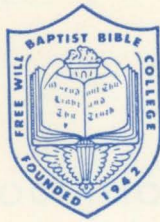

PROCEEDINGS
Thursday Evening, June 5, 1975

The Sixty-first Annual Session of the Texas State Association of Free Will Baptists convened with the Central Texas District Association at the Fellowship Free Will Baptist Church in Bryan with the moderator, Pastor Allan Moore, presiding.

The moderator called the state meeting into session.

Rev. Rufus Coffey led in prayer. Mr. Buddy Sledge, Mayor Pro-Tem of the city of Bryan, delivered an official welcome to the city. Mr. Ed Morris, deacon in the host church, led in singing "Standing On the Promises". "The Living Circle", a musical ensemble of the host church, sang "To God Be The Glory".

An offering of \$130.25 was received for the state office.

Pastors Eugene Richards and Glenn Hood of the Christian Education Board conducted the presentation of the State CTS competitive activities awards. (See Christian Education Board Report)

Mr. Jim Williams presented golf tournament prizes.

Pastor Moore delivered a short moderator's message from Matthew 9:29. Then he and the assistant moderator, Rev. Owen Barger, appointed the following committees:

Mr. Ed Morris led in singing "There is Power in the Blood".

The moderator introduced Rev. Lonnie Davoult, Executive Secretary of the Oklahoma State Association, who brought greetings and invited Texans to the Oklahoma State Meeting this year.

Special music was offered by Mr. Bob Morris. He sang "Say I Do".

Dr. Malcolm Fry, Director of the National Church Training Service Department, was introduced. He delivered the evening message "Commit Thou to Faithful Men" from II Timothy 2:2. It was a great message followed by an alter service to which many responded.

The clerk read the constitutional amendments proposed by the General Board. The motion carried to lay the proposed constitutional amendments on the table until Friday's session.

The moderator introduced Rev. Paul Kettelman of Free Will Baptist Bible College who brought greetings from the school and asked for prayer and support.

Recess

Friday Morning, June 6, 1975

The Moderator called the meeting to order.

Mr. Ed Morris led in singing "Joy Unspeakable".

Mr. Bob Field, Master's Men President of the host church, delivered the morning devotional, "Be of Good Cheer", from Matthew 9:1-2.

Ministers, deacons, delegates and visitors attending the state meeting for the first time were recognized and welcomed by the moderator.

The motion carried to dispense with the reading of the names of registered delegates.

The Assistant Clerk, Pastor Thoman Marberry, gave the credentials report. The motion carried to accept the report. (See Reports)

The moderator recognized and introduced the officers of the state association.

Rev. Bill Jones, President of Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College brought greetings from the school and asked for prayer and support.

The Executive Secretary, Mr. Jim Williams, gave the Executive Office report. The motion carried to accept the report. (See Reports)

Rev. Rufus Coffey, Executive Secretary of the National Association of Free Will Baptists was introduced. He brought greetings from the National Office.

Pastor H. Ray Berry gave the Missions - Church Extension Board report. The report was accepted. (See Reports)

Mr. Dave Wilkes gave the report of the Board of Retirement and Insurance. The report was accepted. (See Reports)

Pastor Allan Moore, member of the National Foreign Missions Board, reported on behalf of that department and encouraged Texas churches to use the Faith Promise Giving plan for Missions support.

Pastor Roy Norie, Jr. reported on the state Missions - Church Extension Board's involvement in Foreign Missions support.

Pastor Glenn Hood gave the Christian Education Board report. The report was accepted. (See Reports)

The report of the Trustee to Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College from Texas was given by Pastor Clyde Gillentine. The report was accepted. (See Reports)

The Report of the General Board was read by the clerk. The report was accepted. (See Reports)

The meeting recessed for the worship hour. Mr. Ed Morris led in singing "I Will Hasten To Him and "My Saviour's Love". Mr. John Molino led in prayer. Pastor and Mrs. Harold Teague sang "Walk With Me". The speaker of the hour, Dr. Roger Reeds was introduced. He spoke from II Timothy 2:2 on "The Process and The Product". It was a challengeing sermon.

Pastor Raymond Getz read the report of the Committee on Committees. They appointed the Resolutions Committee, the Temperance Committee and the Obituary Committee. (See Committee reports)

The motion carried to accept the report of the Committee on Committees and dismiss them.

The meeting recessed for lunch.

Friday Afternoon

The afternoon session opened with the congregation singing "To God Be The Glory". Pastor Lonnie Hall led in prayer. The moderator read II Timothy 2:1-4.

Pastor Thurmon Murphy read the report of the Nominating Committee which was accepted to be acted upon item by item. This years officers were elected. (See OFFICERS)

The Obituary Committee report was read by Mrs. Vivian Moore and accepted. The delegation stood in memory of those whom God has called from our midst. Rev. Bill Jones led in prayer.

Pastor Charles Reeves read the Temperance report. The report was accepted and the committee dismissed.

The motion carried to remove from the table the amendments to constitution proposed by the General Board and consider them item by item. (See General Board Report) Proposed amendments to the constitution #1 through #4 were read by the clerk and accepted by the body.

Motions carried to postpone temporarily consideration of proposed constitutional amendments #5 and #6.

Pastor Thomas Marberry, on behalf of the Executive Committee, recommended election of Mr. Jim Williams as Executive Secretary for another two-year term. The recommendation carried. (See OFFICERS)

Pastor Clyde Gillentine was elected as Trustee to Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College from the State of Texas for a three year term. (See OFFICERS)

The moderator called for consideration of the Missions - Church Extension Board recommendations. (See Missions - Church Extension Board Report)

Missions - Church Extension Board recommendation #1 was read by the clerk. The motion was made to adopt this recommendation. The motion carried to amend Article IV, Section H of the comprehensive plan of state missions by changing the last clause thereof to read, "title will revert to the Texas State Association of Free Will Baptists." The motion carried to amend Article IV, Section B of same plan to read "The state will only have one work in full-time mission status at any given time unless funds are available to begin other works". The main motion to adopt recommendation #1 carried.

The motion carried to adopt Missions - Church Extension Board recommendation #2. (See Missions - Church Extension Board Report)

The motions carried to adopt proposed constitutional amendments #5 and #6. (See General Board Report)

The motion carried to adopt Missions - Church Extension Board recommendation #4. (See Missions - Church Extension Board Report)

The names of the Nominees for the Missions - Church Extension Board were read by Pastor Thurmon Murphy. The motion carried to close nominations and proceed to elect these nominees by acclamation. (See STANDING BOARDS)

Pastor Clyde Gillentine read the Resolutions Committee report. Their resolutions were adopted and the committee was dismissed. (See Committee reports)

The body stood in appreciation of the Central Texas District and the Fellowship Free Will Baptist Church for hosting this state meeting.

The moderator called for consideration of the General Board's proposal of re-allocation of the co-operative funds. The proposal was adopted. (See General Board Report)

The motion carried to charge the Executive Committee with the responsibility of fixing the location of the next state meeting.

The motion carried to charge the Executive Committee with the responsibility of making written recommendations to the body concerning a central location for the state meeting in the next session.

The moderator introduced Rev. Paul Kettelman who spoke on the subjects "The End of the Commandment is Charity" and "Jesus is Our Daysman". Rev Everett Hellard and the congregation sang "No, Not One". The state meeting ended with a joyous chorus.

Visitors to the General Board were welcomed.

The General Board adopted the following recommendations.

1. The acceptance of the program with necessary changes.
2. The acceptance of standing board reports.
3. The acceptance of the Executive Secretary's report.
4. The acceptance of the Hillsdale Trustee's report.

5. The acceptance of recommendations #1 through #5 of the Missions - Church Extension Board report.
6. That recommendation #6 of the Missions - Church Extension Board report not be accepted and these duties be considered the responsibility of the Executive Secretary, as this is already outlined in the constitution. (ARTICLE IX, Section 6)
7. The acceptance of the following proposed amendments to the constitution:
 1. Whereas the national association now has a full time department devoted to the ministry of retirement and insurance for our pastors and layman employees and whereas this department has met the need so well, we recommend the state retirement and insurance board be declared vacant and the board be removed from the constitution as a standing board of the state association. (ARTICLE X, Section 8) The coop money now received by the board will be placed in the general fund and the state treasurer will continue to pay on those programs already in effect.
 2. Whereas the Trustee to Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College from other states have gone to three year term periods, we recommend amendment of ARTICLE VII, Section 2 by adding "And the Trustee to Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College, who shall be elected every three years."
 3. We propose amendment of ARTICLE IX, Section 5 by adding "He will subscribe to the standards set forth in the Hillsdale Faculty Handbook and the Doctrinal Questionnaire for faculty members."
 4. We propose amendment of ARTICLE X, Section 6 by deleting the last two complete sentences.
 5. We propose amendment of ARTICLE XI, Section 3 by adding, "The nominating committee shall not make nominations for members of the Missions - Church Extension Board."
 6. We propose amendment of ARTICLE X, Section 2 by adding, "The Missions - Church Extension Board shall be composed of one member from each district who shall serve terms of one year each."
8. We recommend the following Allocations of Coop funds received by the state office:
 - 25% National Office
 - 40% State Office
 - 25% Missions - Church Extension Board
 - 10% Christian Education Board
9. We recommend that a Trustee to Hillsdale Free Will Baptist college be elected in this session for a three year term.

EXECUTIVE SECRETARY'S REPORT

I am proud to be called a "Free Will Baptist". William Shakespeare, the poet asked, "What's in a name? That which we call a rose, by any other name would smell as sweet." In other words, a rose would be a rose no matter what it is called. The name, likewise, does not make a person, but the person makes the name.

Free Will Baptist have made a name for themselves all across this great country. From a humble beginning in the year 1727, these people have carried the message of free will - free grace - free salvation.

Those of us that go by the name of Texas Free Will Baptists owe a great debt to some who have gone before us in the work. Great sacrifices have bought us a rich heritage and a good name.

But there is "a name which is above every name." It is the name of Jesus. Isaiah wrote, "His name shall be called Wonderful, Counselor, the Mighty God, the Everlasting Father, the Prince of Peace."

Yes, I am proud of the name Free Will Baptist, and I am proud of the name of Jesus. Let us join in a greater effort to make these names apply to more and more people in the great state of Texas.

1974 was a year of activity for your secretary. While travelling some 20,000 miles, I had the opportunity to be with most of you in one way or another. I had a full year of District meetings, camping, revivals, teacher training, seminars, retreats, and worship services.

We appreciate the encouragement, the prayers, and the financial support of Free Will Baptist people who have made this year possible.

The future looks bright for our churches and for our association. We are looking for increased giving to make possible an even more active work by the executive office. We also see greater activity in other areas of our state work.

The fact that more Free Will Baptist churches are needed in Texas is obvious to everyone. Eight out of ten Texans live in the cities of the state. Most of our churches are either rural or located in small towns, and so we have no outreach to most of our population. We need an active mission - church extension program that will plant strong, fundamental, Bible preaching churches in the larger cities of our state.

For these and other reasons, we strongly encourage the adoption of the program presented by the State Mission Board.

The National Association now has a full time department devoted to the ministry of retirement and insurance for our pastors and laymen employees. Because this department has filled the need so well, we recommend the State Retirement and Insurance Board be declared vacant and the Board be removed from the constitution as a standing board of the association. The coop money now received by the board would be put in the general fund and the state treasurer would continue to pay on those programs already in effect.

I further recommend that the Texas member to the Hillsdale Board of Trustees have a three year term. This would fit with the new term periods of the other states.

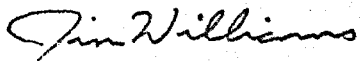
We are happy to note that total giving through the state office is up by 47% in 1974. Finances are always a problem but it is comforting to know that God has never ran into a depression or a recession.

While total giving was up for 1974, we must realize that we determine how successful a program will be by how much we are willing to put into it. God's work requires that we put our prayers, our efforts, our finances, our selves in without measure.

It will be necessary to find increased support for our full-time state office. The full-time office has proven itself over the past two years. However, much more needed to be done but the finances were not available. We welcome all suggestions and ideas in this area. Perhaps, we need to discuss the possibility of a state owned bookstore at this time.

We welcome the new faces to Texas. Several new men have joined our ranks in the past year. May we all join together in a spirit of love and cooperation like we have in Christ and spread the names of Jesus and Free Will Baptist across our state, across our town, and across our neighborhood street.

The Texas State Mission-Church Extension Board hereby submits the following proposals to the 1975 session of the State Association:

1. We recommend that the comprehensive plan of state missions be approved.
2. We recommend that all seats on the State Mission Board be declared vacant.
3. We recommend that a new board be elected consisting of six members, one from each District.
4. We recommend that the District Association serve as its own nominating committee for this representative.
5. We recommend that all Mission Board members be elected annually.
6. We recommend that the promotion of the National Missions cease to be the responsibility of this board and that a State Missions Director be elected to promote these two efforts.

The following plan is submitted for the work of the Texas Mission-Church Extension Board:

I. The first consideration is the site for a new work.

- A. Attention should be given to large and growing cities in our state. Many of these do not come under the concern of any particular District (Orange, Beaumont, Galveston, Texas City, etc.).
- B. Surveys could be taken to determine good sites for future work. Much information could be obtained by mail from the Chamber of Commercences.
- C. Requests could come from our own people who move to towns where no FWB Church is located. Some of these families are strong Christians and would make an excellent nucleus for a new work.
- D. Requests could come from the applicant who has a burden for a particular city.
- E. Final site selection should always be finally in the hands of the State Board. The board would not discourage other new works but could give them only prayer support.

II. Secondly we will consider the applicant.

- A. The man and his wife need to be in good physical health. His age is a factor.
- B. The couple need to have mental and emotional stability. If they have a history of discouragement and conflict with people, they should not be considered.
- C. Their past performance should be considered. Has the man been a church builder in the past? Would we consider him a successful man? Has the wife shared in the past ministry?
- D. Does his family agree this is God's will? A complaining, grudging family will hinder his work.
- E. Is he a "self starter"? Does he have drive and determination?
- F. Is he a soul winner?
- G. The applicant needs to have a good understanding of Free Will Baptist Doctrine and he must, without hesitation, teach and preach this doctrine.

- H. Experience and education are very important factors.
 - 1. A high school education is required.
 - 2. Bible College training is desired.
- I. The man must have a working knowledge of Church administration, evangelism, teaching ministry, and other related areas.
- J. Maturity is an intangible but very important factor to consider in the man.
- K. The applicant should not use tobacco, drugs, or have other habits that would hinder the work.
- L. The man must have a neat personal appearance and give evidence of good social manners.
- M. All applicants must meet for a personal interview by the Board.
- N. Final choice of the man for any particular new work must rest with the State Board.

III. Consideration will now be given to financing the new work.

- A. Each District will be encouraged to give a larger percentage of the coop to the State.
- B. Those Churches and Districts not now contributing to the coop plan of giving will be encouraged to do so.
- C. Individuals and Churches will be encouraged to give directly to the State Board for the cause of Church extension in Texas.
- D. A new missionary will be put on itinerary for two months full time before he goes to the new field. Faith promise cards will be used to raise support for the new work.

IV. Some other considerations.

- A. The State will join the National Mission Board in each new work to make it a joint project for the obvious reasons.
- B. The State will only have one work in mission status at any given time.
- C. The missionary will be required to file a report monthly on forms approved and furnished by the Board.
- D. The Board will seek to involve the people of our Churches in the work of the Mission (surveys - door to door, telephone, mail - prayer, etc.)
- E. The Board will receive all monies and send them to the National Board except for a designated amount that will be held in a building fund.
- F. The Board will hold title to all property until the mission is self sustaining and duly organized into a Church. A dissolution clause will be contained in the deed so that if the property ceases to be used as a Free Will Baptist Church, title will revert to the State.
- G. The support will continue until such time as the mission can be self sustaining, however, the Board will review the progress made on a regular basis.
- H. The missionary will be under contract to the State Board and will be accountable to them only.

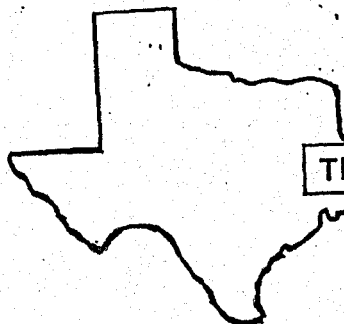

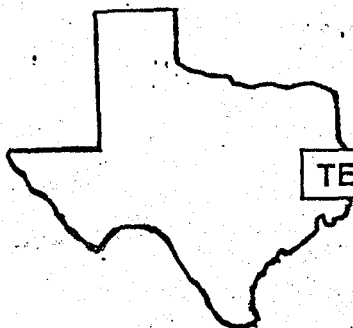

"BOARD WORKS"

SUNDAY SCHOOL INSTITUTES: Your State Christian Education Board conducted two(2) Sunday school institutes in two(2) areas of our state in the past seven(7) months. The first was at the First FWBC in Wichita Falls with Karen Murphy conducting two(2) seminars on Teaching Nursery-Juniors. There were seventeen(17) present. The second institute was at the First FWBC in Garland with a full program of seminars with twenty-two(22) present(all 22 were from the Garland church.)

Some audio visual equipment was purchased so the board could not only tell of its value in teaching but also demonstrate this value while teaching.

PLANS: To cover every area of Texas with these institutes. If you would like us in your area, just ask! If you would like another institute in your area on different materials and seminars-contact the board. Plans have been laid to place a registration fee for the institutes, this will be kept to a minimum and no offerings will be received. A certificate will be given to each attending the institutes.

C.T.S. RALLEY: This year's State C.T.S. Rally was sponsored by the Christian Education Board.

SCHOLARSHIPS: We gave \$200.00 in scholarships to two students last fall who attended Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College. We plan to give another \$200.00 in scholarships(if funds are available) this fall to students from Texas who will be attending any of our three(3) Free Will Baptist Colleges.

Many times individual churches give scholarships to students and this is never known by others, so we are asking that if this is done by your church or you as an individual to please let us know and we will recognize the giver and the receiver. This could be an example or challenge for others to do the same. In the fall of '74', Debbie Dobbs received a \$50.00 scholarship from Weldon Houston, the Medessa District gave a \$50.00 scholarship to both Keith Potter and Merv Pugh, and Ronnie Mizzles and LaDonna Covington received \$100.00 scholarships each from the State Christian Education Board.

MINISTER'S AND LAYMAN'S RETREAT: The first state wide minister's and layman's retreat was held at the West Fork Dist. camp grounds and the program was planned and presented by the Christian Education Board and the State Executive Secretary. There was 30 men in attendance and another retreat is planned for 1975.

Report From the Hillsdale Board of Trustees

In the past year I have attended all meetings of the Hillsdale Board of Trustees. I have taken an active part and have voted on all decisions faced by the Board. I believe our decisions were made in the best interests of the friends and students of Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College, including those in Texas. According to the Registrar, we currently have 20 students enrolled from Texas in the spring semester.

Hillsdale is completing one of the most successful and outstanding years in its history. Enrollment records were broken with 145 students of which 121 were full time. A 20% increase is projected for the fall of 1975 giving us a total student body of 190. Much of this increase will come from Texas.

Continuing efforts are being made by the Board of Trustees and the administration to improve the school and give it an even greater ministry.

Academic improvements include curriculum expansion, additional instructors, and revision of academic scholarship regulations. North Central Regional Accreditation is still being sought. A recent updating of our listing in Report of Credit Given has brought assurance that Hillsdale graduates will be accepted by Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary.

Due to the increased enrollment, much building has been and is being instituted. A new home for the President and a duplex for staff and faculty were completed on campus in 1974. A new student lounge was recently built on the patio of the Project IV building. It is hoped that sufficient funds will be available so construction can begin on a new four-plex by May. This building will house 24 - 28 students and is much needed.

Financially, the school is meeting its day by day needs, but increased giving will be needed to meet payments that will be due this summer.

A new Advisory Committee has been established by the Board of Trustees to advise the Board and administration of Hillsdale in whatever area the members may be qualified. The nucleus of this committee, composed of 15 members (including at least one from Texas), will meet with the Board of Trustees in May.

Much has been accomplished in the past year at Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College and much remains to be done. The future looks great. Pray much for the Board of Trustees, the administration, and for Hillsdale.
