THE SIXTY-FIFTH SESSION OF THE SOUTHEAST, MIS-SOURI YEARLY MEETING OF THE FREE WILL BAP-TISTS WHEN CONVENED WITH THE TWIN OAKS CHURCH, RT. 2, FREDERICKTOWN, MISSOURI, AUGUST 7-9, 1958.

The services was called to order by the clerk, Rev. Albert Halbrook, who presented the moderator, Rev. Rolla Smith. Congregational singing was led by Rev. Dean Burpo, with Sister Burpo as pianist.

Prayer by Rev. Melvin Howell.

Welcome address by Brother Clarence Francis.

Response by Rev. Harvey Hill.

Devotions were led by Rev. O. D. Matthews, with scripture reading and comments from Romans 12:1, 2, 11-15, followed with prayer.

BUSINESS COMMITTEE

1. Inasmuch as the National Association asks that its representation be by individual churches, we recommend to the Southeast Missouri Yearly Meeting that representation to the Yearly Meeting be as follows:

Three delegates for the Quarterly Meeting at large.

One delegate for each church organization.

One delegate for each fifty members of the church or major fraction thereof.

It will be necessary for Article XIV to be revised.

2. We recommend that this body send a recommendation to the Missouri State Association that representation to the Missouri State Association be by individual churches.

3. We recommend that Article XII of the Constitution be deleted and all power of discipline and issuing of cards of standing be in the hands of the Quarterly Meeting.

4. We recommend that Article IV of the Constitution be changed to read as follows:

All officers shall be elected at the close of the regular session of said Southeast Missouri Yearly Meeting to serve for one year or until their successors are elected and qualified.

5. We recommend that Article V of the Constitution be deleted and the remaining Articles be renumbered.

6. We recommend that each church send a liberal offering to the State Association Entertainment Fund.

7. We recommend that the Yearly Meeting allocate \$75.00 to the State Association Entertainment Fund.

8. Since there has come to the Free Will Baptist denomination new Missionary challenges from Africa, South America and other fields, and we believe that a better understanding of the need and how to meet the need is essential to greater Missionary giving, we recommend that this body sponsor a Missionary Conference, inviting and urging every church and pastor to participate in the Missionary Conference, said conference to be held at the Free Will Baptist Church of Farmington, at a time convenient to the National Promotional Secretary of Missions, and that a special committee of three be appointed by the Moderator to plan with the National Board of Missions for the time, the speakers, the advertising, etc.

9. Since our attention has been called to a very special need for funds to retire the indebtedness against the Free Will Baptist Rible College and since December 17 and 18 have been designated Victory days by the College, we recommend to the Yearly Meeting that a representative from the College be invited to come to the Yearly Meeting and meet the pastors and other leaders and work out a plan to raise funds and to explain to our people the ministry of the College to our Denomination. It is understood that this will all have to be worked out with the College and dates set up at a time when the representatives can come, however, it will be in time for all offerings and pledges to be received before December 17.

10. We recommend that the Yearly Meeting give a standing vote of thanks to the host church and pastor for their wonderful hospitality, also to all churches of the Madison County Quarterly Meeting.

DENOMINATIONAL ENTERPRISE COMMITTEE

We, the Denominational Enterprise Committee, submit the following recommendations:

1. In regards to the letters we received from Dr. Johnson relative to the Victory drive we recommend that each church support the drive.

2. Whereas new doors of opportunity have been opened to Missions we urge more liberal giving to Missions.

3. Since the Cooperative plan has proven to be successful, we urge each church in Southeast Missouri Yearly Meeting to give cooperatively.

TEMPERANCE COMMITTEE

We, the Temperance Committee, submit the following report:

Since the consumption of alcoholic beverages continues to increase year after year and many are made to suffer because of this fact, we urge that every church member, not only be a total abstainer from the use of alcoholic beverages, but that he be a strong witness against the use of it.

Futhermore, we urge that each layman, particularly the men, avail himself of information concerning the Christian Civic Foundation and cooperate with that organization in fighting the use and sale of liquor.

We recommend that each church member seriously consider his influence in society and strive to be discreet in all things, which in their proper place and proportion are good.

CONSTITUTION .

This organization shall be known as the Southeast Missouri Yearly Meeting of Free Will Baptists and shall be composed of the St. Francois County Quarterly Meeting, the Madison County Quarterly Meeting, and the St. Louis District Quarterly Meeting.

Article I

When the delegated body shall meet in regular annual session for the transaction of business, the Moderator, or in his absence, the Assistant Moderator, shall call the meeting to order and invite all to take part in congregational singing.

After a sufficient number of hymns the Moderator shall read, or have read, some suitable Scripture. Then prayer shall be offered. This Association shall convene on Thursday night before the second Sunday in August.

Article II

Five or more delegates from one or more churches of each Quarterly Meeting comprising this Yearly Meeting shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. However, a lesser number may adjourn from time to time.

Article III

The letters from the Quarterly Meetings to be read, dues received (\$4.00 per church), the delegates seated. All ordained ministers and the companions and licensed ministers who are in good standing and full fellowship with some church in the Yearly Meeting, together with ordained deacons, church clerks, and church treasurers, shall, by virtue of their authority, be standing delegates in this Yearly Meeting.

Article IV

All officers shall be elected at the close of the regular session of said Southeast Missouri Yearly Meeting to serve one year or until their successors are elected and qualified.

Article V

The Moderator shall appoint all committees unless otherwise ruled by the body.

Article VI

The Moderator shall have the privilege to solicit the help of any minister or delegate present, in appointing committees.

Article VII

After the organization has been completed, corresponding messengers and visiting brethren from other religious bodies are invited to a seat in council. Should there be letters of greetings or reports from other bodies, they may, at this time, be read.

Article VIII

All items of business, coming to this Yearly Meeting, except routine business, must come through the Business Committee, or a committee appointed for that special purpose.

Article IX

Before any question can properly be discussed by the delegated body, it must be brought before the body by a motion properly sustained. All questions are settled by a majority vote of the delegates present. When a question is properly before the body, any regular delegate has a right to speak on the subject. No person shall be allowed to speak more than five (5) minutes on any subject at one time, and not more than twice on the same subject without special permission from the Moderator.

Article X

The Moderator shall have power to stop all discussions that are leading to confusion.

Article XI

Official papers of this Yearly Meeting must be signed by the Moderator of the Yearly Meeting and the Secretary.

Article XII

Each Quarterly Meeting belonging to the Yearly Meeting shall be entitled to three (3) delegates at large, one (1) delegate for each church organization, and one (1) delegate for each fifty members of the church or major fraction thereof.

Article XIII

Any person who is a delegate to this Yearly Meeting wishing to speak on any subject properly before the Body, shall arise and address the chair, by saying, "Brother Moderator," or "Brother Chairman" and shall speak no further until they have been recognized by the Moderator.

Article XIV

This Constitution may be altered or amended at any regular meeting by a two-thirds majority vote, provided that one day's previous notice of proposed change or amendment has been given.

BY-LAWS ADOPTED FOR THE BODY

Known As

The Southeast Missouri Yearly Meeting of the Free Will Baptist Churches, and at the present date, composed of the Madison County Quarterly Meeting and St. Francois County Quarterly Meeting of the Free Will Baptist denomination.

No. 1—The officers of this Yearly Meeting shall be a Moderator, Assistant Moderator and Secretary-Treasurer who shall also serve as Statistician. There shall also be an Executive Board of three or more members who are actively engaged in work of the Free Will Baptist_Church in Southeast Missouri. No one person can hold more than one office.

No. 2—The Moderator and Assistant Moderator shall be elected annually and shall hold office until their successors are elected and gualified.

No. 3--Choice of these officers shall be made by nomination and by legal vote. In case where there is but one nominee the officer shall be elected by acclamation.

No. 4-The Moderator and Assistant Moderator shall not

be elected jointly but shall be elected separately by nomination and by legal vote.

No. 5—The Secretary and Treasurer shall be elected by nomination and by legal vote as the Moderator and Assistant Moderator. He or she will hold office for one year, and be paid a salary agreed upon by him or her and the body. The Secretary and Treasurer shall be the same person. It shall be the duty of said officer to keep an accurate record of the proceedings in a book or books furnished him or her by the body. The said officer agrees faithfully to discharge all the duties of the office willingly in the interest of the cause of the Free Will Baptists everywhere.

No. 6—The Executive Board shall be elected as other officers, but shall serve a term of three years; terms to expire alternately. It shall be the duty of said Board between sessions of the Yearly Meeting, to be in charge of the work in a general way. They shall act as an advisory body for each local body composing this Yearly Meeting. They shall, at all times, have at heart, the cause of Christ and the Free Will Baptist denomination and in all cases, act without partiality or respect of persons.

They agree to discharge their duty or duties faithfully to work according to the leadership of the Holy Spirit and the usages of the Yearly Meeting, that they are to serve. Should money, or any other property of the Yearly Meeting, be entrusted to them, they shall handle, hold, and convey said property with the greatest possible care, and will be able, at all, times, to give a full and complete report of all property to the proper authorities.

No. 7—These By-Laws may be altered or amended at any regular meeting by a two-thirds majority vote, provided that one day's previous notice of proposed change or amendment has been given.
