THE SIXTY-SIXTH SESSION OF THE SOUTHEAST MISSOURI YEARLY MEETING OF THE FREE WILL BAPTISTS WHEN CONVENED WITH THE FELLOWSHIP CHURCH, FLAT RIVER, MISSOURI, AUGUST 6-8, 1959.

The services on Thursday evening, August 6th, were called to order by the Clerk, Rev. Albert Halbrook. Rev. Rolla A. Smith, pastor of the Third Church, St. Louis, was presented as Moderator and assumed charge.
