by the "General Eldership" as follows:

- "1. Resolved, That the Eldership enter at once upon Foreign Mission work.
- "2. Resolved, That we accept the first proposition submitted to us by Rev. Thomas H. Stacy from the Free Baptist Foreign Mission Board.
- "3. Resolved, That upon the adoption of the foregoing resolutions we proceed to elect two persons who shall be members of the Foreign Mission Board.
- "4. Resolved, That the Board of Missions of the General Eldership have supervision of the Foreign Mission work of the 'Church of God,' and that they be asked to devise ways and means at once for securing money for the work and sending missionaries to the field."

We trust that it means more help for India and a great blessing to 40,000 people who heretofore have had no definite work in this direction. Will not all of us heartily welcome this step?

It is the wish of the Board to utilize all the returned missionaries as fully as circumstances will warrant, and it is deemed expedient to put a general agent into the field to work exclusively for the Foreign Mission Society. We expect Rev. Z. F. Griffin to be that agent during the coming year. For these prospects we thank God and take courage.

## IN GENERAL.

There has been a deficiency in the treasury for about two years. It ought to be somebody's business to keep the people in touch with the opportunities and needs of the mission, so that deficiencies may be quickly met.

Do we intend—or will we thoughtlessly turn away from the men and women at the front and trusting us for support? Will we allow generation after generation committed to our care to die with no knowledge of a Saviour? We have a peculiar trust, a great responsibility, a serious matter to answer for before God; it means more than holding the fort in gospel-hardened America.

The spirit of missions ought to obtain more largely in our churches: for the most part the interest is in home work, and frequently the church is the end of its own service. Twenty-three persons are reported as state agents for home work. Their work is to strengthen weak churches and to organize new ones; in every sense it is home work. The Foreign Mission work has not a man at home devoted exclusively to its work, and the cause suffers in consequence.

Do you say that we cannot do differently? I am not willing to admit it. Small outlay and small expectancy bring small returns; "according to your faith be it unto you." God is showing us in this missionary age that he is able to thrust thousands of missionaries into the field through means which represent no particular church, and yet these missionaries come from all of the churches. It is the missionary spirit that is doing this; no attempt to build up denominations, but to save the lost. God would be a great deal better pleased with us and we would secure the promise and the right to perpetuity if instead of continually setting up political machinery, piling over theological lumber, flirting with larger denominations, looking out a soft place to drop into, we would set ourselves to the work of rescuing the perishing in earnest.

The church is not an end but a means; and that church or denomination whose great efforts are put forth to build herself up has lost the genius of the Gospel. Let her save men and she will strong. The value of a church is not in her numbers so much as in her efficiency, and that is manifest in the good she does to the world. God will never dispense with her so long as she is doing an indispensable work; and there never was a greater opportunity in the field of evangelization than the present day affords.

A great necessity—in my mind—of a man to devote himself entirely to the work at home will be met, very largely at least, in Mr. Griffin. I shall not be satisfied until this plan has a fair trial, and let us hope that he will have opportunity to test it fully.

Another necessity is a superintendent for the foreign field. This is the plan adopted by many societies at the present time. However conscientious the missionaries are, from the nature of things, each has the deepest interest in his own station and his special department of work. A superintendent can be juster to any station in its relation to the whole field than the missionary at that station. He can do more for those places outside of all stations and provide for the work in general. The questions of Christian schools and unchristian teachers, government grants, general evangelistic work, native agency, the establishment of new stations, and many others, should be thought out with the station missionaries, by a superintendent.

To fail to secure and sustain these two men for fear it will hazard the interest of Home Mission work is unworthy both of ourselves and the last great command of Him "whose we are and whom we serve." To fail to do this for fear the end will not justify the means evinces a lack of faith in God and in the policy of the most successful of modern missions.

The large amount of illness among our missionaries and numerous changes in consequence so detrimental to our work lead me to question whether we are praying for the work and the workers as faithfully as we should; they need the support of our prayers.

Let us be very careful to push the card system and make the special days a help instead of a hindrance to this.

Let us enter upon the year's opportunities with courage and expectancy. It is God's cause, and he will honor the work that we do and the faith that we exercise in his name.

## ABSTRACT OF THE INDIA REPORT.

*For the year ending March 31, 1893.*

Another year has gone and we send out to our friends this brief report of work done. We have met with the usual joys and sorrows. Satan has not left us to work uninterruptedly, neither have we had to fight our battles alone, for Christ, faithful to his promise, has been with us. Rich experiences have been enjoyed, and there are no faint-hearted ones among us.

Our native ministry have shown many signs of steadfastness. Some of them are becoming strong men and good messengers of Christ to their countrymen.

Early in the year Miss Jessie Hooper went home with health much impaired. In September Rev. and Mrs. Brown went because of the poor state of Bro. Brown's health. At the close of the year Rev. and Mrs. Griffin and children, Dr. Nellie Phillips with Mrs. Boyer's children, and Dr. and Mrs. Bacheler all went to take well earned and deserved rest. Dr. Bacheler's departure was fifty-two years, five months, and ten days after his first landing in India. We have seriously felt the loss of so many, but we have been cheered by the return to the field of Mrs. Smith, Miss H. P. Phillips, Rev. and Mrs. Burkholder, and Rev. and Mrs. Coldren. These all came back to resume the work they had left.

It is hoped the friends at home will be impressed with the need for more men and women to fill the places of those who must rest.

Mr. J. B. Rae reports:—

*Bazar Preaching.*—This has been kept up as usual at two appointed stations. Many listen respectfully, and many inquire into the truth. One case has become very hopeful. The interest increases among the native gentlemen. They attend our English services whenever we hold them. There seem to be many secret disciples.

*Itinerating.*—Three native preachers, three colporteurs, two native Christian women, Mrs. Rae, and myself have been out in the district, parts of December, January, February, and March. Scores of villages have been visited, the message has been heartily preached and eagerly heard. Idol worship is on the wane. Temple service is falling into neglect. The truth is finding entrance into darkened minds. The work is very hopeful.

Mrs. Smith reports:—

After a furlough of twenty months, on the 20th of January I returned to the Sinclair Orphanage and again took up the work. The superintendency of this work, together with the mission girls' day school, six Bible women, a large Bible class, and several other inter-

ests, had been in the hands of Miss Coombs during my absence. Much credit is due Miss Coombs for the able manner in which she has managed these interests. The Orphanage now has thirty-seven inmates, the day school seventy-six.

Miss Coombs reports:—

We were kept in comparative good health through drought and cholera, and on the whole made advancement. After Mrs. Smith returned I took charge of two out-stations, several Bible women, and the book room in the bazaar. The little school in connection with the book room for poor children is looked after by the man in charge of the room. The man is a Christian and gives the children Christian instruction. One month he reported seventy-five as having visited the room with whom he had religious conversation.

The work with the Bible women is interesting because they receive the message so eagerly, disheartening because they are prevented from publicly accepting the Saviour by family bondage and the rigid rules of caste.

At Baliapal there is only one Christian family, but another is to move there soon.

Metrapore is in about the same condition. Sunday services are conducted for them at the present by preachers from Balasore. We hope they may have a pastor living with them soon. Two young men and their wives from this place have been studying in Balasore during the past year, getting ready for future work when needed.

Miss H. P. Phillips reports:—

After my absence from the country I find many changes, many of them indicating large and glorious possibilities. The organization of the A. C. F. among the larger boys seems to be a blessing. Several of them have taken charge of little Sunday-schools in and about Balasore. Several of them teach in our Christian Sunday-school.

Mrs. Rae assists me in the supervision of ten schools and all the zenanas.

The ten lower primary girls' schools made over to me have now 400 pupils, with an average attendance of 276. Frequent *punjahs* and the annual marriage epidemic breaks in upon our work. One school has just had thirty marriages out of a membership of 100; about ten of these are lost to the school. Fifteen teachers and twelve women to gather the children are employed. The zenanas show that our mission there is accomplishing a great work. The number of pupils under instruction here is 167, with 10 teachers.

Mrs. Boyer reports:—

There are at present 39 boys in the Orphanage. The average for the year is 36. I have studied their dispositions and tried to gain and keep their confidence as a mother would that of her boys. They sweep, bear water, make their clothes, study, and have some time for play every day.

*The Mission School* fell to me when Mr. Griffin left. I spend a portion of each day teaching there.

There are three Bible women at Balasore supported by New Brunswick people. A few months ago these with Mrs. Griffin's were made over to Miss Coombs.

The A. C. F.'s have had regular and well attended meetings. Active members take turns in leading. Spiritual growth is apparent. Improvement is greatly needed. I often wish that I knew the young folks at home were praying for this little band.

The Hindu Sunday-schools have been kept up all the year. I try to visit one each Sunday. The schools are all held in a mud hut or on a veranda. They sing, have a simple Bible story, and use a simple catechism.

SINGLA is twenty-five miles from Balasore. A colporter named Besu and his wife live here and work daily among their Hindu neighbors.

UJURDA.—Seed sown here about two years ago has become a fruitful tree. Ujurda has now eight Christian families. Eleven persons have been baptized since last report. Though poor all contribute regularly of their earnings to the Lord's cause. The school, at

one time numbering sixty pupils, now numbers about twenty children and two teachers. The parents taking fright when the chief man of the village was baptized have kept their children at home. Daniel Nayak is shepherd of this flock, and a house is being built for him. Two converts have been recently disciplined. Both confessed their faults and asked forgiveness. There has been much to rejoice over. Will those interested in young people's societies remember us?

Mrs. H. C. Phillips says:—

We visited Santipore during February. It is the only place this side the "river" that seems like home to me, and I would gladly live there again. The place blossoms with thrift. The spiritual needs of the people are being cared for; the children are trained quite well. The S.antal school opened a year ago last January, with about thirty boys and girls, does better than I expected. They enjoy singing very much.

The people supplied us with more food than we could use, and we left what we did not need for the Q. M.

Not less than five hundred children come in from the different schools to receive their prizes.

#### CHANDBALI.

Rev. M. J. Coldren reports:—

After a pleasant but busy two and a half years in America I took over this charge from Bro. Hallam on the first of December. I find plenty to do. My home visit helps me to get a better view of my work here. I appreciate my native brethren more, and see that the ingathering must be made by the Holy Spirit. We will give ourselves faithfully to the preaching of the word.

*English Work.*—I hold an English service every Sabbath at 6 P. M. All the Europeans in the place attend and English-speaking native gentlemen sometimes. Sometimes fifteen have been present; sometimes only the port officer, excepting my own family.

*Chandbali Middle English School.*—This school is not so full as it was a few years ago. We have changed two of the teachers and hope it may be more prosperous. The attendance fluctuates; many of the children, being farmers' boys, work during the busy season.

*Wisconsin Village Schools.*—These have been given up for lack of Christian teachers, but the people have devoted their money to colporteurs and evangelists. One hundred and twenty-five dollars will build houses for and sustain two Christian men in the work a whole year, and that means *three hundred and sixty-five sermons* for each of them.

*Evangelistic Work.*—We have done what we could since our return, and the way is opening for more. I have a comfortable boat for the native preachers, and two of them are expected to be in the country work all the year. I am with them all that I can be spared from the station. I am determined to press the evangelistic work with all vigor during the next ten years. Should I be spared 3000 villages in the Bhudruck subdivision must be visited as soon as men and means will permit it to be done. These centers which I propose to establish in large villages at suitable distances will serve well this general plan. I think I can reach every village in twenty years, and preach the Gospel so thoroughly in each that every man, woman, and child may hear the good news. I believe I have as faithful men to work with me as there are in the mission or any mission. They work because they love the work and have a realization that they are servants of God and not simply employees of the mission. I have ever tried to make my men feel that they were not employed by me, but by the Lord, and to him they are responsible.

Instead of being a kind of police to watch them, I am a fellow-laborer, responsible to the same Master that they are, and I believe they can be trusted to go to their work without any suggestion or order of mine. It is pleasant to work with such helpers, and then we seek deeper experiences every day. At daylight every morning they come to my study and we have a *preparation* prayer-meeting to help us in the day's work. During the year villages have been visited.

Rev. Rama Jenna reports:—

During the year 877 visits have been made to villages, markets, *jatras*, and bazars by the native preachers, of whom two worked all the year and one for three months. The church has held regular services during the year, Sunday-school in the morning, preaching at 3 P. M., prayer-meeting every Wednesday, and a special prayer-meeting for the Christian workers every morning at daylight. The usual attendance is 63, the majority of them Hindus. Many believe in Jesus with the head but not with the heart, and do not get courage to confess him.

The church-members tithe their income with one or two exceptions.

Mrs. Coldren reports:—

The care of the woman's work of this place came into my hands in December last. Since July four women have been going two by two among the neighboring villages. They are well received. In February a class for special instruction of Christian children was begun. The children come to the mission house each morning.

Our Sunday-school numbers about fifty. Most of the children are Hindus; eight are Christians. Appropriate Christmas exercises were held for the children; over 150 were present. The next night we started for Bhudruck to visit the native Christians and help them give a treat to the Sunday-school. The school is composed mostly of Hindu girls; several Christian children are among them. They recited Scripture texts and sang Christian hymns.

The teachers for the day school, and nearly all for the Sunday-school, are women. The people of Bhudruck made the children presents of a cloth—which means a dress—and native sweetmeats, toys, and books. This Sunday-school is well organized and seems to be doing excellent work. Mrs. Ager will report the work of the Bible women.

Rev. E. C. B. Hallam reports:—

I remained in charge at Chandbali until the return of Mr. Coldren. No changes in methods were made in his absence. The work was sustained in the bazar and market with usual interest. Many were almost persuaded to be saved, but still they fell short of accepting Christ as a personal Saviour.

The Sunday services were maintained as usual. Lessons from the Gospels illustrated by Bible pictures were given to the class composed of Hindu lads; the International Lessons were reserved for Christians only, in the afternoon.

Two prayer-meetings were held weekly.

A series of Bible readings was instituted and given twice a week, which all our Christians usually attended.

Since Mr. Coldren's return we have taken up our abode at Balasore temporarily until the station at Kanthi is ready for occupancy. Have been visiting places where work seemed specially called for.

## KANTHI.

Rev. E. C. B. Hallam reports:—

In November the Board requested the writer to settle in and commence regular work in Kanthi. This is an important center, the occupancy of which some of us have desired for thirty or forty years. The way at length seems to be opening. A plot of land has been secured, and the erection of a mission house is now in progress, under the superintendence of Mr. Ager.

A visit to Kanthi by the writer and his wife showed the impracticability of its immediate occupancy until a permanent residence is constructed. Mr. Ager is there pushing on the work of building. In January the writer attended a *jatra* at Khandarai. The rajah made Dr. Bacheler and the writer and his party thoroughly welcome. We arrived in time to participate in a religious service on the rajah's premises conducted by Brother Sachidananda Rai. It was soul-stirring. The ladies of the zenana were located so they could hear unseen. We enjoyed excellent opportunities for preaching the word. Many heard.

We made another tour to Kanthi later in the season. Three native workers there are daily engaged in preaching and tract distribution. Another is under appointment. Religious services on the Lord's day are maintained; resident Bengali gentlemen attend sometimes.

*Literary Work.*—During the year the writer has completed some tracts in Oriya and Bengali. Some for Christian, others for Hindu readers. In all eight—four in each vernacular. He has also undertaken to prepare the International Sunday-school Lessons in Oriya only.

Mrs. Hallam reports:—

The weekly prayer-meetings were held and the regular work prosecuted after our return to Chandbali from holding evangelistic services in Balasore and Bhudruck. After turning over the work to Mr. Coldren we have made our home at Balasore and made tours to Kanthi. Dr. Mary Bacheler and I made several visits to the women of the rajah's household at Khandarai. They took us by the hand and showed us all over their houses. They showed us their jewels, but a more pleasing sight was the wife of the rajah's son and her little boy, the heir, trying to learn a sweet Bengali Christian hymn. Mrs. Smith has kindly lent us a couple of efficient women to begin work here. I go out with them nearly every day. Some Brahmins have invited us into their homes and listened to the word. They are pleased to hear our Christian hymns. We need an appropriation for native helpers here.

Mrs. Ager reports:—

Work at Balasore and Kanthi has taken us from Bhudruck, our station, with the exception of five months. Mr. and Mrs. Coldren took the oversight of the work there when we left it, and they say it is going on as usual. Last June two people from Hinduism and two from a Christian family were added to the church by baptism. We hope to return to our station after the mission house is finished in June.

## BHIMPORE.

Rev. T. W. Burkholder reports:—

After an absence of a little over two years it was our privilege again to join the brethren in the work here in India. Our joy in meeting all at the annual gathering cannot be told in words; and after the close of the Yearly Meeting, returning to our home here in the jungles, as we took up the duties and responsibilities of another term of service our hearts overflowed in thankfulness to the Giver of all good for the way in which everything had been looked after by Brother and Sister Stiles during our absence. It seldom falls to the lot of missionaries to have their work so ably and well provided for in their absence as was ours.

The pastor of the church, Pellaram Kisku (*Joseph Odell*), was ordained to the regular work of the ministry at the Yearly Meeting, being the first Santal ordained in the mission. His ordination is a cause for gratitude. Pellaram reports for the *Bhimapore church* as follows: By the Lord's blessing the church is growing daily. During the past year twenty were baptized, some from heathen families and some from Christian homes. Church services and Sunday-school are regularly maintained. On Fridays the teachers meet to study the Sunday-school lesson. Four evenings of the week prayer-meetings are held at different houses, led by young men of the church. The pastor goes among them in turn. A number of the women go from house to house, village to village daily, teaching the word. A Christian Endeavor Society and a training class for workers have been organized.

We have weekly, monthly, and yearly giving. Our past yearly giving, for five days, the first week in January, was an occasion of real help and joy. All classes and conditions of church-members brought in gifts, ranging from a chicken's egg to the live chicken itself; also live cattle, sheep, goats, and produce from the gardens and fields.

Remember to pray for us.

Mr. Burkholder says:—

*Bhimapore Training School.*—Both teachers and pupils have been faithful during the past year. Eight boys and five girls passed government examinations successfully; one girl received a scholarship for one year. There are 130 names on the rolls, 40 of which are girls'.

*The Industrial Department* of the school continues, every one being required to work two hours every afternoon except Saturday at rope and basket making, cloth weaving, sewing, carpentry, and general outside clearing up. No exception is made in regard to this work and attendance upon divine service.

*Jungle Schools.*—There were sixty of these during the past year, and nearly all taught by men trained by the mission. In these sixty schools there are 1674 pupils, 1411 boys and 263 girls.

*Ulda Church.*—It was just beginning when we went away. Bro. Stiles opened the work and baptized quite a number. It is one of the most encouraging places of labor. The people rejoice in the Lord's service. During a week's stay the entire church-membership attended every service. Their interest seemed genuine. Eight persons were baptized during that week and added to the church roll, making their number twenty-nine. They have a good mud chapel which they built themselves.

*CHITRAPATHAR.*—This little interest still progresses. We baptized five there during last cold season. Champai Murmu and his wife, supported by Bro. Hill of Northwood, N. H., are doing good work. The separate work at Garisole is discontinued, and

the interest is absorbed in the mother church at Bhimpore. A hopeful interest is growing up at Dadara. A number of Christian families live there and hold Sunday-school and service every Lord's day. We thank our home friends for assisting the Santal work. None in our mission is more promising.

*Country Work.*—We spent what time we were able visiting branch churches and the homes of Christian families. Wherever we went our hearts were cheered. We saw many destitute places ready for the sickle. Our prayer is for workers and means.

*Medical Work.*—This has occupied considerable of our time. A knowledge of medicine gives me a special opportunity to reach some not otherwise reached. Medical supplies and instruments are needed.

Mrs. Burkholder reports:—

*Work at Bhimpore.*—On our return we found the work in good order. Mr. and Mrs. Stiles took good care of it. We now employ four women Bible readers in this village and four who live at a distance. Our older school girls work with the women. A training class for the older boys and another for the larger girls have been started. During our camping tour I was deeply impressed with the necessity of getting the girls from the distant villages into our training school. We are getting some of them in. In our boys' orphanage we have fourteen, twelve belonging to us and two boarders. In the girls' orphanage we have five boarders and twelve orphans.

In the primary department of our day school we have seventy-eight pupils with three teachers. Last year the five girls who went up for government examinations all passed; one received a scholarship. We are grateful to the Woman's Board for regular contributions. Seventy-five cents a month comfortably supports a girl with us. Ordinarily many of them know nothing of books or chastity till they come to us.

Last month five from our orphanage were received into the church by baptism and seven children from our Christian families.

The Sunday morning service for children is well attended. The field is widening and brightening. We rely on Him for success whose arm has brought salvation.

*Evangelistic.*—Our cold season visiting showed us the greatness of the work and the fewness of the laborers. The employment of lay evangelists is meeting with success.

Rev. E. B. Stiles reports:—

For the greater part of the year I have been so much like "a man without a country" that I have nothing to report. The work at Bhimpore was nominally in my hands till the end of November, although I was there but very little after the end of August. The way in which the work went on during our absence speaks well for the faithfulness of our Santal workers. I learned to love the Santal brethren very much during my two years among them and would like to continue to work with them.

In August we went to Darjeeling for a change; returned in October; went back by the doctor's orders, where Mrs. Stiles remains on her sick bed. Owing to this sickness my work has been interrupted, and some of my work has fallen on the brethren. I entered upon my work in the Bible school March 6, but was obliged to leave it in about two

weeks. Mr. Miner has charge, and he and Miss Butts conduct the classes that were in my hands, beside their own. Our trials have been blessed to our good, and we thank the Father for his consolations.

Rev. M. C. Miner reports:—

*Bazar preaching* has been kept up. Aside from the church pastor, our preaching force consists mostly of the Bible school students. We often meet men in the country who have heard our bazar preaching.

*Sunday-School.*—This has been pushed with vigor. There are a number of Sunday-schools in town: the one at the church has been better than last year. Teachers' meetings have had good attendance. There are thirteen classes.

*Evangelistic.*—The cold season was long and pleasant, consequently much country work was done. I was out 66 days; Mrs. Miner and the children 58. Our time was mostly spent in Keshpore, Chundrakona, and Tumlook. The preachers went in another direction, and we did the best we could reading the Word, singing, and talking with the people. We had large gatherings and many signs of interest. One man and his wife came nine miles to confess their faith in Christ, but when the time came they failed to appear for baptism. At Tumlook we were able to secure a first-class building site for a future mission house but did not do much evangelistic work. We can go into Tumlook as soon as the money for the station and the missionary are ready.

*Press.*—The work has been large, but on account of competition it was done on a very small margin. The Oriya department has been put in order and Oriya tracts published. If money were available, valuable service could be rendered by printing tracts. Last year's surplus was used to buy Bengali type, and more is needed.

Dr. Bacheler reports:—

*The Bible School.*—After Stiles left for Darjeeling Miner took his work and taught the Bible classes. Miner and Miss Butts took the English classes. The other work went on as formerly. There have been twenty in the school this year. Full course graduates, two. Partial course graduate, one. Samuel was head master. Champai had the preparatory classes. Jacob Misra assisted in the Bible classes. Examinations showed progress quite up to the average.

Mr. Miner reports:—

*DAINMARI.*—The Dainmari church has been disbanded, and the names remaining added to the Midnapore church. Wicked men professing Christianity have worked much harm here.

*BABAIGADIA* moves on as in former years. Charley has visited the church about once a month. Extra work has been opened near here.

*PALASBANI* remains about the same. Charley has preached to them. Narah has carried on village work in twelve villages in this neighborhood, and worked faithfully. Famine has distressed the people much, and it is a question how they shall obtain their seed rice.

Miss E. M. Butts reports:—

The work of the Industrial School, the Ragged Schools, and the Woman's Department of the Bible School has been continued as reported last year. One boy passed from the Industrial to the Upper Primary, and fifteen passed from the Ragged Schools to the Lower Primary. The wives of two or three of the Santal Bible School students have made very commendable progress.

Dr. Mary W. Bacheler reports:—

*Zenana Work.*—The number of pupils under instruction have been somewhat less during the past year; the number of teachers about the same, varying from thirteen to seventeen. Total number of pupils 240. Monthly average 80. The rules with regard to

religious teaching are gradually made more strict. The majority are willing to learn to read and write. During the past year Bible stories have been taught in all houses, and some pupils have learned them well and quickly.

*Medical Work.*—The dispensary has continued its work for those who came for treatment. The season has been unusually healthy, and the number of patients has been smaller than usual. The dispensary is self-supporting. A small number have been visited and treated in their homes.

Work here was in charge of Mr. Brown, and it went on well until he was obliged to return to America. Mr. Ager has been detailed to superintend the construction of the mission house at Kanthi, and so has not been able to be here much. The native helpers have been faithful.

Mr. and Mrs. Brown gave the work a good start until sickness took them away. The native workers have done nobly, and the truth abides in their hearts. The Christian village is prosperous and the church is in earnest.

## Report of the Home Mission Society.

---

### CORRESPONDING SECRETARY'S REPORT.

It is always a pleasure to report progress, hence my duty in presenting this report becomes a very pleasant one. During the past year a decided advance has been made in our home mission work. Waning interests have been revived, new churches organized, older ones strengthened; best of all, hundreds have been converted. One church alone which has been assisted by this society reports more than sixty additions. Notwithstanding the "hard times" several new church edifices have been or are being erected. This shows great faith in God and in his blessed work. We believe that heaven will crown such efforts with success, since we are told that "according to our faith it shall be unto us." In order that all may better appreciate the progress made let us look for a moment at the finances. The year began with an indebtedness of \$1918.93, and closed with a balance on hand of \$1155.41.

There has been according to the treasurer's report a gain in the total contributions of \$3607.68 over the year 1892, and of \$4541.06 over 1891. In other words the total contributions have more than doubled in the past three years, the figures being in 1891, \$3803.40; 1893, \$8344.46. Another encouraging item, we are able to report for the first time the following amounts of money raised and expended by the several state organizations in state work: Maine, \$4607.30; Minnesota, \$2800; Michigan, \$1500; New Hampshire \$1297.42; North Nebraska, \$1273; Iowa, \$606.91; Massachusetts, \$97.69; total amount reported for state work, \$12,182.32; for home missions, \$20,526.78. We regret that we have been unable to obtain reports from the other state organizations among us; hence cannot present to the denomination at large any accurate idea of how much money we are raising from year to year for home mission work. We still believe that such a report if complete and accurate, would not only prove to be most interesting but also of great practical benefit in the work. Will not therefore every state agent or treasurer kindly see that such an annual report is forwarded to the treasurer or corresponding secretary in the future.

Reports from our field in the South continue to be encouraging, especially when we consider the very meager appropriations we have been able to make. Professor Brackett is "still holding the fort" at Harper's Ferry in the face of difficulties that would weaken the faith of a less heroic and godly man. The needs of Storer College must increase rather than decrease from year to year, hence our gifts must also increase or this noble institution will very soon be seriously crippled.

In regard to the work in the Shenandoah Valley he writes, "So far as I can see our churches are all doing fairly well. Several of them are building or improving their property. The Baltimore church hopes soon to occupy a building that it is raising funds to purchase. Brother Wainwright has been faithful and vigilant in his work as a missionary. Several new and important interests have sprung up as one result of his labors. I will not speak of the depressing influence of 'the times' on our financial prospects, but simply say that we are struggling on, trusting and hoping for better days."

These encouraging reports and especially the increased contributions during the past year have greatly strengthened our faith in the work. Believing that all our constituency need, in order to have our wants supplied, is a careful, conscientious presentation of facts,

we would urgently request all our workers and especially pastors to present our wants from time to time to the people. The setting apart of a special day for home missions by the Conference Board, the returns from which amounted to some \$2000, affords one opportunity which no faithful pastor ought to neglect. Perhaps a single illustration of the kind of appeals for help we are constantly receiving may not be out of place just here. The church which sends this appeal is located in a growing city of six thousand inhabitants, separated by a small stream from the capital city of the state, which numbers twelve thousand inhabitants. The pastor who is soon to locate with this church writes, "Our church was the first one located in this place when it numbered only three or four hundred people. It is now definitely settled that I shall locate there and risk a support. I am sure that the Home Mission Board will aid me if possible; but I am not sure that this is the wise thing for me to do, and yet something must be done. Somebody must go. I can manage doubtless to get the house put into good repair and painted, get moved and at work. Then, if I ought to have assistance from abroad, doubtless the Lord can and will provide it in some way. I would much rather put money into the home missionary treasury than to draw any out, but we cannot always do what we would prefer to do. If I can secure a salary of \$500 a year I can live and pay house rent too, but I shall have no bank account. My family consists of a wife and five children—youngest going to school. Unless our plans fail next year's work in this valley will put our cause in better shape." Do not such appeals as this merit not only a most prayerful consideration but also a most generous response? This society will rejoice in the opportunity of sending your generous gifts to this and to scores of other needy churches during the coming year. Shall we be disappointed?

Permit me before closing to call attention to the sad fact that we have lost by death three of our prominent and faithful workers—Rev. Henry J. Brown of Spencer, Iowa; Rev. Oscar E. Baker of Lincoln, Neb., and Rev. John S. Manning of Hillsdale, Mich. The two former were members of our Home Mission Board for several years, while the name of the latter will be associated forever with the Freedman's Mission at Cairo, Ill., where "Father Manning" did such splendid service. Without doubt appropriate resolutions on the life and labors of these brethren will be presented and adopted during this meeting; hence it is not necessary for your secretary to enumerate here their many virtues or real traits of character. Thank God, they have fought a good fight; they have finished their course, they have kept the faith, and are now gone to receive that crown of righteousness which the Lord, the righteous judge, giveth unto all them that love his appearing.

[here insert the amount], to be, by my said Executor, paid over to the Treasurer of said Society, in . . . . . days [or months] after my decease, to be used for the purposes for which said Society was incorporated [or for the Permanent Fund]."

In giving real estate the word "devise" should be used after "bequeath."

I have reports from eleven schools for the year ending Oct. 1, 1893:

## Report of the Education Society.

### CORRESPONDING SECRETARY'S REPORT.

Educational institutions are at once the fruit and root of denominational life. Multitudes coöperating plant and nourish them; they in turn ministering, bring richer and stronger life and spirit to the body. The efficiency of schools tells how successful and strong the church is as workers together. The rare combination of knowledge and spirituality adds to the success which the beautiful partnership has reached as workers together with God.

Believing that the Education Society exists to perpetuate our life as well as to furnish a species of service for the world I advocate, what I mentioned a year ago, a federation of educational interests under one active, potent control. I believe in the assignment to each institution of its own territory for operation and support. Let the whole denomination strengthen the weak places and create and control educational appliances sufficient as well as efficient. I am thoroughly convinced that the Christian school is the most powerful agent in saving the youth and in imparting to him love and respect for the denomination of his choice. The Gospel applied saves him at a time when he is most susceptible. A church school, too, forms a radiating power to scores of churches. I am in favor of the revival in every Western state, of the academy or fitting school as feeders for our colleges and as creators of material for the school of divinity and theology.

When once our educational interests shall have been formally submitted to Conference Board that body will probably furnish such sanctified oversight as our schools demand. Even with the best appliances the supply of material for our ministry must come largely from the pastor agonizing over a convert till he comes into brightest light, and then praying even as ardently that God would set the saved one apart to holy service. Nay, perhaps the work must still be done by the Christian mother on her knees by the cradle, dedicating all that the cradle holds to preach glad tidings at home and abroad. Whatever appliances we may lack, cease not to pray the Lord of the harvest that he send the laborers forth.

The following are the Constitution and By-laws adopted by the Board:

## CONSTITUTION.

1. The officers of this Board shall be a President, Vice-President, Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary, and a Treasurer, who shall be the Treasurer of the General Conference, and an Executive Committee of seven in which the President and Recording Secretary shall be included.

2. The President, Vice-President, Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary, and Treasurer shall perform the usual duties of such officers. The Executive Committee shall have general charge and direction of the work of the Board during the interim of its meetings, subject to the instruction and approval of the Board, and shall make a full report to the Board at each meeting.

3. The work of the Board shall be divided into such special departments as shall be necessary to its efficiency.

4. There shall be Departments of Foreign Missions, Home Missions, Education, and Ministerial Relief.

5. For each of these Departments there shall be a Secretary, who may or may not be a member of the Board, and who shall be appointed by the Conference Board and act under its direction.

6. There shall be an annual meeting of the Conference Board with anniversary exercises, at such time and place as it shall determine, and such special meetings for business only as shall be called by the Executive Committee.

#### BV-LAWS.

1. Each meeting of the Conference Board shall be opened by prayer.

2. Any member of the Board not able to be present at a meeting of the Board shall report the reason for absence to the Secretary prior to the meeting.

3. No member shall absent himself from the Board during its meetings without obtaining permission from the Board. Members violating this rule shall forfeit their traveling expenses.

4. Special committees shall be appointed by the Board as may be needed to provide for business assigned to the Board by General Conference, such as Publication Committee, Finance Committee, Historical Committee, Program Committee, etc.

5. The order of business at meetings of the Board shall be as follows:

1. Call to order.
2. Roll-call.
3. Prayer.
4. Reading minutes.
5. Reports of committee2.
6. Unfinished business.
7. Election of officers.
8. New business.
9. Adjournment.

6. This Constitution and these By-laws may be amended by a two-thirds vote of the members present at any regular meeting of the Board.


