Minutes of last session read and approved as read. by Clerk. Motion

Motion made by Bro Wm Buster and seconded by Bro. Ed Rabillard that all letters from Quarterlies be read and delegates seated in a body. Motion Carried.

 concerning the Near Return of the Christ.

Motion was made by Bro. March Harpole
 and seconded by the last recommendation
 from last year's that we change the
 yearly meeting from the month of
 September to the first Wednesday night in
 June. Motion Carried.

Business Committee then gave the

following recommendation: - "Whereas the City of Nashville Tennessee is the recognized headquarters of the Free Will Baptist Churches of these United States and whereas it is centrally located for our people be it therefore resolved that the State Association of Illinois recommend that the National Association of Free Will Baptist convene its session of 1951 in said City of Nashville Tennessee.

This Motion was made by Bro Wm Buster, seconded by Bro Claude Childers - Motion defeated.

The motion was then made by Bro March Harpole, seconded by Bro. C. H. Curry that the above recommendation be changed to the Free Will Baptist Tabernacle of Benton, Illinois instead of Nashville, Tennessee. Motion Carried.

Motion made by Bro. C. H. Curry, seconded by Bro James Edmonds that the Chair appoint a Committee to care for the National should it come to Benton, Illinois in 1951. Motion Carried.

The Chair appointed the following: Bro. W. R. Burton, Bro. Wallace Malone and Bro. March Harpole.

Nominations in order for someone to preach the Introductory sermon at the Yearly Prayer for 1951. Bro. Carl Williams elected by acclamation. This Yearly will be held at F. W. B. Tabernacle at Nash City, Benton, Illinois.

Topic "Should all of our Tithe be put in our own Church Treasury?" opened by Bro. Lee Le Vault followed by Claude Childers, Mrs C. J. Kettner, C. H. Curry, Charles Osburn, Bro Buster and others.

Ladies Auxiliary report given by Sister

Chesta Clampt. She reported 9 auxiliaries in our yearly meeting with a membership of 128 members. This is an increase of 9 members in the year. They had 1 loss from death and have 61 tithers. The 9 auxiliaries spent \$1092.50 last year to exalt Christ through the different channels of their work. \$862.37 of this went through the District Treasurer's hand.

Motion made by Bro. Burton and seconded by Bro. Malone that we accept the report and stand as a vote of thanks for the work they have done. Motion carried and standing vote of thanks given.

The Chairman then appointed the Auditing Committee consisting of Bro. Claude Childers, Lovie Holm and Floyd Hartley.

Business Committee then gave the following report - "We your business Committee do hereby beg apology to the action taken against Eld. Everett Albright in the regular session of the 1948 Yearly Meeting because of no legal charge against him, and recommend that he be given restored to full fellowship as an ordained minister in the Free Will Baptist Organization and that the same be published in the Marion Daily Republican"

Buster based his message on Exodus 14:23 "Speak Unto The Children that they go forward" This was a very wonderful message filled with spirit and power.
