## Minutes of the January Quarterly Meeting held at the Jonesboro First Free Will Baptist Church

### Friday Evening - January 12, 1990 7:30 p.m.

The meeting was called to order by Moderator, Bro. Samuel Rogers. "Blessed Assurance" was sung. Devotional was given by Bro. Paul Bean from I Samuel 18:1-4.

Prayer was by Bro. Gene Carter. The Presbytery Board was excused in order to examine candidates. Special singing was by Heather and Patricia Prescott from the First Free Will Baptist Church in Jonesboro.

Evening message was given by Bro. J.W. Russell. Bro. Russell chose Isaiah 64:4 as his text. Bro. Russell closed his message with prayer. The Friday evening session was closed with a song: "Amazing Grace".

#### Saturday Morning - January 13, 1990 9:00 a.m.
