MINUTES.

goodly number of the Ministers, Deacons and Messengers of that part of the church of God, commonly known as Social Band Association met with Richwoods church, Richwoods, Ark., Sept. 18th, 1915.

The annual sermon was preached by Elders G. W. Million and W. T. Shoffit from Acts 15:6-22 and Heb. 6:1, after which proceeded to regular business.

- 1. A call for church letters showed sixteen represented, viz: Reform, Zion Hill, Warm Springs, Stony Point, New Hope, Grandview, Union Ridge, Richwoods, Old Jackson, Pleasant Valley, Eureka, New Covenant, Lonoke, Clear Lake, Sugar Tree Grove and Elnora.
- 2. Called for petitionary letters, received one, Liberty. (This church was organized by G. W. Million.)

3. Called for corresponding letters, received one,

Fairdealing Association of General Baptists.

4. Proceeded to elect a moderator and clerk, which resulted in choice of Eld. D. M. Holder, Moderator, and Eld G W. Million, Clerk.

Took a recess until 2 o'clock, p. m.



SATURDAY AFTERNOON.

Met about 2:20 o'clock. Prayer by W. P. Brooks.

5. The appointment of several committees was the first thing taken up in afternoon which was as follows: On Arrangement of Business—J. F. Gates, J. R. English, J. R. Hancock, W. P. Brooks and Nin Carroll.

On Finance—J. M. Cavenar, T. W. Elliot and W.

Hicks.

On Divine Service—J. P. Kincaid, D. Bates and S. S. Motherman.

On Obituary—J. C. Carter, D. Pursfull and N. Y. Gary.

On Literature—Retained the old committee.

6. Call for tardy letters, received none, but permitted Eld. J. R. English to represent Denman church and Bro. — Rickey, Union church, at O'Kean, Ark.

7. Moved that a new committee of five be appointed to be styled "Committee on Credentials." J. D. Poynor, G. P. Johnson, G. B. Blalock, J. M. Cavenar and J.W. Tharp were appointed to constitute same.

8. Read Rules of Decorum.

9. Spent some 30 or 40 minutes in devotional ser-

vices, which was enjoyed by all present.

10. Moved that each minister of the Association make a full written report at each annual meeting of the Association, of all the work done by him during the year preceding each annual meeting, and that each church clerk be required to make a record of all the work done by each minister in service of said church.

Adjourned until Monday morning at 8 o'clock.

A great revival was going on at Richwoods church when the Association convened and a great service was had Friday night, Saturday night, Sunday and Sunday night.

Eld — preached Friday night.

Revival broke out Saturday night during testimony services and no one could preach.

The Moderator filled the stand Sunday at 11 o'clock

on "Love."

Preaching and ordinance services Sunday night con-

ducted by Elds. D. M. Holder and W. T. Sharp.

Late in the afternoon Sunday 1000 or 1200 people came together on Clear Lake and witnessed the baptism of 26 candidates by the Methodists, Missionaries and "Freewills."

MONDAY MORNING.

Came together about 8 o'clock, prayer by Eld. J. C. Carter.

11. Took up the quarterly meeting item first thing

and decided to have none for next year.

12. Moved that each church in the Association ask each member of said church to assess themselves to such an amount as the Lord has prospered him and that said church require said member to pay the amount assessed. And resolved further that three financial agents be appointed to assist the churches in this work

The Association was divided into three districts, viz: All that part of Association east of Black River, District No. 1, agent W. P. Brooks. All that part west of Black River and north of Fourchee, District No. 2, J. D. Poynor, agent. All that part west of Black River and south of Fourchee, District No. 3, J. P. Kincaid, agent.

13. Decided to have no evangelist in 'field during

next year.

14. Brethren G. B. Blalock of Old Jackson church and Wm. Tippet of Elnora church were ordained to the deaconship. Presbytery: Elds. H. T. Newberry, J. W. Tharp and J. C. Carter. Deacons, G. P. Johnson and Dave Seamons.

15. Moved to correspond with Fairdealing and Hopewell Associations of General Baptists. Bro. Newton Gates was selected as messenger to Fairdealing, held three miles south of Grandin on Thursday night before 2nd Sunday in September.

Elder D. M. Holder and G. P. Johnson were selected as messengers to Hopewell, held Wednesday before

2nd Sunday in October, 1915.

16. Moved to hold the next annual meeting with Stony Point church, seven miles northwest of Pocahontas.

17. Elders D. M. Holder and W. T. Sharp were selected to preach the annual sermon at next meeting.

18. The several committees reported and were dis-

charged.

19. Resolved that we tender our heartfelt thanks to the good people of Richwoods for the kind hospitality shown us while in their midst.

Adjourned to meet at Stony Point, at 10 o'clock, on Saturday before the 3rd Sunday in September.

CONSTITUTION.

1. This Association, when properly organized, shall consist of a Moderator and a Clerk, who shall be chosen by the suffrage of the members present. The duty of the Moderator shall be to keep the Association in order, state questions fairly and take the vote thereon; to have the liberty of speech as other members, providing his seat be filled, to have no vote unless the Association be equally divided in which case he shall have the casting vote. The duty of the clerk shall be to keep a fair record of all the proceedings of the Association

2. This Association shall be composed of ordained ministers, deacons, licentiates, together with delegates duly chosen by the several churches in our union and sent to represent them in this Association, said delegates being members of some church within this Association, whom the members judge best qualified for that purpose, who, on producing letters certifying to

their appointment, shall be entitled to seats.

3. In the letters from the several churches shall be expressed their respective number of members in fellowship, and the number received, dismissed, excluded, and died since the sitting of the last Association and day of church meeting.

4. No query shall be received by the Association from any church unless it has been acted on in said church and cannot be settled, in which case the As-

sociation shall take up the same and act on it.

5. Every church in the Association shall be entitled to a representation of delegates not exceeding three.

6. Every motion made and seconded shall be acted

on unless withdrawn by the mover.

7. The Association shall not have the power to lord it over God's heritage so as to infringe on any of the internal rights of the churches; nevertheless we agree that the churches composing this Association shall stand in the same relation to each other in this association that individuals do to each other in the

churches: that is to say, if a church trespass against a sister church, the church injured shall try to reclaim them by Gospel steps; if they cannot be reclaimed they shall be dropped from our union.

8. We agree to do all business by a majority of the

members present.

Any church may be admitted into this Association by letter and delegate. If apon proper examination it is found to be orthodox and orderly such admission shall be manifested by the moderator giving the right hand of fellowship to the delegates thereof.

10. This Association shall have power to sit advisory council; to give churches all necessary advice in matters of difficulty; to inquire into the cause why churches neglect to represent themselves in this Association; to appoint any members, by and with his or their consent, to transact any business they may deem necessary; to invite any brethren in the ministry to a seat with the Association; to adjourn the Association to any time and place that may be thought necessary; to exclude from his seat any member who shall not conform to the Rules of Decorum, and shall report his or their conduct to the church or churches from which he or they were delegates.

11. This Association possesses appellate jurisdiction in all cases of difficulty that may arise in the

churches.

12. The Lord's Supper shall be administered at each annual association.

13. Each annual association shall be held on the 3rd Sunday in September.

ARTICLES OF FAITH.

We believe that the Scriptures of the Old New Testaments are the infallible word of God, and the only safe rule of faith and practice.—II. Tim. 3:16-17. II Peter 1:20-21.

2. That there is but one living and true God, and in the Godhead or divine essence, Father, Son and Holy

Ghost.—St. John 1:1; I John 5:7.

3. That we are fallen and depraved creatures, and cannot extricate ourselves from our fallen situation by any ability we possess by nature.—Romans 8:7-20.

4. Salvation, Regeneration, Sanctification, Justification and Redemption are by the life, death, resurrection, ascension and intercession of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.—Heb 9:24. Eph. 4:9. Rev. 1:18.

5. We believe that he that shall endure to the end, the same shall be saved.—Matt. 24:13. Rev. 2:10.

6. That the joys of the righteous and the punish-

ment of the wicked shall be eternal.—Matt. 25:46.

We believe that baptism, the Lord's Supper and the washing of the saint's feet are ordinances of Jesus Christ appointed in the church and none but true believers are proper subjects, and that the only true mode of baptism is immersion.—On Baptism Matt. 3:16. Rom. 6:4. Acts 8:38 Col 2:12. The Supper. Matt. 26:27. Mark 14:22. Luke 22:19. I Cor. 23:34. Washing of feet. St. John 3:14-17. I Tim. 5:10. I Peter 2:21.

8. We believe in the sanctity of the first day of the week—or Lord's day—and it ought to be observed and spent in public or private worship of God, and on it we should abstain from our wordly concerns, except in case of necessity or mercy.—Ex 31:15-17. Deut. 5:12.

9. We believe in the resurrection of the body, both the just and the unjust, but every one in his own order—those who have done good, to the resurrection of life; and those who have done evil, to the resurrection of damnation; and that God hath appointed a day in which he will judge the world in righteousness by Jesus Christ.—St John 5:28:29. 10. That it is our duty to be tender and affectionate to one another and to study the happiness of the people of God in general, and to be singly engaged to promote the honor and glory of God—Galatians 6:10;

12. We believe that the Lord Jesus Christ is the door . Ainto the church, and that baptism is anduty in answer

13. We believe that the Lord's people arestone him, therefore should be one at his, table.—In Cor. ...12:13. St. John 15:11-21-22. Matt...16:26-28.

RULES OF DECORUM.

1:2:The assciation, when convened, shall be opened and closed by singing and prayer.

🚅. 22000 Only one person shall speak at a time; who shall

rrise to his feet and address the moderator.

3: 3: The person thus speaking shall not be interrupted in speech, except by the moderator, until heagets through; nor shall the moderator interrupt him unless m habreak order.

The person speaking shall adhere to the queston, and shall in no wise cast personal reflections

any person who may have spoken before him.

520 No person shall speak more than three times on the same subject without leave of the association.

No member shall laugh or whisper in time of pub-

lic speech.

Members shall address each other by the sappellations of brother or vbiethren.

8. No member of this association shall cabsent himself when the association is sitting in conference with-

out leave of the moderator.

9. The names of the members of the association shall be senrolled lands called mover as coften as the

association thinks necessary.

11. 10. No member shall speak longers than wift teen minutes at any one time without leave of the massociation.

11. Any member who shall knowingly break any of these rules shall be reproved; by the moderator according to the direction of the association.
