

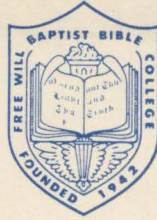

PROCEEDINGS

The Thirteenth Annual Session of Southwest Virginia Association of Free Will Baptists was held with Oak Grove Free Will Baptist Church, Big Stone Gap, Virginia, May 13th to 15th, 1949.

Service was opened by singing "Amazing Grace." Elder Paul Harry Miller, Clerk, read for Scripture lesson Col. 3:1-25. Prayer was offered by Elder J. W. Brannon. Congregation sang "On Jordon's Stormy Banks."

After singing the Conference was then declared open for business. Elder Mack Butler was elected Moderator and Elder W. B. Galloway Ass't. Moderator by voice of the Conference.

After acceptance of his office the Moderator was granted power to appoint the Pulpit Supply Committee which was to serve in this capacity for the entire session. The chair appointed the following: Sis. I. N. Sturgill, Bro. Robert Dixon, and Bro. Ben Hill.

Due to absence of the pastor of Oak Grove Church, Elder Leonard J. Fields, the assistant pastor, Elder W. B. Galloway, was selected to preach the introductory sermon. The Conference then adjourned until 1:30 p. m.

Friday—11:00 O'clock

Service was opened by song "In the Shadow of the Cross," and "I'll Fly Away." Elder Galloway read for a Scripture lesson Luke 5:1-12. Prayer was then offered by Bro. L. J. McConnell. After prayer the congregation sang "Amazing Grace." Bro. Galloway used as a text "Launch out into the deep and let down your nets." Bro. Galloway preached a wonderful sermon which was enjoyed by everyone present.

Friday—1:30 P. M.

Friday afternoon service opened by reading the 5th chapter of Romans. Prayer was offered by Bro. E. J. Kilgore. The Conference resumed its work with a motion

being made to have the Preface of the New 1949 Treatise of the Faith and Practice of Free Will Baptists printed in our Minutes of the Annual Association. This motion was accepted and passed by the Conference.

A discussion was held concerning a plan to finance the Yearly Association without borrowing money from the Quarterly Conference as has been the custom. Several interesting and helpful suggestions were made, and a motion was made and accepted and passed by the Conference that each church in the association make a voluntary contribution of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) annually to the Yearly Association to be paid in to the Quarterly Meeting before each Yearly Meeting.

A motion was made and accepted and passed by the Conference to adopt and place in the Minutes a copy of the By-Laws of the Minister's Conference.

A report was received from Woodway, Va., Church of the Young People's League Work, and songs were sung by the members present.

A motion was made and accepted and passed by the Conference to retain Sis. Edna Davis, Norton, Va., Route 1, Box 650, as Field Worker for the Young People's League Work of the Southwest Virginia Association of Free Will Baptists.

Reports were received and passed from six ministers.

The Conference was then adjourned until 9:30 a. m. Saturday, May 14th.

Friday—8:00 P. M.

Elder J. W. Brannon being the Pulpit Committee's selection to bring the Friday night message, read II Cor. 6:1-10. Text: "Workers together for Christ." Bro. Brannon preached a wonderful message which was enjoyed by all.

Saturday—9:30 A. M.

Service opened by Congregation singing "Love Lifted Me." Scripture reading 23rd Psalm. Prayer was offered by Elder V. B. Thacker.

Conference was opened for business by Moderator as follows: Ministers, Deacons, Delegates, and Corresponding Messengers were enrolled and seated in order.

A very interesting talk was given by Elder George Dunbar of Chuckey, Tenn., concerning a twelve point program which has been adopted by the Union Association of Tennessee, and used very effectively for the support of all phases of the work.

A motion was made and accepted by the Conference that a committee be appointed to obtain more information concerning the Twelve Point Program and be submitted to this association for the adopting of a similar plan for the betterment of our work in this association. The Conference, appointed the following: Elder W. B. Galloway, Elder Mack Fisher, and Elder Paul Harry Miller.

Delegates were elected to John Thomas Association to convene with Pole Church, Swords Creek, Va., Saturday before the second Sunday in September, as follows: Bro. E. J. Kilgore, Elder C. G. Turner, Sister Goldie Kiser, and Sister Jackie Culbertson.

Delegates were elected to Clinch Valley Association to convene with Penelton Church Friday before the second Sunday in August as follows: Elder V. B. Thacker, Elder L. J. Fields, Sister Jackie Culbertson, and Sister Goldie Kiser.

Delegates were elected to the National Association to be held in Columbus, Georgia, to begin on Tuesday before the third Sunday in July as follows: Elder Paul Harry Miller, Elder W. B. Galloway, Bro. Leslie G. Ketron, and Elder C. A. Robinette.

Delegates were elected to the State Association to convene with the South Side Church, Norton, Va., on Thursday before the third Sunday in June as follows: Elder C. A. Robinette, Bro. Roy Begley, Sister Charlie Robinette, Elder Clarence Turner, and Bro. Jack Adkins.

Saturday—11:00 O'clock

Service was opened by wonderful singing by the Enoch Rose Quartet. Prayer was offered by Elder L. J. Fields. Brother George Dunbar was the Pulpit Committee's selection to bring the 11:00 o'clock message. His Scripture reading was Deut. 2:1-8. The text: "Ye have compassed this mountain long enough: turn you northward." A wonderful message followed and the service was enjoyed by everyone.

Saturday—1:30 P. M.

Service was opened by singing "What Wonderful Joy," by the Enoch Rose Quartet. Prayer was offered by Elder Bill Hall. Scripture was read from 3rd Psalms. The Moderator opened the service for business.

Brother E. J. Kilgore gave a report from our State for Children of Greenville, Tenn. was present with seven of the children and they gave a song program which was enjoyed by everyone. A free will offering was received

for the Home of one hundred twelve dollars (\$112.00).

Brothre E. J. Kilgore gave a report from our State Executive Board of which he is a member.

A talk was received and enjoyed by the Rev. Solomon Birnbaum, Associate Director of the American-European Bethel Missions Inc.

A report was received and passed from the Wise County Quarterly Conference.

The Clerk and Assistant Clerk were instructed by the Conference to have 1,000 Minutes of the Association prepared, 850 for the Wise County Quarterly Conference and 150 for the Lee County Quarterly Conference.

PREFACE

(From National F. W. B. Treatise, 1949 Revised Edition)

For over two hundred years there has been a Baptist people in the United States, who preached and practiced "Freedom of the will." A great many of these Baptist came from Wales and London to the Eastern part of the United States, in the early settling of this country. Among the earliest records available we find the name of Paul Palmer who preached and organized a church in Perquimans county, North Carolina in the year of 1727. This church was later lost to the Calvinistic Baptist. Not only this church was lost, but several others in the course of time were lost, but a sufficient number kept the "Faith once delivered to the saints," that a steady increase has prevailed throughout the years.

Those who are called Free Will Baptist, in North Carolina were first called by this name by those who opposed the Doctrine of "Freedom of the Will." The same thing was true in the north with Rev. Benjamin Randall and his followers whose church was organized at New Durham; N. H., in the year of 1780. The name was later adopted by the believers in "Salvation by Grace through faith" who preached "Freedom of the Will."

Among these believers it was deemed wise to set forth certain outstanding, fundamental doctrines as believed by the denomination. In several of the states there were booklets setting forth the "Articles of Faith." Many of the Disciplines set forth had different ways of doing things, while the fundamental doctrine was the same in all. These Disciplines and the "articles of faith" set forth

the fact that "these were set forth for convenience" with the solemn declaration, that "The Bible is Infallible," and in every instance it was plainly set forth that "We believe the whole Scriptures to be the word of God."

In the year 1935 at Cofer's Chapel, Nashville, Tenn., a committee was elected for the purpose of formulating, by way of revision, a Treatise out of the various Disciplines and former Treatises, to be used in Free Will Baptist churches. This committee was composed of the following ministers, namely: J. C. Griffin, Chairman, and Winford Davis, E. B. Joyner, J. S. Frederick, E. E. Morris, W. B. Davenport, Millard Vanhooose, C. B. Thompson and Ralph Staten, with two laymen, M. L. Morse and Hubert Post. This Committee worked for several hours and then reported. A motion was carried that the report be accepted. In the year of 1947, while the National Association was in session at Highland Park F. W. B. Church in Detroit, Mich., a resolution was passed in which seven members of the General Board of the National Association and one member from each affiliated State Convention or Association was to meet and revise the Treatise and report at the next session of the National Association. This committee composed of the following ministers, namely: J. L. Welch, Chairman, R. B. Crawford, J. C. Griffin, J. F. Miller, K. V. Shutes, F. S. Vanhooose, L. A. Holliday, I. W. Yandall, M. L. Sutton, Ralph Staten, Harry Beatty, H. E. Willis, Floyd Cherry, R. N. Hinnant, Seldon Bullard, C. H. Curry and A. J. Lambert met at Cofer's Chapel in Nashville, Tenn., in April and the revision was made and presented to the National Association in session in Pocahontas Free Will Baptist Church, Pocahontas, Ark., July, 1948, and was adopted.

BY-LAWS
OF THE MINISTER'S CONFERENCE
Of
WISE COUNTY QUARTERLY CONFERENCE
Organized April 17, 1948 at the
South Side Chapel Church, Norton, Va.

PREAMBLE—From long experience, we the Ministers of Wise County Quarterly Conference of the Free Will Baptist, realizing the necessity of a Bond of Union and Fellowship among our Ministers, do therefore ordain this Constitution for our good to edification.

Article (1) This organization shall be known as the Minister's Conference of the Wise County Quarterly Conference.

Article (2) The object and purpose of this organization shall be to unify and substantiate the work of the Ministry.

Article (3) This conference shall convene every three months on Saturday mornings at 9:30 a. m. before the fourth Sundays in the months of March, June, September and December.

Article (4) All Ministers of the Wise County Quarterly Conference of Free Will Baptist are required to attach themselves to this Minister's Conference, and attend the regular sessions either in person or report to it by letter.

Article (5) It shall be the duty of this Minister's Conference to keep each church of the Wise County Quarterly Conference informed as to the ministerial standing of each of the Ministers.

Article (6) Any Minister refusing to attach themselves to this Minister's Conference are subject to discipline, or any attached Minister failing to report or support this Conference for one year shall be subject to discipline.

Article (7) Any Minister who might be subject to discipline for un-Christian conduct or for doctrine contrary to the Articles of Faith as set forth and believed by Free Will Baptists shall be tried according to Matthew 18:15-17, providing charges are made for public or private offence by an ordained Minister who is in good standing in his respective Church or Conference and when such charges are presented in writing properly signed, or by the

Church through its Official Board in which the Minister is Pastor, providing all charges are duly signed by the presenter or prosecutor.

These By-Laws were adopted and passed by a unanimous vote at the regular Conference at Wilson's Chapel, Dorchester, Va., July 3, 1949.

OBITUARY

Funeral service was conducted March 23, 1949, for the late Rev. W. T. Large, who departed this life March 21, 1949 after a few days of serious illness.

Services were under the direction of Rev. B. R. Powers, a co-worker of Rev. Large for years, and of Coeburn Lodge No. 97 of Ancient, Free and Accepted Masons.

Rev. Large was born December 20, 1902 in Wise County, Va. Since early manhood he has been a singer, song lover, and a great booster of Gospel singing. He was converted in the year 1930 and shortly thereafter was baptized and united with the Rugsby Chapel Church, Caney Ridge, Va. On January 15, 1933 he delivered his first message at this church. From that time until 1944 he was a very active minister through southwest Virginia, Tennessee, Kentucky and West Virginia, then ill health and on the doctor's advice he gave up most of his work.

In Bro. Large's last years of preaching he often made the statement that God would let him live to build an earthly home for his wife and children and see the Greenville, Tennessee home for children completed. God saw fit to grant his family an earthly home, and by and through seed sown by Bro. Large and others the harvest will complete the Greenville Home.

A few hours before Bro. Large died he revived long enough to tell his children he was moving, and that his new address would be HEAVEN.

So we believe our loss is Heaven's gain.

Large is survived by his wife Mrs. Bessie Large of Coeburn, Va.; three sons: Troy, Russell, and Donald Large, all of Coeburn, Va.; five daughters: Mary Helen and Charlotte Large of Coeburn, Va.; Mrs. Emma (Large) White, Castlewoods, Va.; Mrs. June (Large) Chase, Clintwood, Va., and Mrs. Verna (Large) Kulman, of Missouri.
