Message by Rev. William Smith, Executive Secretary, Georgia State Association of FWB, Colquitt, GA
– "Christ's Preparation of the People" (I Tim. 4:1-2, II Tim. 4:1-4)

Introduction: The theme of the conference is "Exalting the Lord", with a reference verse of Psa. 34:3. The two texts show the contrasts of what we see in the world and what we read in the Scriptures. As the Old Testament declares there are times in our relationship with God that we need to go back to the old landmarks and see if we are still living within the boundaries. Instead of attacking the preaching of the Gospel of Christ, we now hear that the gospel message is not relative for the world we live in today. The subtitle of this sermon is the Inauguration of Christ, for tonight we will see the beginning of His earthly life and tomorrow night we will end with the Coronation of Christ, the completion of the work of redemption.

I. His Incarnation – His Birth

A. Selection of the Mother

B. Submission of Mary

1. She found favor with God.
2. She was pure (a virgin).
3. She felt unworthy and exalted the Lord.
4. She was obedient.

II. His Inauguration – His Baptism

A. Declaration of the Speaker (John)

1. "There is one coming after me that is greater than me."
2. John felt unworthy to baptize Jesus.
3. John, as all Godly men should do, led his disciples to follow Jesus.

B. Descent of the Spirit

1. The dove is a symbol of peace; Jesus is the Prince of Peace.
2. The Father was pleased with the Son.

III. His Temptation – His Battle

A. The Tempter's Focus

1. Toward the Son: There were three temptations.
 - a. Satan tempted Jesus to not trust in the Father's goodness and to distrust His Father's care and concern about Him.
 - b. He tempted Jesus to presume upon the Father's power and protection.
 - c. He tempted Jesus with the offer of the kingdoms of the world and the glory of them.

2. Toward mankind: Satan not only wanted Jesus to fail, but he wanted to destroy the plan of salvation.

B. The Tempter's Failure

1. Satan faced One who was committed to the will of the Father.
2. Satan faced the One who held all power in His hands.

IV. His Transfiguration – His Beauty

A. Description of the Kingdom

1. Jesus ends Matthew 16 on the subject of surrender.
2. He then tells them that some standing there would see the "Son of Man coming in His kingdom".
3. Though Moses and Elijah were present, never forget that it is Jesus who is the Lord.

B. Discourse about Calvary

1. They realized that Jesus was speaking about John the Baptist.
2. The tide had begun to turn. Jesus' popularity was declining and, like John the Baptist, He soon would be rejected and eventually crucified.

Pastor's Conference – Theme: "The Basics of Christianity"

Presiding: Rev. Freddy Gillentine (Heritage Parks, Abilene)

Scripture reading and prayer by Rev. Michael Scott (CrossRoads, Lubbock).

Message by Rev. Jimmy Dickinson (Bible, Odessa) "Exalting Christ Publicly" (Acts 2:42)

Introduction: After Passover, our text says that the disciples continued daily and many were saved. We need to do the same: take the Gospel to the people. We don't need to worry about our image or trying to impress others; we just need to show them to Christ.

I. Exalting Christ with our Time A. In Worship

1. Our Presence – showing our priorities in life
2. Our Participation – showing what we love to do

B. In Work

1. Manual Work – revealing our willingness
2. Missionary Work – reaching out to others

II. Exalting Christ with our Talents

- A. Displayed Publicly – to set an example to others
- B. Done Privately – not for our benefit only, but for the glory of God in building His church

III. Exalting Christ with our Testimony

- A. Our Conversation – reveals what is in our hearts
- B. Our Conduct – not just to “talk the talk” but to walk the walk.

Conclusion: Turn to God for the strength to do the necessary; faith will see you through! Fellowship with others and show yourself worthy as Christ lives in you. Take care of our brothers and sisters as Christ would. Make them know and aware that time is short and Christ will return swiftly (in the blink of an eye). Make sure your life is in order and pray continually. Seek the face of Christ!

Message by Rev. Charles Jones (First, Kermit)

“Exalting Christ’s Personality” (Heb. 2:9)

- I. His Preexistence – Jesus personally was made lower than the angels, for our benefit, that He might die for our sins.
 - A. As Creator
 - B. As Communicator
- II. His Provision – There are consequences for our sins that must be paid, according to God’s plan, by someone. Will it be you or Jesus?
 - A. A Seeking Savior
 - B. A Substitute Sacrifice
- III. His Promises – We are in a real battle; who is our enemy?
 - A. His Presence – The Word of God (Heb. 4:14-16) must be taught to our children so that they will rely on Him.
 - B. His Power – This spiritual battle started in Heaven (Dan. 10:12-13); Satan was expelled from Heaven and came to earth. We are caught in the middle of this war and need to depend on the Holy Spirit.
 - C. His Preparation – Structure your life to survive the battle by arming yourself.

Moderator’s Message: Rev. Keith Woody (Lakehills, Cedar Park) “What We Must Do to Survive” – Nehemiah 2:12-20

Introduction: A study of Nehemiah compels the reader to question what convinced Nehemiah that he could succeed where others had failed. He knew that he had the hand of God on his life and that his work was divinely instructed, and he had a plan in mind and steps to accomplish it. Here are 10 things that we must do in order for Texas Free Will Baptists to survive.

- I. We must build new churches.
- II. We cannot live in the past.
- III. We must have a revival in our existing churches.

- IV. We must have a loyalty to, and a burden for, Texas Free Will Baptists.
- V. We must start taking an interest in what everyone else is doing in our state.
- VI. We must find the money for supporting new works in the state of Texas, and we must put financial support for new churches in our church budgets.
- VII. We must find a way to embrace new methods without losing our Free Will Baptist distinctives.
- VIII. We must recruit quality workers to come to Texas and plant new churches and work in our ministries.
- IX. We must seek God's direction on our future efforts.
- X. We must organize our work for the Lord.

Message by Rev. William Smith, Executive Secretary, Georgia State Association of FWB, Colquitt, GA
– "Christ's Perfection of His Purpose" (Acts 2:36)

Introduction: Last night's message focused on some contrasts between the world and the Scriptures, looking at the Inauguration of Christ. Tonight we will explore a variety of Scriptures looking at the Coronation of Christ, the completion of the work of redemption.

I. His Crucifixion

- A. Sufficient for all Sin (1 Peter 1:18; Hebrews 7:22-28; Hebrews 10:12)
- B. Sufficient for all Sinners (Hebrews 9:14-15; Hebrews 9:27-28; Matthew 11:28)

II. His Resurrection

- A. Deity of Christ Proved (Acts 2:22-32; 1 Corinthians 15:3-4)
- B. Destiny of Christians Provided (1 Corinthians 15:17; 1 Corinthians 1:19-23; 1 Corinthians 15:42-57)

III. His Ascension

- A. His Position (Acts 1:9; Acts 7:55-56; Hebrews 10:12)
- B. His Priesthood (Hebrews 7:25; Hebrews 9:24; Hebrews 4:14-16)

Conclusion: Almost two years ago I was watching the NBC Nightly News on Saturday evening. To introduce the last news segment the anchor made the following statement "This week the very foundation of Christianity has been shaken." The segment used as its proof: the priesthood scandal in the Catholic Church, the discovery of The Book of Judas, and the Sea of Galilee could have frozen and this explains the miracle of walking on the water. However, the Kingdom of God and the work of Christ is not dependent on the deeds and the discoveries of man. We can answer all of those negative stories with the following:

When Jesus came into the coasts of Caesarea Philippi, he asked his disciples, saying, Whom do men say that I the Son of man am? And they said, Some say that thou art John the Baptist: some, Elias; and others, Jeremias, or one of the prophets. He saith unto them, But whom say ye that I am? And Simon Peter answered and said, Thou art the Christ, the Son of the living God. And Jesus answered and said unto him, Blessed art thou, Simon Barjona: for flesh and blood hath not revealed it unto thee, but my Father which is in heaven. And I say also unto thee, That thou art Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church; and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it. (Matthew 16:13-18)

 - o The CrossLife mission in San Antonio are currently meeting in a day care facility and are averaging about 40 in Sunday morning service.
 - o The CrossRoads mission work in Lubbock is going well and they are seeing a lot of new visitors and making contacts.
 - o The Board expressed its appreciation for the financial and prayer support from all the state's churches and encouraged each to continue in their giving, even in difficult economic times.

Constitutional Amendment

Recommended by the General Board on Date of the Annual Convention

- Article VII: Date and Location of the Annual Convention **shall be amended as follows:**

Section 1: This association shall convene with a worship service on *the second* Wednesday night ~~before the third Sunday~~ in June. The Executive Board has the right to change the time or place of this meeting if the need or an emergency arises.

Constitutional Amendment Recommended by the General Board on Composition of the Executive Board

- Article VIII: Officers shall be amended as follows:

Section 1: The officers of this state association shall consist of moderator, assistant moderator, clerk, and assistant clerk, ~~Hillsdale trustee and executive secretary.~~

Section 2: These officers shall be elected at each regular annual session of the association except ~~the executive secretary and the clerk, who shall be elected every two years, and the trustee to Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College who shall be elected every three years.~~

- Article IX: Duties of Officers **shall be amended as follows:**

Section 5 shall be deleted and Section 6 shall be renumbered as Section 5.

- Article X: Duties of Officers **shall be amended as follows:**

Section 4: The Executive Board shall consist of the moderator, assistant moderator, clerk, assistant clerk, ~~Hillsdale trustee and executive secretary,~~ *and one member-at-large*. It shall act on behalf of the association when not in session and shall have the power to receive funds, to report and superintend such work for the state as may seem best and the means at hand may warrant in order to fulfill the plans and undertakings of the state association. It shall also make nominations for the position of executive secretary. Nominations for the position of executive secretary may also be made from the floor.

Credentials Committee Report

The Credentials Committee has received letters and representation fees from the following district associations: Central Texas (19 churches), East Texas (10 churches), West Fork (11 churches), West Texas (5 churches), and Rio Grande Valley (1 church). These districts are entitled to one delegate for each hundred members or fractional part thereof. The Central Texas District, the West Fork District, and the West Texas District have specified no delegates to the State Association. Delegates from the East Texas and Rio Grande Valley Districts are to be appointed by their respective moderators. We recommend that these districts and their respective delegates be seated.

North Point FWB Church has appointed Lee and Sally Wilcox as local church delegates.

Eastside FWB Church has appointed Chuck Topping as a local church delegate.

No other churches specified delegates. We recommend that these letters be accepted and the delegates be seated.

The Credentials Committee has received no letters or dues from the following:

- Northwest Brazos District Association
- Oakdale First FWB Church, Amarillo

The State Clerk called the pastor of the Oakdale First FWB Church to confirm that they had received the reporting form and the pastor said that the church had met and agreed that, because of their small size and current inability to contribute to the State Association, they would withdraw from the State Association and continue as an independent church with the intention that when conditions improved they would rejoin the State Association in the future. Given that this is the fourth consecutive year in which they have not submitted a letter or dues, the Credentials Committee recommends that the State Association grant their request to withdraw. We further recommend that each of our members place this church in their prayers for future reconciliation.
