CONSTITUTION of the TENNESSEE FREE WILL BAPTIST WOMAN'S AUXILIARY CONVENTION

PREAMBLE

Believing that a bond of union and fellowship among Free Will Baptist Women of Tennessee will achieve greater success in all their efforts which are put forth in the various districts throughout the state, through a state organization, this further combining our auxiliary work with a view to unity of purpose in promoting more effectively the cause of Christ along all lines of Christian Women's endeavors, we do organize and adopt the following constitution for our better government.

Article I — Name

This organization shall be known as the Tennessee Woman's Auxiliary Convention of Free Will Baptists.

Article II — Purpose

The purpose of this convention shall be to bring the women of each district convention together for fellowship, sharing information, transacting business pertaining to the promotion of mission work in general, and encouraging one another in the work of the Lord.

Article III — Membership

Section 1. This convention shall be composed of the officers of the convention together with district officers, ten district delegates (duly accredited by the credentials committee), and local presidents. Two additional delegates from each local auxiliary may be qualified to vote by paying a registration fee of \$1.00 each.

Section 2. Local Woman's Auxiliaries representing directly to this body shall send one dollar twenty-five cents (\$1.25) per member for membership and convention representation fee.

Article IV — Officers

Section 1. The officers of this convention shall be a president, vice president, secretary, treasurer, and field worker. These shall serve on the state executive committee together with three members elected by the convention as desired. Five of these shall compose a quorum.

Section 2. All officers and duly accredited delegates shall be members in good standing of a Free Will Baptist church and active members of a local woman's auxiliary.

Article V — Meetings

The annual meeting shall be held each year at such time and place as may be determined at the previous annual meeting or by the executive committee.

Article VI — Amendments

This constitution may be amended at any annual meeting of the convention by a two-thirds vote of members present.

BY-LAWS

Article I — Duties of Officers

Section 1. President—The president shall preside over all meetings, appoint such committees as may be needed, call the executive committee together when necessary, be ex-officio member of all committees, and serve as chairman of the executive committee, see that reports are made promptly to the national secretary and perform all duties usually pertaining to such an office.

Section 2. Vice President—The vice president shall preside in the absence of the president or by her request and otherwise assist her in the oversight of the work in general.

Section 3. Secretary—The secretary shall keep an accurate record of all proceedings of the convention and executive committee meetings, preserve all valuable papers and turn same over to her successor in office, and make an annual report to the national secretary on a form available from the WNAC office. She shall compile the districts' slates of officers and addresses immediately after the convention. She shall also send a slate of state officers and addresses to the national executive secretary.

The secretary shall also serve as historian keeping a historical record and submitting historical information to the national executive secretary annually.

Section 4. Treasurer—The treasurer shall have charge of all funds belonging to this convention and shall pay out same only when authorized by the convention. The treasurer shall keep an accurate account and shall give a written report of all funds received and disbursed at each annual meeting of the convention. She shall also send an annual report to the WNAC executive secretary-treasurer at least ten days before the end of the fiscal year. She shall encourage support of missions through the WNAC Gift Plan, individual giving and special offerings. The convention year shall terminate and all books of the treasurer be closed October 30.

Section 5. Field Worker—The field worker shall have charge of all field work pertaining to, or necessary to, the promotion of the work of the convention and keep the national program before the district officers.

Article II — Elections

The general officers shall serve a term of two years, shall be nominated by a nominating committee and shall be elected by acclamation, unless there are other nominations. In case of more than one nominee for any particular office, a vote will be taken on each. All elections shall be held at the closing business session of the convention.

Article III — Expenses

An appropriation toward the expenses, postage and stationery for officers may be decided upon by the convention. All field promotional work is subject to the state executive committee, who should approve all work done by state officers in the interest of state work, as well as expense of the same.

Article IV — Committees

Section 1. Executive Committee—The executive committee shall be composed of the five officers and three members elected by the convention. Five of these shall compose a quorum. They shall hold meetings for the transaction of business as often as necessary. It shall be the duty of the executive committee to maintain an oversight of the work at large. They shall act for the convention when necessary. They shall prepare the program for the regular meeting of the convention.

Section 2. Resolutions Committee—A resolutions committee of five members shall be appointed by the president as needed.

Section 3. Nominating Committee—The nominating committee shall be composed of at least one member from each district convention, to be nominated from the floor and elected by the body at its annual meeting.

Section 4. Credentials Committee—The secretary shall be chairman of the credentials committee, and other members may be appointed by the president.

Section 5. Finance Committee—The finance committee shall be appointed by the president. This committee audits the financial records of the year and reports on same to the convention.

Section 6. Registration Committee—Members as needed may be appointed by the president to serve on this committee. This committee registers those in attendance as the convention may desire.

Article V — Fees and Reports

Section 1. One dollar (\$1.00) per active member shall be paid yearly to the Woman's Auxiliary Convention for membership and convention representation fee, plus an additional \$1.00 fee for each local auxiliary comprising the District Convention.

Section 2. Local auxiliaries, in sections of the state where there is no district convention, may send \$1.25 per member directly from the local to the state convention.

Section 3. It shall be the duty of each body directly affiliated with the Tennessee Woman's Auxiliary Convention to send a report to the state secretary by October 30.

Article VI — Gifts

The desired plans for giving in the Woman's Auxiliary are mission offerings following each special season of prayer, Co-Laborer offerings, and gifts to WNAC general fund and Memorial Student Loan Fund and other gifts designated by the Convention.

Article VII — Amendments

These by-laws may be amended by a two-thirds vote of members present at any regular meeting of the State Auxiliary Convention.

Tuesday Morning, November 16, 1971

The twenty-sixth session of the Tennessee Woman's Auxiliary Convention convened in the First Free Will Baptist Church in Jackson, Tennessee, at 9:30 A.M. The meeting was opened with singing the theme song "All for Jesus" followed by "Tell Me the Story of Jesus." Mrs. Jane Greenway, president of TWAC, called the meeting to order. After the president read the chosen scripture, James 1:22, Mrs. Clara Picirilli led in prayer.

Mrs. Greenway introduced the state officers. This was followed by a most cordial welcome from Mrs. Norlin Jones, the wife of the host pastor. She used Joshua 1:9 as a challenge. The response was given by Mrs. Myrtle Reeds.

The president called attention to the copies of the proposed constitution and by-laws which regulate the new plan of Auxiliary work.

"I Am Not Worthy" was sung by Mrs. Kathy Dye. Immediately following, Dr. Robert Picirilli brought the morning message using the selected theme: "*Me . . . In Mission Action?*" He based his message on the paradox given in John 8:12 and Matthew 5:14. Several Biblical examples were used to prove that Jesus is not only the Light of the world, but that He makes lights of other men. Those in attendance were challenged to let their lives shine and to go even further by passing the light on to light the wicks of other men's souls. At the close of the message the congregation sang "The Light of the World is Jesus."

A lovely memorial service was given by Miss Mary Ruth Wisehart in honor and memory of lives of dedication and service. Rev. George Lee led in a prayer of thanksgiving and rejoicing for the lives of those who have served

and are now gone before us. An offering was received for the expense of the TWAC. Mrs. Frank Rudy prayed the benediction and blessing upon the noon meal.

Tuesday Afternoon, November 16, 1971

The afternoon session was opened by singing "Whosoever Will." Using the topic "Weighed Actions" and 1 Samuel 2:3a, Mrs. Ralph Staten challenged all present to translate their knowledge into action. If one is achieving his goals, then there is no fear of being weighed and found wanting. Mrs. J. B. Smith led in prayer.

Mrs. Ray Turnage reported that there are presently 36 children, of which 21 are teenagers, at the Home for Children in Greeneville. The following prayer requests were given: professional help for emotionally disturbed children; another couple for house parents; prayer for house parents.

A report of WNAC which was held in Nashville, Tennessee, in July 1971, was given by the national field worker, Mrs. Brenda Spruill.

The business session was called to order by the president, Mrs. Greenway. A motion was made to accept the report of the Credentials Committee. The delegates named were seated. (See Committee reports).

The reports of the secretary and treasurer were read and adopted. (See Officers' reports).

Committee reports were presented and were adopted. (See Committee reports). A motion was carried that the Honor Awards Committee be discontinued.

Motion carried for 700 copies of minutes to be printed and distributed to district and state officers.

Motion carried that the secretary and treasurer be paid \$35 each for clerical work involved in each office.

Motion carried to give Dr. Picirilli a love offering of \$15.

Motion carried that each local auxiliary send at least \$1 per member to be used to pay the expense of the field worker.

The president introduced the new constitution and by-laws. Motion carried that these be accepted.

The Nomination Committee composed of Mrs. Myrtle Parrish, Mrs. Dennis Christian, and Mrs. J. B. Smith was reelected by the body.

The following delegates were chosen for the 1972 WNAC: Joann Lamb, Rosa Dickey, Mrs. Dennis Christian, Mrs. J. B. Wolfenbarger, Mrs. Ralph Staten, Brenda Patrick, Myrtle Reeds, Mrs. Paul Woolsey, and Mrs. George Lee.

Using a space-age theme, Mrs. Cleo Pursell conducted the installation of officers. Mr. Don Sexton led in the dedication prayer.

Women of the Cumberland District, under the direction of Mrs. Frank Rudy, presented a pageant entitled "Me . . . In Mission Action?"

The meeting adjourned by singing "Have Thine Own Way, Lord" and prayer.
