

#### JANUARY 23, 1965

The Quarterly Meeting at Satilla Church was opened with the Rev. James Ursrey leading the singing of "Stand up for Jesus." Prayer was by the Rev. T. G. Hamilton.

Devotions were brought by the Rev. Irvin Hyman from Psalm 77 on the topic "The Old Time Religion."

## MINUTES OF THE QUARTERLY MEETING

# SOUTH GEORGIA ASSOCIATION HELD AT SPRING GROVE CHURCH — JESUP APRIL 24, 1965

The Quarterly Meeting of the South Georgia Association met April 24, 1965 at Spring Grove Church, Jesup. The Rev. Kenneth Faison led in singing "Stand Up For Jesus" and "Showers of Blessings." The Rev. Billy Livesay was at the piano. The Rev. Damon Dodd invoked God's blessings upon the meeting today.

The Rev. T. W. Long read from Matthew 5:1-12. He used verse 7 "Blessed are the merciful; for they shall obtain mercy" as his text verse for devotions. "To be merciful we have compassion toward others" he said.

The host church extended a cordial welcome to the association and response on behalf of the body was given by H. F. Johnson of Bethel church. The session was called to order by the clerk and he presented the moderator. At the written invitation signed by a majority of the members of the Baxley Free Will Baptist Church, the Executive Committee of the South Georgia Association met with the members of the Baxley Church on Saturday, July 10, 1965 at 3:00 P.M. The purpose of the meeting was not to inject the Association into an individual church's affairs nor to issue any kind of ultimatum nor to try to tell anyone what or how they must do certain things. Rather the Association was to offer suggestions or any help whereby the two warring factions might unite and bring about good relation among themselves.

After hearing both sides present their feelings and after listening to a partial tape recording of the business session in question, the Executive Committee arrived at the following advisory conclusions to offer to the church:

"The presence of a tape recorder brought into the conference seems to indicate organized opposition to the pastor. The Committee agrees that the presence of an outside minister in the person of the Rev. C. D. Remtz was unfortunate and unwise. The Committee agrees that the second conference was out of order.

The first conference was in order but was incomplete inasmuch as Brother Upright, according to the tape, failed to take a vote on the main motion.

Because of the seemingly misunderstanding and confusion on the part of some of the congregation, it is the recommendation of this Executive Committee that the church consider disregarding both of the conferences in question and announcing and calling a new coference to conduct the business of electing officers and calling a pastor.

We further recommend that an outside, impartial, minister or member of the South Georgia Association be invited in to moderate the conference.

We further recommend that neither of the men, Brother Upright nor Brother C. D. Rentz, be considered as pastor of the Baxley Church.

We further recommend that the conference be well announced and publicized so that every member of the church may know about it. Also, that every member of the church be urged to be present at the new conference.

# of the ANNUAL SESSION SOUTH GEORGIA ASSOCIATION

#### OCTOBER 15, 1965

The 88th annual session of the South Georgia Association met at Stoney Hill Church at 10:00 A.M. The Rev. Kenneth Faison led in congregational singing. The Rev. Wilford Harden brought devotions from Matthew 14:29-31. Prayer was offered by the Rev. Emmett McDoffie.

Motion made and adopted to add \$10.00 to clerk's expenses for this session. A recommendation from CTS Convention came to nominate the District CTS President—Darrell Douglas.

Announcement was made concerning Youth Rally to be held 2nd Friday in December and June. The CTS Convention meets 4th Saturday in March and September (March, 1966 at Satilla Church). Revival announcements were made by various churches. Adjournment was by prayer by the Rev. Grant Sevarence.

#### AN OPEN LETTER

#### REPORT OF THE YOUTH CAMP BOARD

On Sunday, August 8, 1965, cars from all over South Georgia made their way to Waycross, the site of the first South Georgia Associational Youth Camp. The weather was hot and balmy. Our hearts were filled with anticipation as we wondered just how things would turn out.

Upon arrival, scores of cars greeted our eyes and campers were everywhere. The camp has room for 190—and it looked as if we would fill it—and even go over the limit.

When the final tally was taken there were 171 young people—boys and girls—and 17 workers, giving us 188 in all. Never in the history of our Association had that many young folks attended camp.

That night we assembled in the auditorium and almost 200 voices rang out the praises to our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ—the One Who made the camp possible for our South Georgia youth. Bro. George C. Lee, pastor of the First Church in Albany, Georgia, brought a challenging message from God's Word—as was the case each night during the week.

Scores of decisions were made. In all there were 18 first time decisions for Christ recorded. This number, of course, represented those who were trusting Jesus as their personal Saviour. Rededications recorded came to 80. This number represented young people who surrendered their lives to the Lord for missionary and full-time service and those who gave up worldly things in their lives such as theatre going, dancing, rock 'n roll music, etc.

Lives were transformed. Testimonies heard were a real challenge and inspiration to our hearts.

We bow in praise to our wonderful Lord, Who, through His Holy Spirit and His Word—made all these things possible. Pastors will be notified by mail of the decisions made by their young people.

Next year we would like to plan for two weeks. There is a waiting list, however, for the camp and we are only guaranteed the one week from August 7-13. We're asking you to pray that the Lord will open up the previous week of July 31-August 6 for us. This week would be used for the Junior age of 8 through 11 years. The second week would then be used for young people age 12 through the teen age span. The same camp staff would serve for the two weeks.

Remember, pray that the dates of July 31-August 6 will open for us. Our Lord is able -- and we need this extra week. Otherwise, we might be unable to care for all our campers.

Our thanks to all the parents and friends for providing transportation. Our sincere appreciation is extended to all the camp staff who served so faithfully for the Lord and for our youth.
