In response to a request at last year's state meeting for the executive committee to study the possibility of purchasing the South Oak property, the executive committee presents the following statement as information: "After careful consideration of the options involved in purchasing the South Oak property and realizing the financial burden it would place on our state, the Executive Committee recommended we not pursue the purchase of this property."

MSC to look into the possibility of having Dr. David Gibbs, the director of the Christian Law Association, as a quest speaker at next year's state meeting and share with us information during the day concerning such topics as "Legal Issues Facing the Church" and "Pastors and Their Taxes" and also preach the message for the Thursday evening service.

In response to the motion presented at last year's general board meeting concerning the executive committee studying the promotional director's salary, it was **MSC** that we increase the salary of the promotional director to \$36,000 beginning with the budget year of 2001. Listed below is an itemized breakdown of the recommended salary increase. This is an increase of approximately 10% of what is listed in the Digest of Reports for the 2001 budget. The below listing is a yearly salary.

Realizing that the increase in last year's salary was not able to be taken due to a lack of funds in the promotional office and realizing the need for the promotional office giving to increase from the churches in our

state, we suggest a few possibilities to be discussed to assist in making this salary increase possible:

2) Take a small percentage (such as 4%) of the South Carolina Plan of Support that comes through the promotional office and designate it to the promotional director's salary

3) Promote a special Sunday, such as Roll Call Sunday, each year in which churches would take up an offering that would specifically go to the promotional office to help with this increase in the promotional director's salary.

2000 Promotional Office Report

Rev Mike Jones, Promotional Director

The year 2000 was a tremendous year for Free Will Baptists in South Carolina. Gifts to the Plan of Support increased by nearly \$133,000 (Glory!). Gifts to the Promotional Office increased by \$6,000. And Sales at the FWB Christian Book Store increased by nearly \$25,000. We praise the Lord for His continued Blessings. As Promotional Director, I traveled well over 40,000 miles during 2000 and had the opportunity to visit in all of our Churches. I am thankful to report that Free Will Baptists are alive and well.

Because of the hard work of the Master's Men of Temple FWB Church of Darlington (Pastor Todd Parrish) and the generous giving of the Eastern Conference of FWB, the outside of the Promotional Office / Bookstore received a new coat of paint early this year. A hail storm ended up bringing us a brand new roof. Signs Ltd of Lake City helped us get a new announcement sign. And Book Store Manager, Eddie Hobbs, worked on our flowers and shrubbery so that we now have a building that Free Will Baptist can be proud of .

All sales through the Christian Book Store are now exempt from S C Sales taxes; saving our customers 6% on each purchase. A new section featuring FWB writers and doctrines has been added. And the Carlisle- Marie Hanna Conference Room has a very nice conference table and chairs courtesy of the Florence-Darlington FWB Ministers Fellowship.

Two new Foreign Missionary families were added to our Plan of Support this year and generous FWB opened their hearts and their wallets to help send them to the field where they can win souls for Christ. Generous giving also allowed the Home Mission work at Anderson to become a self supporting Church impacting their community for Christ.

The SCFWB.com web site was begun this year. It now list all of our Churches and their Pastors, has a listing of available Pastoral Candidates and speakers, has a Music Box page listing available singers from FWB Churches in South Carolina, a section listing the FWB state officers, Links to other FWB Works, and will soon contain a web page for each church in our state showing a picture of the church, its pastor, the time of its services, and a map to make it easy to locate.

Helps are being made available to assist pastors and churches with Taxes, Retirement, Insurance, and Legal issues. Methods are also being looked into to help our Churches across the state reach more souls and grow in their impact for Christ in their community. God is at work among Free Will Baptists Churches and we look for 2001 to be one of the best years in the history of Free Will

Book Store Manager, Eddie Hobbs salary has remained constant for the past 3 years at \$23,000 per year (including all taxes and benefits).

Promotional Director, Mike Jones had a salary budget of \$34,500 for 2000.
