South Carolina State Association Peace Free Will Baptist Church, Florence, SC February 27-28, 2002

It was MSC to lay on the Table the following information recommended by the South Carolina Free Will Baptist Executive Committee as approved and recommended by the General Board:

Executive Committee Motions Concerning Constitutional Revisions

Meeting in Florence, SC, February 13, 2003 The Executive Committee proposes the following motions regarding the revised constitution...

- 1) The State Association approve the grammatical, spelling, and sentence construction changes made in the Constitution of the South Carolina State Association of Original Free Will Baptists, Inc. and distributed to all the Ministers in the state prior to this session.
- 2) That the South Carolina State Association of Original Free Will Baptsits, Inc. grant the clerk continuing authority to change grammatical, spelling, and sentence construction as they are found in the South Carolina State Association of Original Free Will Baptsits, Inc. Constitution.
- 3) That the word "partial" be removed from the constitution when used to refer to a person's term of office; therefore allowing individuals to serve two full terms regardless of any partial term served.

- 4) That representation fees to the State Association be changed from a set amount to an annual designated fee. 5) That Article V, Section One, Method of Selection of Delegates to the National Association of FWB be changed to read- "Each conference or association shall have the privilege of nominating one delegate to represent the South Carolina State Association of Original Free Will Baptists, Inc. State Association at the annual meeting of the National Association of FWB. If any conference fails to nominate a delegate or the delegate is unable to attend then the Moderator will choose delegates from available laymen with consideration given to representation from all conferences. If all six conference delegates are able to attend the National Association then the State Moderator will designate one of them as an alternate on a rotating basis."
- 6) That the Executive Committee be expanded to include two members at large as reported in the Digest of Reports.
- 7) That the Church Training Board (CTS) be dissolved and that the officers of the State Youth Conference (previously CTS) be elected at the annual meeting of the State Youth Conference. The Director shall report annually to the South Carolina State Association of Original Free Will Baptsits, Inc. (for example, as is presently done by the South Carolina Free Will Baptist Women Active for Christ).
- 8) That the South Carolina State Association of Original Free Will Baptsits, Inc. Executive Secretary serve as the General Board Member to the National Association beginning in 2003.
- 9) That a South Carolina State Association of Original Free Will Baptsits, Inc. Historian be elected to serve a five year

term and that he be eligible to succeed himself at the pleasure of the body.

- 10) That the annual fees for services rendered be changed to
 - A) Clerk- \$500 Annually
 - B) Moderator- \$100 Annually
 - C) Treasurer- \$250 Annually
- 11) That the South Carolina State Association of Original Free Will Baptsits, Inc. Constitution and By-laws be printed annually with the minutes of the State Meeting.
- 12) After printing the constitution, it was noted that the Resolutions and Nominating Committee composition and duties were listed incorrectly. Below is the correct reading of the current constitution:

ARTICLE VIII - Section TWO:

- 2. Resolutions Committee
- a. Composition. This committee shall consist of five (5) members.
- b. Duties. It shall be the responsibility of this committee to: 1) Receive all resolutions, 2) Carefully, examine, study, and discuss each resolution with those who presented the resolution if needed, and 3) Properly prepare each resolution for presentation to the body for vote.
- 3. The Nominating Committee.
- a. Composition. It shall be composed of one delegate from each conference or association.
- b. Duties. It shall be the responsibility of this committee to: 1)Secure from the Clerk the list of elected positions that are to be filled at the current session. 2) Prayerfully prepare a slate of names for needed officers, directors, board members and standing committee members for

presentation to the body for their consideration and election.

13) That the following statement be added to the South Carolina State Association of Original Free Will Baptsits, Inc. Constitution:

By adding the following words to Article III, Section Two, 6.

"When a conference or association is dissolved or a new conference or association is added, the Clerk shall be authorized to change all pertinent references in the constitution."

- 14) That the Field Directors of the South Carolina State Association of Original Free Will Baptsits, Inc. be allowed to serve a Five year term and be able to serve successive terms.
- 15) That the South Carolina State Association of Original Free Will Baptsits, Inc. Treasurer serve as liaison for the Poston Baggett Loan Fund and the Free Will Baptist Bible College, Nashville, TN, and he shall report to the State Association annually.
- 16) Recognizing that most churches across our state already have a men's fellowship, we recommend that the position of Master's Men Field Director be eliminated.
- 17) In light of the motion in 1998 regarding establishing a Home Mission Board for five years and due to the fact that all terms are due to expire this year, we recommend that the present board structure be retained until 2004, at which point the board will begin a five year rotation alphabetically according to Conference.

It was MSC to accept the South Carolina Free Will Baptist

South Carolina Free Will Baptist Executive Committee Minutes and General Board Minutes

Tuesday, May 14, 2002 Florence, SC

We received a letter from the Great Commission Conference stating that they had agreed to adopt and abide by the resolution passed at the South Carolina Free Will Baptist State Association February 2002 meeting regarding sexually fallen ministers.

It was MSC that a van be purchased for the South Carolina Free Will Baptist State Office for use in helping to fulfill the duties of the SC FWB Executive Secretary.

It was MSC to accept the State Office and Book Store reports as given by Bro. Mike Jones.

It was MSC to give the SC FWB Executive Secretary an additional week's salary for vacation purposes.

It was MSC to send an invitation to a pastor from the upper part of the state to sit with the Executive Committee in its meetings until next year's state meeting in order to serve as a representative from the upper part of the state. Bro. James Sanders was selected to serve.

It was MSC to recommend that an additional member at large be added to the Executive Committee; therefore, including a total of two member-at-large members. One member-at-large is be from

the upper state conferences (Beaver Creek or True Life or the Palmetto Conference or the Great Commission), and one member-at-large is to be from the lower state conferences (The Eastern Conference or the Central Association or the South Carolina Conference).

This motion would require the following Constitutional Change:

Article VIII, Section One, 1: Current Reading:

- a. Composition. The Executive Committee shall consist of the Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, and one member elected at large from the Association.
- b. The Executive Committee member at large shall be elected annually to serve one year. He may succeed himself as often as elected by the body. Recommended Reading:
- a. Composition. The Executive Committee shall consist of the Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, and two members elected at large from the Association. One member-at-large is be from the upper state conferences (Beaver Creek or True Life or the Palmetta Conference), and one member-at-large is to be from the lower state conferences (The Eastern Conference or the Central Conference or the South Carolina Conference).
- b. The Executive Committee members at large shall be elected annually to serve one year. They can succeed themselves as often as elected by the body. It was MSC to allow Bro. Mike Jones to serve as General Board member to this year's National Meeting in July.

It was MSC to recommend the following Constitutional Change:
