




# August 7 through August 9, 1946

The Southeast Missouri yearly meeting of Free Will Baptist convened with the Flat River Church, August 7, 1946 through August 9.

### WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 7, 7:45 P. M.

The Southeast Missouri yearly meeting officially began as scheduled by pre-arranged program. Called to order by clerk with some preliminary remarks after which the welcome address was given by Miss Velma Holman of Flat River, Missouri.

Response by Ozella Wilson of St. Louis, Mo. Devotional led by Host Pastor, Rev. F. C. Zinn. Singing by congregation from Hymn Book. Prayer was led by Rev. Craven.

The Moderator then appointed a committee on Divine Service, Rev. F. C. Zinn, Chairman, Bobby Hill and Mary Ray, members.

A very spiritual praise service was held after which Rev. O. T. Allred of St. Louis, Mo. delivered the introductory sermon, subject: "Revival of Early Church Missionary Zeal." Scripture text: Acts 2nd chapter, verses 42 through 47. A very inspiring message was delivered. Partial report of committee on Divine Service that Rev. Woodrow Matthews preach at 11:00 A. M. Thursday, August 8. Service closed with benediction.

### THURSDAY, AUGUST 8, 9:30 A. M.

Called to order by Moderator. Devotional Service led by Rev. Kermit Esther. Singing by congregation from Hymn Book. Prayer offered by Rev. James F. Miller. The Scripture Lesson read from the 14th chapter of St. John.

A very spiritual praise service, closing the Devotional Service. Moderator in charge: reading of Constitution and By-Laws. Reading of letters of St. Francis and Madison Co. quarterly meetings. Proxies were appointed for delegates who were absent from among others of each quarterly meeting attending.

Motion carried to accept the reports, and that the delegates be seated. The report of the yearly meeting Executive Board was read, and the motion carried to accept the report. Rev. Woodrow Matthews re-elected to Board for 3 years.

Devotional led by Assistant Moderator. Singing by congregation from Hymn Book. The sermon was delivered by Rev. Matthews, Subject: "Fruit Bearing." A very spiritual message was delivered, closing with prayer at the altar.

At 12:00 o'clock noon a bountiful dinner was spread for all attending.

### THURSDAY, AUGUST 8, 1:30 P. M.

Called to order by Moderator with Rev. Zinn leading the devotional service with singing by congregation from Hymn Book. Led in a word of prayer by sister Beobout. Scripture reading from second chapter of 2 Thessalonians. Rev. Zinn led in prayer and conducted a wonderful praise service.

Sunday School Convention reports read and motion carried to accept the reports. Partial report of committee on Divine service that Rev. K. J. Esther preach at 7:45 P. M.

Called to order by Moderator. Singing led by Bro. Bobby Hill. Prayer led by Sister Eunice Miller. Scripture Lesson read by Christina Halbrook, 12th chapter of Romans and also conducting a praise service.

### ORDER AND BY-LAWS

Order and By-Laws of the Southeast Missouri Yearly Meeting of Free Will Baptist while in regular session:

Item No. 1—The delegated body shall meet Thursday morning at 9:30 before the 4th Sunday in August of each year for the transaction of legal business. The Moderator, or in his absence, the assistant Moderator shall call the meeting to order, and invite all to take part in congregational singing. After a sufficient number of songs, the Moderator shall read some suitable Scripture, then some one shall offer prayer.

Item No. 2—If it is found that a delegation is present from both Quarterly Meetings, the Moderator shall declare a quorum present to transact business.

Item No. 3—The letters from the quarterly meetings are to be read and the delegates seated. All ordained and licensed ministers who are in good standing, and full fellowship with some church in the Yearly Meeting shall by virtue of said authority be made standing delegates in the Yearly Meeting; also ordained deacons and Church clerks together with the treasurers.

Item No. 4—When all delegates, both elected and standing have been seated, the body will then proceed to elect officers as required by item No. 1 governing the organization. Each officer elected shall be instructed in the duties of the office to which they have been elected. The instructions to be given by the Moderator, or some one qualified to do so.

Item No. 5—The Moderator elected shall at once take charge of the meeting and shall when present, preside over all meetings. In the absence of the Moderator, the assistant Moderator shall preside over the meetings.

Item No. 6—The Moderator shall appoint all committees, unless otherwise ruled by the Body.

Item No. 7—The Moderator shall have the privilege to solicit the help of any minister or delegate present in appointing committees.

Item No. 8—After the organization has been completed, corresponding messengers, and visiting brethren from other religious bodies, are invited to a seat in the council. Should there be letters of greetings, or reports from other bodies, they may at this time be read.

Item No. 9—All items of business coming to this Yearly Meeting, except routine business, must come through the business committee, or a committee appointed for that special purpose.

Item No. 10—Before any question can properly be discussed by the delegated body, it must be put before the body by a legal motion properly sustained. All questions are settled by a majority vote of the delegates present. When a question is properly put before the body, any regular delegate has a right to speak on the subject. No person shall be allowed to speak for more than five (5) minutes on any subject at one time and not more than twice on the same subject without special permission from the Moderator.

Item No. 11—The Moderator shall have power to stop all discussions that are leading to confusion.

Item No. 12—All persons who are Pastors of Churches in the bounds of this yearly meeting are required to when possible, to be present at all business meetings, and according to the usages of the Free Will Baptist Denomination preside over the meetings, encourage the clerks to keep the minutes and fill out all report blanks to the quarterly meetings and associations.

Item No. 13—All ministers who are members of this yearly meeting are required to submit in writing a full and complete report of their ministerial labors for the past year, failure to do so forfeits their rights to their certificate of ministerial standing. These reports will be read to the body, and then given to the committee on credentials for further investigation.

Item No. 14—Official papers of this yearly meeting must be signed by the Moderator of the yearly meeting, and the secretary.

Item No. 15—Each quarterly meeting belonging to the yearly meeting, shall be entitled to two delegates for the organization, and two delegates for each one hundred members, or major fraction thereof belonging to the said quarterly meeting.

. Item No. 16—Any person who is a delegate to this yearly meeting wishing to speak on any subject properly before the body, shall arise and address the chair, by saying, Bro. Moderator, or Bro. Chairman, and shall speak no further until they have been recognized by the Moderator.

### BY-LAWS ADOPTED FOR THE BODY

By-Laws adopted for the body known as the Southeast Missouri yearly meeting of the Free Will Baptist Churches, and at the present date composed of the Madison and St. Francis County quarterly meetings of the Free Will Baptist Denominations.

Item No. 1—Governing the Organization: The officers of this yearly meeting shall be a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Secretary and Treasurer. There shall also be an Executive Board of three or more members, who are actively engaged in the work of the Free Will Baptist Church in Southeast Missouri.

Item No. 2—The Moderator, and Assistant Moderator shall be elected annually, and shall hold office until their successors are elected, and qualified.

Item No. 3—Choice of these officers shall be by nomination, and by legal vote. In cases where there is but one nominee, the officer shall be elected by acclamation.

Item No. 4—The Moderator, and Assistant Moderator shall not be elected jointly, but shall be elected separately by nomination, and by legal vote.

Item No. 5—The Secretary and Treasurer shall be elected by nomination and by legal vote as the Moderator and Assistant Moderator. He or she will hold office for one year, and be paid a salary agreed upon by he or she and the body. The Secretary and Treasurer shall be the same person. It shall be the duty of said officer to keep an accurate record of all the proceedings of legal business and make a record of the proceedings in a book or books furnished him or her by the Body. The said officer agrees faithfully to discharge all the duties of the office willingly in the interest of the cause of Free Will Baptist everywhere.

Item No. 6—The Executive Board shall be elected as other officers but shall serve for a term of three years, terms to expire alternately. It shall be the duty of said Board between sessions of the yearly meeting to be in charge of the work in a general way.

They shall act as an advisory body for each local body composing this yearly meeting. They shall at all times have

at heart the cause of Christ, and the Free Will Baptist Denomination, and in all cases act without partiality or respect of persons. They agree to discharge their duty or duties faithfully. To work according to the leadership of the Holy Spirit, and the usages of the yearly meeting that they are to serve.

Should money or any other property of the yearly meeting be entrusted to them, they shall handle, hold, convey and convoy said property with the greatest possible care and will be able at all times to give a full and complete report of all property to the proper authorities.

Item No. 7—Suggested the following By-Laws be added. Any changes must be made by two-third vote of those present.

# **PROCEEDINGS**

The Southeast Missouri Minister's Conference met in its Sixth Annual session August 6-7, 1946 at Flat River Free Will Baptist Church, Flat River, Mo. 7:45 P. M.

The Ministers' Conference was opened by the President, Rev. Mark Lewis, and in the absence of the Secretary-Treasurer appointed Rev. James Barker, Clerk Protem. Welcome, Mrs. Belva Zinn; Response, Rev. O. T. Allred.

The congregation stood for a moment of silent prayer,

and then Rev. Albert Tucker led in audible prayer.

Song service led by Rev. F. C. Zinn, opened by singing, "I Am Thine O Lord," and "Wonderful Words of Life." Prayer, Rev. Wm. Reeves.

In the absence of the appointed minister, Rev. Woodrow Matthews, Rev. J. F. Miller was asked to bring the message. Subject: "Revival of Early Church Prayer"; Text: Acts 4:31. A soul-stirring message was delivered with a challenge to the church.

While the congregation sang "Amazing Grace" all gathered in the altar for a fellowship handshake. This was followed by prayer led by Rev. Effie Matthews. Benediction

by Rev. Mark Lewis.

# WEDNESDAY MORNING, AUGUST 7, 1946, 9:30 A. M.

Devotional led by Rev. Albert Tucker as follows: Opened with singing, "Take the Name of Jesus with You." Prayer, Rev. Harvey Hill. Hymn, "The Lily of the Valley." Scripture reading: St. John 15. Hymn, "I'll Go Where He Sendeth Me.'

The Minutes of the previous session of the Ministers Conference was read by the Clerk Protem, Rev. Albert Holbrook, followed by the reading of the Constitution and By-Laws by the President, Rev. Mark Lewis. The Roll Call was given with nine ministers present. Invitation extended for membership with no response.

The presence of the ministers' wives and the laity of the church was acknowledged.

President declared time for election of officers and after prayer by Rev. Woodrow Matthews the following officers were elected: President, Rev. Mark Lewis; Vice President, Rev. Harvey Hill; Secretary-Treasurer, Rev. Albert Holbrook.

The President appointed the following as a Business Committee: Rev. Harvey Hill, chairman; Rev. Charles Moyer and Rev. Woodrow Matthews. Five minutes recess declared.

11:00 O'clock Service.

Singing led by Rev. Wm. Reeves, "We're Marching to Zion," "This World Is Not My Home." Prayer, Sister Belle Coffey. Hymn, "In the Morning of Joy." Scripture reading from Hebrews 2.

Sermon, Rev. Harvey Hill, Subject: "Revival of Early Church Courage." Scripture reading, 1 Thess. 1:1-10. Text: Acts 5:29. A wonderful message was delivered. Benediction and expression of thanks for the food, Rev. Woodrow Matthews.

### WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON, 1:30 P. M.

Services opened by Rev. Mark Lewis with an announcement that the Youth Encampment would be postponed for this year due to the Infantile Paralysis epidemic.
