### CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS OF THE SALEM ASSOCIATION OF FREEWILL BAPTISTS OF FLORIDA

Promphic

We, the believers in Christ according to the doctrine of the Free Will Baptist Denomination, having been baptized unto a like profession of faith in Jesus Christ and properly organized into churches, realizing the secondly of a bond of union and followship among us for preservation of the "Faith once Delivered Unto the Salats," and the spreading of the gospel of Christ upon earth, do therefore ordain and establish this constitution.

ARTICLE I - NAME

This organization shall be known as the Salem Association of Free Will Baptists of Florida. ARTICLE II - PURPOSE

The purpose of this organization shall be to unify the work of the churches composing this Association by devising and executing such measures as will best spread the gospel of Christ as we interpret it.

ARTICLE III - MEMBERSHIP Any regularly organized and well disciplined Free Will Baptist Church conforming to the usage's of the Free Will

Baptist denomination as set forth in the Treatise of the Falth and practices of the Free Will Baptists of the National Association, may upon proper application, and a voice of the Association, become a member of this Association, ARTICLE IV - COMPOSITION

The sessions of the Association shall consist of delegates appointed or elected by the churches of which this Association is composed. All ordained ministers, and descons who are exembers and in good standing with the Association and the churches to which they belong, shall be standing delegates. Ministers from Sister Associations who are serving churches in the Association shall have the right to make suggestions but the voting rights shall be reserved for the delegates of the Salem Association. All officers of the Association will be standing delegates.

ARTICLE V - REPRESENTATION

Each obwith in this Association shall be extitled to one delegate for every 25 members or fraction thereof.

ARTICLE VI - OFFICERS, BOARDS, COMMITTEES AND REPRESENTATIVES

Section 1. The officers of this Association shall be a moderator, vice moderator and clark-treasurer, who shall be slected every two years on the odd year, except to fill vacancies.

Section 2. The Standing Boards of this Association shall be the Executive Board, Missions Board, Youts Board and Christian Education Board.

Section 3. The committees of this Association shall be Committee on Committees, Resolutions, Finance, Nominations and Obituaries.

Section 4. Representatives:

- (1) The Association shall elect two laypersons to serve on the Comp Mt. Pleasant Board of Directors, one member elected each year to serve 2 year terms.
- (2) The Association shall nominate one person annually to represent the Association to the Florida State Executive Committee.

ARTICLE VII - BOARDS

Section 1. The Executive Board shall be composed of the officers of the Association, the chairperson of each standing board and one representative at large from each church.

Section 2. Missions Board -- composed of 5 members from different churches, elected annually on a rotating basis. Section 3. Youth Board - composed of 3 members from different churches, elected secondly on a rotating basis.

ARTICLE VIII - COMMITTEES

The Committees of this Association will be appointed and elected at each meeting of the Association.

- (A) Committee on Committees composed of 3 members from different churches, appointed by the moderator to recommend the persons to fill the regular committees of the Association.
- (B) Regular Courtoittees:

Resolution: 3 members from different churches Finance: 3 members from different churches Nominations: 3 members from different churches

Oblimatics: I member

ARTICLE IX - SESSIONS

The sessions of this Association shall be held quarterly. The Fall and Spring sessions will convene on Friday night before the second (2") Saturday in October and April. The Summer session will convene on the second (2") Saturday in July and the Winter session, which is our Annual session, will convene on Frider night before the second (2")

Saturday and on the second (2") Saturday of January. Annual letters and reports shall be received in this session. ARTICLE X - FINANCE

Section 1. All churches represented in the body are asked to pay \$50.00 per quarter (\$200.00 per year) for representation fout.

Section 2. Each church is asked to send at least ten percent (10%) of his income for the cooperative plan of support. Section 3. All cooperative funds coming into this body shall be spent under a budget plan. This budget must be

approved by the body while in assion. Section 4: The Moderator and Clerk shall each receive fifty dollars (\$50,00) annually for their services.

### ARTICLE XI - DISCIPLINE

This Association shall have the power to discipline the Charches of which it is composed, and to withdraw followship from a charch as a whole when it's action is inconsistent with the doctrine and usage's of the Free Will Baptist church, if labor with it is unsuccessful. But in no case can it reverse a decision of a church.

ARTICLE XII -- PRESBYTERY

- Section 1. This body of ordained ministers and descons shall promote followship, issue cards of good standing, provide opportunities for continuing education, discipline its members and ordain new ministers to preach the Gospel. Section 2. New pasters of the Salem Association shall be examined and approved by the Salem Prosbytery or its representatives.
- Section 3. The Salem Presbyery shall have its own constitution and by-laws and function as an independent body from the Salem Association.
- Section 4. Each church will request the Salem Presbytery to examine their new paster within 30 days of calling him as their paster.

Section 5. The Salem Presbytery will examine the new paster within 30 days of receiving a request by the church that called him.

### ARTICLE XIII - AMENDMENTS

This Constitution may be altered or amended by a susjority of the Association at any regular annual session, provided the suggested assendments are received by the Clerk in writing one day before the vote is taken.

#### BY-LAWS

- Each session of this Association shall be called to order by the Moderator and opened with prayer. Each
  session shall be closed with prayer.
- It shall be the shaty of the Moderator to preserve order and submit all actions to the body. He shall have the same right of speech as any other member, but he must appoint someone else as Chairman while he speaks. He shall not have the right to vote except in the case of a tie.
  - (A) The Moderator shall be the Chairman of the Executive Committee
  - (B) He shall sen that all the action taken by this body is carried out, unless otherwise delegated by the Association.
- 3. The Vice Moderator shall assume the duties, rights and privileges of the Moderator in his absence.
- 4. The delegates shall be enrolled by the Clerk before they are sested in this body.
- All business shall be brought before the body by a move and second and shall be disposed of according to Parliamentary seago.
- A member wishing to make a motion or to speak in conference shall first rise, address the Moderator, and be recognized by him before proceeding. A member may second a motion without rising and addressing the Moderator.

# CONSTITUTION OF THE PRESBYTERY OF THE SALEM ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS ARTICLE I - NAME

This organization shall be known as the Presbytory of the Selem Association of Free Will Beptists of Florida.

ARTICLE II - PURPOSE

The purpose of this Presbytery shall be the furtherance of the Gospei, to promote failowship, issue cards of good standing, provide opportunities for continuing education (such as seminary and retreats), and discipline its messions.

ARTICLE III – MEMBERSHIP

The membership of this Presbytery shall consist of all ordained ministers and descons holding cards of good standing in the Presbytery. This Presbytery may invite visiting ministers and descons to sit in conscil with it in any assembly thereof. Licensed ministers in good standing with a member church of this Association are associate members of the Presbytery with no voting privileges.

ARTICLE IV - OFFICERS

The officers of this Presbytary shall be exoderator, assistant moderator, clerk and treasurer, who shall be elected assaually and shall serve until their successors are elected at the pent meeting.

ARTICLE V - MEETINGS

The Presbytery shall hold annual sessions on Friday night at the Fourth Session of the Salera Association. Called sessions may be held at the call of the moderator, or any five members of said Presbytery who deem it necessary, upon written notice to the membership. Ten members shall constitute a quorum.

ARTICLE VI - COMMITTEES

- (A) The discipline committee shall consist of the moderator, clork, and the chairman or his representative from the examination committee.
- (B) The examination committee shall consist of at least 3 ordained ministers elected annually by the Presbytcry. This committee will examine and make recommendations concerning ordination to the Presbytcry, of new members.

(C) Other committees, as they are needed, may be appointed by the moderator, ARTICLE VII 

AMENDMENTS

This constitution may be amended at any regular meeting of the Presbytery by a two-thirds majority of the members present.

### BY-LAWS

#### ARTICLE 1 - ORDINATION AND RATIFICATION

This Presbytery shall have the responsibility to establish guidelines relating to the ordination of applicants to the Gospel Ministry and ratification of the credentials of ordelsed ministers transferring to the Salem Presbytery.

ARTICLE II – CARDS OF STANDING

This Presbytery shall issue annually cards of good standing to ministers upon the presentation of a report in person (incase of sickness or some other legitimate reason letters may be accepted). Cards of good standing shall be issued annually to descons upon the presentation of a letter of recommendation from their local churches. A desation of \$5.00 per member is requested. Any minister or descon failing to hold a card of good standing shall not have voice in this Presbytery. Any minister having lost his card of good standing may be reinstand in the Presbytery upon the presentation of his report and who manifest a sincers interest in the work of the Lord. Ministers who have retired or who have reached the age of retirement and have continued to manifest a sincers interest in the work of the Lord may be issued a lifetime card of good standing which they may hold as long as they hold somborship in this Presbytery or as long as their conduct is unquestionable.

Ministers who are members of churches in the Salora Association who do not have eards of good standing do not have the approval of this body to present themselves in other Free Will Baptist meetings as a Free Will Baptist minister in good standing.

ARTICLE III - DISCIPLINE

The Presbytery shall have the power to try and withdraw fellowship from any member upon evidence of guilt of unchristian conduct, or who is teaching or preaching herery or who has proven to be disloyal to the tenets of first as expressed in the Treatise of the National Association of Free Will Baptist, as held by the Salom Association of Free Will Baptist of Florida.

ARTICLE IV - DONATIONS

Each member of this Presbytery shall be saked to desset \$5.00 annually upon the presentation of his report. This find is to be used for acquiring seccessary equipment, the printing of such assertals as cards of good standing, constitution and by-laws, stationery, minutes of meeting and for defraying of secessary traveling and smalling expenses, and other expenses as authorized by the Presbytery.

ARTICLE V - AMENDMENTS

These by-laws may be schended at any meeting of the Presbytery by a two-thirds majority vots of members present.


### GUIDELINES FOR LICENSED MINISTERS IN THE SALEM ASSOCIATION

- 1. RULES PERTAINING TO THE LICENSED MINISTER
  - A. Qualification of the Licensee:
    - I. He miss be a member of a chirch which belongs to the Salem Association.
- 2. He must give evidence to his church that he is divinely called to preach, whereupon the local church is authorized to examine him for licenze. This examination should include the areas of the candidate's life, doctries, reputation, and his convictions and abilities regarding the work of the ministry. His present and prospective educational and professional qualifications should also be considered. Upon completion of such an examination, the local church shall determine whether or not to grant license. Their ministerial license shall be valid for a period of one year but is renewable annually.
  - 3. He must have his licease renewed by said church and kept in force until ordination.
  - B. The activities of the Licensee:
- 1. According to the general practices of Free Will Baptists, a licement minister is urged to afford himself of every apportunity to preach the word. He is five to exercise all the privileges and responsibilities of an ordained minister with the exception of pastoring a church and efficieting at the observances of the ordinances and weddings.
- 2. The licenses should consider the years between his receiving license and being ordained as years of study and training in proparation for his calling.
  - C. His Relationship to the Prosbytery:
- 1. The clerk of the church should report the names of licensed ministers to the clerk of the Presbytery who will forward a copy of those guidelines to each licensee.
  - 2. Licensed ministers will be eligible to hold associate membership in the Presbytery.
- II. SUGGESTIONS FOR PREPARATION FOR ORDINATION
  - A. Attend a Free Will Baptist Bible College if possible.
  - B. Seek counsel of an experienced pastor or pastors.
    - C. Make as thorough a study as possible of the following:
      - 1. The Holy Bible
      - 2. Systematic Thoology
        - 3. Hornileties
        - Pastoral Theology and Claurch Administration
        - Evangelism
        - Church History (especially FWB history)

### III. A SUGGESTED SCHEDULE OF WORK LEADING TO ORDINATION

- A. As soon as licensee feels that he is qualified to become a candidate for ordination, he should request a list of study questions from the Examining Committee of the Presbytery. We would strongly encourage him to proceed with his executation before entertaining a call to a church.
- B. At least two months before the Examining Committee mosts, he should secure the examination. He should make three (3) copies of the completed examination (One for each member of the Committee), and send them to the Examining Committee on later than two weeks before its meeting.

  C. The Candidate is required to pass an oral examination administered by the Committee.
- D. The Committee will report to the condidate on whether he person or what areas he may need additional study in.
- E. When the approved candidate has passed the examination and has received a call to a church or is engaged in some other form of Christian service that would justify his being ordained, the Commisse will recommend his ordination to the Prosbytery. This recommendation will usually be made only after the candidate has been licensed for one full year.
