PROCEEDINGS OF THE EIGHTH ANNUAL SESSION of the South Carolina State Association of the Original Free Will Baptist held with Tabernacle Church, Cowards, S. C., November 16 - 17, 1950.

#### MORNING SESSION

1. The South Carolina State Association of The Original Free Will Baptist met with Tabernacle Church near Cowards, S. C. in its Eighth Session on Thursday and Friday November 16, 1950 at 10:00 o'clock. The President, Rev. L. A. Holliday called the meeting to order and the opening song was "To the Work."

2. Rev. Seldon Bullard was in charge of the Devotional Service. A passage

of Scripture was read after which Prayer was offered.

Rev. T. A. Williams the host Pastor gave the Welcome Address, which was responded to in an able manner by the Reverend Paul Shehan of Whitney, S. C.

Following this the President of the Association gave his annual address or message. His message was opened by the Congregation standing and singing "All Hail the Power of Jesus Name." The Scripture Lesson was from Gen. 13:1-4. Prayer was offered by Rev. A. F. Lawter, of Lockhart, S. C. Rev. Holliday used as a Text; "And He went on His way to Bethel to the place He went at first" using for His subject; "BACK TO THE EARLY ALTAR."

This was truly a very timely message, pressing home the great need of the return of Gods people to the Early Altar which has always been the source

of Divine inspiration and Power.

Following the President's Message the appointment of committees were then made: Reading Clerk, Fred Powers; Finance, J. M. Williams, Henry Smith and W. D. Sawyer; Resolutions, Rev. A. F. Lawter, Rev. O. M. Hilburn, Mrs. H. C. Simmons, Rev. J. A. Hucks, and Rev. P. J. Ketteman; Obituary, Rev. W. L. Jernnigan, Rev. L. A. Gray, and Hoyt Powell.

With the organization being completed prayer was offered by the President

for Divine guidance throughout the session.

The business session was then called off until two o'clock for devotional and Sermon.

Reverend O. M. Hilburn brought a very timely message on "The Four Phases

of our Church Work, using as a Text: "Co-labors with Christ" 1 Cor. 3:9.

At this time the Ladies of the host Church served a good mid-day meal

picnic style which was enjoyed by all.

tions conducted by the Reverend Fred Powers of Timmonsville.

We adjourned at this time (4:00 p.m.) until Friday morning at 9:00 a.m. Rev. A. F. Lawter of Lockhart, S. C. brought the message at 7:30 p.m.

#### FRIDAY MORNING SESSION

The Devotional Service was conducted by the Rev. H. E. Powell, of Hvman. After the congregation joined in singing "Draw Me Nearer" Rev. Powell brought a short message, using as his text Rev. 7:31. A season of Prayer was called for by the secretary of the association for a troubled world, this prayer was led by the Moderator Rev. L. A. Holliday and closed by Rev. H. M. Mellette.

One of the high lights of the entire association was a message on Consecration by the Moderator and followed by an appeal by Rev. M. H. Mellette for

repentance among our folk and a return back to the altar of God.

Motion made and properly sustained that a committee selected to draw a report on our stand in national and international affairs as a denomination in the State of South Carolina, and that a copy be sent to the South Carolina Assembly and Senate, also a copy to be sent to the U. S. Senate, the U. S. Congress and to the United Nations. A copy of the same to be sent to the Free Will Baptist Press, Ayden, N. C., the Gem, of Monette, Ma. The State and Record in Columbia and the New York Tribune. This committee was appointed by the Moderator as follows: Rev. M. H. Mellette, chairman, Rev. J. A. Hucks, Rev. O. M. Hilburn.

Rev. Damon C. Dodd made some very timely suggestions in regards to our Sunday School and other literature. He also reported that a reel of the Mission picture of our mission work in Cuba entitled "A Letter to Melintenno" could be secured from the National headquarters for use in our work in South Carolina. After much discussion by Rev. P. J. Ketteman and others it was decided not to purchase a reel of the picture.

A letter was read in which Rev. H. J. Sawyer offered his resignation as secretary and treasurer of Home Missions. His resignation was accepted and the Clerk instructed to write Rev. Sawyer expressing our deep appreciation for the faithful service rendered during the time he held the office, and our regret of his resignation.

At this time we recessed for the preaching hour and lunch. Rev. L. S.

Gray brought a very timely message.

### FRIDAY EVENING SESSION

Devitional led by Rev. J. B. Oliver, using as a text Matt. 9:1-27.

Report of Resolution Committee

The following resolution was accepted by the Resolution committee and passed in the General Session:

Realizing the need of a better system of financing our young men in the Christian ministry also that there has been some funds raised for education;

Therefore, be it resolved by the South Carolina State Association of Free Will Baptist; Do recommend that a board of three members be elected to serve for a period of 2, 4, and 6 years respectively; and that they be clothed with authority to make loans and provide terms for the payment of same.

The board elected was as follows: Rev. Fred Powers, 2 years; Rev. M. H. Mellette, 4 years; Rev. O. M. Hilburn, 6 years. The above Fund to be known as the Baggett-Poston Memorial Fund.

# CONSTITUTION and BY-LAWS OF THE SOUTH CAROLINA STATE ASSOCIATION OR ORIGINAL FREE WILL BAPTISTS CONVENTION

Preamble: We, the officials, ministers and delegates of this the South Carolina State Association of Original Free Will Baptists, while in session at Unca Church, Spartanburg, South Carolina, November 13-14, 1946, do accept and adopt the foregoing constitution and by-laws.

Article One: This body shall be known henceforth as the South Carolina State

Association of Original Free Will Baptists.

Article Two. It shall be the purpose of this organization to cooperate with the National Association in its efforts to elicit combine, and direct the energies of the Free Will Baptist Church, for the promotion of Home and Foreign Missions, Chrisian Education, Sunday School, Free Will Baptist League and Ladies Auxiliary Work, and for the extension of the kingdom of God in general.

Article Three. Section One. This Association shall consist of delegates duly appointed or elected by the church or organization to represent, and ordained and licensed Free Will Baptist Ministers, who are of good repute in the Original Free Will Baptist Church, and who reside in South Carolina, or hold membership in,

or pastor a church in South Carolina.

Section Two. Each Association or Conference, may represent in this Association on the basis of two delegates for each Association and Conference of one thousand members or less, and one additional delegate for each additional thousand members or fractions thereof.

Section Three Any local church that desires to may send an additional delegate, provided said church sends a contribution for Association expenses of not

less than \$5.00.

Article Four. This Association shall have an Executive committee of five, composed of ordained ministers and lay members in good standing in the Association, one to be appointed by the Moderator each year for a five year term, to act officially in the event any case may arise in this Association, when, and only when it is deemed necessary or expedient for the best interest of the cause of the church in general.

Article Five. The officers of this Association shall be a president, first, second and third vice-president, a corresponding secretary, a recording secretary, and a reading clerk. Said reading clerk to take the place of the recording secre-

tary in his absence and a treasurer.

Section Two. These officers are to be elected by the Association to serve

a term of two years.

Article Six. All officers of this Association, all members of its committees and boards, all its sercretaries, missionaries, and agents appointed by the Association or by any of its boards, shall be members of regular Free Will Baptist Organizations in South Carolina cooperating with this Association.

Article Seven. All missionaries, teachers and Christian workers approved, appointed, or supported by this Association must be fundamental in their views of the Bible and its teachings, and in harmony with the doctrines of the Original Free Will Baptist church. They must also give evidence of genuine Christian piety, for fervent zeal in the service of Christ, and of ability to do the work for which they are considered.

Article Eight. This Association shall hold its meetings annually on Thursday and Friday of the week between the second and third Sundays in November, beginning at 10:00 a.m., unless, or until, some change of the time of the year shall be

thought best.

Article Nine. These Articles may be altered or amended at any regular session of the Association by a vote of two-thirds of the members present providing the change is recommended at least one day before the vote is taken.

#### BY-LAWS of the ASSOCIATION

1. A portion of the Scripture shall be read and prayer offered at the beginning of each morning and afternoon session of the Association, and prayer shall be offered at the close if each session.

This is to be done by the President, or someone appointed by him.

2. The President or Vice President shall call the Association to order at the hour designated by the program committee.

When neither the President or the Vice-President is present, the Recording Secretary shall call the Association to order and a President Pro Tem shall be elected by the body, who shall preside for that session of

the Association.

- 3. It shall be the duty of the Recording Secretary to enroll the delegates of the Association who shall present themselves with proper evidence of their right to seats therein, and those enrolled by the Secretary shall compose the Association.
- 4. Each organization represented in the Association shall send into the Association as large a contribution as they can from time to time. This money to be used to meet the expenses of the Association and to promote the work it undertakes.
- 5. On the first day of the Association Meeting the President shall appoint a Resolution Committee to consist of three members, all resolutions not connected with the reports of boards and committees shall be referred to this committee, which shall report on all resolutions referred to it, with or without recommendation.
- 6. The officers of the Association, the departmental Secretaries, the Executive Committee, and all boards shall be elected by the Association. All other committees may be either appointed by the President or elected by the body.

In the election of officers, boards, or committees, the votes may be by ballot if preferred, or by any other method agreed upon by the body.

7. In the event of a standing Executive Committee, the members shall be elected for a term of five years except the first four elected, who shall serve a

period of one, two, three and four years respectively.

8. The duties of the Executive Committee shall be as follows: 1. To act for the Association in matters that demand its consideration between the regular annual sessions of the Association. 2. To have oversight of arrangements for meetings of the Association with the authority to change, if necessary, the time and place of meeting. 3. To fill vacancies in the Association that may be caused of death, resignation, etc., between the regular sessions of the Assn.

9. It shall be required of all members of the Association to remain throughout the entire session, unless they are excused by a majority vote of the body.

- 10. Anyone desiring to speak shall rise and address the Preident, and shall wait until he is recognized before speaking further. 1. The President shall not allow discussions that are unchristian in spirit and that tend to create envy and strife among the brethern, and anyone resenting the ruling of the President in such matters shall be liable to censure of body.
- 12. No one shall be allowed to speak more than 15 minutes or more than

twice on the same subject without permission of the body.

- 13. It shall be the duty of the President to have his annual message so prepared and arranged that it can be handed to the Secretary for publication in the minutes of each session of the Association.
- 14. The officers of this Association, except that of the Board of Trustees and the Executive Committee, shall be for a term of two years.
- 15. These By-Laws may be altered at any regular session of the Association by a vote of two-thirds of the members present, providing the change is recommended at least one day before the vote is taken.
