Friday, January 24, 1986

REPORT OF THE
BOARD OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

On June 6, 1985 the State CFS competitive activities, conducted by the Christian Education Board, took place at the Fellowship FWB Church in Bryan, Texas. We had the best participation and quality competition that this state has witnessed in several years. Out of the thirty-four (34) entrants, twenty-four (24) advanced to the National level. Texas was well represented at the National in Nashville, Tennessee and came away with five (5) first place awards. All five were from the Duncanville Church as follows; Andy Gray, Adventurer Declamation; Rodney Anderson, Crusader Declamation; Learner/Adventurer Chorale; Herald Chorale and the Youth Choir. In the Music & Arts category there were ten #1 ratings from Texas. The other participants performed well, however ratings are only given in Music & Arts.

The 1985 Texas Teen Retreat, co-sponsored by this board with Hillsdale, at the Central Texas District FWB Camp near Carlos was well attended and enjoyed by all. The Teen Retreat was again scheduled for the camp near Carlos for 1986, however will be held in East Texas in 1987.

On September 6-7, 1985 thirty-four (34) Free Will Baptists from across our State gathered in the beautiful hill country of Bandera, Texas at the Twin Elm Guest Ranch. Dr. Ken Riggs, Professor of Christian Education at Free Will Baptist Bible College in Nashville, Tennessee was our guest speaker. He shared with us many challenging insights into the unique benefits of the Bible in the daily life of the Christian. Together with his inspirational messages and the rustic atmosphere each person expressed having had a wonderful experience. It is our desire that more of our people take advantage of the annual Men & Women's Retreat.

A new and exciting project, a Video-Audio Cassette Library, has been adopted for 1986 by the Christian Education Board.

The graduation exercises at Hillsdale on May 9, 1986 was a proud moment for ten seniors and sixteen sophomores who recieved thier B.A. and A.A. degrees. President Wade also awarded a Certificate in Bible degree, the first ever awarded. Wayne Hyman recieved the certificate for having completed the required courses by correspondence.

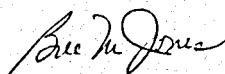
This past year has witnessed the completion and dedication of the Geri Ann Hull Learning Resources Center, a spacious building housing library, classrooms and faculty offices. The old library area was renovated and remodeled into a student recreation area. New faculty have done well in missions and music.

Student enrollment did not meet the expectations of the administration this past year. To meet the challenge for 1986, programs in business have been revamped, classes added for math students, plans made for counseling those students not adequately prepared for college level courses and the addition of an inter-collegiate sports program for this fall. Also, senior students will attend classes only on Monday -- Wednesday, giving them extra opportunity to minister in local churches.

Nine students from Texas attended Hillsdale during the past year. They did well, as represented by Deborah Ann Gillentine who received her A.A. degree, graduating Magna Cum Laude!

In giving, Texas ranks third to Missouri and Arkansas for states other than Oklahoma. From July to December of 1985, Texas gave \$2495.47. We can and should do better. Students pay about half of what it actually costs for their education Free Will Batptist people make up the difference.

This has been my first year representing Texas on the Board of Trustees, but both members of the Board and of the Administration have been responsive to suggestions and questions. Hillsdale is a worthy school to support and the right place to sen our your adults for their college education, for it not only educates their mind, but it prepares them in a total way for life.
