


#### GENERAL BOARD MEETING November 20, 2006 Eastside FWB Church

The meeting was called to order the by the Moderator, the Rev. Bobby Peters, who then brought a brief devotional in which he expressed gratitude for the Lord's blessings and for the privilege of serving Him. Scriptures shared included Deut. 8:10; Psalm 107:22; Col. 1:12; 3:15; I Thess. 5:18, and others. Bro. David Miller then led us in a prayer of thankfulness.

Consideration was then given to the subject brought up by Dale McCoy at the Annual Meeting of the feasibility of having 3-member boards in the association, rather than 5-member boards, as some are now. Bro. McCoy suggested that this might preclude men from having to serve on more than one board. It was decided to leave things as they currently are.

David Miller said that info will soon go out concerning the Winter Retreat. Raymond Rivers will be the speaker for this event that will be held at the Vineyard. Cost \$35.

Terry Drinkwater brought up a matter given him by folks from some of the smaller church that there be no meal at association meetings, or that the meal be optional, depending on the wishes of the host church. They say they would like to host the meetings but feel they are too small to provide the meals. After lengthy discussion it was decided that we let the Association know we are looking into the matter and we'd like their suggestions.

#### FIRST QUARTERLY SESSION Florida State Line Association January 13, 2007

The First Quarterly Session of the Florida State Line Association met January 13, 2007, at Shiloh FWB Church, Columbia, AL. The Rev. Ricky Carroll gave the invocation. The Rev. Jason Miller led the congregation in singing "We Have Come Into His House" and "Jesus Hold My Hand. Wendy Shuemake played the piano.

A welcome to the church was given by Bro. John Lanton. A response on behalf of the association was given by the Rev. Rodney Brazil.

Session was then officially opened by the Clerk, the Rev. Jeff Lunsford.

The Moderator, the Rev. Bobby Peters, then appointed the following committees:

Credentials Committee (which is the Ordaining Council), and a Finance Committee. These committees were then dismissed to do their work.

The Moderator's opening remarks addressed the reason why Jesus came: for the redemption of mankind. I Tim 1:15; Luke 5:32; and Rom. 5:8 were cited as key passages supporting his proposition. The heart of God is the salvation of mankind. We need a revival of personal soulwinning – doing the thing that is on God's heart. One who is saved but is not a soulwinner is not much of a Christian. The devil wants us to be busy, but God wants us to be witnessing.

There were no petitionary letters. The Rev. Rick Cash, from the Alabama State Office, was officially welcomed by the Moderator.

Eighteen ministers and 15 deacons were recognized as standing delegates.

Scripture reading and prayer were by the host church. The Rev. Thomas Coxwell read John 3:16. He commented that this single verse has probably led more people to Christ than any other.

Prayer requests were shared and prayer was then led the Rev. Terry Drinkwater.

Credentials Committee report was given by the Rev. Terry Drinkwater. He reported all 17 of our 17 churches reported by letter and with delegates. The committee further reported, "Per phone conversation with David Rabon, we recommend Springfield FWB Church be dropped from the roll of churches of this Association." MSC to receive the report and adopt the recommendation.

The roll was called for elected church delegates. Thirty-five delegates were seated.

Mission Board report was given by Bro. Tommy Taylor. A handout regarding the schedule for the Mission Conference in February was distributed and brief comments were made concerning the upcoming conference and the Feb. 3<sup>rd</sup> Missions Banquet. MSC to receive the report as information.

Youth & Education Board report was given by Bro. David Miller. He reported that the Winter Retreat with Bro. Raymond Rivers had 21 campers and a total of 35, including staff and speaker. Many decisions were made at the altar at that retreat. Couples Retreat is March 17 and costs \$35/couple. Men's Retreat is April 20-21 and costs \$35/person. Junior Camp will be June 18-22, with Teen Camp held June 25-29. The cost for either camp is \$100/camper. MSC to receive as information.

Ministers Retirement report was given by the Rev. Wayne Parker. Bro. Parker requested that all ministers let the Board know how many years they have been in the ministry. The Board reported that the Rev. Thomas Coxwell has not received as much as he has supposed to receive in retirement, a sum totaling \$2,700. Bro. Coxwell's monthly income has been corrected, and the Board recommended giving him back pay in a lump sum from the Retirement Fund's C.D. MSC to receive the report and adopt the recommendation.

The Ordaining Council reported meeting on January 2, 2007, for the purpose of examining the Rev. Bobby Register at the request of the First FWB Church of Samson. "We found him to be of sound doctrine and character. We have also received a letter of good standing for Bro. Bobby from the Liberty Association in Florida, and therefore recommend that he be accepted into full fellowship in the Florida State Line Association." MSC to receive the report and adopt the recommendation. The Moderator then extended the right hand of fellowship to Bro. Register on behalf of the Association.

Finance Committee report was given by Sis. Jennifer Miller. She reported that the Association received \$4,345.39. The Association also received \$2,721.69 in designated giving, making a grand total of \$7,067.08. MSC to accept the report as given.

Sis Jennifer Miller also distributed copies of the Treasurer's Report. The report was received as printed.

Registration Committee Report was given by Harvest FWB Church. They reported 18 ministers, 15 deacons, 35 delegates, and 24 guests registered for a total attendance of 92. The report was received as information.

District Women Active For Christ (WAC) report was given by Sis. Wendy Shuemake. She thanked the ladies for items collected in October for the Provision Closet. The total value amount collected was \$815. She also reminded everyone that the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the district WAC will be March 3<sup>rd</sup> at Harvest FWB Church. Local chapters were also reminded to send in their dues. Sis. Shuemake also highly complimented the new WNAC magazine, . She announced the Pastor Appreciation Dinner and Acts 1:8 Missions Cookout. MSC to receive as information.

#### MISCELLANEOUS BUSINESS:

- 1. The Rev. Thomas Coxwell expressed his gratitude to the Association for the decision made today regarding his retirement income.
- 2. The Rev. Greg Ramsey lamented the loss of Springfield FWB Church. He encouraged us to pray for all of our churches.
- 3. Sis. Cynthia Knowles and Sis. Annette Thomlinson distributed a handout regarding the Acts 1:8 Missions Cookout. In 2006 a total of 151 people attended the cookout, and the event raised \$14,363.39. The 2007 cookout will be Saturday, August 18<sup>th</sup>, at Goodwater FWB Church.

MSC for session to end. ANNOUNCEMENTS:

Revival at Harvest: Feb. 25-Mar. 2<sup>nd</sup>. Rev. Ron Davis, Evangelist. There will be 10:00 AM services, as well as evening services.

Goodwater WAC will be showing the film "Facing the Giants" in February. \$5/person, Proceeds will go to ACTS 1:8.

A report was given by Bro. Rick Cash. Power Point presentation of Acts 1:8 Thanks for Acts 1:8 support. Showed how funds are distributed. There is a new work in Mobile, AL. The Rev. Tim Riggs is the missionary. A nucleus of believers from the old church is already there, waiting and ready. Funds from sale of old building may be available to us. A building was dedicated in Uruguay. Operation Renovation raised \$47,000 for a camp and its renovation in Russia. Statewide the total giving for all causes last year was \$1,142,330. Every FWB family should be receiving the Digest. Statewide Missions Conference with 70+ churches starts tonight in Northport. Encouraged pastors to get behind the February quarter folder campaign to help erase the Southpark property debt, and the change boxes for the April World Mission offering.

WORSHIP SERVICE began by singing "I'll Fly Away." Prayer by the Rev. Greg Ramsey. "When The Roll I Called Up Yonder." The morning offering totaled \$ 240.00 and will be given to the Acts 1:8 mission program.

The Moderator announced that the College Choir from Free Will Baptist Bible College will be at First Church – Dothan. Sunday night March 11<sup>th</sup>.

Enthusiastic singing continued with the old favorites, "There Is A Fountain Filled With Blood" and "I'd Rather Be An Old-Time Christian Than Anything I Know." Special music was provided by the Rev. Jason Miller, who sang, "Because He Lives."

Rev. Rick Cash brought a stirring message from Mark 12:39-44. In the context there is a warring going on between Jesus and the religious leaders. He warns His disciples to beware of them. The leaders were selfish and gloried in their religion. In contrast to them was the widow who was serving and sacrificial. She is poor, hurting and alone. Still she brought what she had and gave it to the

house of God. She gave to a church whose beliefs were wrong. They believed in works salvation. Their behavior was wrong, too. They were corrupt. Most of us would have advised her not to give. So, why did she give? Jesus was watching and she wanted God's approval. Giving is as important as singing, preaching, praying and any other part of worship.

We don't know the rest of the story, but surely on Hallelujah Square there is a little old widow woman rejoicing in the Savior's presence. "I don't know why the Savior hasn't given me anymore than He has, but I know that what I do have I want to give it to my Lord. I want His smile."

#### SECOND QUARTERLY SESSION April 7, 2007 Eastside Free Will Baptist Church

The 2<sup>nd</sup> quarterly session of the FL Stateline Association met April 7, 2007, at Eastside FWB Church in Dothan, AL. The Rev. Jason Miller began the meeting by leading us in singing "Brethren We Have Met to Worship." Opening prayer was offered by the Rev. Terry Drinkwater. A second congregational song was "Praise Him, Praise Him." The body was welcomed to Eastside by Pastor Greg Ramsey. Response by the Rev. Doug Carr. The clerk then officially opened the session.

Moderator Bobby Peters' opening remarks were based on II Thess. 3:1-5, especially v. 1. If there was ever a time when we needed the Word to have free course, it is today. He shared about Bro. Randy Wright, who has pancreatic cancer. He will undergo aggressive chemotherapy. Mobile mission work reported having 34 in attendance at their first service, and a lady in her 50's got saved! A report on Acts 1:8 was sent from Bro. Rick Cash. We are behind budget at this point. Pray for the work at Prattville. This is the 3<sup>rd</sup> time we've attempted to start a church there. For the past 3 years Acts 1:8 giving from our association has declined. Prayer requests were shared by the body.

The Moderator then appointed a Credentials Committee and called for correspondence from sister associations. Ministers and deacons were recognized.

Scripture reading was by, Bro. Randy Dean, a member of the host church. He read from Phil. 2:5-11. We were exhorted to have the mind of Christ today.

Finance committee appointed: Jennifer Miller, Rita Sullivan, & Rose Drinkwater.

Report of credentials committee: 17 churches reporting with letters, 16 churches reporting with delegates, 1 church reporting without delegates. Recommend elected church delegates be seated. MSC to receive the report.

Mission Board report was given by Bro. Tommy Taylor. He asked for feedback on the mission conference.

Youth and Education Board report was given by Bro. David Miller. The Couples Retreat was enjoyed by all who attended. Camp dates were given. Packets for youth camp are available for each church.

The Ordaining Council's report was given by the Rev. Terry Drinkwater. He urged the body to pray that we have more young men answer the call to preach. A letter of good standing was granted for the Rev. Dale McCoy to the Cahaba River Association. Also, we welcome the Rev. James Deese back to our area as pastor of Pine Hills.

The Finance Committee report was given by Sis. Jennifer Miller. She reported:

Rodney Brazil did a good job as speaker at the Pastor Appreciation dinner, and thanked Goodwater Church for hosting it. Encouraged all ladies to attend the State WAC meeting, which will be at Madison on the 28<sup>th</sup> of this month. Keep in mind the missions cookout in August. All churches are invited to attend, even if your church does not have a WAC chapter. MSC to receive as information.

Session was officially opened by the clerk.

Moderator's Opening Remarks: Grace: Jn1:16-17 all we have or ever hope to be is because of God's grace through Jesus. I Cor 15:10 it's by His grace we are who we are I Cor 15:10 it is wonderful, amazing grace. Praise God we are Americans. It is by God's grace that we are Americans. Most of us had nothing whatsoever to do with our being born in the greatest country in the world. I could have been born in another place and been taught a lie about God. But by God's grace I was born here and taught about Jesus, and he's my friend... Also glad to be born a southerner. ... And from Alabama... And from southeast Alabama -- far enough south to miss most of winter's ice and far enough above the Gulf of Mexico that hurricanes have lost most of their steam... Everything I've said is to remind us of God's grace extended to us because of His love for us." Present and former service men and women were then recognized and applauded. We then had a prayer of blessing on our nation and our troops, offered by Bro. Virgil Hagler.

**Credentials Committee:** consisted of the Ordaining Council.

There were no **Petitionary Letters** nor did we have any **Correspondence** from Sister Associations.

Recognition was made of 13 ministers and 10 deacons

**Scripture reading & prayer** were led by host pastor Bobby Peters. He read Ps. 116.

Because the Credentials Committee was not ready to report, the Moderator then called for **announcements.** 

Revival @ Goodwater July 8<sup>th</sup> – 11<sup>th</sup> Randy Bishop

The **Credentials Committee** reported that we had 15 church reporting and sending delegates.

A **Finance Committee** was appointed: Loretta Culpepper, Rhetta Butler to assist Jennifer Miller.

Standing delegates were recognized and seated.

The clerk then **called the roll of elected delegates**. Those delegates were then seated.

#### REPORTS OF STANDING BOARDS

Mission Board: The Moderator shared information from Rick Cash. Total ACTS 1:8 receipts for 2006 were \$544,445.75. Our 2007 budget is \$560,000. This is our best first first six months ever in ACTS giving. At present we are \$25,400 ahead of where we were at this time last year. Our two new missionaries are in place, Dale McCoy in Prattville, and Tim Riggs in Mobile. The Mobile mission had its first service April 1st. They are now averaging 35 in attendance and 3 have already been saved. Jamie Lancaster is scheduled to return to Uruguay at the end of July. Pray for the annual Pastor's Conference in Russia in September. Bro. Jason Miller will be going this year.

Youth and Education: Bro. David Miller "we just completed two weeks of youth camp. Our board wants to thank all the churches that supposed these camps. God truly met with us. Junior Week we had 58 campers and 12 staff. There were 19 salvation decisions and 2 answered the call to preach. Teen Week we had 38 campers and 11 staff. There were 4 salvation decisions and 23 rededications. Please be in prayer for all these young people. [Bro. Miller lamented that only 12 teen campers were actually from the State Line Association!] Our Winter retreat will be December 28-29 "with more information forthcoming." Several campers then gave testimonies. MSC

**Ministers' Retirement:** Wayne Parker reported an account balance of \$3,106.57.

Randy Dean has resigned from the Board having taken a church in GA. The Board nominated Harvey Windham to take his place. MSC

**Ordaining Council:** Rev. Terry Drinkwater reported that a letter of good standing was granted to the Southern Quarterly for Rev. Glenn Poston

Children's Home Trustee: no report.

**Finance Committee & Treasurer's** Report were offered by Jennifer Miller. Receipts for today were \$3,314.24 for the Association, \$1,810.03 for disbursement, for a grand total of \$5,124.27. MSC

**Registration Committee:** Robin McLaney reported 116 people present today: 13 ministers, 11 deacons, 46 delegates, and 38 guests. A rising vote of thanks was given to the host church. MSC

We promise, by His grace, to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid all appearance of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world, from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages, and to "provide things honest in the sight of all men."

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to the study of the Scriptures, secret prayer, family devotions, and social worship, and by self-denial, faith and good works endeavor to "grow in grace and the knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ."

We will not forsake the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences, public worship, and the observance of the ordinances of the gospel; nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor, and all its benevolent work.

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the Spirit" in the bonds of peace. To be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and as far as we are able, promote the success of the church and of the Gospel. We will everywhere hold Christian principles sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society, constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come, and His will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

To this end, we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprises, the support of missions, the success of Sunday Schools, and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of the world. And may the God of peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

# CONSTITUTION ADOPTED APRIL 7, 1962

#### ARTICLE I - NAME

This organization shall be known as the Florida State Line Association of Free Will Baptists.

#### ARTICLE II - COMPOSITION

This Association shall be composed of such regularly organized and well-disciplined Free Will Baptist churches, conveniently located as may embody themselves under this Constitution.

#### ARTICLE III - REPRESENTATION

**SECTION I:** (Standing Delegates) All elected officers, Board members, licensed ministers, ordained ministers, and ordained deacons who are members of a member church shall be standing delegates.

**SECTION II:** (Elected Delegates) Each church shall be entitled to one (1) delegate for every twenty-five (25) members and one (1) delegate for the fractional part of twenty-five (25) members, it shall be entitled to two (2) delegates.

**SECTION III:** (Certification) No one will be seated as an elected delegate unless they are certified as such on their church letter.

#### ARTICLE IV - ADMISSION

SECTION I: (Churches) Newly constituted or other churches maintaining gospel order, and preaching, agreeing with the denomination in doctrine and practices, as are contained in the NATIONAL TREATES OF FAITH AND PRACTICE OF THE ORIGINAL FREE WILL BAPTISTS, in favor of benevolent enterprises such as Sunday School, C.T.S., missions, and education, desiring admission into this union shall petition with delegates and letter at any session, and if, upon examination, are found to be orthodox and orderly, after not less than three (3) months under the watch-care of the Association, shall be received into the Association, and such reception shall be manifested by the right hand of Christian fellowship given by the chair.

**SECTION II:** (Ministers) Admission of ministers shall be subject to recommendation of the Ordaining Council and approval of the Association.

#### ARTICLE V – DISCIPLINE

**SECTION 1:** (Duties) Any church who shall fail to attend three (3) successive sessions and whosever shall be generally remiss, and whosever shall fail to conform to the practices and adopt the doctrine of the Free Will Baptist denomination, and whosever shall fail to comply with the rules, regulations and decisions of this Association shall be subject to discipline and exclusion.

**SECTION II:** (Power) This Association shall have no authority and/or power in the internal affairs of any church in this association, nor shall they have any power over the property of any church.

#### ARTICLE VI – GENERAL OFFICERS

**SECTION I:** (Officers) The officers of this Association shall be a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Assistant Clerk, and Treasurer, who shall be elected annually, and who shall be a member of a member church.

**SECTION II:** (Duties of Moderator) The Moderator shall preside over all sessions and shall serve as chairman of the General Board and Executive Committee, and shall be an ex officio member of all boards and committees. The Moderator shall represent the Association on the Alabama State Association General Board.

**SECTION III:** (Duties of the Assistant Moderator) The Assistant Moderator shall assist the Moderator and act as Moderator in the Moderator's absence.

**SECTION IV:** (Duties of the Clerk) The Clerk shall record and preserve the proceedings of the body when in session and shall record and preserve the proceedings of the General Board. He shall compile and have published the minutes of the Association. All records shall be delivered to his successor in office.

**SECTION V:** (Duties of the Treasurer) The Treasurer shall receive all funds and shall be responsible to give a correct account of all funds received and distributed by him.

#### ARTICLE VII - BOARDS

**SECTION I:** (Standing Boards) Standing boards of the Association shall include the General Board, Executive Committee, Mission Board, Board of Ministers' Retirement, Ordaining Council, and Youth & Education Board.

**SECTION II:** (Personnel) Standing boards, exclusive of the General Board and Executive Committee, shall be elected as follows: the first named for a term of one year, the second for a term of two years, and the third for a term of three years, and so forth. Succession to the office thereafter shall be as order requires.

**SECTION III:** (General Board) The General Board shall have power to act in behalf of, and for, the Association, from one regular session to another, to carry out the plans and undertakings of the Association, to fill any irregular vacancies that may occur in any department between sessions of the Association, to plan a program of work for the Association, and to handle all matters coming within the scope of the work of the Association. It shall be the duty of this board to make written reports of all its work to each of the Associational sessions for final approval.

**SECTION V:** (Executive Committee) The Executive Committee shall be composed of the Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, and five (5) members of the General Board. The General Board will elect these five members. It shall be the duty of the Executive Committee to transact emergency business when the Association is not in session. The Executive Committee shall give a written report of business transacted at each session of the Association.

**SECTION VI:** (Duties of Boards) It shall be the duty of the various standing boards to plan a program and supervise its operation in their respective fields. They shall organize themselves and regulate their work as may become necessary, and create such by-laws as may be deemed essential for their government, consistent with the Constitution. It shall be the duty of each board to make a written report at each session of the Association for final approval.

#### ARTICLE VIII - FINANCE

**SECTION I:** (Policy) The financial policy of the Association shall be the giving of tithes and offerings. It is suggested that each church pay 10 per cent of its income to the Association.

**SECTION II:** (Offerings) A free will offering shall be received at each session. **SECTION III:** (Disbursements) All disbursements shall be make by check and all checks shall be signed by the Moderator and the Treasurer.

**SECTION IV:** (Budget) Each standing board shall prepare a budget of its proposed financial expenditures at the beginning of each Associational year and present the same for approval of the Association before any expenditures are made for the year.

**SECTION V:** (Unified Treasury) Funds of all departments shall be handled by the Treasurer of the Association. Designated and Co-operative funds cannot be transferred from one account to another.

#### ARTICLE IX - MEETINGS

The Association shall convene quarterly. The first and second quarterly sessions shall convene on Saturday before the second Sunday in January and April. The third quarterly session shall convene on the last Saturday in June. The fourth meeting shall be the Annual Session and shall convene for one day, which shall be on Saturday before the second Sunday in October

#### ARTICLE X - ALTERATION

This constitution may be amended or altered at any regular session by a twothirds vote of members present, provided the proposed amendment or alteration has been presented in writing at the previous session.

# BY-LAWS of the FLORIDA STATE LINE ASSOCIATION Adopted April 7, 1962

- Each meeting shall be opened by reading a portion of the Bible and with prayer, and shall be closed with prayer.
- Questions of fellowship, expulsion, and all other items of business of the Association shall be settled according to the TREATISE OF FAITH AND PRACTICES OF THE NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS.
- All business of the Association shall be brought before the body by move and second and shall be disposed of according to Robert's Rules of Order.
- 4. The associational year shall begin September 1 and end August 31.
- Churches and their pastors shall serve as committees and shall be named by the chair at least three months before the Annual Session.
- Each church shall send a letter to each session certifying the election of their delegates and containing general, financial, and statistical information about their church and any other information that the Association may request.

- No church shall be recognized in this body who does not commune and was feet at least once a year.
- By a two-thirds vote of all members present a ruling of the Moderator can be overruled.
- It shall be the duty of the Moderator to seat all delegates in a designated section of the assembly room at the beginning of each business session.
- 10. No member shall absent himself while the Association is in session without first obtaining permission from the Moderator.
- 11. No person shall be allowed to speak more than ten minutes, nor twice, on the same subject without special permission from the Moderator.
- No person shall be allowed to nominate more than one member provided the person nominated is elected.
- Ministers pastoring in the Florida State Line Association of Free Will Baptists must be in good standing with a local association of Free Will Baptists which is affiliated with a State Association of Free Will Baptists which is affiliated with the National Association of Free Will Baptists. A minister pasturing in the Florida State Line Association, and his wife, if married, must not have two living wives or husbands. Any church in the Florida State Line Association that calls a pastor not meeting the above qualification will automatically be out of fellowship with the Florida State Line Association. (Anyone who has been divorced and remarried is considered as having two living wives or husbands.)
- 14. These by-laws may be amended or altered at any regular session by a two-third vote of members present, provided the proposed amendment or alteration is presented in writing.

# BY-LAWS of the PRESBYTERY

#### **MINISTERS**

- I. Admission and Standing
  - A. Candidates for licensing and ordination
    - 1. An individual shall first unite with a church t hat is a member of the Association
    - This church shall petition the Association through the Ordaining Council of the Association for licensing and ordination of its candidate.
  - B. Ordained and Licensed Ministers coming from another Association
    - He must unite with a church in the Florida State Line Association.

- His church must petition for him membership in the Association through the Ordaining Council of the Association. This must be done by the next Associational meeting after calling the pastor.
- Any church who calls a pastor who does not wish to unite with the Association must be examined by the Ordaining Council. This must be done by the next Associational meeting after calling the pastor.

#### C. Ministers coming from other denominations

- He must first unite with a church in the Florida State Line Association
- This church must petition for his membership in the Association through the Ordaining Council of the Association.

#### II. Qualifications

#### A. Licensed

- The individual must satisfactorily answer questions prepared by the Ordaining Council.
- Candidates that are married must not have more than one living wife or the candidates' wife must not have more than one living husband.
- 3. He must be of solid character.
- He must abstain from the use of any alcoholic beverages and/or the use of tobacco.

#### B. Ordination

- The individual must satisfactorily answer questions prepared by the Ordaining Council.
- Candidates that are married must not have more than one living wife or the candidate's wife must not have more than one living husband.
- 3. He must be of sound character.
- He must abstain from the use of any alcoholic beverages and/or the use of tobacco.
- 5. He must hold license for not less than one year before applying for ordination.
- He must be called to a Christian work or be presently enrolled at Free Will Baptist Bible College and completed at least one year before applying for ordination.

#### C. Ministers Making Application from other Associations

- Must present license or ordination certificate to the Ordaining Council for ratification by the Council
- He must present a letter of recommendation from the Association from which he comes, or from his licensing body, which is affiliated with a State Association of Free Will Baptists, which is affiliated with the National Association of Free Will Baptists, provided he was licensed or ordained by this licensing body.

### D. Ministers Making Application from other Denominations

a. Licensed

- Must surrender license from denomination of which he was previously a member.
- 2. Must hold FWB license for one year before ordination.
- He must answer questions prepared by the Ordaining Council.

#### b. Ordained

- 1. Must have ordination papers ratified by Ordaining Council.
- Must answer questions prepared by the Ordaining Council for ordination.
- He will not be re-ordained, but upon approval of the Ordaining Council, he will be granted a FWB Ordination Certificate.

#### DEACONS

A local church is allowed to examine and ordain its own deacons if it so chooses, or send them to the Association if they so desire.

- I. Deacons Sent to Association for Ordination
  - He must be a member of a church in the Florida State Line Association.
  - 2. He must have been elected by his church to the office of deacon.
  - 3. The church shall petition the Association through the Ordaining Council of the Association for ordination of its candidate.

#### II. Qualifications

- He must be of sound character.
- He must be the husband of one wife and the candidate's wife must be the wife of one husband.
- 3. He must believe and practice FWB doctrine.

# GUIDELINES for the FLORIDA STATE LINE ASSOCIATION

## MINISTER'S RETIREMENT

- I. NAME: Florida State Line Association Minister's Retirement
- II. WHO QUALIFIES FOR BENEFITS?
  - A. Any minister who has attained sixty-five (65)years of age and has pastured or is pasturing a church in the Florida State Line Association for a minimum of five (5) years.

- B. The minister's time will begin on the date he starts pasturing a church in the Florida State Line Association which supports the Association with regular offerings.
- C. The church has contributed to the Board of Minister's Retirement regularly, either through the Associations Co-operative Plan or directly to the Board of Retirement for at least five (5) years.
- The minister does not have to cease pasturing in order to be eligible for benefits.
- E. The minister who is drawing retirement, at his death, his widow would be eligible to draw his retirement, providing she is at least sixty-five (65) years of age, or disabled.
- F. Any minister who has not reached the age of retirement and becomes physically disabled to perform his pastoral duties may apply for retirement benefits if he has fulfilled all other requirements.

#### III. THE MINISTER'S MEMBERSHIP:

- A. The minister who has reached the age of retirement <u>must maintain</u> <u>membership</u> in a local <u>Free Will Baptist church</u> which is affiliated with the local, state and National associations of Free Will Baptists.
- B. <u>If</u> the minister's membership is in a Free Will Baptist church outside the Florida State Line Association, <u>that church of the FWB Association</u> in which he is affiliated, <u>must submit</u> a **letter of good standing** to the Florida State Line Association **each year** stating that fact.

#### IV. RETIREMENT BENEFITS:

- A. The retiring or disabled minister must have his church submit an application to the Florida State Line Association for approval before he receives any benefits.
- B. Benefits shall be paid according to the following scale:

5-10 years pastoring \$50.00 per month 10-15 years pastoring \$75.00 per month 15-20 years pastoring \$100.00 per month Over 20 years pasturing \$125.00 per month

- C. If funds are not available all retirees benefits shall be prorated.
- D. Birthdays and Christmas bonuses will be determined by the Board of Retirement as funds are available.
- E. Pastoring outside the Florida State Line Association will not be used in calculating benefits.
- F. Pastoring a church in the Florida State Line Association after April 13, 1996, that does not support the Minister's Retirement plan will not be used in calculating benefits.
- G. The retired ministers shall be governed by the Florida State Line Association Presbytery's rules.
- H. The retirees are urged to attend all Associational meetings.
- These guidelines will not affect those who are already receiving retirement benefits.


