## SPECIAL SESSION OF THE SOUTHERN ILLINOIS FREE WILL BAPTIST YEARLY CONFERENCE

A special session of the yearly meeting was called by the Moderator Saturday, February 16, 1957, at 2:00 P. M. Meeting in the Ina Free Will Baptist Church at Ina, Illinois. Services were opened by singing "Leaning On The Everlasting Arm".

Devotion and Prayer were led by Rev. Claude Childers. Song "Are You Washed in The Blood".

Special Session was called to Order with Business:

26 Ordained Ministers and 26 Ordained Deacons were present.

Freedom County had 17 delegates present. Wayne County had 4 delegates with 33 delegates present from Franklin County.

Motion was made by Rev. Hosea Smith and seconded by Rev. John Hiltibidal that the delegates of the 3 counties be seated. Motion carried.

Letter was read by Rev. George Waggoner from the Lawyer. United Prayer led by Rev. George Ritter.

- (1) Motion was made by Rev. George Ritter and Seconded by Rev. John Hiltibidal, to give trustees the right to borrow money to acquire the land left to "The Free Will Baptist Church as a Church Denomination", by the late Rev. Elmer P. Warren. Also to be free to work with owner of the land to sell or keep as they see fit. In behalf of the Southern Illinois Conference. Motion Carried.
- (2) Motion was made by Rev. Robert Norman and seconded by Rev. Claude Childers, that if the property is sold the proceeds be used to pay all expenses and bills acquired in acquiring the land and the remainder be put in the yearly conference treasury. Motion Carried.
- (3) Motion made by Rev. Jack Ketteman and seconded by Rev. Claude Childers to assess each church \$2.00 now to meet the immediate obligations of the Conference. Motion was made by Mont Davis and seconded by Rev. Carl Williams to amend the first motion. That a free will offering be sent from each church of \$2.00 or more to be sent to the treasurer with two (2) weeks to meet this obligation. Motion Carried.
- (4) Motion was made by Rev. Leslie Elliott and seconded by Eugene Kline that the yearly dues be raised from \$5.00 per church to \$7.50 to keep out of the red. Motion Carried.

Motion was made by Rev. Carl Williams and seconded by Rev. Paul Sulcer to adjourn. Motion Carried.

Leslie Lewis to cease nominations and elect by acclamations. Motion carried and each were duly elected.

Rev. George Waggoner gave a report about the tract of land to be inherited, also a report about the camp meeting. He gave the details on the contest for fund raising.

Treasurer's report was given by Mrs. O. C. McClerren. Motion was made by Rev. Wallace Malone and seconded by Rev. Cloy Myers that the report be accepted. Motion Carried.

Motion was made by Rev. Jasper Armstrong and seconded by Rev. Cecil Walker that the treasurer be authorized to pay the various bills. Motion Carried.

A Motion was made by Bro. Willis Childers and seconded by Rev. Cloy Myers that a standing vote of thanks be given the ladies and people of various churches who helped serve the delicious meals during the yearly conference. Motion carried and vote of thanks given.

Silent prayer and prayer by Rev. George Waggoner were given in remembrance of the deceased Brethren.

(1) We the Business Committee recommend that the moderator of the yearly conference be allowed to appoint a "State or Local Home Mission Board", consisting of five (5) men, who in turn will make plans for our State or Local mission work. (S) Committee.

Motion was made by Rev. Leslie Elliott and seconded by Rev. Wallace Malone that we adopt this plan. Motion carried.

(2) We the Business Committee recommend that one member of the State or Local Mission Board be replaced each year by election. (S) Committee.

Motion was made by Bro. Willis Childers and seconded by Rev. Wallace Malone that we accept this plan. Motion carried.

(3) We the Business Committee recommend that when appointment is made, the first man appointed will serve for five (5) years, second man four (4) years, third man three (3) years, fourth man two (2) years, and fifth man one (1) year. (S) Committee.

Motion was made by Rev. Leslie Elliott and seconded by Rev. Howard Flota that we accept this plan. Motion carried.

- (4) We the Business Committee recommend that each church give an offering each month for this important and worthy cause. (S) Committee. Motion was made by Rev. Eugene Norris and seconded by Rev. Cloy Myers that we adopt this plan. Motion carried.
- (5) We the Business Committee recommend that this yearly conference elect one trustee each year, for the yearly association, with the Wayne Co. Trustee being retired at this season. The Freedom Co. Trustee retiring in 1958 and the Franklin Co. Trustee retiring in 1959. Trustee being replaced to be replaced by a man from his county. (S) Committee.

Motion was made by Rev. W. F. Turnbough and seconded by Rev. John Hiltibidal that we adopt this plan. Motion carried.

(6) We the Business Committee recommend that the television or radio programs planning be referred to our State or Local Mission Board. (S) Committee.

Motion was made by Rev. Wallace Malone and seconded by Rev. C. J. Ketteman that we adopt this plan. Motion carried.

(7) We the Business Committee recommend that the Quarterly Conference who entertains the Yearly Conference stand the expenses of such Conference. (S) Committee. Motion was made by Rev. Leslie Elliott and seconded by Rev. C. J. Ketteman that we adopt this plan. Motion lost.

The Credential Committee gave their report.

The Motion was made by Rev. Leon McBride and seconded by Rev. Lester Breeze that we accept the report and grant the cards. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Rev. John Hiltibidal and seconded by Rev. Howard Flota that we retain the Credential Committee for 30 days and consider all reports that come in. Motion carried.

The men appointed for the State or Local missions were Rev. W. F. Turnbough, Rev. Claude Childers, Rev. George Mc-Claskey, Rev. Howard Flota and Rev. Cecil Walker.

Motion was made by Rev. Leslie Elliott and seconded by Rev. Cecil Walker that delegates to National be paid \$15 of the expense. Motion carried.

Mrs. Kathryn Waggoner, Lester Lewis, Willis Childers, Ed Robilard and Mrs. Freda McClaskey were nominated as delegates to the National Association. Motion was made by Rev. Leon McBride and seconded by Rev. Wallace Malone that nominations cease and to proceed to elect by acclamation. Motion carried.

The next yearly conference will meet with the Wayne Co. Quarterly the Wednesday night before the 4th Sunday in June.

Motion was made by Rev. George McClaskey and seconded by Rev. Leon McBride that Harl Hillard be elected as trusete for Wayne Co. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Rev. C. J. Ketteman and seconded by Lester Lewis to hold all the officers for the coming year. Rev. George Waggoner for Moderator, Rev. George Ritter, Assistant Moderator; Mrs. O. C. McClerren, Treasurer; and Mrs. Freda McClaskey, Clerk. Motion carried.

A vote of appreciation was given our visitor and speakers, Rev. James Miller and Rev. Raymond Riggs, both of Nashville, Tenn.

Motion was made by Bro. Willis Childers and seconded by Rev. Cecil Walker that we adjourn business. Motion Carried.
