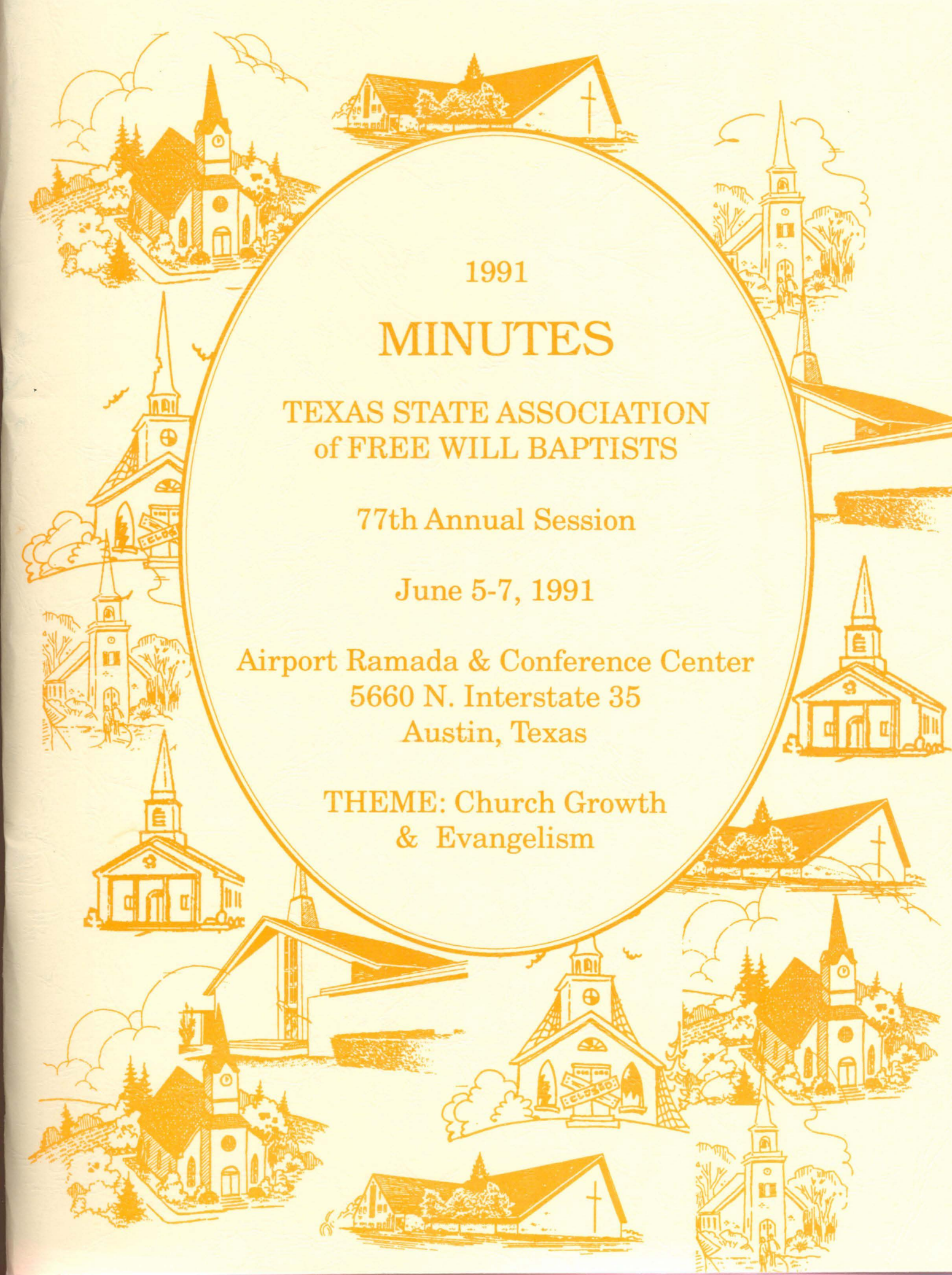

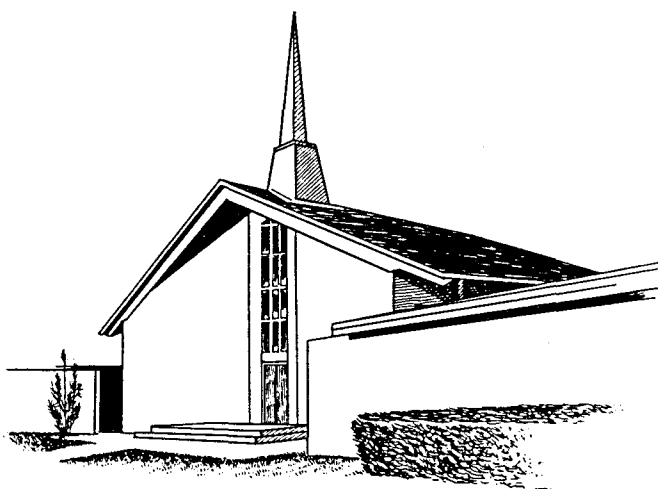

EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING
Thursday, July 5, 1990
Austin, Texas

The Executive Board of the Texas State Association of Free Will Baptists met at the Hampton Inn in Austin, Texas, on Thursday evening, July 5, 1990. Members present for the meeting were Bill Jones, Moderator; Thurmon Murphy, Clerk; Dale Smith, Assistant Clerk; H. Z. Cox, Parliamentarian; and Joel Kircher, Hillsdale Trustee.

Moderator Bill Jones called the meeting to order at 8:00 p.m. H. Z. Cox led the opening prayer. The first item of discussion was a very positive evaluation of the recent state meeting.

The second item of discussion was centered around location possibilities for the 1991 state meeting. Several pro's and con's of having the meeting in a motel facility in Austin were discussed.

There was a motion that the 1991 state meeting be in Austin at the motel or hotel which would provide us with the best package of meeting rooms and rates. The motion was carried. Clerk Thurmon Murphy reported that he had visited numerous motel facilities during the day and that he would recommend three of them for the entire board to look at and make a final decision on as a meeting site.

The board then discussed possible themes for the 1991 meeting. By consensus the board agreed upon the theme "Church Growth and Evangelism" which had originally been planned as the theme for the 1992 state meeting.

There was a motion to invite Doug Little to speak at the 1991 Pastor's Conference on the theme "Worship Content In the Local Church." The motion carried.

We agreed to ask Raymond Getz, who had not made it to the board meeting because of car trouble incurred on the way, to coordinate the effort to raise funds for the 1996 National meeting scheduled to be in Fort Worth.

Moderator Bill Jones states that he and Dale Smith would have to leave and return home early the next morning due to an illness in Bill's church. He appointed Thurmon Murphy, H.Z. Cox, and Joel Kircher to inspect the hotels in Austin which should be considered as possible meeting sites for the 1991 state meeting and book the one which offered the best overall package.

The meeting was dismissed in prayer by Thurmon Murphy at 10:45 p.m.

EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING
January 18-19, 1991
Austin, Texas

The Executive Board of the Texas State Association of Free Will Baptists met for the annual All Boards Meeting at the Airport Ramada in Austin, Texas, on Friday evening, January 18, 1991. Members present for the meeting were Moderator Bill Jones; Raymond Getz, Assistant Moderator; Thurmon Murphy, Clerk; Dale Smith, Assistant Clerk; H. Z. Cox, Parliamentarian; and Joel Kircher, Hillsdale Trustee.

Moderator Bill Jones called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. and asked each member to share a verse of Scripture on encouragement, which they did. The Moderator then led the board members in prayer. Gratitude was expressed by the Moderator for the good work done by some of the board members.

Brother Jones then gave a report on his work as Acting Executive Secretary. He announced that the Mission District had disbanded. He reported on the general condition of the several associations (West Fork, East Texas, Central, and Midessa) which he had visited during the previous several months.

Clerk Thurmon Murphy reported on his work in travel and promotion in several association meetings including the Midessa, Northwest Brazos, and East Texas.

Assistant Moderator Raymond Getz gave a summary report on the Hispanic works in Texas and Mexico.

Thurmon Murphy, in his capacity as Acting Treasurer, gave the financial report of the State Office for the year 1990 and presented a proposed budget for 1992. The board entered into a lengthy discussion of the financial needs of the state. Several suggestions of ways and means of increasing the financial support of the various state ministries were made. There was a motion to receive the report and recommend the proposed budget to the State Association (through the General Board) for adoption. The motion carried.

Dale Smith gave a report on the CHALLENGE and Parson to Parson. Board members spoke about the need to have more news of Texas in the CHALLENGE and the need to resume publishing the Parson to Parson.

Clerk Thurmon Murphy presented a proposal for a Desk Top Publishing System including a Macintosh computer, color monitor, laser writer, and necessary software. The proposed package was for \$7,492.95. He expressed that the CHALLENGE, Parson to Parson, State Minutes, Digest of Reports, Programs, Correspondence, Sunday school electives (part of the TOGETHER WE GROW program) could all be done on this system. It was also observed that work

for the various district associations, local churches, and youth camps could also be done on such a system for a nominal fee. Two members of the board agreed to ask the West Fork and the Central Associations for contributions to help pay for the computer itself. A motion was made then to ask the State Association to pay for the balance. The motion carried.

Joel Kircher, Hillsdale Trustee, gave a report on the work of Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College. He reported on the growth and progress of the school, and spoke about the financial needs of the college.

A motion was made and passed to retain the following Cooperative Program allocations for 1992:

State Office	40%
National Cooperative Program	25%
State Missions-Church Extension	23%
Christian Education Board	12%

The board then turned to finalizing plans for the state meeting program. The theme "Church Growth and Evangelism" was finalized. Speakers chosen to preach were Bobby Ferguson, Doug Little, and Luther Sanders. Mark Jones and Bob Williams were appointed to direct the music. The board agreed to sponsor a Pastor's Conference Luncheon once again. Doug Little had already been invited to speak at the Pastor's Conference. We further agreed to ask him to play and sing at the conference. Charles Reeves was chosen to bring the Friday morning devotion.

Attention was turned to some preliminary plans for the 1992 state meeting which is scheduled for East Texas. The board agreed to invite Tom Malone, new president of Free Will Baptist Bible College, to speak on the theme "The Church and It's Pastor."

There was a motion to pay the expenses of Texas' National General Board member, Thurmon Murphy, to the National Association in Charleston, West Virginia. The motion carried.

Raymond Getz spoke on plans to raise the necessary funds for Texas to host the 1996 National Association in Fort Worth. A motion was made that Acting Treasurer Thurmon Murphy place all of the monies designated for the 1996 National into a Certificate of Deposit. The motion carried.

The Friday evening session was then dismissed in prayer by Moderator Bill Jones at 10:35 P.M.

The Saturday morning joint session with all of the boards and the Woman's Auxiliary met at 8:30. Moderator Bill Jones brought a brief devotion. Thurmon Murphy gave an oral report on the work and plans of the Executive Board.

Everyl Getz gave the report on the work and plans of the Texas Woman's Auxiliary.

David Sutton gave a report on the work of the Missions-Church Extension Board. Don Guthrie, West Fork Missionary to Plano, gave a report on the progress and plans of the new work in Plano.

Mark Jones gave the report of the Christian Education Board. He announced that Bobby Williams would serve as their new chairman and that Craig Shaw would serve on their board until the state meeting in June. Bobby Williams then spoke on some of their plans and goals for the year. He announced that the Texas Youth Conference would be in Duncanville April 26 & 27. The theme of the TYC is "Youth In Ministry." He then announced a Boot Camp for August 16 & 17, 1991 for Juniors and Seniors, the theme being "Teens In Leadership." He further announced a couples retreat for November 15 & 16, 1991. The theme of that retreat was announced as "Stabalizing Your Marriage for Ministry."

The meeting was then dismissed in prayer by Don Guthrie at 10:05 a.m.

The Executive Board then met with the Christian Education Board and agreed to give them the Thursday afternoon Pastor's Conference service so Doug Little could conduct a seminar under the sponsorship of the Christian Education Board.

The General Board of the Texas State Association of Free Will Baptists met on June 5, 1991, at the Airport Ramada in Austin, Texas, at 2:00 p.m. The State Executive Board was present, along with the chairmen of the State Home Missions Board and the Christian Education Board. Representatives from the following district associations were present: West Fork, East Texas, and Central Texas. There were no representatives from the Midessa, Permian Basin, Northwest Brazos, or Rio Grande.

Moderator Bill Jones called the meeting to order at 2:00 p.m. and gave a devotion based on John 6. He then led in prayer.

The clerk then recognized the members of the General Board and moved that they be seated. The motion carried.

There was a motion to adopt the program for the state meeting. The motion carried.

Brother Jones then gave a report on his work as Acting Executive Secretary. He reported on his travels to several district associations and gave a general overview of the state work. His report was mostly positive.

Thurmon Murphy, in his capacity as Acting Treasurer, gave the financial report of the State Office and presented a proposed budget for 1992. He moved that the report be received and the budget recommended to the state body for adoption. The motion carried.

Thurmon Murphy presented a proposal to purchase a Macintosh desktop publishing system. There was a motion to recommend to the state body that the State Executive Board be authorized to purchase the system, the price not to exceed \$7,492.95, half of which is to be paid from the state's general fund and the other half to be raised from other sources. The motion carried.

There was a motion, which carried, to recommend to the state body that the following Cooperative Program allocations be retained for the year 1992:

There was a motion to adjourn. The General Board then adjourned at 4:05 p.m. Bobby Ferguson led the closing prayer.

WEDNESDAY EVENING, June 5, 1991

The seventy seventh annual session of the Texas State Association of Free Will Baptists was held at the Airport Ramada Inn in Austin, Texas, June 5-7, 1991. The meeting began on Wednesday evening as Bob Williams opened the service by leading the congregation in "Leaning On the Everlasting Arms." Thurmon Murphy, Clerk, declared the session to be in order. The opening prayer was led by Billy Walker. Moderator Bill Jones welcomed the people association by association, and recognized and welcome the visitors from out of state.

Bob Williams led "I Just Keep Trusting My Lord" and "Jesus, Lord to Me." A quartet composed of Mark & Tracy Jones and Bob & Carla Williams sang a medley of songs including "I'm Bound for That City," "Touring That City," and "It's a Great, Great Morning."

The moderator then announced the following committees which had been appointed earlier at the General Board meeting:

The evening offering was then received.

Moderator Bill Jones introduced the speaker for the evening, Bobby Ferguson. Before the message Carla Williams sang "Amazing Grace." Following the theme for the 1991 state meeting "Church Growth and Evangelism" Brother Ferguson preached on the subject "Ten Reasons Why Evangelism Should Be the Number One Priority of the Church." He used First Corinthians 9:19-23 as his text, and listed seventeen reasons why evangelism should be the number one priority of the church. At the conclusion of his message he led in prayer.

Bob Williams then led two choruses: "My Jesus I Love Thee" and "There Is a Name I Love to Hear."

The benediction for the service was given by Mike Cousineau.

THURSDAY MORNING, June 6, 1991

Mark Jones opened the service by leading the congregation in singing "Victory In Jesus." Joel Kircher led the opening prayer. Moderator Bill Jones read a portion of Scripture and delivered the Moderator's Message on the subject "Taking Risks." He then led in prayer.

Assistant Clerk Dale Smith gave a partial report of the Credentials Committee. The delegates were seated.

Ken Eagleton gave a report from the Foreign Missions Department. He explained why he and his wife, Marvis, had returned from Brazil to assume a stateside ministry with the missions department. He gave an overview of our missions work worldwide. He announced that the hospital in Ivory Coast had burned two nights earlier and that all of the medical supplies had been lost. No one was injured in the fire according to the reports. Bill Jones asked H. Z. Cox to lead the congregation in prayer on behalf of the needs relative to the medical ministry in Africa.

Charles Denman gave the report of the National Master's Men program.

Roy Thomas gave the report of the National Home Missions Department. He gave a quick overview of the home missions work around the country.

Jim Shepherd gave a report from Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College. He announced that Hillsdale had experienced a 47% increase in enrollment during the past two years.

The moderator then asked Jim Shepherd to report on the National Sunday School Department. Brother Shepherd announced that there was a large deficit at Randall House Publications and that there would be some cut backs and reorganizations.

Bob Williams gave the report of the Christian Education Board. He announced that their theme for 1991 as "Leadership In Ministry." He announced several meetings sponsored by the

Board of Christian Education, including some retreats and seminars which were to be conducted relative to their 1991 theme. There was a motion to receive the report and adopt the budget. The motion was seconded and carried.

Joel Kircher gave the report of the Hillsdale Trustee.

The morning business session was dismissed in prayer by Bill Jones at 10:15.

PASTOR'S CONFERENCE, Thursday morning

11:00 A.M.

The Pastor's Conference began as Bob Williams led a medley of songs including "Power In the Blood," and "Are You Washed In the Blood?" Then he led "Anywhere With Jesus" and "Thou Art Worthy."

The West Fork Preacher's Quartet, consisting of Joel Kircher, Craig Shaw, Richard Rust, and Mark Jones, sang "I'm Free Again." Dale Smith presided over the service. Craig Shaw read Deuteronomy 31:6-8 and led in prayer. An offering was then received with Richard Rust leading the offertory prayer.

Dale Smith had all the ministers stand together at the front in a continuous line, each minister having his hand on the shoulder of the minister next to him. Bill Jones led in prayer on behalf of the speaker, Doug Little. Ray Wages sang a solo: "Find Us Faithful."

Don Guthrie introduced Doug Little of Russellville, Arkansas, who preached on the subject "Making Worship More Meaningful In the Local Church." He enumerated six things which would make our worship more meaningful: Prayer, Praise, Participation, Preaching, Planning, and Patience. He closed his message in prayer. After Bob Williams led "Thou Art Worthy" the meeting was dismissed in prayer for the Luncheons (Pastor's & Auxiliary).

THURSDAY EVENING, June 6, 1991

7:00 P.M.

Mark Jones began the service by leading "How Great Thou Art." He then repeated the song as a solo as the members of the congregation greeted each other with expressions of love and appreciation.

Assistant Moderator Raymond Getz introduced Doug Little who gave the report of Free Will Baptist Bible College on behalf of Bob Shockey who was unable to attend the state meeting. Brother Getz then introduced Mike Cousineau, missionary to Ivory Coast, who read Psalm 145. Mark Jones then led the congregation in singing "Into His Presence," "Holy Ground," "Majesty," and "Amazing Grace." Cynthia Biddle sang a solo entitled "Oh I Want to Know You More."

An offering was then received, with David Ferguson leading the offertory prayer. Carla Williams and Tracy Jones, instrumentalists for the state meeting, played the offertory music.

Doug Little played the piano and sang "The Ninety and Nine." Mike Cousineau then returned to the podium and led the congregation in prayer on behalf of the speaker for the evening, Doug Little. Brother Cousineau also asked for prayer on behalf of the work in Africa, especially in view of the news of the burning of the hospital there.

Doug Little brought the evening message entitled "Prayer: Unlocking God's Power for Evangelism." He used Colossians 4:2-6 as his text. He closed his message with prayer. Assistant Moderator Raymond Getz, who presided over the service, called the congregation to come forward for prayer.

FRIDAY MORNING, June 7, 1991

8:30 A.M.

Bob Williams opened the service by leading "Spirit of the Living God," "Lord, Be Glorified," "We Have Come Into His House," and "Holy Ground." Roy Wilson led the opening prayer. Charles Reeves read from Matthew 9 and brought the morning devotional.

Dale Smith gave the final Credentials Committee report. There was a motion to seat delegates from churches which got their letters in late. The motion was seconded and carried. He also gave a registration report.

Melvin Worthington gave the report of the National Executive Office.

Raymond Getz reported on the progress of the 1996 National Association fund.

Everyl Getz gave the report of the Texas Woman's Auxiliary, enumerating their many accomplishments for the year, and stating their goals for 1992.

Clerk Thurmon Murphy presented the General Board report which contained three recommendations. All three items were adopted.

Clerk Thurmon Murphy, serving also as Acting Treasurer, gave the financial report of the State Office and presented the proposed budget for 1992. He reminded everyone of the large amount of money that is not being channeled through the State Office. He moved that the report be received and the budget adopted. The motion was seconded and carried.

Dale Smith, Assistant Clerk and Acting Editor of the *Texas Challenge*, gave a report on the state paper.

There was a motion to receive the report and elect the various officers at the proper time. The motion was seconded and carried.

Since the report of the Christian Education Board had been given on Thursday morning, officers for that board were then elected. David Ferguson (1993), Don Guthrie (1994), and Craig Shaw (1994) were elected to serve on the Christian Education Board.

David Sutton gave the report of the Missions-Church Extension Board. He announced that the board was very close to hiring a missionary couple to start a church in Austin. He indicated that the announcement should be made in about a month. He presented a proposed budget for 1992. He moved that the report be received and the budget adopted. The motion was seconded and carried.

Don Guthrie reported on the progress of the Collin Creek Free Will Baptist Church in Plano, which is a West Fork District Association project. He announced that construction on the church building would begin around June 19th.

E. R. Mayo, a member of the Mission Board, spoke to the association, at the request of the moderator, on the subject of supporting missions.

There was a motion to authorize the Executive Board to use two thousand dollars of the 1996 National Association fund to purchase a \$2,000 bond from the Collin Creek Church in Plano. The motion was seconded and carried.

Roy Wilson (1994) was elected to the Missions-Church Extension Board.

H. Ray Berry gave the report of the Obituary Committee. The report was received and the congregation observed a time of silent prayer in memory of the deceased. Bill Jones then led the congregation in prayer.

Don Guthrie gave the report of the Resolutions Committee, which contained three items. All three items were adopted. There was then a motion to instruct the clerk to write President Bush informing him of our support of his stand against funding abortion clinics and his stand for prayer in public schools. The motion was seconded and carried.

The following general officers were elected by acclamation:

There was a motion to authorize the moderator to appoint National Association delegates at the National. The motion was seconded and carried.

The business session the adjourned. Moderator Bill Jones led the dismissal prayer.

MORNING WORSHIP SERVICE, June 7, 1991

11:00 A.M.

Mark Jones opened the service by leading "Leaning On the Everlasting Arms." Joel Kircher gave the invocation for the worship service. Mark Jones then led "Blessed Assurance" and "Holy Ground." David Sutton led the congregation in prayer. Mark Jones then led "Holy Ground" again. Mike Lightsey of Bryan sang "Who Will Be Jesus?"

Moderator Bill Jones introduced the speaker for the morning service, Luther Sanders. Nancy Bankhead Copeland, of Fort Worth, sang "Who Will Call Him King?" Brother Sanders then preached on "Discipleship: The Neglected Part of Evangelism." Matthew 28:19,20 was his text. He closed the message with a poem of his own composition, and with a prayer.

The 77th annual session of the Texas State Association of Free Will Baptists was then dismissed in prayer led by H. Z. Cox.

GENERAL BOARD REPORT

The General Board of the Texas State Association of Free Will Baptists met on June 5, 1991, in the Board Room of the Airport Ramada Inn, in Austin, Texas. As a result of this meeting we offer the following report and recommendations.

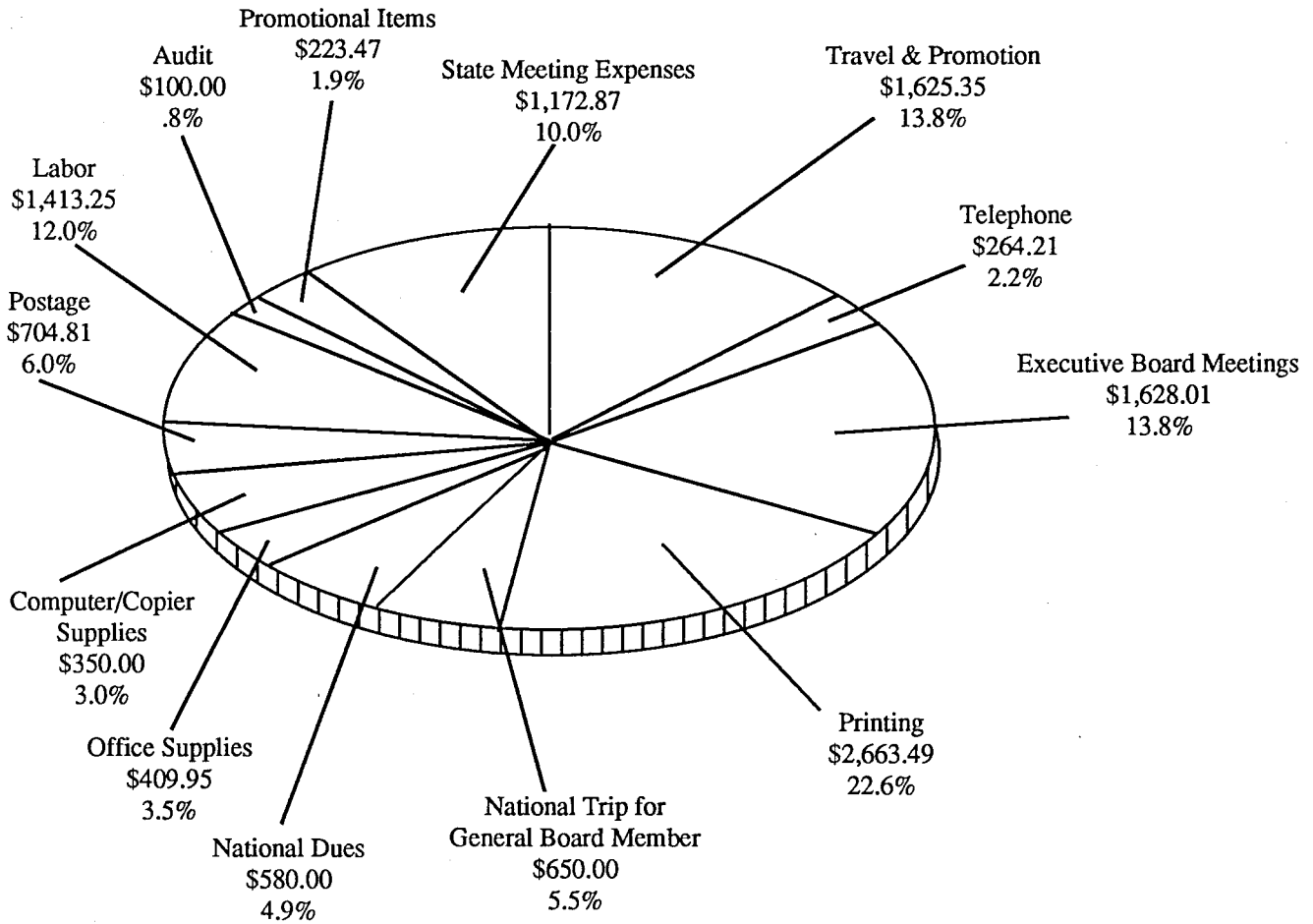

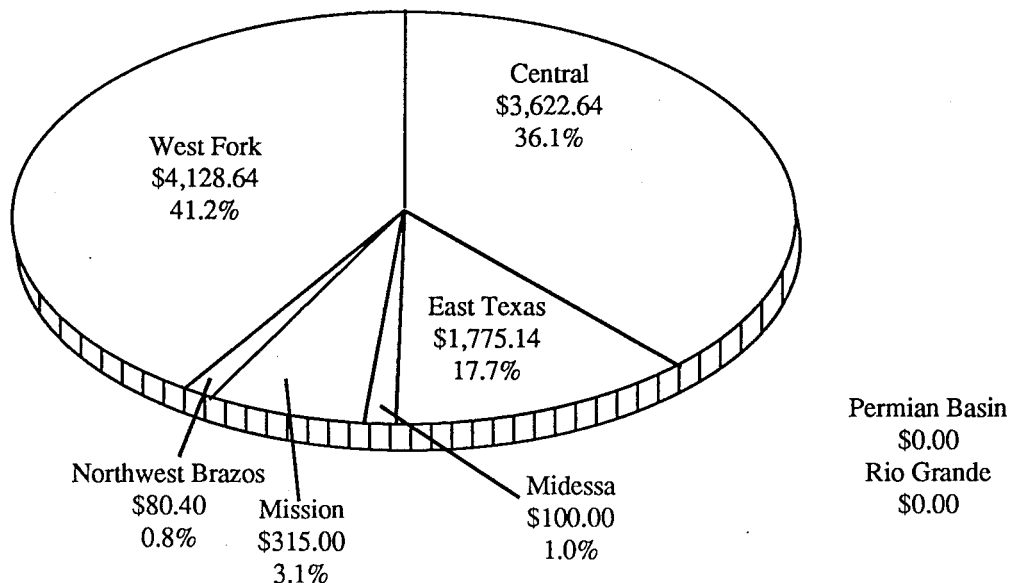

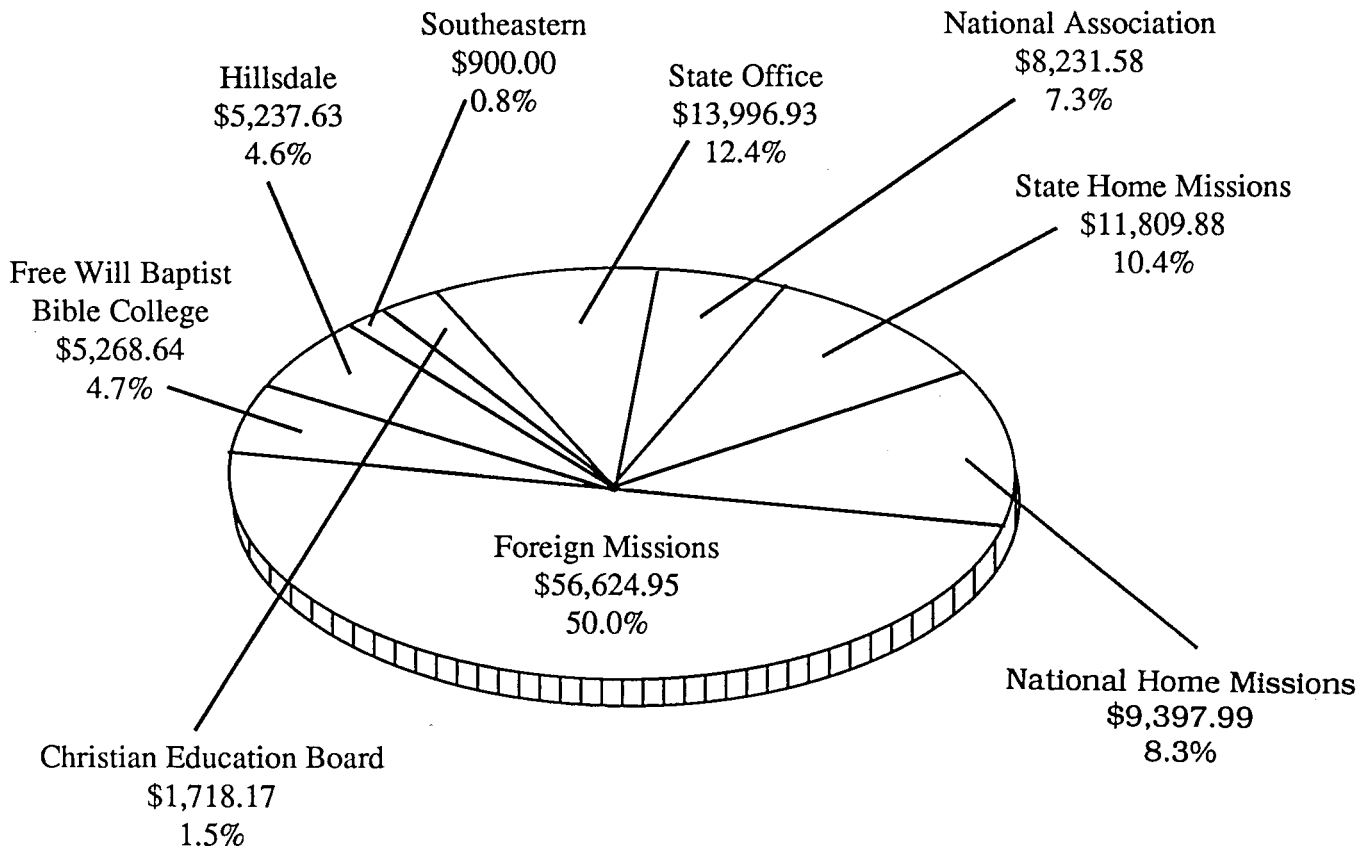

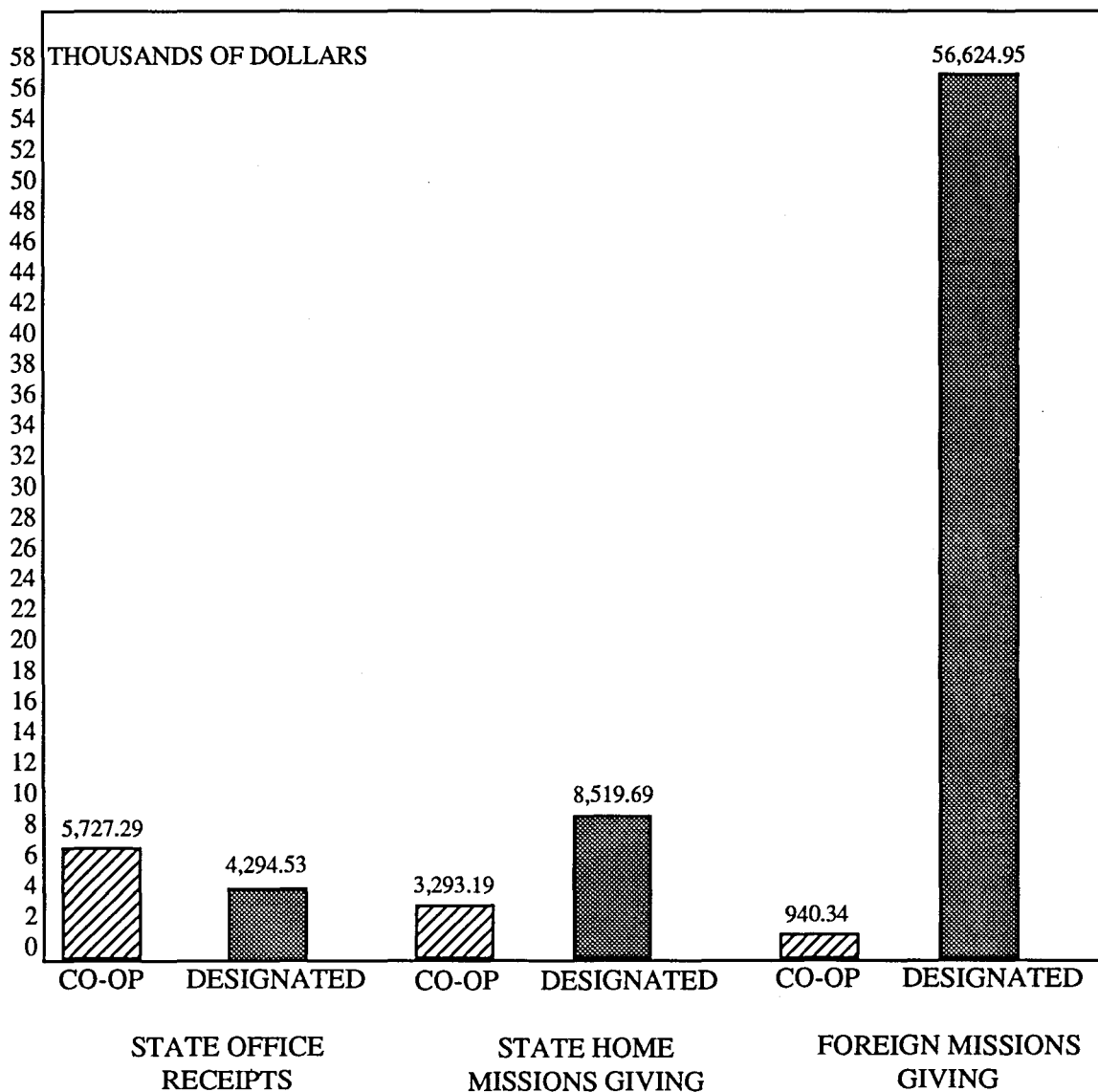
Total Texas Support for 1990

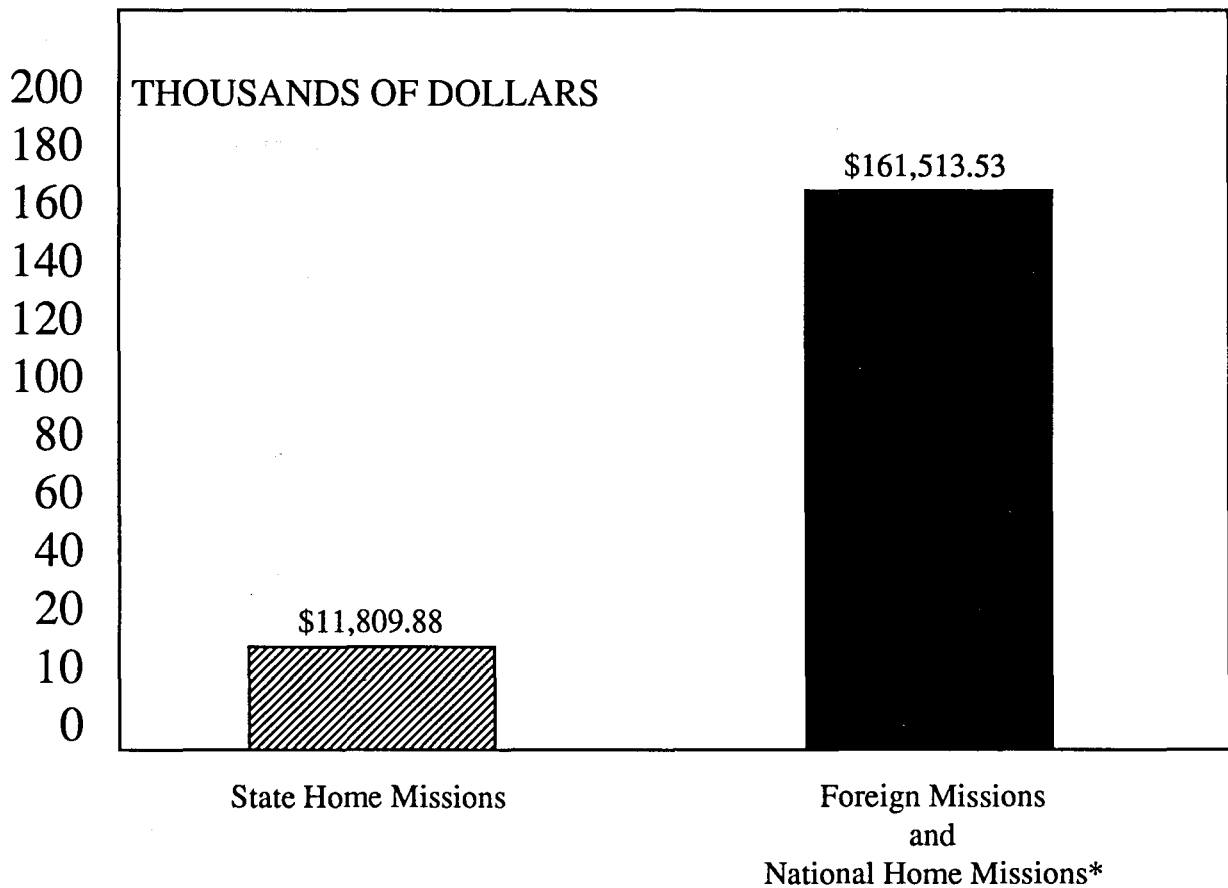


A BRIEF COMPARISON OF CO-OP GIVING AND DESIGNATED GIVING 1990

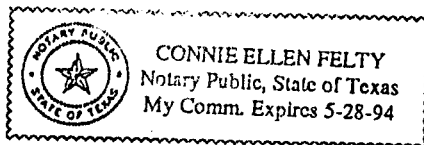

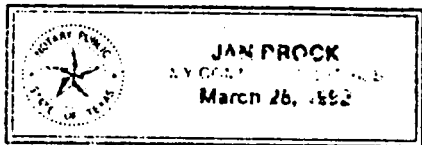

1990 REPORT

The Mission Board met several times during the year 1990. The first meeting was the "All-Boards" meeting in Duncanville on January 19-20 where plans were made for the year. It was at that meeting that we discussed the possibility of going to Austin for the next state mission project rather than San Antonio.

The Board met two times in Austin. Individual members have also made trips there. After surveying the city, we made a definite decision to go there. A special thanks to Bro. H. Ray Berry and the committee for releasing the San Antonio funds to be used in Austin. We have selected the North-Northwest area of the city for the project. Land is very expensive in this growing area, and as you know, we have limited funds. Pray that we will soon locate the "right" piece of property at the "right" price. We hope to be able to show you the land when we have our State Meeting in Austin in June, 1991.

We enjoyed our meeting in Weslaco in September. It has been a joy working more closely with Bro. James Munsey as he oversees the Mexican Missionary endeavor. We were especially blessed as we attended the Hispanic Ass'n meeting at Donna and as we visited the churches in Reynosa.

We commend Bro. Don Guthrie and the West Fork Association for the good progress at the mission work in Plano. By the end of the first year, the attendance was 40 with monthly offerings of \$2,500. The group is giving 10% plus designated gifts to outside causes. Three choice acres of land on Parker Road have been purchased. Your gifts to the "Plano Land Fund" will speed up the date for beginning the new building.

Of the 27 churches reporting on Roll Call Sunday, October 28th, two had more than 200 in attendance (Houston First - 257; Duncanville First - 219) and three had more than 100 in attendance (United/Bryan - 162; Evergreen/Iola - 132; Fellowship/Bryan - 109). Nine of the remaining churches had more than 50 in attendance with those remaining less than 50. We appreciate all of our churches, regardless of the size. Let's all work hard to make our church everything that it can be for God's glory.

A special thanks goes to our Texas missionaries who serve us on the foreign fields. They are: Ernest & Elaine Holland, Mike & Deleen Cousineau, and Darrel & Lila Nichols, all in Africa; Judy Smith in Japan; Ron & Linda Callo-way and Dwain & Debbie Crosby in Spain; and Ken & Marvis Eagleton, Brazil, who are presently in Nashville. They all deserve our faithful prayer and financial support.

The Bachelor of Music will be offered. Six(6) different B.A. degrees are now available.

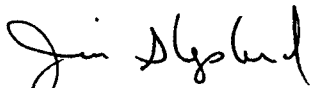
Janice Banks will join the faculty as a missions instructor. She will team with Reford Wilson in our missions program.

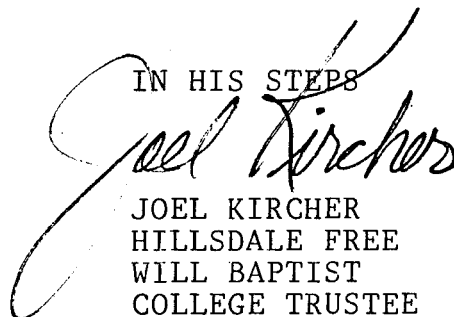

**CONSTITUTION
OF THE
TEXAS STATE ASSOCIATION
OF
FREE WILL BAPTISTS**

ARTICLE I: Name

This organization shall be known as the Texas State Association of Free Will Baptists.

ARTICLE II: Purpose

The purpose of this organization shall be to enlist the cooperation of all Free Will Baptists in Texas in sending the gospel of Jesus Christ to all quarters, both near and far, in winning the lost through the preaching of the gospel, and in teaching and training those who are saved to be holier and more efficient members of the body of Christ, thus advancing the interests of the kingdom of God.

This association shall produce literature, and establish and maintain such educational and benevolent institutions as needed to accomplish its purpose of winning the world to Christ.

ARTICLE III: Membership

Section 1: This association shall be composed of the district associations and the churches of Texas which are known to be orderly, duly organized, and conforming to the faith and usages of the Free Will Baptist denomination as set forth in the Treatise of the National Association of Free Will Baptists, "A Treatise of the Faith and Practices of the Free Will Baptists." All churches belonging to this state association must be members in good standing of some regularly organized district association. Any church or organization conforming to the above regulations must make proper application for membership in the association, and, after satisfactory examination and recommendation by the Credentials Committee, be elected to membership in the state association by a two-thirds majority vote of the body.

Section 2: All regularly ordained ministers and deacons, who are members in good standing of a local church belonging to this association are members of the association.

Section 3: Any and all references to church or churches in this Constitution and By-Laws shall also refer to mission or missions.

ARTICLE IV: Representation

Section 1: Each district association shall be entitled to one delegate for each hundred members or fractional part thereof.

Section 2: Each church shall be entitled to two delegates regardless of the number of its membership.

Section 3: Regularly ordained ministers and deacons and wives of the same who are qualified members of this association shall be entitled to vote in all sessions of the association.

Section 4: Elected delegates to the state association shall be retained as standing delegates for special called meetings.

ARTICLE V: Finances and statistics

Section 1: It shall be required of all district associations that they represent themselves by delegates and communicate by letter their standing, prospects, and statistics at each annual convention of this

association. Any district association belonging to this association which shall fail to report itself for two successive sessions may be dismissed from the association by a two-thirds majority vote of the members present in a regularly constituted session.

Section 2: It shall be required of all churches belonging to this association that they communicate by letter of greeting, naming their delegates. It is strongly urged of each church that it represent itself by delegates.

Section 3: The letter of each district association shall be accompanied by a registration fee of five dollars (\$5.00) plus the required National Association fee for each church or mission which is a member of that district.

Section 4: The letter of each church or mission shall be accompanied by a registration fee of twenty dollars (\$20.00).

ARTICLE VI: Discipline

Section 1: The state association shall investigate any question of discipline, doctrine, or practice that may come before it from any of the bodies comprising this association and make recommendations to correct such erroneous views.

Section 2: In the event of any question of discipline, doctrine, or practice on the part of an associate association, delegates of that association or church shall not be seated until such error or erroneous views have been corrected.

Section 3: Decisions of the Credentials Committee may be appealed: (1) to the state association sitting as a committee of the whole, or (2) to a special committee.

Section 4: The state association cannot discipline a local church, churches or members of a local church except to discipline the district of which they are members. The association does not have the right to refuse to seat ministers or churches against whom charges are pending.

Section 5: This association reserves the right to withdraw fellowship from any member district until such time as this association is satisfied that discipline, doctrine, and practices are in conformity with the doctrine and practices of the association, but in no case shall the association assume authority to reverse the decisions or abrogate the autonomy of local churches or district associations.

ARTICLE VII: Date and location of the annual convention

Section 1: This association shall convene with a worship service on Wednesday night before the second Sunday in June. The Executive Committee has the right to change the time or place of this meeting if the need or an emergency arises.

Section 2: Each district shall have the privilege of entertaining the state association according to the length of time since it last entertained it, according to the orderly revolving list of all the districts. Any new association becoming a member of the state association shall automatically be placed at the bottom of the list. If the district next in turn to entertain this association does not desire to exercise its privilege, it may voluntarily forfeit its privileges until its next-regular turn to entertain.

ARTICLE VIII: Officers

Section 1: The officers of this state association shall consist of moderator, assistant moderator, clerk, assistant clerk, parliamentarian, Hillsdale trustee, and executive secretary.

Section 2: These officers shall be elected at each regular annual session of the association except the executive secretary and the clerk, who shall be elected every two years, and the trustee to Hillsdale

Free Will Baptist College who shall be elected every three years.

Section 3: The officers shall be elected on the last day of the state meeting.

ARTICLE IX: Duties of officers

Section 1: The moderator shall preside over all sessions of the state association, the Executive Board, and the General Board. He shall work to promote the general welfare of the association. The moderator shall appoint committees as provided in this constitution.

Section 2: The assistant moderator shall serve in all capacities of the moderator in his absence or upon the request of the moderator.

Section 3: The clerk shall make a legible, complete, and accurate record of all proceedings of the association and prepare a manuscript of the same for printing of the minutes. He shall make and keep on file minutes of all regular and called sessions of the association, the Executive Board, and the General Board. He shall proofread any minutes recorded by himself prior to relinquishing this responsibility to any duly elected successor.

Section 4: The assistant clerk shall work with the clerk in every capacity when called upon to do so by the clerk or moderator

Section 5: The trustee to Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College from the State of Texas is to act at the board meetings of the college in behalf of the State of Texas. He is to give an annual report to the state association of Texas on the progress of the college.

He will subscribe to the standards set forth in the Hillsdale Faculty Handbook and the Doctrinal Questionnaire for faculty members.

Section 6: The executive secretary shall perform the duties listed below: Representation: The executive secretary is the official spokesman to and for Texas Free Will Baptists. He represents state and national programs to the Texas state association, district associations, and local churches. He represents Texas Free Will Baptists to other organizations as needed. He shall assist in coordinating and promoting the activities of our state boards. He is responsible to coordinate that which relates to the state association meeting. He shall be an ex-officio member of all the boards of the Texas state association.

Communication: The executive secretary is responsible to keep Texas Free Will Baptists informed. He shall present a complete written report to each annual session of the association of all work which he has done. He shall edit the CHALLENGE to inform, encourage, and instruct. He shall initiate ideas and programs to present to the state association and produce motivational materials relating to these approved programs. When he represents the state association to other organizations, he is responsible to report the response and reaction. He is responsible for keeping us informed on all news that relates to Texas Free Will Baptists, from an international to a local level.

Counselor: The executive secretary shall be a competent and confidential consultant to all Texas Free Will Baptist churches and pastors as needed. He shall assist churches which are seeking a pastor. He shall be available to assist churches which are having problems. He should be available to assist ministers seeking churches or counsel as needed. He should conduct and/or provide for seminars, workshops, and conferences.

Treasurer: The executive secretary shall receive, hold, and disburse all monies made available by the state association to the various boards, offices, and departments as directed by the state association. He shall present a complete written and audited financial statement to the state association of all monies received and disbursed to each board, national board, etc.

Accountability: The work of the executive secretary shall be under the supervision of the State Execu-

tive Board. If for any reason the executive secretary should be relieved of this office by the Executive Board, we shall have only a ninety (90) days obligation to him. If the executive secretary should be relieved of his office for moral or doctrinal reasons, the Executive Board has no obligation for continuing salary and/or expenses, nor is he eligible for any severance pay.

A part-time executive secretary, working under the direction of the Executive Board, will be expected to perform as many of the above functions as time permits.

Section 7: It shall be the duty of the parliamentarian to thoroughly acquaint himself with good and accepted parliamentary rules that he may be prepared to rule on the order of any business procedure being transacted at any session of the association. It shall be the privilege of the chair to call for a ruling from the parliamentarian when he deems it necessary.

ARTICLE X: Standing boards

Section 1: The standing boards of the state association shall include the Executive Board, General Board, Missions-Church Extension Board, and the Christian Education Board.

Section 2: Unless provided for elsewhere, all standing boards shall be composed of five (5) members each, who shall be elected to serve for terms of three (3) years.

Each board shall elect a chairman and clerk-treasurer to act for one year and be elected at the close of each annual state convention.

The board members shall be elected at the time of the adoption of their board report.

Section 3: It shall be the duty of all boards to receive, disburse, and account for all monies allocated to them from the state, or provided from any other source. Each board shall keep a record of all meetings, all activities, and all work done under its jurisdiction and shall make a full and complete report in writing to the annual convention of the state association. No board shall purchase or sell any real estate property without the approval of the state association, or except by approval of the Executive Committee.

When a board member absents himself from a board meeting without providential reasons, his membership shall be automatically terminated from the board. The remaining members of said board shall elect someone to fill the vacancy until the next state meeting.

Section 4: The Executive Board shall consist of the moderator, assistant moderator, clerk, assistant clerk, parliamentarian, Hillsdale trustee, and executive secretary. It shall act in behalf of the association when not in session and shall have the power to receive funds, to report and superintend such work for the state as may seem best and the means at hand may warrant in order to fulfill the plans and undertakings of the state association. It shall also make nominations for the position of executive secretary. Nominations for the position of executive secretary may also be made from the floor.

The moderator and executive secretary of said Executive Board shall sign all deeds, bonds, notes, etc., and any other papers by which the state association is to become legally responsible.

The Executive Board shall have the power to call the association into conference by notifying each associate district association at least ten (10) days prior to conference. Such notification shall consist of a registered letter sent to the moderator and clerk of each association.

Minutes of all meetings are to be recorded and reported to the association in the next regular convention, and the report of the Executive Board shall be printed in the minutes of the association.

Section 5: The General Board shall consist of each duly elected moderator and one member from each associate district association, the chairman of each state standing board, and the state officers. The moderator shall moderate all meetings of this board.

It shall be the duty of this board to meet preceding the state convention to hear reports of the standing boards and to make recommendations to the state association. This board shall also serve as the Credentials Committee and shall recommend a budget for adoption by the state association.

Section 6: The Missions-Church Extension Board shall promote an active home and foreign missions program in and for the state of Texas.

Section 7: The Christian Education Board shall promote all phases of Christian education through the Sunday School, Church Training Service, workshops, institutes, and Free Will Baptist related schools and colleges.

ARTICLE XI: Committees

Section 1: The moderator shall appoint a Committee on Committees and a Nominating Committee during the first business session of the first day of each annual convention.

Section 2: The Committee on Committees shall nominate the following committees consisting of three members each: Resolutions and Obituary.

Section 3: The Nominating Committee shall present nominations for the standing boards and the state officers with the exception of the executive secretary, but the association shall in no wise prevent members from making other nominations from the floor.

Section 4: The moderator shall appoint other committees as necessary, or as otherwise provided for, which shall hold office until their assigned work is completed or until their successors are appointed.

ARTICLE XII: Alterations and amendments

This constitution may be altered or amended at any regular session of the association by a two-thirds vote of all members present and voting provided the proposed alteration or amendment has been read before the body and has been placed on the table one day in advance of the time the vote is to be taken. Written copies must be provided to the voting membership at the time the amendment is tabled.

BY-LAWS

Section 1: The moderator or assistant moderator, or in their absence the senior minister in years, shall call the association into conference and if a quorum is known to be present the body may proceed with business according to an adopted program.

Section 2: Each meeting of each session shall be opened by reading a portion of the Bible and praying and shall be closed with prayer.

Section 3: All persons declared by the Credentials Committee to be eligible to represent in the association are hereby made and constituted members of this body and are authorized to act in all respects according to the provisions of the Constitution and By-Laws under which this association is governed.

Section 4: Delegates from corresponding bodies and brethren invited to be seated in the association shall be entitled to all privileges of the association except voting.

Section 5: No person shall speak more than twice on the same question nor over ten minutes at the time without special permission of the association; neither shall anyone be permitted to speak without first facing and addressing the chair by the appellation, "Brother Moderator", and shall not proceed with discussion or statement until recognized by the chair.

Section 6: The business of the association shall be governed by good parliamentary regulations at all times.

Section 7: No person shall be allowed to nominate more than one member of any office, board, or committee provided the person nominated be elected. No person shall hold more than one office in the state at any one time.

Section 8: This association shall sit with open doors except when it shall go into a committee of the whole.

Section 9: By a two-thirds vote of all members present and voting, a ruling of the moderator may be overruled.

Section 10: These by-laws may be amended at any regular session of the association by a majority vote of the body provided the proposed amendment has been read before the body and placed on the table one day in advance of the time the vote is to be taken.
