I pastored New Bethel one-half time. Preached 49 sermons, assisted in revival, witnessed seven conversions, received two in membership, baptised one, received \$160.00. Organized League, preached eight sermons elsewhere. Have accepted Oak Grove one-half time. New Bethel, one-half time. LEONARD MILLIGAN, P. O. Box 244, Black Rock, Ark.

I pastored Oldhams Chapel full time. Received from church \$139.00, other offerings, \$70.00, conducted one funeral, preached two sermons over KPOC, one sermon at Jonesboro, received \$10.00. Preached two sermons at Poplar Valley. witnessed 11 conversions, one sermon at Old People's County Rest Home. G. E. HESTER, Walnut Ridge, Ark.

I pastored Elnora church full time. Preached 95 sermons including revivals. Witnessed eight conversions, baptised four, additions to the church, traveled 4,350 miles, received \$885.00. Held a revival at Alice Brooks, preached 11 sermons, witnessed 16 conversions, traveled 500 miles, received \$50.00. Revival at Knobel, preached 10 sermons, witnessed eight conversions, baptised two, traveled 100 miles, received \$60.00. Revival at New Covenant, preached 11 sermons, witnessed 23 conversions, baptised 21, traveled 450 miles, received \$53.60. Preached seven sermons elsewhere. witnessed one conversion, performed three marriage ceremonies, conducted eight funerals, traveled approximately 800 miles, received \$138.54. Total of 145 messages, 56 conversions, baptised 27, traveled 6,200 miles, received \$1,187.14 REV. CARL HIGH. Peach Orchard, Ark.

Article IV of the State Association: This association shall be supported by 28 per cent of the Cooperative receipts that come to the State Treasurer. Also, each district association shall send \$3.00 for each church belonging to said association, which will go to the host church for entertainment expenses.

CONSTITUTION

- 1. This Association, when properly organized, shall consist of a moderator and a clerk, who shall be chosen by the suffrage of the members present. The duty of the moderator shall be to keep the Association in order, state questions fairly and take the vote thereon; to have the liberty of speech as other members, providing his seat be filled; to have no vote unless the Association be equally divided, in which case he shall have the deciding vote. The duty of the clerk shall be to keep a fair record of the proceedings of the Association.
- 2. The Association shall be composed of ordained ministers, deacons, their wives who are members, and licentiates together with the messengers duly chosen by the several churches in our union and sent to represent them in this Association, whom the members judge best qualified for the purpose, who, on producing letters certifying to their appointment, shall be entitled to seats.
- 3. In the letters from the several churches shall be expressed their respective number of members in fellowship, and the number received, dismissed, excluded or died since the last sitting of the Association, and day of church meeting.
- 4. No query shall be received by the Association from any church unless it has been acted on in said church and cannot be settled, in which case the Association shall take same and act upon it.
- 5. Every church in the Association shall be entitled to a representation of messengers, not exceeding five.
- 6. Every motion made and seconded shall be acted upon unless withdrawn by the mover.
- 7. The Association shall not have the power to lord it over God's heritage so as to infringe on any of the internal rights of the churches; nevertheless, we agree that churches composing the Association shall stand in the same relationship to each other in this Association that individuals do to each other in the church; that is to say, if a church trespass against a sister church the church shall try to reclaim them by Gospel steps; if they cannot be reclaimed, they shall be dropped from our union.
 - 8. We agree to do business by a majority of all members present.
- 9. Any church may be admitted into this Association by letter and messengers. If upon examination it is found to be orthodox and orderly, such admission shall be manifested by the moderator giving the right hand of fellowship to the messengers thereof.
- 10. This association shall have power to sit as an advisory council to give churches all necessary advice in matters of difficulty; to inquire into the cause why churches neglect to represent themselves in this Association; to appoint member, by and with his or her consent to transact any business they may deem necessary; to invite brethren in the ministry to a seat with the Association; to adjourn the Association at any time and place that may be thought necessary; to exclude from his seat any member who does not conform to the rules of decorum, and shall report his or their conduct to the churches from which he or they were messengers.
- 11. The Association possesses appelate jurisdiction in all cases of difficulty that may arise in the churches.
- 12. The Lord's Supper and feet washing shall be administered at each annual session of the Association.
- 13. Each Annual Association shall be held on Thursday before the third Sunday in August.
- 14. This Constitution may be changed at any regular session of the Association by a two-thirds majority provided the intended change be announced in writing one day before the vote.

RULES OF ORDER

- 1. At every sitting of the Association, business shall be opened and concluded with a prayer.
- 2. Those who speak shall rise, address the Moderator, and personal reflections shall be avoided.
- 3. All motions made and seconded shall be open for discussion, but debate may be shut off at any time by a majority of the members of the Association.
- 4. If any proposition or motion under debate contains two or more points, it shall be divided at the request of any member and the vote taken separately.
- 5. Motions made and lost shall not be recorded on the minutes unless so ordered at the time.
- 6. No one shall speak more than once on the same subject without special leave from the body.
 - 7. All questions shall be decided by a majority of the members present.
 - 8. No member shall absent himself without leave of the Moderator.
- 9. Arrangements shall be made so as to insure two sermons or other devotional exercises equivalent thereto in addition to the business session each day, and the Moderator announces at the adjournment of each business session who is to have charge of said service.
- 10. Alterations may be made in these rules at any regular meeting of the Association.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

- 1. THE BIBLE—The Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments were given by inspiration of God, and are our infallible rule of faith and practice.
- II. GOD—There is one living and true God, revealed in nature as the creator, Preserver and Righteous Governor of the Universe, and in the Scriptures as Father, Son and Holy Ghost, Yet as one God, infinitely wise and good, whom all intelligent creatures are supremely to love, adore and obey.
- III. CHRIST—Christ is God manifest in the flesh; In His divine nature truly God, in His human nature truly man. The Mediator between God and Man, once crucified, He is now risen and once glorified, and is our ever present Savior and Lord.
- IV. THE HOLY SPIRIT—The Scriptures assign to the Holy Spirit all the attributes of God.
- V. THE GOVERNMENT OF GOD—God exercises a wise and benevolent providence over all beings and all things by maintaining the constitution and laws of nature. He also performs special acts, not otherwise provided for, as the highest welfare of men requires.
- VI. THE SINFULNESS OF MAN—Man was created innocent, but by disobedience fell into a state of sin and condemnation. His posterity therefore, inherit a fallen nature of such tendences that all who come to years of accountability, sin and become guilty before God.
- VII. THE WORK OF CHRIST—The Son of God by His incarnation, life, sufferings, death, and resurrection effected for all a redemption from sin that is full and free, and is the ground of salvation by faith.
- VIII. THE TERMS OF SALVATION— The conditions of salvation are: 1. Repentance or sincere sorrow for sin and hearty renunciation of it. 2. Faith or the unreserved committal of ones self to Christ as Savior and Lord with purpose to love and obey Him in all things. In the exercise of saving faith, the soul is renewed by the Holy Spirit, freed from the dominion of sin, and becomes a Child of God. 3. Continuance in faith and obedience until death.

- IX. ELECTION—God determined from the beginning to save all who should comply with the conditions of salvation. Hence by faith in Christ men become His elect.
- X. FREEDOM OF WILL—The human will is free and self-controlled, having power to yield to the influence of the truth and the Spirit, or to resist them and perish.
- XI. SALVATION FREE—God desires the salvation of all, the Gospel invites all, the Holy Water strives with all, and whosoever will may come and take of the water of life freely.
- XII. PERSEVERANCE—All believers in Christ, who through grace persevere in holiness to the end of life, have promise of eternal salvation.
- XIII GOSPEL ORDINANCES—Baptism, or the immersion of believers in water, and the Lord's Supper are ordinances to be perpetuated under the Gospel. Feet-washing, an ordinance teaching humility of universal obligation, and to be ministered to all true believers.
- XIV. TITHING—God commanded tithes and offerings in the Old Testament; Jesus Christ endorsed it in the Gospel, Matt. 23:23, and the Apostle Paul said, "Upon the first day of the week let every one of you lay by him in store, as God hath prospered him.—I Cor. 16:2a.
- XV. THE CHRISTIAN SABBATH—The divine law requires that one day in seven be set apart from secular employments and amusements, for rest, worship, holy works and activities, and for personal communion with God.
- XVI. RESURRECTION, JUDGEMENT AND FINAL RETRIBUTION— The Scriptures teach the resurrection of all men at the last day. They that have done evil unto the resurrection of damnation; then the wicked will "go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life."

FREE WILL BAPTIST COVENANT

Having given ourselves to God by faith in Christ and adopted the word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this solemn covenant. We promise by His grace to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid the appearance of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity of the world; from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages, and to provide things honest in the sight of all men."

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness, and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the Spirit," in the bonds of peace, to be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and as far as we are able, promote the success of the Gospel.

We will everywhere hold Christian principle sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society; constantly praying and toiling that the kingdom of God may come, and His will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to the study of the Scripture, secret prayer, family devotions and social worship, and by self-denial, faith and good works endeavor to "grow in grace and the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ." We will not forget the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences, public worship, and the observances of the ordinances of the Gospel, nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor, and all its benevolent work.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denomination enterprises, the support of the missions, the success of Sunday schools, and evangelistic effort for the salvation of souls, and the conversion of the world. And may the God of peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.
