SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE REPORT

Presently, we have 3 students from the Social Band Association enrolled at our Bible College in Nashville, Tennessee. Some of the students at our Bible College are preachers, some will be missionaries, and others will be Christian lay people in our churches.

Christian education is expensive because our college does not accept federal and state monies. Presently, it costs a dorm student about \$6,000.00 per year to attend our Bible College.

The Bible gives us several illustrations of God's people being trained, such as the sons of the prophets in II Kings. Paul was a very educated man and emphasized teaching.

We must train our God-Called young people for the service of our Lord. We realize we cannot underwrite the cost for the students from our association, but we all can do something.

We, the Scholarship Committee, recommend that each church give at least \$10.00 per month to the Scholarship Fund.

We have approximately 27 or 28 churches in the Social Band Association. If each church would participate in giving as we recommend, there would be almost \$2,000.00 in the account since our last checks were disbursed in February of this year. So, we are asking each church to prayerfully consider designating \$10.00 per month to the Scholarship Fund in their next business meeting.
