Thursday Morning - February 21st

Bro. Wray Newton led in a congregational hymn. Our state meeting was called to order and delegates were seated. A special altar prayer was given for Bro. Mike Creech who had a heart attack. The host pastor, Bro. Johnny Bullman, welcomed everyone to the state meeting. The response was given by the Assistant Moderator, Bro. Buddy Seay.

It was MSC to accept the motion by the South Carolina State Association of Free Will Baptist Executive Committee as given in the Digest of Reports, as passed by the General Board, and as listed below:

MOTION FROM THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF THE SOUTH CAROLINA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS CONCERNING CONFERENCES THAT RESTORE MORALLY FALLEN MINISTERS TO PASTORAL LEADERSHIP.

After receiving information and input from the 7 Conferences that constitute the South Carolina State Association of Free Will Baptists concerning the licensing or ordination of Sexually Fallen Pastors, the Executive Committee makes the following motion based on the Moral Mandate and the Legal Liabilities of such actions:

1) The MORAL MANDATE: The overwhelming majority of the Conferences in the State have stated that they believe that a Morally Fallen Pastor should not remain ordained; nor should he be re-ordained. They believe that he can be forgiven by God, restored to his relationship with God, and even be used in active service in the work of God; but not in an ordained position.

The Conferences in our state do not wish to condone such moral behavior by returning the fallen Pastor to an active leadership role. To weaken the wall of Holiness at this point would eventually lead to allowing other moral problems (such as Homosexuals) to be placed in our pulpits

2) The LEGAL LIABILITY: In our present legal climate, the restoration of a sexually fallen minister to the pulpit would expose the church, the conference,

and the State Association to the possibility of tremendous legal liabilities.

Therefore, The Executive Committee of the State Association of Free Will Baptists moves that the State Association withdraw fellowship from any church or conference which licenses, ordains, or recognizes a sexually fallen pastor.

Withdrawing fellowship from a conference or church means that they cannot be seated at the State Association meeting; thus they will have no voting privileges nor can their ministers or delegates serve on boards of the State Association during the breach of fellowship. If they maintain this policy four months after action by the State Association, they will no longer be considered a part of the South Carolina State Association of Free Will Baptists. - - - - -

FWB Treatise Chapter III "Associations of Churches"

Section IV: Their Relationships

A. The District Association (or quarterly meeting) and the local Churches:

3. The association's only "power" over the local church is limited to dealing with the church's rights as a member of the association:

a. The association may set whatever requirements it wishes as conditions for the church's "Good standing" in the association although it has no power to force the church to meet those requirements.

b. The association may, for example, refuse to seat delegates from a local church if there is a breach of fellowship being dealt with.

c. Ultimately, the most extreme power of the association is to withdraw fellowship from the local church as a member of the association

B. The broader associations, at each successive level, bear exactly the same relationship to the bodies composing them as that defined above between the district association (or quarterly meeting) and the local church.

- F. The Fund shall be administered by the State Executive Secretary.
