We would appreciate all the help both physical and financial in this work. If it please the body we would like to have the moderator of this association placed on the committee—approved by the body, Rev. W. A. Wilkinson's name will be added to the committee. SUNDAY SCHOOL REPORTS AS FOLLOWS

We find an active Sunday School in each church in this association. We want each church to enlist new members and contact absentees, we ask that each Sunday School hold at least one meeting of officers and teachers each quarter. We also request a study course at least once each month, led by the pastor or any qualified person he might appoint. We want each church to have weekly prayer service, and we encourage youth work, also stress Woman's Auxiliary. We ask each church to hold Vacation Bible School—we feel this is very important, Report received and committee discharged.

TEMPERANCE REPORT

We recommend that each Christian should abstain from that which he or she would term as being harmful to or detrimental to the cause of Christ in their lives, and to help our people from buying from any business establishment that keeps their doors open for business purposes on Sunday or those establishments that sell intoxicating beverages. The Bible teaches that we should honor the Sabbath day and keep it Holy.

CHURCH COVENANT

In order to have more perfect and free Christian love and fellowship for each other, and to advance the cause of our Lord, and Master, We do hereby agree and covenant, by the help of God, our Father, and aided by the Holy Spirit, to keep the ordinances, precepts and examples, as laid down in the New Testament of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

AS TO THE RULES -- ARTICLE 1.

Section 1. When a sufficient number of members are ready for organization the articles of faith and church covenant shall be read and if adopted the right hand of fellowship shall be extended, and after prayer they shall proceed to the election of officers, after which they shall be declared organized and ready for business.

Section 2. No church shall be organized with less than three male members, nor within six miles of another church of the same faith, unless in towns or cities.'

Section 3. The officers of a church shall be a pastor, one or more deacons, and a clerk and treasurer, and not less than three trustees.

Section 4. The church shall call their pastor at the next conference preceding the last regular conference, in the Associational year, unless in case of a vacancy; in such case they may call a conference for that purpose.

Section 5. Any church, in case of necessity, may call a conference and elect one of their members, or a visiting minister, as moderator.

Section 6. The church may hold a conference as often as it deems it necessary.

Section 7. It is suggested that the church commune and wash the members' feet as often as convenient, and it shall not be postponed on account of disobedient members.

Section 8. The church shall not try a member without a hearing unless said member refuses to attend the conference, when notified to do so.

Section 9. That the Church recommend the questioning of any member for license, the same as for ordination.

Section 10. A presbtry of 5 ordained men shall be appointed by the moderator to hold office 1 through 5th year to conduct ordination of ministers or deacos for this association or any church connected with this association.

- Section 11. Deacons shall not be ordained untill they are tried.
- Section 12. Each minister shall be a member of some live church and in good standing with the church.
- Section 13. It shall be the duty of every member, male and female, to attend each conference meeting if they can, for on that day the pastor is expected to instruct the church in a spiritual manner and pointed lessons on doctrine and discipline, and the rule and the church members' duties.
- Section 14. As the Scriptures teach against worldliness in any form, Be it Resolved that each member seek the divine guidance of the Holy Spirit in things that pertain to Holy and Righteous living.

ARTICLE 2.

- Section 1. The pastor shall attend his church unless providentially hindered, and shall sit as moderator and see that justice is done, but may appoint some suitable brother to sit in his stead when he thinks proper for the cause. He shall also hold a protracted meeting with his church once a year.
- Section 2. The deacon shall be elected by the church and shall hold office at the discretion of the church. They shall watch over the flock, advise the unruly members and report such to the church in conference, when necessary, and may administer the ordinance of baptism; they shall make all necessary arrangements for the communion; look into the needs of the church, and the support of the pastor: they shall take notice of such members as refuse or neglect to partake of the Lord's Supper and wash each other's feet, and endeavor to ascertain the cause, that the same may be laid before the church in conference.
- Section 3. The clerk shall be elected by the church and shall hold office at the discreation of the church; he shall keep a record of the members and minutes of the business transactions of the church and shall read the same at the conference as often as the church may demand, and shall turn all books and papers over to his successor in office.
- Section 4. The treasurer shall be elected by the church, shall hold office at the will of the church, shall hold all monies paid into the church for general expenses, and pay out the same only on an order from the church, in conference, and shall turn over all money and papers to his successor.
- Section 5. The trustees shall be elected by the church, and shall hold office for two years and until their successors are elected, unless removed for cause; they have charge of the deeds and all other church property, and shall look after the repairs of the church, but they cannot sell or otherwise dispose of the church property without an order from the

church in conference

Section 6. No one shall be received in the church unless spiritually baptised by immersion by an ordained baptiser.

Section 7. Members mus pay their debts contracted by them. or make satisfactory arrangements with their creditors, and they shall help pay their pastors.

Section 8. We recommend that each church elect a Home Mission Treasurer and all money collected for Home Missions be retained in the church and paid out only by order of the church.

Section 9. No preacher has a right to organize and bring a church into our Association without the arm of a church in our Association to help organize and presbytery same.

Section 10. We reccomend that each ordained minister in our Association obtain credentials showing denomination that ordained them, name of church, county and state. Also presbtery that ordained them if possible.

Section 11. It is required of each church to do everything possible to promote religious work by giving youth members an opportunity and encouraging them to speak in public in behalf of our Savior.

the regular associational conference.

Section 12. Each church shall encourage its members to attend every conference possible, to study minutes, follow the rules and the articles of faith be read in the church at least once a year.

Section 13. No member shall leave the house without sufficient cause nor engage in conversation without being subject to be called to order by

the moderator.

Section 14. All discussions in conference must be conducted in conference with calmness and good feelings: and those who speak must arise to their feet and address the moderator and keep the point in debate.

Section 15. No member shall speak more than twice on the same subject without permission from the moderator nor shall the remarks of anyone

be unréasonable long.

Section 16. When the moderator speaks he shall nominate some other

moderator in his stead.

Section 17. No one shall be interrupted while speaking unless it is

necessary to call him to order.

Section 18. The Executive Committee is the governing body of the Association to act on things pertaining to the Association when the Association is not in session.

Permanent Regulations,

- 1. No preacher or deacon shall be in good standing in our Association having two living wives. I Timothy 3:2
- 2. No minister be held responsible for marrying anyone unknowingly who has previously been married having a living husband or wife.
- 3. That each Church appoint 4 delegates to the Association each year.
- 4. That all deacons from the different churches be standing delegates to the association.
- 5. No minister be called as pastor or used as evangelist in any church in this association without being subject to questioning by ordaining council.
- 6. No minister be used as an evangelist in any church in this association except ones of F. W. B. faith.
