The Sixteenth Annual Session of the Rockfish Conference, convened with Raynor's Chapel, of the Original Free Will Baptist church, October 13, 1927, beginning Thursday and closing Friday evening.

After singing an appropriate hymn, Bro. J. J. Peel led with an able prayer. After which Rev. M. L. Baxley preached the introductory sermon. Text: Luke 8:22. "Let us go over on the other side of the lake, and they launched forth."

After the sermon, the conference was organized by re-electing Rev. H. C. Adcox, Moderator, and Rev. A. J. Pearson, Clerk for the ensuing year.

The moderator took his seat and called the conference to order. He declared the conference open for business for the betterment of the church and the building up of God's kingdom.

The conference appointed a devotional committee composed of Bro. Joseph Walters, Chairman; J. J. Peel, W. L. Strickland.

The conference adjourned till 1:30 for dinner. Benediction by Rev. J. N. Oneal.

Dinner was served on the ground.

THURSDAY AFTERNOON.

Met according to adjournment. Rev. D. S. Brown read a scripture lesson from the Second chapter of Hebrews and led in prayer.

The moderator opened the business of the conference by asking the clerk to read the minutes. The minutes as read were approved.

The moderator called upon the devotional committee to make their report. The report was as follows: Rev. E. T. Porter open at 7:30 and A. J. Pearson preach. Friday at 11 o'clock: Rev. J. N. Oneal open and Rev. D. S. Brown preach. Rev. H. C. Adcox preach at 7:30 at night.

Unfinished business was asked for.

The moving of Raynor's Chapel was discussed. A committee was appointed to see if we could secure a lot on the highway to place the church. The committee appointed was as follows: Bro. Joseph Walters, Rev. M. L. Baxley, and Bro. Joseph Patterson.

On motion by Bro. Joseph Walters, conference close until 9:30 Friday morning. Benediction by Bro. T. S. Sweat.

FRIDAY MORNING.

Conference opened according to adjournment at 8:30.

After reading a portion of Scripture and prayer by Rev. D. S. Brown, the moderator declared the house ready for business.

The clerk read the minutes of Friday and they were approved.

The clerk was asked to call for reports of churches.

They report as follows:

HILLS CHAPEL.—Clarence Dixon, delegate. Report shows 30 members on roll, doing what they can to promote God's kingdom. We have called Rev. J. N. Oneal for pastor for the ensuing year. We send \$2.00 for conference expenses.

They report the church in a growing condition, has 45 members and send \$2.00 for minutes. Eld. E. H. Russ has been our pastor and we have called him for another year. We have sent to Orphanage \$15.56, collection for Sunday School \$13.84, paid pastor \$70.81. We paid Rev. M. L. Baxley \$5.00. Paid for revival services \$25.00, for incidental expenses \$11.46, total for all purposes \$141.67.

EPHESUS.—The report is as follows: The church is in a normal condition. We have received five new members, have on roll 77 members. Paid pastor \$45.65 for his services this year. We paid evangelist \$36.81, improvement to church \$50.00, value of church property \$850.00. We have a good Sabbath School, and we use Free Will Baptist literature. We regret the resignation of our former pastor, Rev. H. C. Adcox. We have called Rev. H. M. P. Todd. We solicit the prayers of the conference. Joseph Walters, delegaate.

C. W. BENNETT, Clerk, Hope Mills, N. C.

LAKEFIELD.—The church reports as follows: The church is in very good condition. We have on roll 27 members. We send W. H. Carmer as delegate. We have paid pastor \$32.00 for missions \$20.30, for Sabbath School \$12.40. We send \$2.00 for conference expenses. Rev. M. L. Baxley has been our former pastor and we have called him for the ensuing year.

J. A. PATTERSON, Clerk, Hope Mills, N. C. RAYNOR'S CHAPEL.—The church is represented by Ed. Bryant, delegate. The church has not had much preaching this year. We send \$2.50 for expenses. We ask the prayers of the conference.

CROSS ROADS.—The church sends as delegates, R. N. Gandy and E. T. Porter. The church is in a very good condition. We have received 11 new members and have on roll 42. Paid for pastoral work \$51.00, for home mission work \$22.50, for incidentals \$6.00. Total paid out \$79.50.

After the report of the churches, the moderator asked the ordained ministers to make their annual report.

REV. H. C. ADCOX.—I have pastored two churches, have preached 58 sermons, received 17 members into the church, baptized 8, money received \$114.15, travelled 1990 miles.

REV. M. L. BAXLEY.—Have been pastoring two churches, preached 84 sermons, received in money \$197.00.

REV.A. J. PEARSON.—Have preached 30 sermons, baptized 11 persons, received into full fellowship of the church 13 members, received \$40.00.

REV. T. S. SWEAT.—I have preached a good many times. I have not pastored any churches but I have superintended 2 Sunday schools. Have received \$25.00 for my labor this year.

REV. J. N. ONEAL.--I have served three churches, preached 145 sermons, received 7 members, baptized 2. My aim is higher ground.

Report of E. T. Porter, Licentiate.

Since I have been licensed, I have held one revival meeting, and ten joined the church. I ask the prayers of the brethren at this junction.

Bro. Joseph Walters made a motion to call off for preaching, and the motion was sustained. Rev. D. S. Brown was appointed by the devotional committee to preach.

Elder A. B. Peavy and wife having a seat in the conference, Bro. Brown gave way for Elder Peavy to preach in his place. Bro. Peavy preached an able sermon from Acts 19th chapter. Text: "Have ye received the Holy Ghost since ye believed?" Closed with prayer by A. J. Pearson till one o'clock.

FRIDAY AFTERNOON.

Conference opened with reading 103 Psalm by Elder M. L. Bailey. Prayer by Elder H. C. Adcox. After which the moderator declared the house open for business. The moderator gave the floor to Eld. A. B. Peavy. who made a statement as follows:

I am not able to do much service. Said his health was not good, but if the conference or churches could use him, he was willing to do what he could provided he was not called too far from home.

We are glad to have Bro. Peavy with us, for the good he has done and the chance for his service in the future.

Next in order was the reports from the committees.

It was voted and ordered by conference to meet Thursday before the second Sunday in October in 1928 at place above mentioned.
