All ministers wishing to become members of this Association will be required to go before the Credential Committee with a recommendation from the church from which they are a member, and also be called upon to present their credentials for examination and answer satisfactory such questions as may be asked of them.
- 2. Any minister who behaves himself unbecomingly to his high and exalted calling shall be reported by the Credential committee to the Association who shall deal with him.
- 3. All ministers will be required to strictly adhere to the teachings of the Free Will Baptist, according to the Articles of Faith.
- 4. All ministers will be required to support and stand by all boards and committees appointed by the Association and do their utmost to make them a success.

- 5. No minister shall speak slanderously or cast personal reflections upon another minister that will hurt his influence or ministerial standing.
- 6. All ministers are requested to make an annual report of the work done by him and submit the report to the Association at the regular session.
- 7. Any minister who draws his letter from the church from which he belongs automatically cancels his credentials until he joins some other church.
- 8. No minister shall receive any members in the different churches of the State Line Free Will Baptist Association, except by a move and second in the different churches.

who died for him, but as the scripture has said for denyng the Lord that nt. because they believe not in the name of teh only begotten Son of God, unbelief, therefore being the cause why the just and righteous God of Heaven will condemn the children of the men, it follows against all contradictions that all men at ne time or another, are found such a capacity, a that through the furnace of God they must be saved.—Acts 17:30; Mark 6:6; Heb. 3:10; John 5:10.

- 7. We believe the whole scriptures infalibly true, and that they are the only rules of faith and practice.—2 Tim. 3:16-17.
- 8. We believe the doctrine of general provisions made of God in Christ for the benefit of all mankind who repent and believe the gospel.—uke 14:16-20; Matt. 28:19-20; Luke 13:3-5, 24_47; Acts 3:19; Mark 1:5.
- 9. We believe that sinners are drawn to God the Father, by the Holy Ghost, through Christ, His Son, and that the Holy Ghost offers His divine aid to all the human family, so as they all might be happy, would they give place to his divine impressions of Holy Spirit shall at a future day own their condemnation just, and charge themselves with their own condemnation for willful rejecting the offers of sovereign grace.—Matt. 11:27; St. John 6:44-65; Ps. 1:1; Tit. 2:11-12; Jef. 22:19.
- 10. We believe that men, not considered simply as men, but ungodly men, were of old ordained to condemnation, considering such who turn the grace of God into laciviousness, denying the only Lord Gdo, Jesus Christ, who brought them nd therefore, shall bring upon themselves swift destruction, but we observe that they are as such the Apostle sayeth because they receive not the love of the truth. That they might be saved therefore the adignation and wrath of God is upon every son of man that doeth evil, living and dying therein, for there is no respect of person with God.—Jude 1:4; Pet. 2:1-2; Thes. 2:11-12; Rom. 2:Q-11.
- 11. We believe that all children dying in infancy, having not actually transgressed against the law of God, in their own persons, are only subject to the first death, which was brought on them by the fall of the first Adam,

Hell by the guilt of Adam's sin, for such is the kingdom of God.—Cor. 22; Matt. 18:2-5; Mark 9:36-37; Matt. 19-16.

- 12. We believe that good works are fruits of a loving faith and that in the use of the means of grace and not out of those means, Eternal life is promised to men.—Rev. 22:14-15; Isaiah 1:19-20; Matt. 8:8; Jer. 6:16; ake 13:34-35
- 13. We believe that no man has any warrant in the whole scriptures for justification before God through His own work, power or ability which he has in and for himself, only he by grace he is made able to come to God through Jesus Christ, believing the righteousness of Jesus Christ to be imputed to all believers for their eternal acceptance with God.—Rom. 4:24;

Acts 8:20-21.

- 14. We believe that all things are foreseen in the wisdom of God so that God knoweth whatever can or cannot come to pass upon all supposed conditions, but not having decreed any persn to evariasting life, out of respect or mere choice, further than he hath appointed the Godly unto life, and the ungodly, who die in sin unto death.—Heb. 4:13; Prov. 8:22-31; Matt. 25:31-46.
- 15. We believe as to touching gospel ordinances, in believers, baptism, laying on the hands, receiving of the sacrament, in bread and wine, washing the saints feet, annointing the sick with oil in the name of the Lord, fasting, prayer, singing praise to God, and the public ministry of the word, with every institution of the Lord we shall fiznd in the New Testament.—Mark 16:15-16; Acts 8:17, 9:6; Luke 19:22-9; John 13:5-7; James 5:14.
- 16. We believe the gospel mode of baptism is by emersion, and believare the only subjects for baptism.—Matt. 3:16; Mark 1:9-10; Isaiah 38-39; Rom. 4; Col. 2:12.
- 17. We believe in a general resurrection of the dead and a final judgment at the last day.—John 5:28-29; Cor. 5:10.
- 18. We believe the happinss of the righteous is eternal and the torments of the wicked are endless.—Matt. 46:25.

CHURCH COVENANT

Having given ourselves to God by Faith in Christ and adopted the word of God as our rule and faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another, by the will of God in this solemn covenant, we promise by His grace to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid all appearance of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity in the world, from all sanctions of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages and to provide things honest in the sight of all men.

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations to the study of scripture, secret prayers, family doctrines and social worship and by self-denial, faith and good works, endeavor to grow in grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ; we will not forget the assembling together for church conference, public worship and the observance of the ordinances of the gospel, not fail to pray according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor and all of its benevolent work; we agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness and watch over one another in love, to be careful of one anther's happiness and reputation, seek to trengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and, as far as we are able, promote the success of the church and of the gospel; we will everywhere hold the Christian principls sacred and Christian obligation supreme, counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society, constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come and His will be done on earth as it is in Heaven; to this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprise, support the missions, the success of the Sabbath Schools and evangelistic effort for salvation of souls and conversion of the world, and may the God of peace sanctify us wholly and preserve us blameless unto the

coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

RULES OF DECORUM

- 1. This Association shall open and close bmy singing and prayer.
- 2. The officers elected at the previous sessin shall begin their administration at the opening of each regular session.
- 3. Only one person shall speak at a time. He shall arise and address the Moderator, and when recognized he shall proceed.
- 4. No person shall be interrupted while speaking, by any one except the Moderator, and not by the Moderator unless he becake the rules of order.
- 5. The person speaking must adhere to the subject in question and shall not use words of personal reflection.
- 6. No person shall speak more than twice on the same subject withcut leave of the Association, and not more than 5 minutes each time.
 - 7. No member shall laugh or whsper in time of public speaking.
- 8. No person shall address another except by the appellation of Brother or Sister.
 - 9. No member shall absent himself without leave of the Moderator.
- 10. The names of all ministers, deacons and delegates shall be enrolled by the clerk, and called as often as deemed necessary by the Moderator.
- 11. Every member of this body must vote for or against every move that comes before it; those failing to do this shall be repremanded by the Moderator.
- 12. Any person knowingly breaking any of these rules shall be reproved by the Moderator, according to directions of the Association.
- 13. We recommend that each church in this Assciation have as many as two Sunday services each month.

CHURCH RULES

We agree as members of the State Line Association of the Free Will Baptist, to cooperate in every move for the betterment of our denomination and the extension of God's Kingdom through the world.

- 2. We agree to meet in conference quarterly, or oftener, if necessary, to transact business of the church.
- 3. The Moderator shall be chosen by the suffrage of the church in the absence of the pastor; the Moderator shall observe good order and explain all questions before he takes the voice of the church on them and shall have the liberty of speech as any other, but not vote unless there is a tie, when he shall give the deciding vote.
- 4. It shall be the duty of all members to fill their seats in the conference and bear ther part of the expense.
- 5. No member shall leave their seat during conference without permission from the Moderator.
- 6. No member shall arraign another before the church for any grievance without first taking gospel steps.—See Mtt. 18:15-16-17. the gospel; we will everywhere hold the Christian principles sacred and in gospel-like order, shall be attended to by the church unless withdrawn by

mover.

- 8. Any person wishing to speak shall arise and address the Moderator, and if two arise at the same time, the Mderator shall decide who shall speak first, and no member while speaking shall cast any reflections on any person, but shall adhere strictly to the subject without permission from the church, and not more than 5 minutes at the time.
- 9. It shall be the duty of all church members to be present at all cliurch meetings, to vote on all questions that come before the church who desires to obtain the mind of the whole church.
- 9. If any member remain silent during the transaction of any business of the church, and afterward complain of what was done, the same shall be deemed disorderly, and the member so offending, shall be dealt with accordingly.
- 11. The members of the church shall not talk about one another slanderously, nor shall any report of circulation that may arise with any church member, but shall make it known to the one the report is against and no one else, and any member doing othewise, shall be dealt with accordingly.
- 11. We agree to do all busiess by a majority of the members present, at any regular or called conference, providing a quorum is present, said quorum being seven members or more.
- 12. These rules shall be read at opening of each conference, strictly enforced by the Moderator.
- 13. Any member or minister of the church who talks about his brother or sister, slanderously, shall be dealt with according as the church sees fit.

CONSTITUTION

This Association shall be known as the State Line Free Will Baptist Association of Alabama and Mississippi.

- 2. The Association shall be composed of ministers, deacons and delegates of different churches forming the same.
- 3. All ministers and churches wishing to become members of this body must, willingly, submit to the Articles of Faith, Constitution and Rules of same.
- 4. Each church in the Association shall be entitled to three delegates for the first hundred members or fraction thereof, and one delegate for every additional fifty members.
- 5. The Association shall have a credential committee composed of three members who shall be appointed by the Moderator at the convening of each regular session, whose duty will be to examine all church letters and applications for membership of both churches and ministers and make report of the same to the body.
- 6. Officers of t heAssociation shall be a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk and Treasurer, who shall be elected by ballot at each regular session.
- 7. This Association shall meet on Friday and Saturday before the Second Sunday in October of each year and shall not adjourn until all bus-

iness is transacted.

8. The Constitution, By-Laws may be altered or amended by a majority vote of any regular meeting and approved by that body and published in the Minutes with notice that it will be acted upon at the next meeting.

9. No ministers, deacons or delegates shall be seated in this body unless they agree to stay throughout the session unless they are providently hindered.

10. Each church represented in this Association shall be required to bring annually 5 per cent per capita as an Associtional fund for the purpose of printing the minutes and Associtional expense.

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
