RULES FOR THE PREACHERS

- 1. All ministers wishing to become a member of the Association will be requirede to go before the Credentials Committee with a recommendation from the church of which they are a member, and also be called upon to present thei rcredentials for examination and answer satisfactorily such questions as they may ask of them.
- 2. All preachers shall attend al lbusiness meetings unless providentially hindered.
- 3. Any minister who behaves himself unbecomingly to his high and exalted calling shall be reported by the credentials committee to the Association, who shall deal with him.
- 4. All ministers will be required to strictly adhere to the teachings of the Freewill Baptist, according to the Articles of Faith.
 - 5. All ministers shall be required to support and stand by all boards

and committees appointed by this Association and do their utmost to make them a success.

6. No minister shall speak slanderously or cast personal reflections upon another minister that will hurt his influence or ministerial standing.

7. All ministers are required to make an annual report of the work doe by him and submit the report to the Association at the regular session.

8. Any minister who draws his letter from the church to which he belongs automatically cancels his credentials until he joins some other church of the same faith and order and he is not allowed to minister any rights that is allowed the minister of the gospel to perform.

9. No minister shall revive any members in the different churches of the State Line Free Will Baptist Association except by a move and second

in the different church.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

1. We believe that there is but one true Eternal God, the Father of whom are al Ithings, from everlasting to everlasting, glorious and immuta-

ble to al lhis attributes—1 Cor. 8, 6, Isa. 40, 26.

2. We believe that there is one Lord Jesus Christ, by whom are all things, th eonly begotten son of God, born of the Virgin Mary, whom God freely sent into the world, beause of the great love wherewith he loved the world, and Christ as ferely gave nimself as ransom for all, tasting death for every man, who was buried and rose again the third day, and ascended into Heaven, from when we look for him the secon dtime in the clouds of Heaven at the last day, to judge the quick and the dead. 1 Tim. 2, 5, 6; Heb. 2 John 3, 16. Rev. 1, 7; Acts 24, 15, 1; John 2, 2.

3. We believe that there is one Holy Ghost, the precious gift of the Father through his dear son, unto the world, who quickeneth and draweth

sinners home to God. John, 1, 6, 7, 8; Acts 2, 4; Eph. 2, 1.

4. We believe that in the beginning God made man upright, and placed him in a state of glory without the least mixture of misery, from which he voluntarily, by transgression, fell, and by that means brought on himself a miserable and mortal state subject to death. Gen. 2, 17, 3, 19.

5. We believe that God is not willing that any should perish, but that all should come to repentance and the knowledge of truth, that they might be saved, for which end Christ had commanded the gospel to be preached among all nations and to every creature. Mark 15, 16; John 3, 15, 17.

Tim. 2, 4.

6. We believe that no man shall suffer in hell for want of a Christ, who dred for him, but as the scripture has said, for denying the Lord that brought them, because they believe not in the name of the only begotten Son of God, unbelief, therefore, benig the cause why the just and righteous God of Heaven will condemn the children of men, it follows against all contradictions that all men at one time or anotherfi are found in such a capacity, as that through the furnace of God they may be saved. Acts 17, 30 Mark 6, 6; Hebrew 3, 10; John 5, 10.

7. We believe the whole scripture is infallibly true, and that they are

the only rules of faith and practice. 2 Tim. 3, 16, 17.

- 8. We believe in the doctrine of general provisions made of God in Christ, for the benefit of all mankind who repent and believe the gospel. Luke 14, 16, 20. Matt. 28, 19, 20. Luke 13, 3, 5. Luke 24,47. Acts 3, 19. Mark 1, 15.
- 9. We believe that sinners are drawn to God, the Father, by the Holy Ghost, through Christ, his son, and that the Holy Ghost offers his divine aid to all the human family, so as they all might be nappy, would they give place to his divine teaching, whereas such as do not receive the divine impressions of his Holy Spirit shall at a future day own their condemnation just ,and charge themselves with their own damnation for willfully rejecting the ofters of sovereign grace. Matt. 11, 27. St. John 6, 44, 65. Psalms 1, 1. Tit. 2, 11, 12. Jef. 22, 29.
- 10. We believe that men, not considered simply as men, but ungodly men, were of old ordained to condemnation, considered such who turn the grace of God into lasciviousness, denying the only Lord God, Jesus Christ,

who brought them, ad therefore, shall bring upon themselves swift destruction, but we observe that they are and such the Apostles sayeth because they receive not the love of the truth. That they might be saved herefore, the indignation and wrath of God is upon every son of man hat doeth evil, living and dying therein, for there is no respect of person with God. Jude 1, 4; Peter 2, 1-2; Thes. 2, 11-12; Rom. 2, 9-11.

11. We believe that all children dying in infancy, having not actually transgressed against the law of God, in their own persons, are only subject to the first death, which was brought on them by the fall of the first Adam, and not that any one of them dying in the state shall suffer punishment in hell by the guilt of Adam's sin, for such is the Kingdom of God. Cor. 15,

12. We believe that good works are he fruits of a loving faith and that in the use of the means of the grace and not out of the use of those means, eternal life is promised to men. Rev. 22, 14, 15. Isa. 1, 19, 20. Matt. 7,

3. Jer. 6, 16. Luke 13, 34, 35.

- 13. We believe that no man has any warrant in the holy scripture for justification before God through his own works, power or ability which he has in and of himself, only he by gace is made able to come to God through Jesus Christ, believing the righteousness of Jesus Christ to be imputed to all believers for their eternal accepance with God. Rom. 4, 24. Acts 8, 20, 21.
- 14. We believe that all things are foreseen in the wisdom of God so that God knoweth whatever can or cannot come to pass upon all supposed conditions, but not having decreed any person to everlasting life, out of respect or merechoice, rarcher than he hath appointed the Godly unto life, and the ungodly, who died in sin unto death. Heb. 4, 13. Prov. 8, 22, 31. Matt. 25, 31, 46.
- 15. We believe, as touching gospel ordinances, in believers, baptism, laying on the hands, receiving or the sacrament, in bread and wine, washing the saint's feet, anoming the sick with oil in the name of the Lord, fasting, prayer, singing praise to God, and the public ministry of the word, with every institution or the Lord we shall find in the new testament. Mark 16, 15-16. Acts 8, 17. Acts 10, 6. Luke 22, 20. John 13, 5, 17. James 5, 14.
- 16. We believe the gospel mode of water baptism is by immersion, and that believers are the only subjects for bapt.sm. Matt. 3, 16. Mark 1, 9, 10. Isaiah 2, 38, 39. Kom. 5, 4. Col. 2, 12.
- 17. We believe in a general resurrection of the read and a final judgment at the last day. John 5, 28, 29. 2 Cor. 5, 10.
- 18. We believe the happiness of the righteous is eternal and the torments of the wicked are endless. Matt. 25, 46.

CONSTITUTION

1. The Association shal lbe known as the State Line Freewill Baptist Association of Alabama and Mississippi.

2. This Association shall be composed of Ministers, Deacons and Dele-

gates of different Churches rorming the same.

- 3. All miinsters and churches wishing to become members of this body must willingly submit to the Articles of Faith, Constitution and Rules of same.
- 4. Each Church in this Association shall be entitled to three delegates for the first hundred members or fraction thereof and one delegate for every additional fifty members.
- 5. This Association shall have a Credential Committee composed of three members who shall be appointed by the Modtrator at the convening of each regular session, whose duty shall be to examine all church letters and applications for membership for both churches and ministers and make report of same to the body.

6. Officers of this Association shall be a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, and Treasurer, who shall be elected by ballot at each regular

session.

7. This Association shall meet on Friday and Saturday before the sec-

ond Sunday in October of each year and shall not adjourn until all business is transacted.

8. The Association shall vote no wheer the next Association shall be

held, until one church gets the majority votes.

- 9. The Constitution, By-Laws, may be altered or amended by a majority vote of any regular meeting and approved by that body and published in the Minutes with notice that it will be acted upon at the next meeting.
- 10. No ministers, deacons or delegates shall be seated in this body unless they agree to stay throughout the session unless they are providentially hindered.
- 11. Each church repreented in this Association shall be required to bring annually 5 per capita as an Essociational Fund for the purpose of printing the minutes and associational expense.

CHURCH COVENANT

Having given ouselves to God by faith in Christ and adopted the word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another, by the will of God in this solemn covenant, we promise by his grace to love and obey him ni all things, to avoid all apperance of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusement and unholy conformity in the world, from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages and to provide things honest in tht sihgt of all men.

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to the study of scripture, secret prayers, family doctrines and social worship and by self denial, faith and good works, endeavor to grow in grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ; we will not forget the assembling together for church conference, public workship and the observance of the ordinances of the gospel, nor fail o pray according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor and all of its benevolent work; we agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness and watch over one another in love, endeavoring to keep the unity of the spirit, in the bonds of peace, to be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and, as far as we are able, promote the success of the church and of the gospel; we will everywhere hold the Christian principles sacred and Christian obligations supreme, counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society, constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come and his will be done on earth as it is in Heaven; to this end we agree to labor for the promotion of education and denominational enterprise, support the missions, the success of the Sabbath Schools and evangelistic effort for salvaion of souls and conversion of the world, and may the God of Peace sanctify us wholly and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

RULES OF DECORUM

1. This Association shall be opened and closed with singing and prayer.

2. The officers elected at the previous session shall begin their administration at the opening of each regular session.

3. Only one person shall speak at a time. He shall arise and address

the Moderator and when recognized he shall proceed.

4. No person shall be interrupted while speaking by anyone except the Moderator, and not by h eModerator unless he breaks the rules of order.

5. The person speaking must adhere to the subject in question and

shall not use words of personal reflection.

- 6. No person shall speak more than twice on the same subject without leave of the Association, and not more than five minutes each time.
- 7. No member shall laugh or whisper in time of public speaking.
 8. No person shall address another except by the appellation of brother or sister.
 - 9. No member shall absent himself without leave of the Moderator.
- 10. The names of all the ministers, deacons and delegates shall be enrolled by the clerk, and called as often as deemed necessary by the Moderator.
 - 11. Every member of this body shall vote for or against every move

that comes before it; those failing to do this shall be reprimanded by the Moderator.

12. Any person who shall knowingly break any of these rules shall be reproved by the Moderator, according to directions of the Association.

CHURCH RULES

1. We agree as members of the State Line Association of the Freewill Baptists to cooperate in every move for the betterment of our denomination and the extension of God's Kingdom throughout the world.

2. We agree to meet in conference quarterly, or oftener, if necessary,

to transact the business of the church.

3. The Moderator shall be chosen by he suffrage of the church in the absence of the pastor; the Moderator shall observe good order and explain all questions before he takes the voice of the church on them and shall have the liberty of speech as any other, but not vote unless there be a tie, when he shall give the deciding vote.

4. It shall be the duty of all members to fill their seats in conference

and bear their part of the expense.

5. No member shall leave their seat during conference without permission from the Moderator.

6. No member shall arraign another before the church for any griev-

ance without first taking gospel steps. See Matt. 18, 15, 16, 17.

- 7. All business brought before the church by motion and second, and in gospel-like order, shall be attended to by the church, unless withdrawn by mover.
- 8. Any person wishing to speak shall arise and address the Moderator, and if two arise at the same time, the Moderator shall decide who shall speak first, and no member while speaking shall cast any reflection on any person, but shall adhere strictly to the subject under consideration.

9. No member shall speak twice on any subject without permission

from the church and not more than five minutes at the time.

- 10. It shall be the duty of all church members to be present at all church meetings, to vote on all questions that come before the church when called on by the Moderator, or any member of the church who desires o obtain the mind of the whole church.
- 11. If any member shall remain silent during the transaction of any business of the church, and afterward complain of what was done the same shall be deemed disorderly, and the member so offending shall be dealt with accordingly.
- The members of the church shall not talk about one another slanderously, nor shall give any report of circulation that may arise again at any church member, but shall make it known to the one the report is against and to no one else, and any member doing otherwise, shall be dealt with accordingly.

13. We agree to do all business by a majority of the members present, at any regular or called conference, providing a quorum is present, said

quorum being seven members or more.

14. These rules shall be read at the opening of each conference, strict-

ly enforced by the Moderator.

15. Any member or minister of the church who talks about his brother or sister slanderously shall be dealt with according as the church sees fit.

RULES COVERING BOARD OF FINANCE

1. The management and control of the financial affairs of the Association shall be vested in the Board of Finance, elected by the Association in the manner provided by the Association.

2. The Board shall meet as often as necessary at the call of the chairman at such time and place as he may designate, but they must meet at

least annually.

- 3. The Board at its annual meeting shall elect a director of finance, whose duty it shall be to direct the whole financial program of the Association.
- The Board shall report annually to the Association its receipts, disbursements, assets, liabilities, and of its work in general, together with any

recommendation deemed advisable.

5. The Board at its annual meetnig may elect its own officers.

6. Any member who is negligent in his duty shall forfeit his office, and the same may be declared vacant by the Moderator of the Association and his successor appointed.

7. A bajority of the board may constitute a quorum for the transac-

tion of business.

8. The Secretary shall keep a correct account of the proceedings of the board and perform any other duty that usually pertains to his office.

9. The Board shall ascertain each year the financial needs of the various departments of church work, and from such information make up the association budget and apportion same to the individual churches.

10. It shall be the duty of this Board to notify each church not later than October the first of each year of the amount of their apportionment.

11. It shall be the duty of the Board to receive the funds collected by the Secretary and divide the same as follows: For education, 10 per cent; for orphanage, 10 per cent; missions, 10 per cent; young people's work, 10 per cent; church extension, 20 per cent; aged ministers, 20 per cent; charity, 20 per cent; provided, however, that all expenses are allowed before division is made.
