Article 9. No member shall absent himself from the body while in session without leave from the Moderator.

Article 10. On all motions made, when the vote of the body is taken, a majority shall prevail.

Article 11. The Moderator shall have the same privilege to speak as any other member, provided the chair is filled.

Article 12. Any member transgressing the above rules shall be admonished by the Moderator.
