

MINUTES OF THE SOUTH GEORGIA ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS

Convening at the Spring Grove FWB Church

January 24, 1998

Jesup, GA

The quarterly conference of the South Georgia Association began with Fred Lockwood leading the congregation singing "When We All Get To Heaven." The pianist was Kinsey Tyer. Host pastor Leon Gibson gave the welcome.

The clerk, Jeff Cockrell, called the meeting to order and introduced the moderator, Wayne Miracle, who opened the session. Henry Clay, from Corinth Church, brought the devotion from Second Corinthians 12:9 on the subject "My Grace is Sufficient."

The roll call of ministers and churches was taken with 18 ministers and 19 churches being present. M/S/C to seat the delegates. M/S/C to approve the minutes of the previous meeting.

The moderator recognized the visitors in attendance: William Smith from the State Office and Mike Crews from the Ogeechee Association.

The moderator appointed the committees for the meeting. Finance: David Griffin, Deena Davis, Wayne Aldridge. Resolutions: Chip Sekulich, Vera Wheeler, Danny Dinkins.

Miscellaneous Business:

Johnny Lewis reported that some churches had expressed interest in sponsoring the TV commercial "The Arrow."

William Smith, representing the State Office, reported that the South Georgia Association gave over \$102,000 through the State Office last year. The goal is for each church to give ten percent to the work of the denomination. Mr. Smith explained the Acts 1:8 plan and discussed the new format for the "Promotional Bulletin." Missionary Ron Wallace is scheduled to leave for Alaska the first week of April."

Eddie Vincent, newly arriving pastor to the Baxley Church, was recognized and welcomed to the South Georgia Association.

After a brief recess, the meeting reconvened with the congregation singing, "I'll Fly Away." The boards and committees gave the following reports:

Benny Larisey gave the resolutions committee report. The following resolution was offered to the delegation: "We resolve that we give the host church a rising vote of thanks for hosting this meeting and for the meal that will be provided today." M/S/C to adopt the report.

Worship:

Fred Lockwood led the congregation singing "Jesus Saves!" Ms. K. Tyre served as the pianist. The offering was received with Wayne Aldridge giving the offeratory prayer. Special music was provided by Joel Hampton who sang, "I Know Who Holds Tomorrow." Johnny Lewis, pastor of Corinth Church, brought the message entitled "Hair Splitters and Church Splitters" taken from First Corinthians 1:4-10. Rev. Lewis stated, "What we need ... is to see real revival." The points to the message were: our speech must diplay the characteristics of Christian unity, our thoughts ought to display the characteristics of Christian unity, and our judgments ought to edify the body of Christ. "In heaven there will be no division; the body of Christ will be full and complete," stated Rev. Lewis. The host church served a delicious meal in the church social hall.

Minutes of the South Georgia Association of Free Will Baptists Convening at Swainsboro FWB Church

Swainsboro, GA

April 25, 1998

The quarterly conference of the South Georgia Association began with Joel Hampton leading the congregation singing "Great Is Thy Faithfulness," Parnell Aldridge led in prayer. The welcome was given by Ed Hodges, Deacon, Swainsboro Church.

The clerk, Jeff Cockrell, called the meeting to order and introduced the

moderator, Wayne Miracle, who opened the session.

Parnell Aldridge, Piney Grove Church, brought the devotion from James 4:2 on the subject "You Have Not Because You Ask Not." Rev. Aldridge explained three reasons why we have not. We have not because we pray not, we expect not, and we are not committed. Rev. The clerk informed the association that the yearbooks have arrived and are

available one per church.

After a brief recess, the meeting reconvened with the congregation singing "All Hail the Power of Jesus' Name" led by Joel Hampton. The boards and committees gave the following reports:

Ordaining Board Report:

Chairman Larry Powell stated that Roy Woods will be leaving to minister in another association and that the board recommends Fred Lockwood to fill Rev. Woods' unexpired term.

Mike Price offered two resolutions from the committee: to give a rising vote of thanks to First Church, Brunswick, and to youth board for District Competition; and to give Swainsboro Church a rising vote of thanks for hosting the meeting. M/S/C to receive the report.

An Ordination Standard South Georgia Association of Free Will Baptists

1. The Licensed Minister

A person must be licensed for a periof of one year before he can be ordained. He must also be called to the care of one or more churches, or into other services which require ordination.

2. Qualifications of Ministers

They must possess good, natural and acquired abilities, deep and ardent piety, be especially called of God to the work, and ordained by prayer and the laying of hands.

3. Duties of Ministers

These are to preach the Word, administer the ordinances of the Gospel, visit their people, and otherwise perform the work of faithful ministers.

4. The Question of Divorce

No individual shall be ordained to the Gospel ministry who has been married and divorced, and in the process has more than one living companion. No individual shall be ordained whose wife has been previously married and divorced.

Note: These regulations are set forth to comply with the Biblical standard for ministers found in 1Timothy 3:1-7.

5. The Ordination of Women

Traditionally and historically Free Will Baptist in the State of Georgia have not ordained women in the Gospel ministry. So far as we are able to discern, this is still the true sentiment over the state. Therefore, until the thinking of our Free Will Baptist constituency becomes more definitive on this matter, we do not ordain women.

6. The Authority to Ordain

Free Will Baptists, committed to the doctrine of congregational church government, understand that the authority to ordain ministers is in the local church. In practice, however, the Free Will Baptist Churches in Gorgia work together in the matter of ordination by delegating the authority for ordination to the association of churches in which the local church holds membership The true source of this authority should never be lost sight of.

III. Responsibility of the new pastor accepting a church in the South Georgia Association

A Treatise of the Faith and Practices of the Original Free Will Baptists; Part IV. The Practices of Free Will Baptists; Chapterll, The Minister; Section III, His Relationships, page 60, Letter B: "To the association. When the minister becomes pastor of a given local church, it is his responsibility to obtain good standing in the association of which that church is a member if he is not already in good standing therein."

Whereas, it is the responsibility of the pastor of a given local church to obtain a good standing in the association of which that church is a member;

And whereas, the South Georgia Association has no jurisdiction over the church in its selecting a pastor because of this particular phase is left entirely into the hands of the local church;

Be it therefore resolved, that any pastor who desires to be a delegate, or have the full voting rights and privileges of an ordained minister, cannot do so because he is not a member of the association.

Of course, when the pastor decides to become a member of the association, then he would be granted these privileges.

IV. Local church calling a new pastor

Since the South Georgia Association has no jurisdiction over the church in its selecting a pastor, because this particular phase is left entirely into the hands of the local church. The only time that the association would be involved would be when the individual would be presented for membership into the association by the local church he is called to pastor.

It is hoped that when a church calls a pastor, they would take into consideration their examining him sufficiently and thoroughly so there would be no need for the Ordaining Board to have to deny him membership because of some technicality the church has overlooked.

For example, if the Ordaining Board found or discovered that the pastor did not meet the guidelines that are upheld by the South Georgia Association, then he would be denied membership and it would leave the local church in a predicament as what to do about their new pastor. Of course, if he meets the qualifications, there would be no problem

V. Minister's attendance at the Associational Meetings

The South Georgia Association has voted and passed the following rulings stated in the 1979 Minutes of the South Georgia Association, page 17:

We recommend that all ministers of the South Georgia Association who do not represent at the district meeting in person or by letter within three (3) consecutive meetings that his name be dropped from the roll call of ministers. In order to be reinstated, he must meet with the Ordaining Board for their recommendation back to the association.

Be it also understood, that when a minister's name has been dropped from the roll, he then becomes ineligible to be a delegate for his local church. He does not have the voting rights and privileges of an ordained minister until he has been reinstated by the Ordaining Board and Association.

VI. Amendments that were adopted January 26, 1980 at the Satilla Free Will Baptist Church

Item #1: Because of the pressing need of clearer guidelines in regard to the ordination of women, we the South Georgia Association of Free Will Baptists believe that the Bible clearly teaches that the office of the pastorate is God's role to man as given in such passages as I Tim. 2:11-15; I Cor. 11:3-15; 14:34-35; Eph. 5:22-24, 33b.

Therefore, In keeping with the teaching of God's word, the ordination of women will be prohibited in the South Georgia Association of Free Will Baptists. (M/S/C to adopt the amendment.)

Item #3: We the South Georgia Association of Free Will Baptists believe that tongues, which is the speaking in ascetic utterances or any unspiritual phenomena advocated by the Charismatic movement is to be considered as unbiblical for practice in our local churches and should be emphatically discouraged. (M/S/C to adopt the amendment.)

South Georgia Association of Free Will Baptists Constitution and Bylaws

Preamble

The object and purpose of this organization shall be to unify the people and strengthen the work of the various churches composing the South Georgia Association of Free Will Baptists, and to devise and recommend measures for the extension of the Kingdom of God in association with the various churches which do now and may hereafter comprise this organization.

Article I

This fellowship of churches shall be known as the South Georgia Association of Free Will Baptists

Article II

Section1: Membership

A. Membership in this association shall consist of such regularly organized churches that adhere to the doctrines and practices of Free Will Baptists as set forth in <u>The Treatise of the</u> National Association of Free Will Baptists.

B. Missions endorsed by the Missions Board of this association may be received under the watchcare of the association until duly organized and have compiled with the aforesaid statement relative to membership.

Section 2: Representation

A. Voting representation shall be by delegates duly authorized by the local churches comprising the South Georgia Association, and upon payment of fees described in Section 4 of this article.

B. The number of delegates shall be determined on the basis of two (2) per church and one (1) additional delegate for each one hundred (100) members or fraction thereof, based on the active membership roll.

C. Standing delegates will consist of all ordained ministers, deacons active on the Board, missionaries, general officers and standing Board members in good standing with the South Georgia Association. * See article regarding requirements for ministers and deacons for good standing located in the By-laws.

Section 3: Discipline

The association's only "power" over the local church is limited to dealing with the church's rights as a member of the association. At the request of a church or an aggrieved minority within a local church the association may act only as an advisory council to give advice in matters of difficulty. All matters involving discipline shall be handled according to the <u>Treatise of the National Association of Free Will Baptists</u>.

Section 4: Fees

Representation fees must be paid in order for delegates to be seated (elective and standing) at any regular session of this association. Representation fees shall be determined by the budget adopted by this association in its April session each year. The budget will cover a period from September 1 through August 31 of each year.

Article III

Section 1: General Officers

The general officers of this association shall consist of a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, and an Assistant Clerk/Treasurer, each of whom shall be elected at the close of the August session. The moderator shall serve a period of two (2) years and may succeed himself for only one term.

Section 2: Committees

A. Executive committee: The executive committee shall consist of the general officers stated in section 1 of this article.

B. Other committees: Committees, as necessary shall be appointed by the moderator unless otherwise provided for in this document and shall hold office until their work is completed or until their successors are named.

Section 3: Boards

A. Executive Board: The executive board shall consist of the general officers, the chairman of each of the standing boards, and the previous moderator for one (1) year following his term of office.

B. Board of Missions: The board of missions shall consist of five (5) members, so elected that one (1) member shall be elected each year.

C. Youth Board: The youth board shall consist of five (5) members, so elected that one (1) member shall be elected each year.

D. Ordaining Board: The ordaining board shall consist of five (5) members, so elected that one (1) member be elected each year.

Section 4: Compliance

Any person(s) elected to a board or committee

A. May not serve in more than one standing board at any time, with the exception of the executive board.

B. Must make every effort to attend each board or committee meeting.

C. In the event of any hindrance(s), he is asked to either send a proxy or contact the chairman by telephone or letter. Failure to comply with the above means that his position may be declared vacant and that the board of committee is open to recommend a replacement at the next quarterly meeting.

Article IV

Meetings: The meetings of the South Georgia Association shall be held on the fourth Saturdays of October, January, April, and the first Saturday in August, unless otherwise agreed upon.

Article V

Affiliation: By a voluntary act of this body, this association shall be a member of the Georgia State Association of Free Will Baptists. Membership with the State Body also gives us affiliation with the National Association of Free Will Baptists.

Article VI

Amendments: This constitution may be amended by a majority vote at any regular session. Notice of intended amendment must be given in writing to the Clerk, and must be read to the association body at the beginning of the session, to be voted on after the worship hour.

Section 1: General Officers

- A. Moderator: The moderator shall preside at the meetings of the association and the executive committee/board, and shall serve as chairman of the executive committee/board.
- B. Assistant Moderator: The assistant moderator serves as moderator in the absence of or at the request of the moderator.
- C. Clerk: The clerk shall keep accurate records of the association and the executive committee/board meetings. He shall call the association into order and introduce the moderator, and shall carry out the instructions of the association or executive committee/board in correspondence, etc.
- D. Treasurer: The treasurer receives all association funds and disburses them as instructed by the association or executive committee/board.
- E. Assistant Clerk/Treasurer: The assistant clerk/treasurer shall serve in the absence of or at the request of the clerk or treasurer. The assistant clerk/treasurer shall be able to sign checks in the event the treasurer is incapacitated.

Section 2: Committee/Board Functions and Meetings

A. Executive Committee/Board: The executive committee/board gives general leadership to the association, serves as the association between sessions of the association, and makes reports to the association for adoption.

This committee/board shall meet quarterly to plan and approve the association program, to hear reports from the standing boards and/or committees and to take care of any business which may claim its attention. These meetings will be at a time and place selected by the committee/board or moderator.

- B. Board of Missions: The board of missions shall offer leadership in areas of local as well as worldwide missions. It shall meet at its discretion.
- C. Ordaining Board: The ordaining board shall examine candidates for licensing and/or ordination who have been recommended by his local church. They shall assist the candidate in planning and conducting his ordination service as the need arises. They shall examine ministers petitioning the association for membership and make recommendations relative to the petition. It shall meet at its discretion.
- D. Youth Board: The youth board shall have general oversight of youth related activities as approved by the association such as Christian camping, youth rallies and CTS competitive activities. It shall meet at its discretion.

Section 3: Requirements for Ministers and Deacons at the Associational Meetings

A. Ministers: Ordained ministers of the South Georgia Association who do not represent at the district meeting in person, by letter, by telephone, etc., within three (3) consecutive meetings will be dropped from the roll call of ministers. In order to be reinstated he must meet with the ordaining board for their recommendation back to the association.

Be it also understood, that when a minister's name has been dropped from this roll, he does not have the voting rights and privileges of an ordained minister as a standing delegate until he has been reinstated.

B. Deacons: Deacons of the South Georgia Association's member churches who do not represent at the district meeting in person, by letter, by telephone, etc., within three(3) consecutive meetings will lose his standing delegate status. He must attend two (2) consecutive meetings in order to be reinstated to voting privileges as a standing delegate.

Section 4: Amendments

These by-laws may be amended by a majority vote at any regular session. Notice of intended amendment must be given, in writing, to the clerk, and must be read to the association body at the beginning of the session, to be voted on after the morning worship hour.
