Proceedings

The seventy-sixth annual session of the South Georgia Association of the Original Free Will Baptist Churches met at Ebenezer Church, Glennville, Tattnall County, Georgia, October 23, 24, 1953.

Friday Morning

Following the singing of several congregational numbers with Miss Joanne Hamilton serving as pianist, the session was opened with prayer by Rev. W. L. Mills.

The Moderator, Rev. J. O. Fort, conducted the devotional services after which he immediately called for letters from the churches. Rev. T. G. Hamilton and Rev. E. C. Morris were appointed reading clerks. The letters were read and adopted and the delegates seated.

Rev. Louis H. Moulton made a brief talk in behalf of the new Savannah Church.

By motion, the chair appointed Rev. W. L. Mills to fill the vacancy on the Credentials Committee created by the absence of Rev. T. M. Carter. This committee was asked to make a report on receiving the Savannah Church into the South Georgia Association.

The moderator asked the Finance Committee to retire to get their report ready. At this time the Moderator declared the body ready to elect officers.

Rev. T. G. Hamilton was unanimously elected Moderator with Rev. J. R. Graham as Assistant Moderator. The election of Clerk was tabled until the afternoon session.

By motion, the session was to have no recess before the morning message.

Rev. Louis H. Moulton led in the singing of "Blessed Assurance," after which Dr. L. C. Johnson, President of the Bible College at Nashville, was introduced. He brought a very timely message from John 15 on the "true vine." A ministerial prayer of consecration followed in a re-dedication of all hearts to God.

By motion, the body adjourned for lunch which was provided by the host church.

Friday Afternoon

Rev. Sammy Wilkinson led the singing and conducted the afternoon devotions.

The Credentials Committee gave their report with the recommendation that the Savannah Church be accepted as a member of the South Georgia Association. This was unanimously adopted.

By motion, Rev. E. C. Morris made a brief report of the State's Promotional work. Following his report an offering was received in the amount of \$44.93 to put our state budget over the top.

By motion, the Moderator officially welcomed into the Association Rev. L. E. Sheffield and Rev. Louis H. Moulton.

The election of officers was resumed. Rev. Louis H. Moulton was elected Clerk; Rev. Tom Lightsey, Assistant Clerk; and S. M. Altman, Sr., Treasurer.

Ordaining Council elected: Rev. I. J. Blackwelder, Rev. J. O. Fort, and Rev. C. J. Pitts.

Credentials Committee elected: Rev. W. L. Mills, Rev. E. B. Joyner, and Rev. J. O. Fort.

By motion, the chair appointed the Finance Committee: S. M. Altman, Sr., Fred Purcell, and Frank Bennett.

By motion, the chair appointed two members to serve with the officers of the Association as the Executive Committee. These were David Mann and J. B. Brigman.

By motion, the chair appointed the Committee on Committees: Rev. C. D. Rentz, Mrs. Opal Howard, Rev. A. L. Thornton, Ira Branch, and Rev. J. E. Wood.

By motion, Rev. J. E. Wood was seated as corresponding messenger from the North Florida Conference and Brother W. N. Wilson as corresponding messenger from the Little River Association.

The Moderator appointed a Devotional Committee to select a speaker for the night service; these were Roy Folsom, R. L. Franklin, and W. N. Purcell.

It was moved and adopted that the Savannah Church be allocated at least \$25.00 from the Association.

The Devotional Committee reported that Rev. Louis H. Moulton had been elected to bring the evening message with Rev. L. E. Sheffield bringing the Saturday morning message.

By motion, the Resolutions Committee gave their report.

Following the announcements, a motion was adopted to adjourn until 9:30 a.m. Saturday.

Friday Night

The evening service was opened with a song and testimony service led by the host pastor, Rev. T. G. Hamilton. Rev. C. D. Rentz conducted the devotions. Miss Julia Davidson rendered a beautiful solo after which the message was brought by Rev. Louis H. Moulton, using as a text 1 Thess. 5:21, "Hold Fast That Which Is Good."

Saturday Morning

After the song "Praise Him," the morning session opened with prayer by Rev. J. B. Harris. The devotions were given by Rev. J. E. Wood.

The Moderator excused the ladies for a brief meeting of the Woman's Auxiliary.

The minutes of the preceding day were read and adopted.

The Moderator called for other church letters at which time the letter from the Zion Church was read and the delegates seated.

The chair appointed Rev. E. B. Joyner to the Ordaining Council to serve in the absence of Rev. I. J. Blackwelder.

Reports of committees were called for and received. See reports. Ministry and Superannuation, Sunday School, Temperance, and Resolutions reports were heard.

By motion, the items of the Resolutions Committee report be read and voted on one by one. Items 2, 3, and 4 of this report were amended.

The Ordaining Council recommended that Brothers Sammy Wilkinson and Tom Lightsey be ordained at this session.

The Missions report was heard and the report of the Woman's Auxiliary election of officers.

By motion, the Moderator appointed a committee consisting of Revs. J. O. Fort, I. J. Blackwelder, T. M. Carter, together with the Executive Committee to revise our Associational Constitution, Associational Decorum, and Church Decorum. These are to be left out of this year's minutes.

By motion, the Ministerial Roll was called and brought up-to-date.

A five minute recess was declared before the morning service.

Rev. Sammy Wilkinson led the singing and Rev. C. J. Pitts brought the devotional. An offering was received for the new Savannah Church in the amount of \$128.15, then a solo by Brother Ennis Purcell. The morning message was delivered by Rev. L. E. Sheffield. He used as his text 1 Peter 2:1-12. The body was dismissed for lunch and prayer was offered by Rev. W. C. Coleman.

Saturday Afternoon

The final session was called to order with the singing of "When the Roll Is Called Up Yonder," led by Rev. W. L. Mills. Rev. E. B. Joyner offered prayer.

The report of the Credentials Committee was given with three late church letters. The delegates were received and seated.

Report of Committee on Committees was then heard.

The Moderator asked for a State Promotional Assistant from the South Georgia Association to help Rev. E. C. Morris or assist him at his request. G. W. Cloud was elected by acclamation.

The Obituary, Christian Education, and Finance Committees' reports were heard.

By motion, the Finance Committee's report was amended to have clerk print 1,000 instead of 600 minutes.

Delegates elected to the State Association were: Frank Bennett, Paul Wilcox and wife, Mrs. Opal Howard, and Mrs. R. M. Moody.

Three invitations were extended to the Association for next year with the decision being made to accept the invitation to meet with Spring Grove Church near Jesup.

By motion, a rising vote of thanks was extended to the retiring officers of the Association for their past services.

The service was then turned over to the Ordaining Council for the ordination of Rev. Sammy Wilkinson and Rev. Tom Lightsey.

Following the ordination of these two men, a motion was made to adjourn the seventy-sixth annual session of the South Georgia Association.

- 4. Resolved, that we further accept the resolutions formerly adopted relative to the early printing of the Association's minutes, and the 100 per cent support of the Unified Program by all churches.
- 5. Resolved, that any church or individual desiring a resolution to be passed by the Association, send the resolution to the church responsible for this report not later than ten days prior to the Associational meeting.
- 6. In order to expedite the business of the Association and conserve our limited time, be it therefore resolved: that the moderator appoint a Nominating Committee of three members, who will select and recommend to the Association eligible and capable individuals for all the officers of said Association at the beginning of each session.

7. Whereas, we consider that a program planned well in advance to its presentation is profitable, and

Whereas, the program of the annual session of the South Georgia Association could be planned to give greater participation by the ministers and laity; therefore,

Resolved, that it is the desire of this body to provide a program that will further the cause of our Lord and the Free Will Baptist church throughout the world.

Resolved, that the Executive Committee be appointed by this body to be responsible for the program of each annual session of the South Georgia Association, and that the church that is hostess to the Association be responsible for the speaker for the Associational Message on Friday morning, and whose message is to be in line with the theme of the session.
