February 18 - 19, 1988

The service opened by singing "When We All Get to Heaven". Rev. Eddie Riddick was the song leader, and Rev. Theron Scott was the pianist. These served during the entire session, unless stated otherwise. Rev. James Earl Raper led in prayer.

The moderator brought his message. (Appendix I). The clerk called the convention to order. The Host Paster, Rev. Talmadge Brown gave the welcome. The delegates were then scated. The program was then approved. The Committee on Committees was appointed. They were as follows: Rev. Henry Potter as chairman, Rev. John Suttles, Rev. Johnnie Bullman, Rev. William Jacobs, and Rev. David Carter.

The visitors were recognized and then made welcome. MSC to accept the True Life Association into membership of the South Carolina State Association. The National Representatives were then recognized. After examining the issues involved, we made the following recommendations:

- 1. We recommend that this body vote in favor of establishing a "retirement village", which will be located in Turbeville, South Carolina.
- 2. This complex will be located on land presently owned by the State Association. This land is part of the property associated with the "Children's Home".
- 3. The State Association, or the moderator, appoint a Board of Trustees, and an Administrator. This Board will carry out the following functions during the year of 1988:
- Determine suitable construction plans for one duplex housing unit.
- b. Research all applicable state and local building ordinances
- these coverages. . Determine necessary insurance coverages, and the cost of obtaining
- d. Accept applications and select the first resident(s).
 e. Present the plans and needs of this ministry before local churches and conferences.
- tual construction to help reduce costs. f. Seek out resources and assistance which could be used during ac-
- g. Make a full report of their activities and findings at the 1989 State
- h. The Administrator, along with the Board of Trustees, will oversee the construction and future operation of the "Retirement Village"
- 4. The first duplex will be financed by a \$50,000 Capital Fund Campaign. The construction on the first unit should begin as soon as possible, with a target paign goal is to raise \$50,000 by the 1989 State Meeting. If the goal is met, mittees to determine individual Conference goals for this Campaign. CHILDREN'S HOME REPORT

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE FREE WILL BAPTIST HOME FOR CHILDREN, TURBEVILLE, S.C. FOR THE YEAR 1987.

The Children's Home experienced a profitable year financially, having an income higher than the expenses, or \$15,028.59 increase; however, the expenses also increased ed \$9,082.55 over the previous year. Commodities and other gifts increased.

We want to thank each church, each person or firm who contributed to the operation of the home, both in S.C. and friends in other states. We served an average of 24 children per day, with low of 22 in Jan. and high of 26 in Oct.

The home is operated by the superintendent, Mrs. Rice, Miss Meeks and Mrs. Hampton, and also by another couple for about 5½ months. Our goal is to employ a couple for the boys dormitory shortly.

In Dec., the home began to take on a new look, with our Chairman, Brother A.C. Allen, obtaining free labor and equipment, using same to cut down some trees in front, taking up all shrubbery around the buildings, tearing down rail fence in front. Three hundred and ten pieces of shrubbery were set out around the buildings and in front. The boys dormitory was painted during the year with many other repairs made.

Money has been raised to replace all furniture in the 6 rooms in the boys dormitory and also matching curtains and bedspreads have been donated to the home. Our goal is to get the curtains over the windows in the boys and girls dorms, as well as, the new furniture in the early part of 1988. Also, our goals are to put more new furniture in both dorms, tear down some old buildings in the back, cut more trees down, move playground equipment to the back and beautify the front.

Our children participated in Tic-Tac-Toe and Bible drills at local churches as well as singing when we visited churches in S.C. and N.C. Our goal is to spend more time in teaching Christian principles to the children and in counseling.

Several were baptized after being saved during the year. Seventeen of the children attended Youth Camp during the summer.

The home is located on 83 acres, using a main building and contents, two dorm buildings and contents, two recreational buildings and contents, one barn, an outdoor sign, 1980 van, 1969 bus, 1982 pickup and two tractors. Land, buildings, and contents valued at \$615,000.00.
