Proceedings of the 50th Annual Session of the Tennessee Women Active for Christ Convention

The 50th Annual Meeting of the Tennessee Women Active for Christ Convention convened November 14, 1995, at Keystone Free Will Baptist Church, Johnson City, Tennessee. The convention theme was "Lighting Up Darkness," with Matthew 5:14-16 as the scripture text. Forty-three were in attendance.

President Dawn Sweeney opened the session with a welcome and an expression of appreciation to the host woman's auxiliary. Marie Thomason led the congregation from the piano in singing "Send The Light." Eleanor Grindstaff led in prayer.

Laura Thigpen introduced Fay Forlines who, along with her husband Leroy, will spend six months in Russia teaching English, theology and ethics. Fay spoke briefly about their itinerary while in Russia and asked for prayer and financial support. Laura Thigpen led in prayer on their behalf. Marie Thomason then sang "My Life Has No Meaning Without Jesus."

The president called the convention to order. The first item of business was the reading of the credentials committees report by Anne Worthington. Motion, second and carried (MSC) to accept the report and seat the delegates. (See reports.) Anne also read the secretary's report. It was received as information. (See reports.)

Gladys Gragg, Tennessee Women Active for Christ (TWAC) treasurer, gave the treasurers report. (See reports.)

Mary Ruth Wischart, Executive Secretary/Treasurer of Women Nationally Active for Christ (WNAC) gave the WNAC report. (See reports.)

The meeting recessed at 10:05 for committee meetings. At 10:35 the meeting reconvened and the following gave the following committee reports: appreciation, Diane Harrison; registration, Myrtle Reeds; finance, Gladys Gragg; resolutions, Arlene Farley. The reports were received and voted on. (See committee reports.)

In final business Gladys Haney gave the nominating committee report and officers for 1995-97 were elected. (See nominating committee report.)

Patti Hollifield conducted an installation service on letting our lights shine in the home, neighborhood, work place, church, and to the utter most parts of the world. Tammy Allen dismissed the business session at 11:05 with prayer.

At 11:15 the worship hour began with the congregation singing "Rescue The Perishing" and "Jesus Saves", led by Raymond Riggs. The offering, totaling \$281.00, was received. The offering plus a \$100 honorarium was given to Jim and Karen Cowart. (See Finance Committee Report.) Winona Riggs played "Oh What a Saviour" as an offertory.

Mary Wisheart led in prayer for Joan Gardner, after which Winona Riggs sang "Here I Am."

President Dawn Sweeney read the theme scripture and introduced speaker Jim Cowart, missionary to Brazil.

Jim spoke using the theme "The Shining of God's Servants."

The service closed at 12:30 with the congregation singing "Have Thine Own Way."

TWAC Annual Banquet

Eighty-six men and women met at the Keystone Free Will Baptist Church fellowship hall to hear Karen Cowart, missionary to Brazil speak on "Lighting Up Darkness." Wayne Ford (Keystone Free Will Baptist Church) offered special music, singing "Some Call It Heaven, I Call It Home."

WNAC Report

November 14, 1995

Greetings to the women of Tennessee

The theme, "Great and Mighty Things Through Prayer," permeated each part of the 1995 WNAC Convention. 1,204 registered for WNAC.

New officers were elected as follows: President, Everyl Getz (TX); Vice President, Marjorie Workman (TN); Secretary, Jo Ann Wood (TX); Members at Large: Annette Aycock (SC), Diana Bryant (FL) and Barbara Chaffin (OH).

Local Groups and Membership. This year, WNAC showed 724 active local groups with a total membership of 7,423. Eleven Actionette groups were also reported with 93 members. Tennessee reported 45 local groups with 590 members.

State treasurers and secretaries can help us get more accurate reports. Make sure all the local groups in your state submit annual reports and pay dues. State reports must reach the national office July 1 to get into the annual report.

Finances. We praise God for the financial support WNAC received this year. We have paid back the money borrowed for furniture from the Memorial Student Loan. Support to WNAC as well as designated giving is up this year.

In the past five years, WNAC gave a total of \$2,498,806.39. This total included non-cash gifts to the provision closet.

Last year, the women gave a total of \$575,320.36 including non-cash gifts to the provision closet. The women of Tennessee gave as follows:

Tennessee was first in giving to the Co-Laborer Offering, third in giving to the Emphasis Offering and first in total contributions.

Three hundred women attended our ninth National Retreat at Glorieta Conference Center in Glorieta, New Mexico, October 20-22. The weather was great, the scenery was beautiful, the food was delicious, the speakers were outstanding. But most importantly, God's presence was evident in every service. Our women came back refreshed and revived and ready to go again.

Future Events. Our next retreat will be held at Ridgecrest, North Carolina, September 12-14, 1996. Begin now making plans to attend.

Next year's convention will be held in Fort Worth, Texas, July 22-23. Our 1996 theme is "*Hold the Light High*," Acts 13:47, emphasizing personal witnessing.

Who We Are. Seeking to create a family-type atmosphere in which each child can experience and learn to trust the true unconditional love of God, we have four divisions, each of which minister to children in their own unique way:

1. **Trula Cronk Home for Children** - Six long-term residential homes.
2. **P.A.T.H. Shelters** - One house that is always open to receive children out of emergency situations.
3. **The Stanley Foster Care Program** - Placement of children into Christian homes off campus.
4. **The Oaks Family Conference Center and Camp** - Serving children and families through youth camps, seminars, family retreats, and much more.

Souls Being Saved. In 1993 we saw 14 of our young people saved and more than 38 last year. Already in 1995 67 kids have accepted Christ as their savior.

You Need to Know. FWBFM now has several field representatives available to visit any organization to provide inspiring updates about this work. Please contact our Development Office for more information (423/639-9449).

Our Kid's Great Accomplishments. One girl was named "Student of the Month" in September and another in October. Six females recently made the B Honor Roll, and two males made the A Honor Roll. One of our teenage girls was elected Homecoming Queen at her high school.

Space won't allow to include all the kids that have won awards for citizenship, penmanship, math, science, sports, music and much more.

Significant Statistics. Last year the P.A.T.H. Shelter served 222 children from 38 different counties across the state. During 1994, we had to turn away 806 children due to lack of space.

Because of You. Over the last year (from 11/1/94 to 10/31/95) FWBFM has received \$124,199.92 from the churches of the Tennessee State Association.

TWAC Nominating Committee Guidelines

General Provisions for the Committee

Members of the nominating committee are elected by the state convention to serve one year. (The nominating committee shall be composed of members who are delegates nominated from the floor and elected by the body at its annual meeting.)

The president of the Convention will serve as an ex-officio member of the nominating committee. The committee must meet and send a proposed slate of officers to the TWAC president by September 30.

General Considerations for Presenting Names to the Committee

In addition to the qualifications and duties listed in the Constitution for TWAC officers, the nominating committee members should consider the following:

Consider as many different areas of the state as possible in electing officers. Of course it is impossible for every local auxiliary to be represented by a state officer, but sections of the state should be considered. Consider the person's qualifications and participation in Woman's Auxiliary.

As a name is presented to the committee for nomination, a list of qualifications and participation in local, district, and state auxiliary work should be presented.

Particular Considerations for Selecting Officers

The nominating committee should consider the following when approving nominees for the slate of officers.

Any person nominated for a state office should be:

1. Active in local and district auxiliary work.
2. Willing and able to attend district and state conventions, executive committee meetings, and workshops and retreats.
3. Able to communicate effectively.
4. Prepared to plan, evaluate and interpret the TWAC program to others.
5. Poised, able to accept criticism, utilize it and keep on working.
6. Flexible, willing to change, grow and improve.
7. Tolerant, respecting the opinions of others and being aware of the diversity among us.

Constitution

Tennessee Women Active for Christ

Preamble

Believing that a bond of union and fellowship among Free Will Baptist Women of Tennessee will achieve greater success in all their efforts which are put forth in the various districts throughout the state, through a state organization, thus further combining our auxiliary work with a view to unity of purpose in promoting more effectively the cause of Christ along all lines of Christian Women's endeavors, we do organize and adopt the following constitution for our better government.

Article I - Name

This organization shall be known as Tennessee Women Active for Christ.

Article II - Purpose

The purpose of this convention shall be to bring the women of each district convention together for fellowship, sharing information, transacting business pertaining to the promotion of mission work in general, and encouraging one another in the work of the Lord.

Article III - Membership

Section 1: This convention shall be composed of the officers of the convention together with district officers, ten district delegates (duly accredited by the credentials committee), local auxiliaries representing without a district, and local presidents. Two additional delegates from each local auxiliary may be qualified to vote by paying a registration fee of \$1.00 each. Local auxiliaries without districts may have two delegates plus the president.

Section 2: Local Woman's Auxiliaries representing directly to this body shall send ten dollars and fifty cents (\$10.50) per member for membership and convention representation fee.

Article IV - Officers

Section 1: The officers of this convention shall be a president, vice president, secretary, treasurer, and three (3) field workers (one each from East, Middle and West Tennessee). These shall serve on the state executive committee together with three members elected by the convention as desired. Five of these shall compose a quorum.

Section 2: All officers and duly accredited delegates shall be members in good standing of a Free Will Baptist church and active members of a local woman's auxiliary.

Article V - Meetings

The annual meeting shall be held each year at such time and place as may be determined at the previous annual meeting or by the executive committee.

Article VI - Amendments

This constitution may be amended at any annual meeting of the convention by a two-thirds vote of members present.

By-Laws

Article I - Duties of Officers

Section 1: President - The president shall preside over all meetings, appoint such committees as may be needed, call the executive committee together when necessary, be ex-officio member of all committees, serve as chairman of the executive committee, see that reports are made promptly to the national secretary and perform all duties usually pertaining to such an office.

Section 2: Vice President - The vice-president shall preside in the absence of the president or by her request and otherwise assist her in the oversight of the work in general.

Section 3: Secretary - The secretary shall keep an accurate record of all proceedings of the convention and executive committee meetings, preserve all valuable papers and turn same over to her successor in office, and make an annual report to the national secretary on a form available from the WNAC office. She shall compile the districts' slates of officers and addresses immediately after the convention. She shall also send a slate of state officers and addresses to the national executive secretary. She shall also serve as historian keeping an historical record and submitting historical information to the national executive secretary annually.

Section 4: Treasurer - The treasurer shall have charge of all funds belonging to this convention and shall pay out same only when authorized by the convention. The treasurer shall keep an accurate account and shall give a written report of all funds received and disbursed at each annual meeting of the convention. She shall also send an annual report to the WNAC executive secretary-treasurer at least ten days before the end of

the fiscal year. She shall encourage support of missions through the WNAC Gifts Plan, individual giving and special offerings. The convention year shall terminate and all books of the treasurer be closed October 30.

Section 5: Field Worker - The field worker shall have charge of all field work pertaining to, or necessary to, the promotion of the work of the convention and keep the national program before the district officers.

Article II - Elections

The general officers shall serve a term of two years, shall be nominated by a nominating committee and shall be elected by acclamation, unless there are other nominations. In case of more than one nominee for any particular office, a vote will be taken on each. All elections shall be held at the closing business session of the convention.

Article III - Expenses

An appropriation toward the expenses, postage and stationery for officers may be decided upon by the convention. All field promotional work is subject to the state executive committee, who should approve all work done by state officers in the interest of state work, as well as expense of the same.

Article IV - Committees

Section 1: Executive Committee - The executive committee shall be composed of the five officers and three members elected by the convention. Five of these shall compose a quorum. They shall hold meetings for the transaction of business as often as necessary. It shall be the duty of the executive committee to maintain an oversight of the work at large. They shall act for the convention when necessary. They shall prepare the program for the regular meeting of the convention.

Section 2: Resolutions Committee - A resolutions committee of five members shall be appointed by the president as needed.

Section 3: Nominating Committee - The nominating committee shall be composed of at least one member from each district convention, to be nominated from the floor and elected by the body at its annual meeting.

Section 4: Credentials Committee - The secretary shall be chairman of the credentials committee, and other members may be appointed by the president.

Section 5: Finance Committee - The finance committee shall be appointed by the president. This committee audits the financial records of the year and reports on same to the convention.

Section 6: Registration Committee - Members as needed may be appointed by the president to serve on this committee. This committee registers those in attendance as the convention may desire.

Article V - Fees and Reports

Section 1: Ten dollars and twenty-five cents (\$10.25) per active member shall be paid yearly to the Tennessee Women Active for Christ for membership and convention representation. An additional one dollar (\$1.00) from each local auxiliary shall be paid for TWAC minutes.

Section 2: Local auxiliaries, in sections of the state where there is no district convention, shall send ten dollars and twenty-five cents (\$10.25) to the Tennessee Women Active for Christ for membership and convention representation.

Section 3: It shall be the duty of each body directly affiliated with the Tennessee Women Active for Christ to send a report to the state secretary by October 30.

Article VI - Gifts

The desired plans for giving in the Woman's Auxiliary are mission offerings following each special season of prayer, Co-Laborer offerings, gifts to WNAC general fund, the Memorial Student Loan Fund and other gifts designated by the Convention.

Article VII - Amendments

These by-laws may be amended by a two-thirds vote of members present at any regular meeting of the State Auxiliary Convention.
