CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS OF THE SALEM ASSOCIATION OF FREEWILL BAPTISTS OF FLORIDA

Promble

We, the believers in Christ according to the doctrine of the Free Will Baptist Donominstion, having been beptized unto a like profession of faith in Jesus Christ and property organized into churches, realizing the second of union and fellowship among us for preservation of the "Faith once Delivered Units the Salats," and the spreading of the gospel of Christ upon earth, do therefore order and establish this constitution. ARTICLE 1 - NAME

This organization shall be knows as the Salem Association of Free Will Baptists of Florida.

ARTICLE II - PURPOSE

The purpose of this organization shall be to unify the work of the churches composing this Association by devising and executing such measures as will best spread the gospel of Christ as we interpret it.

ARTICLE III - MEMBERSHIP

Any regularly organized and well disciplined Free Will Baptist Church conforming to the asage's of the Free Will Baptist denomination as act forth in the Tractise of the Falth and practices of the Free Will Baptists of the National Association, may upon proper application, and a voice of the Association, become a member of this Association. ARTICLE IV - COMPOSITION

The sensions of the Association shall consist of delegates appointed or elected by the churches of which this Association is composed. All ordained ministers, and descons who are sensors and is good standing with the Association and the churches to which they belong, shall be standing delegates. Ministers from Sister Associations who are serving churches in the Association shall have the right to make suggestions but the voting rights shall be reserved for the delegates of the Salem Association. All officers of the Association will be standing delegates. ARTICLE V - REPRESENTATION

Each church in this Association shall be entitled to one delegate for every 25 members or fraction thereof. ARTICLE VI - OFFICERS, BOARDS, COMMITTEES AND REPRESENTATIVES

Section 1. The officers of this Association shall be a moderator, vice moderator and clerk-treasurer, who shall be slotted every two years on the odd year, except to fill vacancies.

Section 2. The Standing Boards of this Association shall be the Executive Board, Missions Board, Youth Board and Christian Education Board.

Section 3. The committees of this Association shall be Committee on Committees, Resolutions, Finance, Nominations and Obituaries.

Section 4. Representatives:

- The Association shall elect two laypersons to serve on the Camp Mt. Pleasent Board of Directors, one member elected each year to serve 2 year terms.
- (2) The Association shall nominate one person anomally to represent the Association to the Florida State Executive Committee.

ARTICLE VII - BOARDS

Section 1. The Executive Board shall be composed of the officers of the Amociation, the chaleperson of each standing board and one representative at large from each church.

- Section 2. Missions Board composed of 5 members from different churches, elected annually on a rotating baris.
- Section J. Youth Board composed of 3 members from different churches, elected manually on a rotating basis. ARTICLE VIII - COMMITTEES

The Committees of this Association will be appointed and elected at each meeting of the Association.

(A) Committee on Committees composed of 3 members from different churches, appointed by the moderator to recommend the persons to fill the regular committees of the Association.

(B) Regular Convolutees:

Resolution: 3 members from different churches

Finance: 3 members from different churches

Nominations: 3 members from different churches

Obligation: 1 member

ARTICLE IX - SESSIONS

The sessions of this Association shall be beld quarterly. The Fall and Spring sessions will convene on Friday alght before the second (2⁻⁰) Saturday in October and April. The Summer session will convene on the second (2⁻⁰) Saturday in July and the Winter session, while is our Annual session, will convene on Friday alght before the second (2⁻⁰) Saturday and on the second (2⁻⁰) Saturday of January. Annual betters and reports shall be received in this session. ARTICLE X = FINANCE

Section 1. All churches represented in the body are saled to pay \$50.00 per quarter (\$200.00 per your) for representation flos.

Section 2. Each church is asked to send at least ten percent (10%) of its income for the cooperative plan of support. Section 3. All cooperative funds coming into this body shall be spent under a budget plan. This budget must be approved by the body while in accession.

Section 4: The Modernior and Clerk shall each receive fifty dollars (\$30.00) annually for their services.

ARTICLE XI - DISCIPLINE

This Association shall have the power to discipline the Churches of which it is composed, and to withdraw followship from a church as a whole when it's action is inconsistent with the doctrine and usage's of the Free Will Baptist church, if labor with it is unsuccessful. But in no case can it reverse a decision of a church.

ARTICLE XII - PRESBYTERY

Section 1. This body of ordelated ministers and descons shall promote followship, issue cards of good standing, provide opportunities for continuing education, discipling its members and ordela new ministers to preach the Gospel. Section 2. New pastors of the Salem Association shall be emanined and approved by the Salem Presbyway or its representatives.

Section 3. The Salam Presbyery shall have its own constitution and by-laws and function as an independent body from the Salam Association.

Section 4. Each church will request the Salem Presbytery to examine their new pester within 30 days of calling blas as their pester.

Section 5. The Salera Pruebytory will examine the new pastor within 30 days of receiving a request by the church that called him.

ARTICLE XUI - AMENDMENTS

This Constitution may be altered or amonded by a majority of the Amociation at any regular mount session, provided the suggested amountments are received by the Clerk in writing one day before the vote is taken.

BY-LAWS

 Each session of this Association shall be called to order by the Moderator and opposed with prayer. Each session shall be closed with prayer.

2. It shall be the daty of the Modernior to preserve order and submit all actions to the body. He shall have the same right of speech as any other member, but he must appoint someone else as Chairman while he speaks. He shall not have the right to vote except in the case of a tie.

- (A) The Moderator shall be the Chairman of the Executive Committee.
- (B) He shall see that all the action taken by this body is carried out, values otherwise delegated by the Association.
- 3. The Vice Moderator shall assume the dutice, rights and privileges of the Moderator in his absence.
- 4. The delegates shall be enrolled by the Clerk before they are sented in this body.
- All business shall be brought before the body by a move and second and shall be disposed of according to Partismentary usage.
- 6. A member wishing to make a motion or to speak in confirmers shall first rise, address the Moderator, and be recognized by him before proceeding. A member may second a motion without rising and addressing the Moderator.

CONSTITUTION OF THE PRESBYTERY OF THE SALEM ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAFTISTS ARTICLE 1 - NAME

This organization shall be known as the Prosbytery of the Seless Association of Free Will Beptists of Florida. ARTICLE II - FURPOSE

The purpose of this Presbytery shall be the furtherance of the Goupel, to promote followship, issue cards of good standing, provide opportunities for continuing education (such as seminars and retrests), and discipline its members. ARTICLE III - MEMBERSHIP

The membership of this Presbytery shall consist of all ordained ministers and descons holding cards of good standing in the Presbytery. This Presbytery may havin visiting ministers and descons to sit in council with it is any assembly thereof. Licensed ministers in good standing with a member church of this Association are associate members of the Presbytery with no voting privileges.

ARTICLE IV - OFFICERS

The officers of this Presbytery shall be moderator, assistant moderator, clerk and treasurer, who shall be elected associatly and shall serve until their successors are elected at the next meeting.

ARTICLE V - MEETINGS

The Prestytory shall hold annual sessions on Friday night at the Fourth Session of the Salera Association. Called sessions may be held at the call of the moderator, or any five members of anid Prosbytery who does it necessary, upon written notice to the membership. Ten members shall constitute a quorum.

ARTICLE VI - COMMITTEES

(A) The discipline committee shall consist of the moderator, clerk, and the chairman or his representative from the examination committee.

(B) The examination committee shall consist of at least 3 ordained ministers elected answally by the Presbytery. This committee will examine and make recommendations concerning ordination to the Presbytery, of new members.
(C) Other committees, as they are needed, may be appointed by the moderator.

ARTICLE VIL-AMENDMENTS

This constitution may be amonded at any regular meeting of the Presbytery by a two-thirds majority of the membera present.

BY-LAWS

ARTICLE I - ORDINATION AND RATIFICATION

This Presbytery shall have the responsibility to establish guidelines relating to the ordination of applicants to the Gospel Ministry and ratification of the credentials of ordeseed ministers transferring to the Salem Prosbytery. ARTICLE II - CARDS OF STANDING

This Presbytery shall issue annually cards of good standing to ministers upon the presentation of a report in person (incase of sickness or some other leptimete reason letters may be accepted). Cards of good standing shall be issued annually to descone upon the presentation of a letter of recommandation from their local churches. A domation of \$5.00 per member is requested. Any minister or descone failing to hold a card of good standing shall be three voice in this Presbytery. Any minister having lost his card of good standing may be reinstated in the Presbytery upon the presentation of his report and who manifest a sincere interest in the work of the Lord. Ministers who have retried or who have reached the age of retirement and have continued to manifest a sincere interest in the work of the Lord may be issued a lifetime card of good standing which they may hold as long in they hold membership in this Presbytery or as long as their coeduct is unquestionable.

Ministers who are members of churches in the Salera Association who do not have cards of good standing do not have the approval of this body to present themselves in other Free Will Baptist meetings as a Free Will Baptist minister in good standing.

ARTICLE III - DISCIPLINE

The Presbytery shall have the power to try and withdraw fellowship from any member upon evidence of guilt of unchristian conduct, or who is teaching or preaching herery or who has proven to be disloyal to the teacts of hith as expressed in the Treatise of the National Association of Free Will Beptist, as held by the Salean Association of Pree Will Beptist of Florida.

ARTICLE IV - DONATIONS

Each member of this Presbytery shall be asked to denses \$3,00 anothelly upon the presentation of his report. This fand is to be used for acquiring secessary equipment, the printing of such manufals as cards of good standing, constitution and by-laws, stationery, mixtures of meeting and for defraying of necessary traveling and mailing expenses, and other exponent as authorized by the Presbytery.

ARTICLE V - AMENDMENTS

These by-laws may be astended at any meeting of the Presbytery by a two-thirds majority vote of members present.

GUIDELINES FOR LICENSED MINISTERS IN THE SALEM ASSOCIATION

I. RULES PERTAINING TO THE LICENSED MINISTER

A. Qualification of the Licensee:

1. He must be a member of a church which belongs to the Salom Association.

2. He must give evidence to his church that he is divinely called to preach, whereupon the local church is authorized to examine him for Homse. This examination should include the areas of the candidate's life, doctrine, reputation, and his convictions and abilities regarding the work of the ministry. His present and prospective educational and professional qualifications should also be considered. Upon completion of such an examination, the local church shall determine whether or not to grant license. Their ministerial license shall be valid for a period of one year but is enterwhele annually.

3. He must have his license renowed by said church and kept in force until ordination.

B. The activities of the Licenses:

1. According to the general practices of Free Will Baptists, a licensed minister is urged to afford himself of every opportunity to preach the word. He is free to exercise all the privileges and responsibilities of an ordered minister with the exception of pastoring a church and officienting at the observances of the ordinances and weddings.

The licenses should consider the years between his receiving license and being ordained as years of study and training in preparation for his calling.

C. His Relationship to the Presbytery:

1. The clerk of the church should report the names of licensed ministers to the clerk of the Presbytery who will forward a copy of these guidelines to each licensee.

2. Licensed ministers will be eligible to hold associate membership in the Prosbytery. II. SUGGESTIONS FOR PREPARATION FOR ORDINATION

A. Attend a Free Will Baptist Bible College if possible.

B. Sock counsel of an experienced perfor or partors.

C. Make as thorough a study as possible of the following:

- 1. The Holy Bible
- 2. Systematic Theology

3. Homiletics

- 4. Pastoral Theology and Caurch Administration
- 5. Evangelism

6. - Church History (especially FWB history).

III. A SUGGESTED SCHEDULE OF WORK LEADING TO ORDINATION

A. As soon as licensec forts that he is qualified to become a candidate for ordination, he should request a list of study questions from the Examining Committee of the Prosbytery. We would strongly encourage him to proceed with his examination before extentialing a call to a church.

B. At least two months before the Examining Committee means, he should secure the examination. He should make three (3) copies of the completed examination (One for each member of the Committee), and send them to the Examining Committee no later than two works before its meeting.

C. The Candidate is required to past an oral examination administered by the Committee.

D. The Committee will report to the condidate on whether he persed or what areas he may need additional study in

E. When the approved candidate has passed the examination and has received a call to a church or is engaged is some other form of Christian service that would justify his being ordinand, the Commission will recommend his ordination to the Prophytory. This recommendation will usually be made only after the candidate has been licensed for one full year.
