#### MINUTUS OF THE SIXTY-SIXTH ANNUAL SESSION OF THE RICH MOUNTAIN ASSOCIATION OF FRUE WILL EAFTIST CHURCH OF JUSUS CHRIST

#### THURSDAY EVENING

The sixty-sixth annual session of the Rich Mountain Association of Free ill Baptist churches met June 27,28,29, at the Hatfield Free ill Baptist Church at Hatfield, Arkansas.

Service opened with a congregational song "Victory in Jesus." Frayer by David Fisher.

Rev. Roy L. Milson opened the Association since the moderator, Rev. C. C.
Rogers was sick and in the hospital. Rev. ilson asked for nominations for an

Resolution No. 1-Be it resolved that our deacons be instructed to see after the support of their pastors and needy vidous and orphans; in fact, all the needy Saints of Jerusalem.--Acts 6:1-7; I Cor. 16:1-3; Heb. 14:34

Resolution No. 2-Be it resolved that we, the members of the Eich Bountain Association, do pledge ourselves to conform to the requirements of God's ork, first by confessing our faults to one another, and praying one for another that we may be healed. James 5:6. That we will do, God being our helper. Foreover, we each one of us, strictly observing that Holy Rule of Order laid do n by our Lord and Christ, our great and loving redeemer, found in the fifth chapter of Fatther 23,24, in which, reads as follows: "Therefore, if thou bring thy gift to the alter and there rememberest that thy brother hath aught thee leave thy gift before the alter and go thy way. First be reconcilled to thy brother and then come and offer thy gift."—Eatt. 5:23,24. Failure to observe these holy rules of order is the direct cause and only true reason why we are so often found out of fellowship and without a good report. Then in order that we may correct this hurtful evil and restore fellowship and peace among ourselves and wake it safe for all coming times is are asking the hearty adoption and faithful servance of this resolution.

Resolution No. 3-Be it resolved, that we, as Free Mill Paptists, abstain from worldly amusements and keep ourselves unspotted from the orld that our lives may be a shining light to those in sin.--Matthew 5:16

Resolution No. 4-Be it resolved, that church clerks, then writing their letters to the association, list only the names of the ministers tho belong to their church by membership.

Resolution No. 5-Be it resolved, that a church does not recommend anyone to be ordained for the ministry until they have preached at least one year ith license.

Resolution No. 6-Be it resolved, that we ask each church of the association to commune and wash the saints' feet at least once a year.

Resolution No. 7-Be it resolved, that the mode for need only read the rules of order after organizing and sering may no legates.

Resolution No. 8—Be it resolved, but each committee read their report to the association and that be passed by the association before they turn it over to the clerk.

Resolution No. 9— e recommend that each church have a Vacation Pible School each year, the teachers of shich to be selected by the individual church.

Resolution No. 10-Be it resolved that the minutes of the Association be signed by the Moderator and Clerk.

Resolution Fo. 11--Pe it resolved, that re, from the depths of our hearts do thank the ones that have labored to earn and preparathe food and took care of this Session of the Association.

Resolution No. 12-Be it resolved, that the association furnish an annual Linisters Certificate to each Linister in good stands with the association.

Resolution Fo. 13-Re it resolved, that our association meet on Friday night before the last Sunday in June out year,

Resolution No. 14-Re it resolved, that we elect our Moderator, and Clerk and Treasurer at the close of our business session of each year.

Resolution No. 15-Be it resolved, that the Association give the Moderator the authority to appoint a Proportional Director for each of the following duties: Vacation Bible School and C. T. S. or League work.

Resolution No. 16-Be it resolved that we the Rich Lountain Association of Free ill Haptists create a mission board for the purpose of surveying surrounding communities to determine the possibility of beginning new churches.

This board shall be composed of three ministers and a lay members.

Resolution No. 17-Be it resolved that we spons a new bulletin to be printed thice monthly, for the purpose of keeping ou copie in the various churches informed as to the activities of the other arches. Be it resolved that we secure a mailing list from the various churches that we might be able to

send this bulletin to interested persons outside our local churches. The cost of this bulletin to be provided by the various churches according to the number of copies they lish to receive.

Resolution Po. 18-Be it resolved that we meet Thursday, Friday and Saturday evenings for our quarterly Feetings.

Resolution Fo. 19—Be it resolved that the churches contribute to the minute fund in relation to church membership and the number of minutes needed rather than having each church contribute an equal amount.

Resolution No. 20—Be it resolved that the delege as from each church have the authority to fill the vacancies in their delations created because of an elected delegate's failure to be present by 10: a.m. Saturday morning. In the event that no delegates, deacons or the Fastor l'a particular church is present that the association body may vote to receive so voting delegates any members of said church which may be present.

Resolution No. 21—Thereas, the use of dangerous rugs is rapidly increasing, and aiding in destruction of the minds of our young people: Be it resolved that we speak out in opposition to, and endeavor to make our people more aware of the dangers of these drugs.

Resolution No. 22-- hereas, Mitchcreft, Occult and Astrology are clearly defined in the Bible as originating with Satan: Be it resolved that we encourage our members to be more alert to the dangers to the Christian who becomes involved in these satanic practices.

## CONSTITUTION OF RICH NOUNTAIN ASSOCIATION OF FRUIT VILL BAFTIST CHURCH OF JEGU CHRIST

From long experience, we the members of the Free 11 Baptist Church of Christ, being regularly baptized upon the confession of our faith in Jesus Christ, being convinced of the necessity of a combination of our chest to perpetuate a union and communion among us, and to preserve and mentain a correspondence with each other, do adopt this constitution for our church government.

- 1. The Association shall be composed of Ordained Hinisters, Deacons, Church Clerks, and members of the different churches, chosen as delegates, and not to exceed five (5) from each church. Delegates producing letters ith sufficient Linute funds, from any church in our sociation, shall be entitled to a seat.
- 2. Letters from the different churches are to express their number in fellowship, the number received by experience, letters of recommendations, the number dismissed, excluded, restored and those who have died since the last Association.
- 3. Delegates thus chosen are to be called the Rath Mountain Association of Free Will Eaptists, being composed of churches in Mestern Arkansas and Eastern Oklahoma. The association is to have no power to lord it over God's heritage, nor to have any ecclesiastical power over the churches; but reserve the right to withdraw from any church becoming disorderly. The association shall have the power provided he ever it is for a good cause, to revoke the license or credentials of any minister licensed or ordained by any church ithin its jurisdiction. The association shall also have the power to exclude any delegate from its session when they or their church are disorderly or fail to keep a good report.
- 4. The Association and Churches shall have a Mc erator; Clerk and Treasurer, ho are to be chosen by the suffrage of the membership present.
- 5. Ne ly constituted churches may be admitted by the Association by petitioning by letter, and delegates if orderly and orthodox.
- 6. No question from any church shall come under consideration of the . Association, unless it has first been discussed by it on church.
- 7. Every motion made and seconded shall be considered by the Association, except it be withdrawn by the member who made it.

- 8. It shall be the duty of the Clerk to keep a regular file of the minutes of the Association in a book to be kept by the Association for that purpose.
- 9. Then a minister of this association shall be charged with preaching any doctrine contrary to the Articles of Faith of the riginal Free ill Eaptists as set forth in our National Treatise, the charge shall be proven or dropped.
- 10. Dealing with disorderly members—If I see my brother in a fault, I should go to him and try to restore him. But if he is not hear me, then I should take one or to others, and if he neglects to hear them also, then take him to the church, and let the church deal with him as a disorderly member. For Faul said that if a man be overtaken in a fault let him that is spiritual restore such one, in the spirit of meekness, considering thyself, lest thou also be tempted.

Bear ye one another's burdens, and so fulfill the last of Christ.-Galatians 6:1-2; Matthew 18:15-18.

- Jesus Christ endorsed it in the Gospel (Matthe 23:23), and the Apostle Paul said, "Upon the first day of the eek, let every one o you lay by him in store, as God hath prospered him."--I Cor. 16:2.

The churches should be more careful of their selection of delegates to the Association, as the Association is not composed of deacons and ministers alone, but by a delegation from the laity of churches of the Association. The Lord's Supper as instituted for God"s people. They all have equal rights to the supper and the right is a birthright. "For by one Spirit are see all baptized into one body."—I Cor. 12:13. This is not ater baptism, but spiritual baptism. Again Christ says, I am the door, by, if any man enter in he shall be saved.—John 10:9. Christ is not the ater baptism. Yet he is "The Door." There is but one door and Christ says He is the Door and he that cometh in at that door shall have full fellowship and equal rights ith all other Christians. "Let a man examine himself, and let him eat of that bread and drink of that cup. For he that eateth and drinketh unworthily eateth and drinketh damnation to himself." Not to the church, but to himself. It is a

personal matter in judging and eating.

The church that does judge and exclude any of God's people is not in keeping with the instruction given by the church of Corinth. To thus judge and exclude one of the children of God is to offend the child so judged and secluded. Now listen to Christ, "He that offends one of these little ones that believe in me, it were better for him that a millstone ere hanged about his neck and that he was drowned in the depth of the sea,"—Natt. 13:6; Cor, 10:30, and 13:22.
