EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETINGS 1957-58

THIRD SUNDAY IN JULY—FIRST FREE WILL BAPTIST CHURCH, DOTHAN

The Moderator, Rev. Bob L. Jones, called a meeting of the Executive Board to plan for the organizational meeting of a quarterly meeting of the State Line Association.

The Moderator gave an informative devotional, which was taken from Acts 3. Prayer was offered by Rev. M. F. Taylor.

Members present were then referred to page 6 of the 1957 minutes, after which followed detailed planning of the quarterly session.

A MC* that a place and time for the first quarterly session be named. Invitations to Howards Grove, Shiloh, and Grangerburg were heard and a MC that the invitation to Howards Grove be accepted.

A MC* that August 9 be designated as the date for the organizational meeting.

A proposed constitution was read by the moderator and the Executive Board, through mutual consent, made some minor changes and adopted the constitution for recommendation to the quarterly session.

Bro. M. F. Taylor suggested that the clerk request in the letters to the Church, which he was instructed by the Executive Board to write, that the Churches come praying that God would guide us in determining a permanent date.

August 14, 1958—Howard's Grove Church

In the absence of a moderator, the meeting was called to order by the clerk, who read from Leviticus 19:16-20; 2 Corinthians 13:1-4; Ephesians 4: 1-3. Brother C. W. Duke led the opening prayer.

The clerk then called for the election of a temporary chairman to preside over the board meeting. Rev. Horace Herndon was elected.

The main item of business concerned the Executive Board with the appointment of a temporary moderator for the association. The chairman asked for discussion of the matter, to which members of the Board and visitors responded.

A MC* that a temporary moderator be elected to serve until the annual election of officers. The board retired to make a decision. They reported the appointment of Rev. Ralph Bell as moderator and Bro. A. C. Womack as assistant moderator.

Necessity of two constitutions for the association was then discussed and the difficulty that had been experienced in determining the necessity of two. A member of the Executive Board called for the reading of a proposed consolidation of the two. The clerk petitioned the Executive Board to make some recommendation to the Association regarding a, or the, constitution, since changes might delay the printing of the minutes. After discussion of the possibility of a handbook separate from the minutes, Rev. Retherford prayed the benediction.

SEPTEMBER 13, 1958—HOWARDS GROVE CHURCH

A song opened the meeting, after which the moderator declared the Board in order for the transaction of business. The moderator made timely and pertinent remarks, after which he explained the order of events leading to the organization of the quarterly session and work of the quarterly meeting. The moderator opened the floor for discussion concerning the constitution of the quarterly session and the constitution of the annual session and an approach to consolidate the two. By mutual consent, the officers, board members present, the ministers, approved a proposed constitution, which was a consolidation and modification of the two constitutions, to present to the annual session for consideration.

The meeting adjourned.

PROCEEDING'S OF THE QUARTERLY SESSION OF THE STATE LINE ASSOCIATION HELD WITH HOWARDS GROVE CHURCH, SATURDAY, AUGUST 9, 1958

The organizational meeting was called to order by the moderator, Rev. Bob L. Jones.

Singing was led by Bro. Gordon Odom, after which the invocation was given by Rev. Ralph Bell. Rev. Bob Jones read from Romans and made fitting remarks for the initial session of the quarterly session.

The moderator declared the meeting in order for the transaction of business.

The clerk, in giving the morning devotional, read from Ephesians 4:1-6.

Further orientation to the quarterly session followed by the moderator. Copies of the proposed constitution were distributed to members of the nine churches represented. The seven ministers present were recognized.

 Λ report of the National Association was given by the moderator.

An offering of \$16.05 was received.

Bro. Gordon Odom led the congregation in singing. Rev. G. W. Nobles offered the invocation for the worship hour.

The moderator introduced the speaker, Rev. Leo Curtis, Pastor of the Blakely Free Will Baptist Church, who brought an informative and illuminating message. He spoke on the subject of "Love" and read from 1 Corinthians 13.

The congregation was dismissed for the noon hour by Rev. Dan Windham.

After lunch, served by the host church, the meeting reconvened with singing led by Bro. Gordon Odom. Prayer was offered by Bro. C. W. Duke.

A special message in song was heard from Bro. and Sis. Dorman Deal, who were accompanied at the piano by Bro. Norman Smothers.

Sis. O. B. Everson of Colquitt, Georgia, was introduced by Bro. Jones. Sis. Everson's "A Woman's Best Tool—The Bible" was very informative.

A motion was made to adopt the constitution that was recommended by the Executive Board.

A MC* that the body consider the constitution article by article. The moderator instructed the clerk to read the constitution.

The following amendments were made to the constitution:

A MC that Article III be amended as follows: The elected officers of the Association shall be the standing officers of the quarterly sessions, all of whom shall perform such duties as usually devolve upon such officers of the yearly association. The standing officer shall secure speakers and promotional facilities and programs of meetings.

A MC that Art. V be amended as follows: . . . It shall have the power to license and ordain ministers, upon the request of the applicant's church, who give evidence of being qualified. And who pass the questioning of BELIEFS AND PRACTICES OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS by the ordaining council. This council shall be composed of (3) ordained ministers as elected by the Association.

A MC that Art. VI be amended by inserting "Saturday before second Sunday in January, April, and July."

A MC that Art. VI be amended by inserting "or more" after \$5.00.

The constitution was adopted as amended and read.

A proposed letter from the quarterly meeting was read by the moderator.

The letter used in Midway Association was read.

A MC that the annual letter be amended by adding the question asking the churches if they wish to entertain the quarterly session.

The meeting adjourned.

A MC* that the corresponding delegates be seated as delegates and that the chair extend a right hand of Christian fellowship.

A cordial invitation was extended to Pleasant Home, the host for the second day's session.

A MC* that the host church be given a rising vote of thanks for their hospitality.

The benediction was pronounced by Rev. S. T. Shutes.

THURSDAY EVENING SESSION

Rev. John Edwards, Pastor of the host church, brought the message, speaking on "Who Is on the Lord's Side."

FRIDAY MORNING SESSION

Congregational singing opened the session, after which the morning invocation was offered by the moderator.

Bro. Dorman Deal brought the morning devotional. He read from Matthew 5 and Ephesians 5. He brought an inspiring devotional.

The congregation sang "Blessed Assurance" after the devotional and Bro. Bob Fowler led the prayer.

The moderator declared the delegation in order for the transaction of any business.

The moderator issued a call for petitionary letters. There were none.

The finance committee reported and a MC* that the report be accepted as read.

The Auxiliaries committee report was adopted as read.

After a brief recess, the morning worship hour was opened with congregational singing. Rev. L. C. Mixon offered the morning invocation.

Rev. John Edwards brought the morning message using as his text Phillipians 3:13. The message was very applicable and fitting.

FRIDAY AFTERNOON SESSION

Congregational singing opened the afternoon session, after which the congregation feasted upon the informative devotional of Rev. M. F. Taylor, who read from Isa. 58.

Rev. Ralph Bell then conducted a memorial service to the Rev. G. H. Jordan, reading from Joshua 1 and using as his thought "Moses, my servant is dead."

The suggestions committee reported and the report was adopted as read.

The chair appointed all ordained ministers serving Churches in the Association and all ordained ministers who are members of a member Church. This committee was instructed to report at the January session.

A MC* that the Executive Board be elected by nominations.

A MC* that the Association give Pleasant Home a rising vote of thanks for its hospitality.
