FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT.

The next Annual Conference will be held in Waycross, Wednesday before the Second Sunday in October, 1931.

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS OF THE ANNUAL CONFERENCE.

Article 1.—This body shall be known as the Southern Union United American Freewill Baptist Annual Conference.

Article 2.—This body shall be composed of ministers and preachers and one or more lay delegates from each church and mission.

Article 3.—Be it resolved that it is the duty of the Executive Board to make arrangements for the convening of the Annual Conference and publish the same wherever they may think essential for the benefit of the conference, and to perform other duties and such general charge of the conference as will in their judgment secure the greatest good for the Church.

Article 4.—Be it resolved that two-thirds of the Executive Board shall constitute a quorum. The time and place of each meeting is to be determined by the conference at each annual session and the Executive Board shall be empowered to make any change or modifications that in their judgment they may deem best. It shall also be the duty of the Executive Board to fill by appointment all vacancies that may occur by death or resignation in any church or mission of this conference.

Aricle 5.—Resolved that no minister shall be elected Moderator of this Annual Conference until he has served as pastor in the Freewill Baptist Church for six years and has a perfect knowledge of all the usages of the Freewill Baptist Denomination, and that no minister shall be Moderator of the District Quarterly Meeting until he has served in the denomination for three years presiding over churches and has a fair knowledge of Freewill Baptist history.

Article 6.—Resolved that any minister or preacher in arrears for dues for more than two years said minister's name shall be dropped from roll.

Article 7.—Resolved that minister's dues \$10.00 to Annual Conference; local preacher's due \$5.00; delegate's dues \$1.00.

Article 8.—Resolved that any minister or deacon be caught sowing the seed of discord in the midst of a church against the pastor in charge, without legal causes, he shall be expelled for 90 days.

Article 9.—Resolved that the Moderator shall travel over the field two times a year and make his visit prior to the regular pastor days and must notify the pastor of each time of visit or cause the same to be done at the expense of the annual conference.

Article 10.—Resolved that the Moderator shall bring a statement of the miles traveled and the amount of money paid out for traveling expenses and the amount of money paid to him when visiting each church.

Article 11.—Resolved that the Moderator shall have power to move any minister he may see that his work is dying and if any minister lets his work die without notifying the said Moderator, said minister shall be dealt with as the conference judges best.

Article 12.—Resolved that Easter Day shall be observed in all of the churches and missions of this body and that Children's Day shall be observed on the second Sunday in June and the Freewill Offering shall be observed on the first Sunday in September. All money raised on these days must be sent to annual treasurer, Rev. C. H. Moore, Ambrose, Ga.

Article 13.—Resolved that there shall be a Sunday School in all of our churches and missions and said schools shall use the Freewill Baptist literature.

Article 14.—Resolved that the Moderators of the District hold its quarterly meeting on each fifth Sunday in the year and all money.

raised above the expenses shall be sent to the annual conference treasurer at once for education and mission. Article 15 .- Resolved that the Moderator and Secretary shall be paid such compensation as the Executive Board may direct. Article 16 .- Resolved that any minister or preacher joining this body without bringing a church, said minister or preacher shall begin his work in the mission field and not allowed to pastor any church until he serves in the mission field one annual conference and report his work to the Annual Conference. This law is only to prevent office seekers and old church hunters running from denomination to de-

nomination seeking whom they can devour. Done by the Executive
