THE FIRST QUARTERLY SESSION JANUARY 19, 1974 SARDIS CHURCH

The session was called to order with prayer by the Moderator, Rev. Clarence Culpepper. Bro. Lowell Vickers led the congregation in singing with Mrs. Earl Stevens as pianist. Rev. W. W. Bush led the prayer.

A warm welcome was extended to everyone by Rev. Wade Walton, Pastor of host Church. Rev. Thomas Gamble gave the response.

Bro. Johnny Gilmore brought a very good devotional. He read Acts 12: 11.

Eight ministers and six deacons were recognized, also Rev. and Mrs. Earl Stevens from the State Line Association.

After lunch, Bro. Bryan Gilmore led in congregational singing followed by prayer by Rev. Earl Stevens.

The Gilmore Quartet sang two beautiful songs, "I Won't Have to Worry Anymore", and "I'll Meet You in the Morning".

The Moderator requested prayer for Rev. Davey Lee Kirkland, Sister Edna Beasley and others who were ill.

The Board of Christian Education made the following report:

We will have four area study courses within the Association during the month of February. These courses will be one night at each location. In order to cut the distance of travel down, we have the following list of locations with the churches participating there.

We encourage you to support these courses. We further plan a week's courses at these churches at a later date.

Purpose: To promote education on the church level, encourage teachers, Pastors, and students to study God's Word more. To draw the local church into the State and National Work to a greater degree.

Proposals:

- I. To encourage each church to have at least one (1) study course during the Associational year.
- II. To encourage each church to set up a library within the church with emphasis on study books to help teachers and students in preparing lessons. We recommend that these books be purchased through our national offices.
- III. We further recommend that books be included on Free Will Baptist Doctrines, Visitation, Church Financing, and books concerning Christian growth and general Christian reading.
- IV. We recommend that each church make an effort to be placed on the mailing list of all National Offices in order to receive any promotional aides available and to keep in touch with National events and what we as Free Will Baptists are doing elsewhere.
- V. We recommend that each church put forth a continuous extra effort in the promotion of all church services. These would include Sunday School, Morning Worship, C.T.S., Evening Worship, Prayer Meeting, Visitation, and Associational Meetings (Quarter and Annual).
- VI. The Board recommends that if local instructors are used to teach study courses, that they be paid ten (10) cents per mile from their home to the location of the course. This would not apply to teachers from our National offices or other Associations.
- VII. We request that the Association allocate fifty (50) dollars to the Board of Education in order to get this Board operating. This money would be used for supplies and travel expenses only. It will be replaced as books are sold, and by offerings taken during study courses. We recommend that the Board be given permission to set up it's own bank account, and be required to give an itemized financial report at Quarterly and Annual Sessions. No check may be issued without the signature of both the Treasurer of the Board and the Chairman.

THE SECOND QUARTERLY SESSION APRIL 20, 1974 HICKORY GROVE CHURCH

The session was called to order by the Moderator, Rev. Clarence Culpepper, who led the opening prayer. Sister Martha Blalock led in Congregational singing with Sister Rheta Blalock as pianist. The pastor of the host church, Rev. Steve Bailey gave the welcome address and Rev. Paul Mallory gave the response.

Bro. Kenneth Blalock brought a very timely devotional, basing his remarks on the scriptures Eph. 4: 25-32 and Prov. 10: 4.

The Moderator recognized ten deacons and nine ministers including the two visiting ministers - Rev. Herman Hersey, Nashville, Tennessee and Rev. Gary Watson, Missionary Appointee to Hawaii.

The roll call of delegates was followed by MSC to seat the delegates. Bro. Bo Vickers led the congregation in singing two hymns. Rev. Charles Allen led the prayer to dismiss for recess.

On reconvening, the Moderator appointed Sisters Kate Palmer and Johnnie Taylor and Bro. Dewey Dean to serve on the Finance Committee. Appointed to serve on the Resolutions Committee were Sisters Martha Blalock, Rosa Payne and Bro. Otis Vickers.

After Congregational singing, Rev. Thomas Coxwell led the prayer. A message in song was presented by Rev. Herman Hersey who rendered a special arrangement of "O Happy Day".

Before the morning message, Rev. Hersey spoke briefly on the insurance plan for Ministers and layment. Then he brought a wonderful message on "Redeeming the Time Because the Days are Evil." THE NINETY-SIXTH ANNUAL SESSION FRIDAY, OCT. 18, 1974 GOODWATER CHURCH

The Ninety-Sixth Annual Session was called to order with prayer by the Moderator, Rev. Clarence Culpepper. Bro. Lowell Vickers led in congregational singing, with Sister Linda Sowell as pianist.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

- 1. THE BIBLE: The Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments were given by inspiration of God, and are our infallible rule of faith and practice.
- 2. GOD: There is one living and true God, revealed in nature as the Creator, Preserver, and Righteous Governor of the universe and in Scriptures as Father, Son, and Holy Ghost, yet as one God, infinitely wise and good, whom all intelligent creatures are supremely to love, adore and obey.
- 3. CHRIST: Christ is God manifest in the flesh; in His divine nature truly God, in His human nature truly man. The mediator between God and man, once crucified, He is now risen and glorified, and is our ever present Saviour and Lord.
- 4. THE HOLY SPIRIT: The scriptures assign to the Holy Spirit all the attributes of God.
- 5. THE GOVERNMENT OF GOD: God exercises a wise and benevolent providence over all things and all things by maintaining the construction and laws of nature. He also performs special acts, not otherwise provided for, as the highest welfare as men requires.
- 6. THE SINFULNESS OF MAN: Man was created innocent, but by disobedience fell into a state of sin and condemnation. His posterity, therefore inherit a fallen nature of such tendencies that all who come to years of accountability sin, and becomes guilty before God.
- 7. THE WORK OF CHRIST: The Son of God by His incarnation, life sufferings, death and resurrection effected for all a redemption from sin that is full and free and is the ground of salvation by faith.
 - 8. THE TERMS OF SALVATION: The conditions of salvation are:
- (1) Repentance or sincere sorrow for sin and hearty renunciation of it.
- (2) Faith or the reserved committal of one's self to Christ as Saviour and Lord with purpose to love and obey Him in all things. In the exercise of saving faith the soul is renewed by the Holy Spirit, freed from the diminion of sin and becomes a child of God. (3) Continuance in faith and obedience until death.
- 9. ELECTION: God determined from the beginning to save all who should comply with the conditions of salvation. Hence by faith in Christ men become His elect.
- 10. FREEDOM OF THE WILL: The human will is free and self-controlled, having power to yield to the influence of the truth and the Spirit, or to resist them and perish.
- 11. SALVATION FREE: God desires the salvation of all, the Gospel invites all, the Holy Spirit strives with all, and whosoever will, may come and take of the water of life freely.
- 12. PERSEVERENCE: All believers in Christ, who through grace persevere in holiness to the end of life, have promise of eternal salvation.
- 13. GOSPEL ORDINANCES: BAPTISM, or the immersion of believers in water, and the LORD'S SUPPER, are ordinances to be perpetuated under the Gospel; FEET WASHING, an ordinance teaching

humility, of universal obligation, and to be ministered to all true believers.

- 14. TITHING: God commanded tithes and offerings in the Old Testament; Jesus Christ endorsed it in the Gospel (Matt. 23:23), and the apostle Paul said, "Upon the first day of the week let every one of you lay by him in store as God hath prospered him." (I Cor. 16:2).
- 15. THE CHRISTIAN SABBATH: The divine law requires that one day in seven be set apart from secular employments and amusements, for rest, worship, holy works and activities, and for personal commission with God.
- 16. RESURRECTION, JUDGEMENT AND FINAL RETRIBUTION: The scriptures teach the resurrection of all men at the last day. They that have done good will come forth to the resurrection of life, and they that have done evil until the resurrection of damnation; then the wicked will "go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life".

CHURCH COVENANT

Having given ourselves to God, by faith in Christ, and adopted the Word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this solemn covenant.

We promise by His grace to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid all appearances of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world, from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages, and to "provide things honest in the sight of all men."

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to the study of the scriptures, secret prayer, family devotions, and social worship; and by self-denial, faith and good works endeavor to "grow in grace and the knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ".

We will not forsake the assembling of ourselves together for church conference; public worship, and the observance of the ordinances of the Gospel, nor fail to pay its poor, and all its benevolent work.

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness, and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the Spirit" in the bonds of peace, to be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and so far as we are able, promote the success of the church and of the Gospel.

We will everywhere hold Christian principles sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society; constantly praying and telling that the Kingdom of God may come, and His will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

To this end, we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprises, the support of Missions, the success of Sunday School and the evangelistic efforts for the salvation of the world. And may the God of peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.
