

## MINISTERS' REPORTS

**CHARLES STATEN** — Preached nine sermons; received nothing at Sharum church, Poynor \$4.00; assisted with radio program five or six months.

**IRA GATES** — Pastored one church, New Covenant, part time; 54 sermons; 22 conversions; 16 received into fellowship; received \$85.40. Other places: 129 sermons; 26 conversions; received \$93.53; baptized 36; received \$178.93; married five couples.

**W. C. FORSYTH** — Received 10 members into fellowship; preached at Sharum, Pruett Chapel, and other places; received \$82.46; organized two churches.

**WILLARD ULMER** — Preached at Pirtle church; preached seven sermons; received for work, nothing.

ARCHIE CONSTANT — Pastored one church; preached 40 sermons; witnessed 15 conversions; baptized 13; organized one church; preached one funeral; officiated one matrimony; held two revivals; received \$19.30.

E. WAYNE TUCKER — Pastored at Firtle; preached 33 sermons; received 6 into fellowship; baptized 4; received \$50.00.  
Preached at Stony Point; 6 sermons; received \$16.35.  
Preached at Sharum; 11 sermons; received \$29.75.  
Officiated seven funerals; married one couple; traveled 420 miles; total received \$89.12.

New Harmony: Preached 37 sermons; received \$95.75.

Poynor: Preached 38 sermons, including revival and camp meeting; received \$73.44.

Hopewell: Preached 38 sermons; received \$41.57.

Preached at other places: Conducted eight funerals; officiated three marriage ceremonies; preached one baccalaureate sermon, four revivals; baptized 31; made 27 radio talks; 157 sermons; received \$456.29.

D. C. JONES — Pastored one church, 29 sermons, at Clear Lake; received \$17.67.

Other places: 76 sermons; received \$41.52; witnessed four conversions; traveled 925 miles; five funerals; married two couples; sermons 105; received \$59.19.

## FREE WILL BAPTIST CHURCH COVENANT

Having given ourselves to God by faith in Christ, and adopted the Word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this solemn covenant. We will everywhere hold Christian principle sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society; constantly praying and toiling that the kingdom of God may come, and His will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to the study of the Scriptures, secret prayer, family devotions, and social worship; and by self-denial, faith, and good works endeavor to "grow in grace and the knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ." We will not forget the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences, public worship, and the observance of the ordinances of the Gospel, nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor, and all its benevolent work.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprises, the support of missions, the success of Sunday schools, and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of souls, and the conversion of the world. And may the God of peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.
