## CONFERENCE PROCEEDINGS

The 28th Annual Meeting of the Free Will Baptist Yearly Conference of Southern Illinois when convened with the Union Free Will Baptist Church of the Freedom Quarterly, Sept. 12, 1947.

Opened by singing, "Standing on the Promises" and "Take the Name of Jesus with You".

Prayer by Bro. Throgmorton.

Song, "Savior Leed Me".

ORGANIZATION— Motion made by Bro C. H. Curry and seconded by Bro. Wm. Buster to elect W. R. Burton

-for Moderator. Bro. Burton duly elected by acclamation.

Minutes of previous meeting were read and approved.

Moderator appointed Bro. J. M. Throgmorton as Assistant Moderator.

The letters from the Quarterly meetings were read and delegates from the various churches received as letters were read. Delegates arriving late were seated as they arrived. Motion carried that the Moderator be empowered to substitute delegates if necessary.
